NITTO ATP FINALS TALKING POINTS

- Familiar foes **Stefanos Tsitsipas** and **Andrey Rublev** face off Friday for a spot in the Nitto ATP Finals semi-finals. Their rivalry dates back to the juniors in 2014, resumed on the ATP Challenger Tour in 2017 and began on the ATP Tour with a fifth-set tiebreak at the 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals. Altogether, Tsitsipas leads Rublev 7-6.
- Tsitsipas, 24, and Rublev, 25, are meeting in group play at the Nitto ATP Finals for the third consecutive year. One year after winning the Nitto ATP Finals title, Tsitsipas edged Rublev in a third-set tiebreak at The O2 in 2020. Rublev defeated Tsitsipas 6-4 6-4 at the Pala Alpitour in 2021 before the Greek withdrew due to an elbow injury.
- A major milestone is on the line for Tsitsipas. If he defeats Rublev and **Casper Ruud** to reach the Nitto ATP Finals championship match, Tsitsipas will break into the Top 2 for the first time and end the year as World No. 2. Rublev has a chance to equal his career-high and end the year as World No. 5 if he extends his stay in Turin.
- Tsitsipas leads the ATP Tour with 11 tour-level semi-finals this season, while Rublev is tied for second with nine. The former World No. 1 juniors are also among the Top-5 win leaders this season, since 2020 and since 2018.

- With wins over Tsitsipas and Rublev, **Novak Djokovic** has clinched the Red Group and a semi-final berth. Yet, he has plenty to play for when he faces 2020 champion **Daniil Medvedev**. Djokovic is the only player who can earn an ATP Tour-record \$4,740,300 as undefeated champion. The five-time champion is also 4-0 in sets this week with the chance of becoming the third player in history to win the Nitto ATP Finals title without dropping a set.

Nitto ATP Finals Stats

- Unable to qualify for SFs after narrow losses to Rublev 6-7(7) 6-3 7-6(7) and Tsitsipas 6-3 6-7(11) 7-6(1).
- Captured 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title with 5-0 record and wins over No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem.
- First and only player in 53-year Nitto ATP Finals tournament history to defeat World No. 1, No. 2 and No. 3.
- Five victories at 2020 Nitto ATP Finals were part of career-long 20 match win streak overall (12 vs. Top 10).
- Last year in Turin, defeated A. Zverev in round-robin match before losing to him in championship match.
- Loss to A. Zverev snapped 9-match win streak at Nitto ATP Finals (8 vs. Top 10).
- Went 0-3 in 1st appearance at Nitto ATP Finals in 2019 (l. to Tsitsipas, Nadal and A. Zverev).
- In 2020, became 1st player in tournament history to go undefeated one year after going winless in his debut.

Career Highlights

- Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in February 2004.
- Four-time Grand Slam finalist denied No. 1 Djokovic of calendar Grand Slam by defeating him for 2021 US Open title.
- Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).
- Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.
- Won 14 of his 15 singles titles on hard courts (7 outdoor, 7 indoor), including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris and 2021 Toronto.

Nitto ATP Finals Stats

- Will play in his 11th Nitto ATP Finals SF (7-3) against winner of Thursday night's Auger-Aliassime vs. Fritz match.
- Defeated Tsitsipas 6-4 7-6(4) on Monday and Rublev 6-4 6-1 on Wednesday to qualify for SF.
- Broke tie with Sampras for 3rd-most Nitto ATP Finals SF appearances behind Federer (16) and Lendl (12).
- Will earn ATP Tour-record \$4,740,300 if he wins 2022 Nitto ATP Finals title as an undefeated champion.
- Owns 14-1 record in 1st match, 8-7 record in 2nd match and 10-4 record in 3rd match at Nitto ATP Finals.

- Earned 15 straight Nitto ATP Finals wins from 2012-15, excluding walkover from Federer in 2014 final.
- Won his 1st 5 Nitto ATP Finals title matches before falling to Murray in 2016 final and A. Zverev in 2018 final.
- Making 6th Nitto ATP Finals appearance since 5th and most recent year-end title at 2015 London (d. Federer).
- Qualified and competed at 15 of last 16 editions, only missing 2017 tournament when he ended year at No. 12.

Career Highlights

- Five-time Nitto ATP Finals champion owns Pepperstone ATP Rankings records for most weeks at No. 1 (373), most years ended at No. 1 (7) and most wins vs. Top 10 (237).
- One of 3 men to hold all 4 Grand Slam championships at same time (also Budge, Laver), boasting 2nd-most Grand Slam titles in history (21) and 5th-most tour-level titles in Open Era (90).
- Only player to win all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events, doing so multiple times for a record total of 38 titles.
- Defeated Ruud in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Rome SF to become 5th player in Open Era with 1,000 wins (also Connors, Lendl, Federer, Nadal).

- Will meet Ruud in his 2nd Nitto ATP Finals SF on Saturday if he defeats Rublev on Friday.
- Bounced back from 6-4 7-6(4) loss to Djokovic on Monday by beating Medvedev 6-3 6-7(11) 7-6(1) on Wednesday.
- Defeated defending champion A. Zverev and 6-time champion Federer en route to 2019 Nitto ATP Finals title.
- At age 21, became youngest Nitto ATP Finals champion since Hewitt, 20, in 2001 and 6th-youngest in history.
- Also became 2nd debutant to win Nitto ATP Finals title since Corretja in 1998 and 7th in history.
- Made history for his country as 1st Greek to compete at Nitto ATP Finals in either singles or doubles.
- Went 1-2 at 2020 Nitto ATP Finals (d. Rublev). Withdrew following 1 match in 2021 due to elbow injury (l. to Rublev).
- One of 3 former champions in this week's field – all of whom are in Red Group (also Djokovic, Medvedev).
- Only player in this week's field to win Intesa Sanpaolo Next Gen ATP Finals title (d. de Minaur in 2018).
- #NextGenATP alumni have won last 4 Nitto ATP Finals titles (2018 & 2021 Zverev, 2019 Tsitsipas, 2020 Medvedev).

Career Highlights

- Top-ranked Greek of all time achieved career-high No. 3 in August 2021 and boasts 10 wins vs. Top-3 opponents (2 vs. No. 1, 3 vs. No. 2, 5 vs. No. 3).
- Became 1st Greek Grand Slam finalist at 2021 Roland Garros and also reached SFs at Roland Garros in 2020 and Australian Open in 2019, 2021 and 2022.

Wesley Koolhof Career Highlights
