Sebastian Ofner | Age: 29 | World No. 141 | Career-High No. 37 | 2025: 9-6 (Geneva SF) | Bastad: 2-1 (2023 QF)
> Earned 1st ranking point at age 17 in July 2013, broke into Top 200 in 2017, Top 100 in June 2023 and achieved career-high No. 37 in January 2024 after reaching 3rd ATP Tour SF at Hong Kong.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour final at 2024 Mallorca, joining Antonitsch, J. Melzer and Thiem as only Austrian men to play in a grass-court final in Open Era.
> Advanced to 2017 Wimbledon 3R in Grand Slam qualifying debut, highlighted by 5-set win over No. 18 Sock and qualified to reach 2023 Roland Garros 4R.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour QF and SF on home soil at 2017 Kitzbuhel as WC.
> Owns 145-115 Challenger record (4-9 in finals), winning titles at 2018 Astana, 2019 Puerto Vallarta and 2022 Prague-1 and latest title at 2023 Salzburg after 0-5 start to 2023 Challenger finals.

NOTE: Ofner is making his 2nd appearance in Bastad after reaching 2nd of 7 ATP Tour QFs in 2023 (l. to Ruud). He is 5-1 in opening round matches this season with a sole loss to Rublev in Halle and aims to record 10 wins in a season for third time in career (13 in 2023, 17 in 2024).

Damir Dzumhur | Age: 33 | World No. 70 | Career-High No. 23 | 2025: 13-14 (Bucharest SF) | Bastad: 1-1 (2019 2R)
> Broke into Top 100 in 2015 and Top 50 in 2017 before winning 3rd ATP Tour title at 2018 Antalya to achieve career-high No. 23.
> First player to sweep both Russian titles in a single season, capturing St. Petersburg and Moscow championships in 2017.
> Earned personal-best 36 victories in 2017, highlighted by biggest wins of career over No. 3 Wawrinka at Dubai and No. 4 A. Zverev at Shenzhen.
> Advanced to Grand Slam 3R on 5 occasions, including at 2018 Roland Garros, where he led No. 3 A. Zverev by 2 sets to 1 and held 1 MP before losing.
> Reached ATP Masters 1000 R16 on 3 occasions, including at 2016 Miami, where he defeated No. 5 Nadal in 2R.
> Went 6-0 in finals on ATP Challenger Tour in 2024, tying with 5 other players for 2nd-most Challenger titles in a single season behind Griekspoor (8 in 2021).

NOTE: Dzumhur seeks to break a 4-match losing streak and earn first win since reaching Roland Garros 3R (l. to Alcaraz). He defeated Ruud in Bastad 1R in tournament debut 6 years ago to become the only Bosnian match winner in tournament history.

[WC] Elias Ymer (SWE) vs Tristan Boyer (USA)

First Meeting

Elias Ymer | Age: 29 | World No. 264 | Career-High No. 105 | 2025: 0-1 (Hamburg 1R) | Bastad: 4-11 ('14, '19, '21-'22 2R)
> Broke into Top 200 in 2015, achieved career-high No. 105 in 2018 and ended 5 straight seasons as No. 1 Swede before being passed by little brother Mikael (2014-18).
> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF at 2016 Gstaad and 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 Pune as Q.
> Made history as a teenager in 2015, becoming 2nd man on record to qualify for all 4 Grand Slam events in a calendar year (also Dancevic in 2011).
> Captured 2016 Stockholm doubles title in team debut w/M. Ymer as 954th-ranked WC (d. Pavic/Venus 6-1 6-1).
> Has 197-162 career record on ATP Challenger Tour with 6 titles (127-87 on clay with 3 titles, 70-72 on hard with 3 titles).
> Achieved career-high No. 5 in junior rankings, highlighted by run to 2012 Orange Bowl final (l. to Djere).

NOTE: E. Ymer leads the 2025 field in most Bastad appearances (12), advancing to 2R 4 times. He aims to record first tour-level win outside Davis Cup since advancing to 2023 Stockholm quarterfinals (l. to Kecmanovic).

Tristan Boyer | Age: 24 | World No. 126 | Career-High No. 109 | 2025: 2-4 (2 times in 2R) | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Unranked in March 2023, broke inside Top 500 in 2023, Top 200 in April 2024 and achieved career-high No. 109 in February 2025 after advancing to Australian Open 2R.
 > Defeated former-World No. 29 Eubanks to qualify for 2025 Australian Open and beat No. 96 Coria in 1R for first tour-level win of career, before defeating No. 64 Vukic in 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells 1R as WC.
 > Earned 44 wins on Challenger level in 2024, equaling Kim in 2004 for most Challenger match wins by an American in a season and became 1st American to earn 3 clay titles in a season, winning in Merida, Campinas and Montevideo.
 > Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings in 2018, highlighted by runs to 3R at Roland Garros (l. to Seyboth Wild) and Wimbledon (l. to Draper).
 > Played college tennis at Stanford University in 2021 and helped win their first Pac-12 championship since 2003.

NOTE: Boyer is playing in his 2nd ATP Tour event on clay and seeks first tour-level win on the surface. He earned 2nd-most wins on Challenger level last year (44, 1st Ugo Carabelli - 49), including 27 on clay and bids to be 1st American to earn a match win at the event since Russell in 2001.

Mikael Ymer | Age: 26 | World No. 618 | Career-High No. 50 | 2025: 0-1 (Davis Cup) | Bastad: 2-4 (2018-19 2R)
 > Broke into Top 100 and competed at Next Gen ATP Finals in 2019 and achieved career-high No. 50 in April 2023 to be 1st Swede in Top 50 since Soderling in 2012.
 > Defeated future World No. 1 Alcaraz at 2021 Winston-Salem to become 1st Swedish singles finalist since Soderling ended career as 2011 Bastad champion.
 > Posted 26-10 record in matches across all levels from 13 September 2022 - 4 February 2023, highlighted by biggest win of career over No. 11 Sinner in Davis Cup Finals group stage.
 > Captured 2016 Stockholm doubles title with older brother Elias as unranked WC, defeating Pavic/Venus 6-1 6-1 in final.
 > Peaked at No. 3 and went 98-33 in juniors with run to 2015 Wimbledon final and wins over future Top-10 ATP players Auger-Aliassime, Hurkacz, Ruud and Shapovalov.

NOTE: M. Ymer returns to Bastad for the first time since 2021 and is playing in his first tour-level match outside Davis Cup since reaching 2023 Wimbledon 3R (d. No. 9 Fritz in 2R for latest Top 100 win; l. to Galan in 3R).

Botic van de Zandschulp | Age: 29 | World No. 100 | Career-High No. 22 | 2025: 5-11 (IW 3R) | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Achieved new career-high ranking 14 times in 2022, peaking at No. 22 in August and ending 2nd straight season as No. 1 Dutchman.
 > At 2021 US Open, became 3rd men's qualifier to reach US Open QF in Open Era, 1st Dutchman to reach Grand Slam QF since 2004, and only player to take a set off eventual champion Medvedev.
 > Earned personal-best 38 wins in 2022, including victories over Norrie, Fritz and Bublik to help Netherlands qualify for Davis Cup Finals knock-out stage.
 > In 2024, posted upsets over No. 3 Alcaraz in US Open 2R for biggest win of career and Nadal in Davis Cup Finals to end former World No. 1's career and help Netherlands advance to 1st Davis Cup final in history (since 1900).
 > In Munich, upset No. 7 Ruud en route to 1st ATP Tour final in 2022 and No. 10 Fritz to reach 2nd final in 2023, before squandering 4 championship points in 2023 final and losing to Rune on both occasions.
 > Went 11-1 in Grand Slam qualifying matches in 2021, qualifying at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open, while entering Wimbledon as LL (l. to Tringelliti in Q3).

NOTE: van de Zandschulp looks for 2nd ATP Tour win on clay this season after defeating Bautista Agut in Munich 1R. By joining de Jong and Griekspoor in 2R, it would mark the first time three Dutchmen are in 2R of same ATP Tour event since 2023 Rotterdam (Brouwer, Griekspoor, van de Zandschulp) and first time on clay since 2007 Amersfoort.

[Q] Filip Misolic (AUT) vs Elmer Moller (DEN)

First Meeting

Filip Misolic | Age: 23 | World No. 105 (Career-High) | 2025: 5-3 (Bucharest QF) | Bastad: 2-1 (2023 QF)

- > Broke into Top 200 in July 2022 and achieved career-high No. 105 in July 2025 after earning biggest win of career over No. 31 Shapovalov to advance to 1st Grand Slam 3R at Roland Garros.
- > Advanced to 2022 Kitzbuhel final in his ATP Tour debut as a 20-year-old WC ranked 205th.
- > Also reached ATP Tour QFs at 2023 Bastad and 2025 Bucharest and qualified for Grand Slam main draws at 2024 Roland Garros (d. Virtanen), 2025 Roland Garros (d. Bu, Shapovalov) and 2025 Wimbledon.
- > Qualified and posted 7 wins en route to 1st Challenger SF, final and title at 2022 Zagreb and did not drop a set en route to 3rd title at 2025 Prague.
- > Owns 6-1 record in ITF World Tennis Tour finals, most recently winning 2022 Porec title.
- > Peaked at No. 63 on ITF Junior Circuit with 81-56 record, but never played at a Grand Slam event in juniors.

NOTE: Misolic is making his 2nd appearance in Bastad after also qualifying in 2023 and reaching his 2nd ATP Tour QF (l. to Musetti). He earned 13 of his 14 tour-level wins of career on clay (13-8 on the surface, 14-12 overall).

Elmer Moller | Age: 22 | World No. 102 (Career-High) | 2025: 1-4 (3 times in 1R) | Bastad: 0-0 (Debut)

- > Earned 1st ranking point in 2019, broke into Top 500 in 2023, Top 200 in October 2024 and achieved career-high No. 102 in July 2025 after winning his 3rd Challenger title in Iasi.
- > Made tour-level debut at 2022 Davis Cup vs. El Salvador and earned all 5 tour-level wins playing for Denmark.
- > Also in Davis Cup, came back from 1-6 first set loss to defeat No. 27 Bublik for biggest win of career in 2024 and to defeat No. 94 Medjedovic in crucial final tie vs. Serbia in 2025.
- > Owns 52-30 Challenger record (3-4 in finals), earning titles at 2024 Braga as Q, 2025 Oeiras-4, and 2025 Iasi, and 76-40 on ITF World Tennis Tour (6-3 in finals), winning most recent title in his hometown at 2024 M25 Aarhus.
- > Peaked at No. 21 in junior rankings in 2021, won 6 boys' singles titles and played in main draws of 2020 Roland Garros (l. to Fils), 2021 Roland Garros and 2021 US Open.

NOTE: Moller made his ATP Tour debut at ATP Masters 1000 Madrid in April and now looks for first ATP Tour win, having won all 5 previous tour-level matches in Davis Cup (5-3). Last week, he captured his 3rd Challenger title in Iasi, and bids to be 6th Dane to win a match in Bastad in Open Era.
