Federico Coria (ARG) vs [7] Pedro Martinez (ESP)

First Tour-Level Meeting

Federico Coria | Age: 30 | World No. 73 | Career-High No. 52 | 2022: 14-15 (Marrakech SF) | Kitzbuhel: 1-0 ('22 2R)
> Achieved career-high No. 52 after advancing to 3rd ATP Tour SF of career at 2022 Marrakech.
> Earned personal-best 16 wins in 2021, highlighted by 1st final at Bastad and 1st SF at Cordoba.
> Qualified and saved 2 MPs vs. Moutet en route to 1st QF at 2020 Rio de Janeiro.
> Captured Challenger titles at 2019 Savannah, 2021 Prostějov, 2021 Brasilia and 2022 Milan.
> Says that his idol is Guillermo Coria, his older brother by 10 years who peaked at No. 3 in 2004.

NOTE: Coria defeated 2021 Santiago champion Garin in 1R to set showdown with 2022 Santiago champion Martinez.

Pedro Martinez | Age: 25 | World No. 49 | Career-High No. 40 | 2022: 17-17 (Santiago Title) | Kitzbuhel: 5-1 (2021 F)
> Achieved career-high No. 40 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Santiago and reaching 1st ATP Masters 1000 3R at 2022 Miami.
> Defeated No. 16 Bautista Agut at 2021 Kitzbuhel for biggest win of career and en route to 1st SF and final.
> Led all players by qualifying for 6 tour-level events in 2020, including Australian Open, Rio de Janeiro, Rome and Roland Garros.
> Also in 2020, earned 1st tour-level win at Australian Open (d. Koepfer), posted 1st ATP Masters 1000 win at Rome (d. Querrey) and advanced to 1st Grand Slam 3R at Roland Garros.
> Reached 5 of 6 career Challenger finals on home clay in Spain, highlighted by 2020 Marbella and 2021 Seville titles.

NOTE: Martinez is 1 of 6 Spaniards in Top 50 and 1 of 11 Spaniards in Top 100 of Pepperstone ATP Rankings.

[3] Roberto Bautista Agut (ESP) vs [WC] Jurij Rodionov (AUT)

First Meeting

Roberto Bautista Agut | Age: 34 | World No. 20 | Career-High No. 9 | '22: 23-11 (Doha Title) | Kitzbuhel: 0-1 ('21 2R)
> Captured 10 ATP Tour titles, achieved career-high No. 9 in 2019 and earned 300th win in 2020 (d. Sandgren in US Open 1R).
> Reached 1st Grand Slam SF at 2019 Wimbledon and 1st Grand Slam QF at 2019 Australian Open after entering season with 0-9 record in Grand Slam 4R.
> Defeated No. 1 Djokovic in 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai SF, 2019 Doha SF and 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R, as well as No. 1 Medvedev in 2022 Mallorca QF.
> Went 4-1 at 2022 ATP Cup and 6-0 at 2020 ATP Cup to lead Spain to finals after helping Spain win 2019 Davis Cup.
> Played football for Villarreal C.F. until he was 14 years old.

NOTE: Bautista Agut hopes to avoid 3rd straight 2R loss after 1R bye (l. to Thiem at Bastad, l. to Varillas at Gstaad).

Jurij Rodionov | Age: 23 | World No. 145 | Career-High No. 124 | 2022: 2-3 (Twice in 2R) | Kitzbuhel: 1-2 (2022 2R)
> Earned 1st ranking point at age 16 in November 2015, broke into Top 200 in January 2019 and achieved career-high No. 124 in May 2022.
> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2021 Stuttgart as WC.
> Qualified, saved 1 MP and rallied from 2 sets down vs. Chardy at 2020 Roland Garros for 1st tour-level win.
> Owns 5-1 record in Challenger finals, including titles in 2022 at Biel and Mauthausen.
> Peaked at No. 7 in juniors, highlighted by run to 2017 Wimbledon boys' singles QF and boys' doubles final w/Vrbensky.

NOTE: Rodionov seeks 2nd ATP Tour QF and 2nd-biggest win of career (d. No. 12 Shapovalov in 2020 Vienna 1R).

Pablo Andujar (ESP) vs [WC] Filip Misolic (AUT)

First Meeting

Pablo Andujar | Age: 36 | World No. 98 | Career-High No. 32 | 2022: 8-11 (1 QF) | Kitzbuhel: 6-4 (2011, 2019 QFs)
> Achieved career-high No. 32 in 2015 and broke back into Top 100 in 2018 following 3 right elbow surgeries.
> Owns 4-5 record in ATP Tour finals with all 9 finals on clay and 3 of 4 titles in Morocco.
> Won most recent title at 2018 Marrakech as No. 355, becoming 2nd-lowest-ranked champion since ATP Tour was established in 1990 (No. 550 Hewitt at 1998 Adelaide).
> At 2021 Roland Garros, earned biggest singles win of career vs. No. 4 Thiem and reached doubles SF w/Martinez.
> Defeated future No. 5 Ruud en route to 11th and most recent Challenger title at 2019 Prostějov.

NOTE: Andujar snapped 6-match tour-level losing streak by defeating No. 9 seed Sonogo 6-4 3-6 7-6(4) on Tuesday.

Filip Misolic | Age: 20 | World No. 205 | Career-High No. 194 | 2022: 1-0 (Kitzbuhel 2R) | Kitzbuhel: 1-0 (2022 2R)
> Broke into Top 200 and achieved career-high No. 194 at age 20 in July 2022.
> Defeated lucky loser Dutra da Silva in ATP Tour main draw debut at 2022 Kitzbuhel as WC.
> Qualified and posted 7 wins en route to 1st Challenger SF, final and title at 2022 Zagreb.
> Owns 6-1 record in ITF World Tennis Tour finals, most recently winning 2022 Porec title.
> Peaked at No. 63 on ITF Junior Circuit with 81-56 record, but never played at a Grand Slam event in juniors.

NOTE: Misolic shares his 8 August birthday with 40-year-old Federer and 21-year-old Auger-Aliassime.

[Q] Sebastian Ofner (AUT) vs [PR] Dominic Thiem (AUT)

Sebastian Ofner | Age: 26 | World No. 235 | Career-High No. 126 | 2022: 1-1 (Kitzbuhel 2R) | Kitzbuhel: 6-4 ('17 SF)
> Broke into Top 200 in July 2017 and achieved career-high No. 126 in May 2019.
> Advanced to 2017 Wimbledon 3R in Grand Slam qualifying debut, highlighted by 5-set win over No. 18 Sock.
> Failed to qualify in his next 15 tries at Grand Slams before qualifying at 2022 Roland Garros.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour QF and SF on home soil at 2017 Kitzbuhel as WC.
> Owns 91-87 Challenger record (3-4 in finals), winning titles at 2018 Astana, 2019 Puerto Vallarta & 2022 Prague-1.

NOTE: Ofner is 2-1 vs. Austrians in tour-level matches and seeking 2nd ATP Tour QF of career (also 2017 Kitzbuhel).

Dominic Thiem | Age: 28 | World No. 199 | Career-High No. 3 | 2022: 6-8 (Gstaad SF) | Kitzbuhel: 13-7 (2019 Title)
> Achieved career-high No. 3 in March 2020 and remained in Top 5 until suffering right wrist tear in June 2021.
> Playing in his 4th Grand Slam final, defeated A. Zverev in 5th-set TB to win 2020 US Open title, becoming 1st player to win US Open final from 2 sets down since Gonzales in 1949.
> Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals each year from 2016-20, defeating No. 3 Federer and No. 2 Djokovic en route to 2019 championship match, then beating No. 2 Nadal and No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2020 final.
> Playing in his 3rd ATP Masters 1000 final, defeated 5-time champion Federer to win 2019 Indian Wells title.
> Went 9-3 from 2019-20 against Djokovic, Nadal and Federer, joining Murray as 1 of 2 players with at least 5 career wins over each member of Big 3.

NOTE: Thiem is 7-2 vs. Austrians in tour-level matches, including his 1st ATP Tour win (d. Muster at 2011 Vienna).
