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BMW OPEN BY BITPANDA TALKING POINTS

- This year's **BMW Open by Bitpanda** is headlined by World No. 3 **Alexander Zverev**, who is making his 12th consecutive appearance at **MTTC Iphitos**. Three-time champion, winning in 2017-18 and on his 28th birthday last year, he is tied with countryman Kohlschreiber for most Munich titles in Open Era. German No. 1, who turns 29 next Monday, now seeks 25th tour-level title, first since Munich last year and first final of the season.
- No. 2 seed **Ben Shelton** advanced to his biggest clay court final in Munich last year after saving 3 MPs in his first-round match against Gojo. No. 3 seed **Alexander Bublik** is on a 14-2 run on clay since Roland Garros, including run to both of his ATP Tour titles on the surface, winning back-to-back in Gstaad and Kitzbuhel, and is looking for his first match win at the event after losing to Bergs in the first round as a qualifier.
- No. 5 seed **Francisco Cerundolo** and **Jan-Lennard Struff** meet again in the first round after Cerundolo defeated then-defending champion Struff at this stage last year. Struff, who advanced to his first ATP Tour final at this venue in 2021 and won 1st title in 2024, has appeared in 14 of the last 15 editions (including qualifying). Cerundolo won his 4th ATP Tour title in Buenos Aires in February and is seeking the biggest title of his career.
- Former finalists **Botic van de Zandschulp** and **Marin Cilic** are also featured in this year's field. Dutch No. 2 van de Zandschulp reached back-to-back finals in 2022-23, losing to Rune on both occasions. Cilic reached the final in 2010 and 2012, is the oldest player in the draw at 37 years and seeks to surpass Tommy Haas (35 in 2013) as the oldest champion in tournament history.

- > Broke into Top 50 in 2022 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at Adelaide-2 and achieved career-high No. 26 in January 2026 soon after advancing to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final in Shanghai, losing to his cousin Vacherot in final.
- > Earned 1st Top 10 win in 15th attempt over No. 10 Shelton in 2025 Queen's Club 1R as LL before biggest wins of career over No. 3 Zverev in 2025 Wimbledon 1R and en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at 2025 Shanghai.
- > Playing on indoor hard courts in fall 2022, saved 1 MP vs. No. 17 Schwartzman in Tel Aviv 2R, 9 MPs vs. No. 15 Carreno Busta in Gijon QF and 2 MPs vs. No. 16 Cilic in Basel 1R.
- > In 2021, advanced to Kitzbuhel SF, reached 6 other ATP Tour QFs, and earned 1st 18 tour-level wins of career.
- > Captured Challenger titles at 2020 Rennes, 2020 Calgary, 2021 Istanbul as Q, 2022 Poznan, 2023 Zug and 2024 Lille.
- > Five-time All-American at Texas A&M University (3 singles, 2 doubles), where he graduated from Mays Business School in 2018.

NOTE: Rinderknech looks for his third clay win of the season after defeating No. 60 Cilic in Davis Cup and No. 14 Khachanov to reach ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo 2R last week. He also aims to record 4 tour-level wins vs. an opponent for the first time in career (3-0 vs. Michelsen, 3-1 vs. Cobolli, Hanfmann).

Alex Michelsen | Age: 21 | World No. 36 | Career-High No. 30 | 2026: 13-8 (Brisbane SF) | Munich: 1-1 (2024 2R)
> Broke inside Top 50 in August 2024 and achieved career-high No. 30 in July 2025 after defeating former finalist Tsitsipas en route to 1st Grand Slam 4R at Australian Open earlier in the season.
> Earned 1st ATP Tour win and reached 1st QF, SF and final at 2023 Newport, becoming youngest American ATP Tour finalist since Fritz at 2016 Memphis.
> Also advanced to ATP Tour finals at 2024 Newport, where he held 1 MP vs. Giron, and 2024 Winston-Salem.
> Defeated No. 9 de Minaur for 1st Top 10 win at 2024 Los Cabos, No. 10 Musetti en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2025 Toronto and former champion No. 7 Fritz to reach 2026 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells 4R.
> Reached ATP Masters 1000 doubles finals at 2024 Cincinnati w/McDonald after defeating him in qualifying and 2025 Shanghai w/Goransson.

NOTE: Michelsen is 7-1 in opening round matches this year, lone loss to Khachanov at Australian Open. 21-year-old seeks 2nd Top 30 win on clay (1-2) after defeating No. 12 Fritz en route to 1st ATP Tour QF on clay at 2024 Geneva.

Jan-Lennard Struff | Age: 35 | World No. 81 | Career-High No. 21 | 2026: 2-6 (Rotterdam 2R) | Munich: 16-9 ('24 Title)
> Achieved career-high No. 21 in June 2023 after advancing to 3rd ATP Tour final at 2023 Stuttgart.
> Entered 2023 Madrid as LL, defeating No. 5 Tsitsipas in QF and Karatsev in SF, after losing to him in qualifying, to become 1st lucky loser to reach an ATP Masters 1000 final in series history (since 1990).
> On home soil, advanced to 1st ATP Tour singles final at 2021 Munich, earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Medvedev in 2021 Halle 1R and became 3rd oldest first-time ATP Tour champion at 2024 Munich.
> Posted personal-best 35 victories in 2019, highlighted by 1st Grand Slam 4R appearance at Roland Garros.
> In 2018, became 1st player in Open Era to rally from 2 sets down in Wimbledon 1R and 2R (d. L. Mayer and Karlovic).
> Lost in qualifying at 20 tour-level events before qualifying for 1st time at 2013 Roland Garros and earning 1st tour-level win at 2013 Wimbledon as Q (d. Kavcic).

NOTE: Struff won lone ATP Tour title at this venue in 2024 and is one of two former champions in the draw alongside Zverev (2017-18, 2025). He is seeking first win since defeating Grenier in Rotterdam 1R in February and his first Top 20 win on clay since defeating No. 17 Bublik at 2024 Roland Garros (15-24 overall).

> Broke into Top 100 and Top 50 in 2022, Top 20 in 2024 and achieved career-high No. 18 in May 2025 after defeating two-time champion No. 2 Zverev en route to ATP Masters 1000 Madrid SF.
> Moved into Top 25 in July 2022 after defeating No. 5 Ruud en route to 1st ATP Tour title in Bastad and No. 8 Rublev en route to Hamburg SF in back-to-back weeks.
> Won 2nd title at 2023 Eastbourne to be 1st Argentine ATP Tour champion on grass since Frana in 1995.
> As World No. 103 at 2022 Miami, became lowest-ranked semi-finalist in 37-year tournament history and 1st player to reach SF in his ATP Masters 1000 main draw debut since Janowicz at 2012 Paris.

> Father, Alejandro, also played pro tennis; younger brother, Juan Manuel, won 2021 Cordoba title; sister, Constanza, played for Argentine field hockey team that won gold medal at 2018 Youth Olympics.

NOTE: Cerundolo is 10-1 in his opening-round matches since October with a sole loss to Munar at Adelaide in January. South American No. 1 is 12-6 vs. Germans on tour-level after 12-1 start (4 of last 5 losses vs. Zverev).

Emilio Nava | Age: 24 | World No. 112 | Career-High No. 74 | 2026: 4-8 (Santiago QF) | Munich: 0-0 (Debut)

> Former World No. 5 junior broke into Top 200 in August 2022 and Top 100 in September 2025 and achieved career-high No. 74 in March 2026 soon after run to Santiago QF.

> Qualified at 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Miami and 2022 Winston-Salem, before earning 1st tour-level win at 2022 US Open over Millman and defeating No. 46 Isner for lone Top 50 win at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Miami.

> Did not drop a set en route to 1st Challenger SF, final and title at 2022 Shymkent-1 and 2nd at 2023 Modena.

> In 2025, went on a 19-0 run at Challenger level, picking up titles in Asuncion, Concepcion and Sarasota before losing in Tallahassee final to Rodesch and tied Draxl for most Challenger wins (44).

> Two-time Grand Slam boys' singles runner-up and two-time Grand Slam boys' doubles runner-up, finishing junior career as 2019 US Open boys' singles finalist.

> Also advanced to 2019 Aus. Open boys' singles final, squandering 1 MP vs. Musetti and falling 4-6 6-2 7-6(12).

NOTE: Nava is 0-6 vs. Top 10, seeking the biggest win of his career (1-14 vs. Top 50, d. No. 46 Isner at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Miami). He aims to break a 4-match tour-level losing streak since advancing to his 2nd ATP Tour QF in Santiago earlier this year.

Ben Shelton | Age: 23 | World No. 6 | Career-High No. 5 | 2026: 12-5 (Dallas Title) | Munich: 4-1 (2025 Final)

> Broke into Top 200 in August 2022, Top 100 in November 2022 and Top 20 in September 2023, achieving career-high No. 5 in November 2025 before making his Nitto ATP Finals debut.

> Defeated countrymen Paul and Tiafoe en route to 2023 US Open SF, becoming youngest American man in US Open SF since Chang, 20, in 1992 and beat No. 4 Sinner for 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Shanghai.

> At 2025 Toronto, became youngest American ATP Masters 1000 champion since Roddick, 21, at 2004 Miami.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2023 Tokyo, joining Bryan Shelton as 4th father-son duo to win a tour-level championship in Open Era (Phil & Taylor Dent, Ramanathan & Ramesh Krishnan, Petr & Sebastian Korda).

> Advanced to 2023 Australian Open QF at age 20 and on his 1st trip outside USA, becoming youngest American man in Aus. Open QF since Giampalva Jr., 19, in 1982, and in Grand Slam QF since Roddick, 20, at 2002 US Open.

> Posted 65-10 singles record in 2 seasons for University of Florida, clinching 2021 NCAA team title and 2022 NCAA singles title while being coached by his father Bryan, a former World No. 55.

NOTE: Shelton is making his 2nd appearance in Munich after run to last year's final, becoming the first American man to reach an ATP Tour clay court final above ATP 250 level since Agassi at 2002 ATP Masters 1000 Rome. He is 20-1 vs. players outside Top 100 since 2024 Wimbledon, losing to No. 182 Wong at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Miami.

Alexander Blockx | Age: 21 | World No. 71 (Career-High) | 2026: 3-2 (Monte-Carlo 3R) | Munich: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 100 in March 2026 and achieved career-high No. 71 in April 2026 after defeating No. 16 Cobolli on his 21st birthday to reach ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo 3R.
 > Made his ATP Tour debut at 2023 Antwerp as Q and defeated No. 61 Giron for 1st ATP Tour win of career at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati as Q.
 > Qualified for 2025 Next Gen ATP Finals and advanced to the final, losing to Tien in a rematch of 2023 Australian Open boys' singles final and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2026 Australian Open as LL.
 > Owns 72-38 Challenger record (4-2 in finals), winning titles at 2024 Kobe, 2025 Oeiras-3, 2025 Bratislava-2 and latest at 2026 Canberra, defeating fellow NextGen players Budkov Kjaer and Jodar.
 > Went 108-48 in ITF juniors, highlighted by winning 2023 Australian Open boys' singles, defeating Tien in the championship match, becoming 1st Belgian junior Grand Slam champion since Coppejans at 2012 Roland Garros.
 > Also reached boys' doubles final at 2023 Australian Open partnering Fonseca (l. to Tien/Williams).
