Pedro Martinez | Age: 25 | World No. 117 | Career-High No. 40 | 2023: 3-5 (Pune QF) | Santiago: 4-0 (2022 Title)
 > Achieved career-high No. 40 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Santiago and reaching 1st ATP Masters 1000 3R at 2022 Miami.
 > Defeated No. 16 Bautista Agut at 2021 Kitzbuhel for biggest win of career and en route to 1st SF and final.
 > Led all players by qualifying for 6 tour-level events in 2020, including Australian Open, Rio de Janeiro, Rome and Roland Garros.
 > Also in 2020, earned 1st tour-level win at Australian Open (d. Koepfer), posted 1st ATP Masters 1000 win at Rome (d. Querrey) and advanced to 1st Grand Slam 3R at Roland Garros.
 > Reached 5 of his 6 career Challenger finals on home clay in Spain, highlighted by 2020 Marbella and 2021 Seville titles.

NOTE: Defending champion Martinez dropped outside the Top 100 this week for the first time since June 2021. He aims to become the 1st player to win a match when defending the Santiago title and seeks 50th career tour-level win.

Yannick Hanfmann | Age: 31 | World No. 153 | Career-High No. 92 | 2023: 0-2 | Santiago: 2-1 (2022 QF)
> Hearing-impaired player broke into Top 100 in 2018 and achieved career-high No. 92 in 2021.
> Qualified en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2017 Gstaad and 2nd final at 2020 Kitzbuhel.
> Earned biggest win of career over No. 9 Monfils at 2020 Hamburg, where he accepted main draw WC instead of playing qualifying at Roland Garros.
> Posted 1st Grand Slam main draw win in 7th try at 2022 Australian Open as Q (d. Kokkinakis).
> Captured 6 Challenger titles after playing for University of Southern California (2012-15), where he helped Trojans win 2 NCAA national titles.

NOTE: Hanfmann seeks to break a 4-match tour-level losing streak to earn first ATP Tour win since defeating Dominic Thiem to reach 4th career ATP Tour SF at 2022 Kitzbuhel in July.

Pedro Cachin | Age: 27 | World No. 61 | Career-High No. 54 | 2023: 1-7 (Buenos Aires 2R) | Santiago: 0-0 (Debut)
> After debuting in Top 200 in September 2015, broke into Top 150 in June 2022 and Top 100 in July 2022 before peaking at No. 54 in November 2022.
> Won 5th-set TBs over Bedene and Holt to reach 2022 US Open 3R.
> Defeated Norrie and Carreno Busta en route to 1st ATP Tour QF of career at 2019 Cordoba as Q.
> Posted 38-11 Challenger record in 2022 (4-3 in finals), winning clay-court titles at Madrid, Prague-2, Todi and Santo Domingo.
> Achieved career-high No. 8 in junior rankings, defeating future ATP No. 5 Rublev en route to 4th ITF Junior Circuit title at 2013 Offenbach.

NOTE: Cachin is 1-9 in his last 10 tour-level matches, defeating No. 78 Monteiro to reach 2023 Buenos Aires 2R two weeks ago for lone win. He is 0-7 vs. right handers and 1-0 vs. left handers on tour-level this season.

Juan Manuel Cerundolo | Age: 21 | World No. 108 | Career-High No. 79 | 2023: 2-2 (Cordoba QF) | Santiago: 1-2 (2021 2R)
> Former Top-10 junior achieved career-high No. 79 in January 2022 after winning 3 Challenger titles in 5 finals during 2021 season.
> Qualified, won 8 matches in 9 days and captured title at 2021 Cordoba in his ATP Tour debut as a 19-year-old ranked 335th.
> Became 1st player to win a title in his debut since Ventura at 2004 Casablanca and 5th-lowest-ranked player to win a title since ATP Tour was established in 1990.
> Boasts 80-33 Challenger record (7-2 in finals), sweeping back-to-back titles on home soil at 2023 Tigre-1 and 2023 Tigre-2.
> Father, Alejandro, also played pro tennis; older brother, Francisco, achieved career-high No. 24 in July 2022; older sister, Constanza, played on Argentine field hockey team that won gold at 2018 Youth Olympics.

NOTE: Cerundolo achieved 7 of his 11 career tour-level wins in Cordoba, where he won his 1st ATP Tour title (2021) and reached 2nd career tour-level quarter-final (2023).

Alejandro Tabilo | Age: 25 | World No. 186 | Career-High No. 64 | 2023: 0-1 (Cordoba 1R) | Santiago: 5-3 (2022 SF)
> Toronto-born Chilean achieved new career-high ranking 12 times in 2022, breaking into Top 100 in February and peaking at No. 64 in July.
> Earned 6 straight-set wins – including 5 over Argentines – en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2022 Cordoba as Q.
> Defeated countryman Garin en route to 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2022 Santiago as WC and 3rd ATP Tour QF at 2022 Munich as LL.
> Qualified at Australian Open in 2020 and 2022, earning 5-set win over fellow South American Galan in Grand Slam main draw debut.
> Represented Canada throughout junior career, peaking at No. 29 in junior rankings during 2015 season.

NOTE: One of 3 home players in the draw, Tabilo seeks first tour-level win of the year and first since beating Johnson at 2022 San Diego 1R in September. He is 3-0 in Santiago opening rounds, having played all 3 previous editions.

Jaume Munar | Age: 25 | World No. 66 | Career-High No. 52 | 2023: 1-5 (Buenos Aires 2R) | Santiago: 1-3 (2022 2R)
> Former World No. 3 junior achieved career-high No. 52 after upsetting No. 3 A. Zverev for biggest win of career at 2019 Marrakech. Also defeated No. 3 Ruud at 2022 Tokyo 1R (career 2-11 vs Top 10 opponents).
> Finished 2022 at year-end high No. 58 after earning personal-best 19 wins and qualifying for 4 ATP Masters 1000 events.
> Defeated countryman Alcaraz before falling to countryman Carreno Busta in 1st ATP Tour final at 2021 Marbella.
> Owns 113-58 Challenger record (8-6 in finals), including clay-court titles at Marbella and Perugia in 2022.
> Reached 2014 Roland Garros boys' singles final and won boys' doubles title in 2015 with countryman Lopez San Martin.

NOTE: Munar is one of 6 players in the field that played in the singles main draw of all 4 editions of Santiago (Bagnis, Cecchinato, Garin, Munar, Tabilo, Varillas). His only tour-level win this season came over No. 723 Pella in Buenos Aires 1R and he is 0-5 vs. right handers and 1-0 vs. left handers on tour-level this season.
