DAY 1 TALKING POINTS

- Opening day at Roland Garros on Sunday features 20 men's matches on the order of play, with seven of the tournament-high 19 Frenchmen in action.
- In the second match on Court Philippe Chatrier, 2021 finalist **Stefanos Tsitsipas** takes on **Jiri Vesely**, who is playing in his first tour-level tournament since last year's US Open. The 29-year-old Czech Republic native has dropped to No. 455 after being sidelined with a left hamstring injury going back to April 2022. He's played in two Challengers since returning last month. He has a protected ranking of No. 94.
- Vesely is 4-17 lifetime against Top 10 opponents (2-5 in Grand Slam events) with wins over No. 8 Thiem at 2016
 Wimbledon 1R and No. 5 Zverev at 2019 Wimbledon 1R. His biggest career win came on clay over No. 1
 Djokovic at 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo 2R. He also beat No. 1 Djokovic in Dubai last year.
- Tsitsipas is 18-6 at Roland Garros and he's reached the 4R or better the last four years. This season he reached the Australian Open final in January and has compiled a 13-4 record on clay with QFs or better in his last four tournaments with a runner-up in Barcelona (I. to Alcaraz), SF in Rome and QFs in Monte Carlo and Madrid.
- In the evening session, the Top 2 Frenchmen **Adrian Mannarino** and **Ugo Humbert** square off. Humbert is the French No. 1 at No. 40 after winning two ATP Challenger Tour titles this month and he's looking for his first Roland Garros win (0-4). No. 47-ranked Mannarino is trying to reach the 2R here for the first time since 2019.
- In another all-French match-up on Court Simonne Mathieu, #NextGen ATP wild card Arthur Cazaux meets Corentin Moutet. The 20-year-old Cazaux is ranked a career-high No. 190 and he's playing in the Roland Garros main draw for the second time (1R in 2021). Moutet reached the 3R in 2019, his best result in five appearances.
- On Court Suzanne Lenglen, No. 11 seed **Karen Khachanov**, a semi-finalist in the last two Grand Slam events (2022 US Open, 2023 Aus. Open), takes on 31-year-old Frenchman **Constant Lestienne**, who is making his main draw debut after losing in the qualifying 1R or 2R on seven occasions. He went 2-7 in qualifying.
- No. 7 seed **Andrey Rublev**, a two-time Roland Garros quarter-finalist, brings a 3-0 record against **Laslo Djere**, who is looking for his first Top 10 win in Grand Slam play (0-4). Three of the Serbian's losses have come at Roland Garros. Rublev is 12-3 on clay this season, highlighted by his first ATP Masters 1000 title in Monte-Carlo.
- On Court 14, former Top 10 Frenchman Lucas Pouille, who has dropped to No. 675 (lowest in 128-draw), reached the main draw as a qualifier for the first time with a three-set win over **Jurij Rodionov**. They meet again as the Austrian is one of three lucky losers in the main draw.

JIRI VESELY

Roland Garros Stats

> Czech Republic native is making his 11th consecutive Roland Garros appearance and his best result was third round in 2017 when he beat No. 15 Sock and Bedene before losing to Bautista Agut.

> Has lost in first round in four of last five years with lone win coming in 2020 (d. Broady, I. to Khachanov).

> Six of his 10 losses have come to Top 25 opponents and Tsitsipas is second Top 10 opponent he's faced at Roland Garros. Lost to No. 9 Raonic in 2R in 2014.

Career Highlights

> Achieved career-high No. 35 in 2015 after breaking into Top 100 at age 19 in 2013 and ending that season as youngest player in Top 100.

> Won ATP Tour titles at 2015 Auckland as Q and 2020 Pune, saving 2 MPs vs. Ivashka and 4 MPs vs. Berankis en route to Pune title.

> Defeated World No. 1 Djokovic at 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo and 2022 Dubai, joining Safin as only players to defeat Djokovic multiple times with no losses.

> Advanced to Wimbledon 4R in 2016 and 2018, losing 5-setter to his idol and countryman Berdych in 2016.

> Became World No. 1 junior on 3 January 2011 and spent remainder of season atop rankings after sweeping Australian Open titles in boys' singles and boys' doubles w/Horansky.

> Was sidelined for 8 months after 2022 US Open until coming back in April 2023 at Ostrava Challenger (QF). Suffered left hamstring injury in April 2022 (Marrakech) and in July 2022 (Newport). Played until US Open before stopping rest of the season.



STEFANOS TSITSIPAS

Roland Garros Stats

> Greek star is making his 7th straight Roland Garros appearance (18-6) and from 2017-2021 he improved his result every year since making debut as a qualifier ranked No. 205 in 2017 (I. to Karlovic in 1R). Last year lost in 4R to Rune.
 > En route to his first Grand Slam final in 2021, beat Isner (3R), No. 12 Carreno Busta (4R), No. 2 Medvedev (QF) and No. 6 Zverev (SF in 5 sets) before falling to Djokovic 6-7(6) 2-6 6-3 6-2 6-4.

> In 2018, reached 2R (I. to No. 8 Thiem in 4 sets) and followed with 4R in 2019 (I. to Wawrinka 8-6 in 5th set), SF in 2020 (I. to No. 1 Djokovic 6-1 in 5th set) and runner-up in 2021.

Career Highlights

> Top-ranked Greek of all time achieved career-high No. 3 in August 2021 and boasts 10 wins vs. Top-3 opponents (2 vs. No. 1, 3 vs. No. 2, 5 vs. No. 3).

> Has finished in Top 10 Pepperstone ATP Rankings for past 4 years (No. 6 in 2019-2020, No. 4 in 2021-22).

> Six-time Grand Slam semi-finalist, highlighted by final runs at 2021 Roland Garros and 2023 Australian Open (I. Djokovic in both).

> Captured 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals title at age 20 and 2019 Nitto ATP Finals title at age 21, becoming youngest champion of latter since Hewitt, 20, in 2001.

> Won 9 ATP Tour titles, including 2021 and 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo, but still seeking 1st ATP 500 title (0-10 in finals).

> Youngest of 30 players to defeat Djokovic (2018 Toronto 3R), Federer (2019 Australian Open 4R) and Nadal (2019 Madrid SF), sweeping Big 3 before turning 21.

ADRIAN MANNARINO

Roland Garros Stats

> Frenchman is making his 15th Roland Garros main draw appearance (13th consecutive) and has lost in 1R in last 3 years, to Ramos-Vinolas in 2020, Bedene in 2021 and Delbonis last year.

> Last win came in 2019 1R over Travaglia in 5 sets (I. to Monfils in 2R). His other 1R wins came in 2016 (d. Kukushkin, I. to No. 9 Raonic) and 2014 (d. Lu, I. to Garcia-Lopez).

> Has 0-2 record vs. countrymen at Roland Garros, falling to Rufin in 2011 1R and to Monfils in 2019 2R.



Career Highlights

> Achieved career-high No. 22 in 2018 and ended 10 straight years in Top 75 of Pepperstone ATP Rankings (2013-22).
 > Captured 1st ATP Tour title in 7th final of career at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Thompson) and 2nd title in 11th final of career at 2022 Winston-Salem (d. Djere).

> Earned biggest win of career over No. 5 Cilic to reach biggest final of career at 2017 Tokyo (I. to Goffin).

> Posted personal-best 33 wins in 2017, ending season on 25-13 run including 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at Montreal.
> Reached 2022 Australian Open 4R and Wimbledon 4R in 2013, 2017 and 2018, but owns 0-19 record vs. Top-10 players at Grand Slams.

UGO HUMBERT

Roland Garros Stats

> French left-hander is looking to earn his first win at Roland Garros (0-4) after 1R losses to Popyrin in 2019, Polmans in 2020, Berankis in 2021 (all in 4 sets) and Ruusuvuori (in 5 sets) last year.

> Roland Garros is only Grand Slam tournament he's winless: 3-5 at Australian Open, 5-3 at Wimbledon, 2-5 at US Open

> Has a 3-5 record vs. countrymen in 2022-23.

Career Highlights

> Achieved career-high No. 25 after upsetting No. 6 Zverev and No. 7 Rublev en route to biggest of 3 career titles at 2021 Halle (d. Rublev).

> Won 1st ATP Tour title at 2020 Auckland (d. Paire) as 21-year-old to become youngest French champion since Gasquet, 21, at 2007 Mumbai.

> Saved 4 MPs vs. Evans en route to 2nd ATP Tour title at 2020 Antwerp (d. de Minaur).

> Owns 7-6 record vs. Top 10 and earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Medvedev at 2022 ATP Cup.

> Defeated former No. 3 Thiem 6-3 6-0 to win 2022 Rennes Challenger title and in May 2023 won his 8th and 9th Challengers at Cagliari and Bordeaux in a 3-week span.

Roland Garros Stats

> No. 4 Serbian (of 5 in Top 100) is making his 6th straight Roland Garros main draw appearance and 7th in 8 years.

> His best result is third round in 2019 (I. to No. 7 Nishikori) and 2021 (I. to No. 6 Zverev).

> Has an 0-3 record vs. Top 10 opponents in Paris and last year lost to No. 2 Medvedev in second round.

> Top 6 Serbians are in this year's main draw.

Career Highlights

> Former World No. 3 junior broke into Top 30 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Rio de Janeiro without dropping a set (d. Auger-Aliassime). Reached career-high No. 27 on 10 June 2019.

> Dedicated Rio title to his parents, Caba and Hajnalka, who both passed away from cancer.

> Defeated countryman Lajovic en route to 2nd title at 2020 Sardinia (d. Cecchinato).

> Earned 5 victories and won 5 TBs en route to 2022 Winston-Salem final (I. to Mannarino) despite entering event with 15-44 career record on hard courts and 1-18 TB record in 2022.

> Also on hard courts, upset World No. 3 Ruud at 2023 Auckland for biggest win of career.

ANDREY RUBLEV

Roland Garros Stats

> Has advanced to quarter-finals in 2 of past 3 years, falling in a 5th set TB to Cilic last year and to No. 6 Tsitsipas in 2020

> Three of his 4 losses in Paris have been in 5-sets: 2017 1R as LL (I. to Schwartzman) and 2021 1R (I. to Struff).

> Rallied from 2 sets down for only time in career to defeat Querrey in 1R in 2020

> Captured 2014 Roland Garros boys' singles title (d. Munar) and reached boys' doubles SF w/Kozlov (I. to Bonzi/Halys).

Career Highlights

Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 20 in January 2020, Top 10 in October 2020 and Top 5 in September 2021.
 Came back from a set down in both SF (d. Fritz) and final (d. Rune) for the first time in his career at 2023 Monte Carlo to earn 1st ATP Masters 1000 title.

> Defeated No. 3 Nadal at 2021 Monte Carlo and No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Cincinnati en route to ATP Masters 1000 finals, then beat No. 1 Djokovic for 11th of 13 ATP Tour titles at 2022 Belgrade.

> Led tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.

> Seven-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist reached 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF and won gold medal in All-ROC mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).

> Went 9-1 in singles and 4-1 in doubles at team events during 2021 season, sweeping titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

2023 ATP Masters 1000 Finals - Rublev captured his first ATP Masters 1000 title in Monte Carlo on 16 April.

Roland Garros Stats

> Has never lost in first round (6-0) at Roland Garros and looking to reach his 3rd straight Grand Slam semi-final (2022 US Open, 2023 Aust. Open). His 17 Roland Garros wins are more than any other Grand Slam tournament he's played.

- > Advanced to 1st Grand Slam QF of career at 2019 Roland Garros (d. No. 9 del Potro in 4R, I. No. 4 to Thiem).
- > Lost Roland Garros 4R matches to No. 1 Murray in 2017, No. 3 A. Zverev in 2018, No. 1 Djokovic in 2020 and No. 6 Alcaraz last year.
- > Reached Roland Garros boys' singles 3R in 2013 (d. Kyrgios in 2R, I. to Nunez) and 2014 (I. to Zormann).
- > Also reached 2014 Roland Garros boys' doubles QF w/Medvedev.

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 10 and achieved career-high No. 8 in July 2019 after ending 2018 season at No. 11.
- > Upset Top-10 players Isner, A. Zverev, Thiem and Djokovic en route to 2018 ATP Masters 1000 Paris title.
- > Broke streak of 23 consecutive losses vs. Top 10 opponents with win over No. 3 Tsitsipas in 4R of 2023 Miami before losing to eventual champ Medvedev in SF.
- > At 2018 Paris, became 1st unseeded ATP Masters 1000 champion since Nalbandian at 2007 Paris.
- > Advanced to QFs of all 4 Grand Slam events, highlighted by runs to 2022 US Open SF and 2023 Australian Open SF.
- > Entered 2020 Tokyo Olympics as No. 4 men's player on Team ROC and went on to earn silver medal (held in 2021).

Roland Garros Stats

> Frenchman is making his main draw debut after falling in qualifying seven times. Has a 2-7 record in qualifying matches.
 > Lost in the first round in 2015, 2017, 2019, 2021 and last year. And fell in the second round in 2018 and 2020.



Career Highlights

> Earned 1st ranking point at age 19 in February 2012, broke into Top 100 at age 30 in August 2022 and achieved careerhigh No. 48 in February 2023.

> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF at San Diego and 1st ATP Tour SF at Tel Aviv during back-to-back weeks in September 2022.

> In 2nd week of 2023, reached 2nd ATP Tour SF in Auckland where he gave a W/O due to a shoulderinjury against countryman Gasquet.

> Defeated Monteiro in Grand Slam main draw debut at 2023 Australian Open after failing to qualify at 21 Grand Slam events from 2015-22.

> Posted 40-17 Challenger record in 2022 (3-2 in finals), capturing hard-court titles at Malaga, Pozoblanco and Vancouver during summer.

> Secret talent is that he is a magician when he is not playing tennis, performing at weddings and parties.

DAVID GOFFIN

Roland Garros Stats

> Making 12th straight Roland Garros appearance and has an 8-4 in first round matches. Comes into Paris ranked outside Top 100 for first time since 2014 when he was No. 105.

> Advanced to 1st of 3 Grand Slam quarter-finals at 2016 Roland Garros (I. to Thiem).

> Owns 5-0 record in 5-setters at Roland Garros, winning 2 en route to 2012 4R (d. Stepanek, Clement) and 2 en route to 2018 4R (d. Haase, Monfils). Also defeated Almagro in 5 sets en route to 2016 Roland Garros QF.

> Reached 2012 Roland Garros 4R as LL in Grand Slam main draw debut, falling to boyhood idol Federer.



Career Highlights

> Earned career-high 59 wins in 2017, ending season at career-high No. 7 after defeating No. 1 Nadal and No. 2 Federer en route to Nitto ATP Finals championship match.

> Overall has finished in Top 25 for 7 consecutive years from 2014-2020.

> Became 6th and final player to beat Nadal and Federer at same event (also Davydenko, Del Potro, Djokovic, Murray and Nalbandian).
