BARCELONA OPEN BANC SABADELL TALKING POINTS

- The **Barcelona Open Banc Sabadell** is the fourth ATP Tour 500 event of the 2022 season and only in the European clay season that leads up to Roland Garros. This year's field includes one previous winner (**Tommy Robredo**-2004) and two other previous finalists (**Stefanos Tsitsipas**-2018, 2021, **Pablo Andujar**-2015).
- **Rafael Nadal**, 12-time Barcelona Open Banc Sabadell champion and current defending champion has been forced to pull out of the event due to injury.
- Top seeded **Stefanos Tsitsipas** is coming fresh from defending his 1st ATP 1000 Masters Title in Monte Carlo. He is playing this event for the fourth time, reaching the final twice (2018, 2021) and losing to **Rafael Nadal** in both encounters.
- No. 2 seed **Casper Ruud** is enjoying a 19-match winning streak on ATP250 level on clay, but is still searching for his first title above that level. He is playing in the event for the first time since qualifying for the event back in 2017. No. 3 seed **Felix Auger-Aliassime** has taken a wildcard into the event and is hoping to improve his record on clay this year after starting the clay season with a 1-2 record in his first two clay tournaments of the season.
- **Tommy Robredo**, 2004 champion and 2006 finalist, has announced 2022 Barcelona as his last professional event. Robredo spent over 100 weeks in the Top 10 from 2006 to 2007 and reached 7 Grand Slam quarter-finals.
- ATP Masters 1000 Miami champion No. 5 seed **Carlos Alcaraz** is one of the 13 Spaniards entered in the draw. With Nadal's absence, he is the highest ranked home favorite in the field. He won the first clay ATP500 event of the season in Rio de Janeiro, beating the No. 6 seed in Barcelona, **Diego Schwartzman**, in the final.

Lorenzo Musetti | Age: 20 | World No. 66 | Career-High No. 56 | 2022: 9-9 (3 times in QF) | Event: 1-1 (2021 2R)
> Achieved career-high No. 56 in March 2022 after reaching back-to-back QFs at Pune and Rotterdam.
> In 2021, qualified for Intesa Sanpaolo Next Gen ATP Finals and reached Roland Garros 4R (l. to World No. 1 and eventual champion Djokovic after leading by 2 sets).
> Advanced to ATP Tour SFs at 2020 Sardinia as WC, 2021 Acapulco as Q and 2021 Lyon.
> Defeated Wawrinka and Nishikori to reach 2020 Rome 3R as 18-year-old Q-WC, becoming 1st player born in 2002 to win an ATP Tour match and youngest player in Rome 3R since Santoro, 18, in 1991.
> Became World No. 1 junior after winning 2019 Australian Open boys' singles title and reaching 2018 US Open boys' singles final.

NOTE: Musetti is 4-2 on clay this season, including a win over No. 9 Auger-Aliassime at ATP 1000 Masters Monte Carlo.

Sebastian Baez | Age: 21 | World No. 59 (Career-High) | 2022: 10-10 (Santiago Final) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)

> Broke into Top 300, 200 and 100 in 2021 before achieving career-high No. 59 in April 2022.
> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour final at 2022 Santiago after defeating No. 18 Garin for biggest win of career in 2022 Cordoba 2R.
> Made hard-court debut at 2021 Intesa Sanpaolo Next Gen ATP Finals, defeating Musetti and Gaston en route to SF.
> Posted 44-7 Challenger record in 2021 (6-3 in finals), tying 4 other players for 2nd-most Challenger titles in a single season behind Griekspoor (8 in 2021).
> Became World No. 1 junior in March 2018 and went on to reach Roland Garros boys' singles final and win boys' doubles gold medal at Buenos Aires Youth Olympics w/Diaz Acosta.

NOTE: Baez is 1-5 in event above ATP250 this season and is trying to break a 3-match tour-level losing streak.

[Q] Nicolas Alvarez Varona (ESP) vs Brandon Nakashima (USA) First Meeting

Nicolas Alvarez Varona | Age: 20 | World No. 285 | Career-High No. 283 | 2022: 0-0 (Marbella CH 2R) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)

> Achieved his career high ranking in April 2022 at No. 283 following a run to 2R of Marbella CH.
> He qualified for his tour-level event at 2022 Barcelona including a career best win over No. 126 Kohlschreiber.
> Earned his first ATP ranking point at 14 years of age in 2015, becoming the youngest player to do so at the time
> Holds an 11-17 record at ATP Challenger level, highlighted by a run to the final at 2021 Rio de Janeiro CH in December.

NOTE: This is Alvarez Varona's 4th time facing a Top100 player across all levels and is searching for his best career win and first tour-level win. Nakashima is the highest ranked opponent he's ever faced (played No. 85 Basic at 2018 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid).

Brandon Nakashima | Age: 20 | World No. 81 | Career-High No. 62 | 2022: 6-7 (2 times in QF) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)

> Former World No. 3 junior achieved career-high No. 62 after advancing to 2021 Intesa Sanpaolo Next Gen ATP Finals SF.
> Advanced to back-to-back ATP Tour finals at Los Cabos and Atlanta as a 19-year-old in 2021, becoming youngest American to reach multiple finals since Roddick in 2001-02.
> Reached 2020 Delray Beach QF as 18-year-old WC in ATP Tour debut.
> Owns 3-0 record in Challenger finals with titles at 2020 Orlando, 2021 Quimper-2 and 2021 Brest.
> Went 44-18 across all levels in 2019, beginning season on ITF World Tennis Tour, starring at University of Virginia, advancing to US Open boys' singles SF and ending year on ATP Challenger Tour.

NOTE: This is Nakashima's first tour-level match on clay and only 2nd off hardcourts (2021 Wimbledon; l. to No. 40 Fritz). He has a 26-21 (0.553) record in career tour-level matches.

[WC] Jaume Munar (ESP) vs Arthur Rinderknech (FRA)

Jaume Munar | Age: 24 | World No. 101 | Career-High No. 52 | 2022: 8-10 (Melbourne QF) | Event: 4-5 (2019 3R)
 > Former World No. 3 junior achieved new career-high ranking 7 times in 2019, peaking at No. 52.
 > Defeated countryman Alcaraz before falling to countryman Carreno Busta in 1st ATP Tour final at 2021 Marbella.
 > Qualified for 2018 Intesa Sanpaolo Next Gen ATP Finals, then upset World No. 3 A. Zverev for biggest win of career at 2019 Marrakech.
 > Went 19-7 in 2020 and 20-6 in 2021 at Challengers, highlighted by titles at 2020 Lisbon and 2021 Antalya-1.
 > Reached 2014 Roland Garros boys' singles final and won boys' doubles title in 2015 with countryman Lopez San Martin.

NOTE: Munar is 2-7 vs. higher-ranked opponents on tour-level this year (d. No. 16 Carreno Busta at ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells 2R).

Arthur Rinderknech | Age: 26 | World No. 58 | Career-High No. 48 | 2022: 11-8 (Adelaide-2 Final) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 50 at career-high No. 48 after advancing to 1st ATP Tour final at 2022 Adelaide-2.
 > In 2021, advanced to Kitzbuhel SF, reached 6 other ATP Tour QFs, and earned 1st 18 tour-level wins of career.
 > Defeated No. 12 Shapovalov in 2022 Doha QF for biggest win of career.
 > Captured Challenger titles at 2020 Rennes, 2020 Calgary and 2021 Istanbul as Q.
 > Five-time All-American at Texas A&M University (3 singles, 2 doubles), where he graduated from Mays Business School in 2018.

NOTE: Rinderknech is looking for his first tour-level win on clay since reaching the semi-final of 2021 Kitzbuhel in July (l. to No. 14 Ruud).

 > Broke into Top 200 in 2019 and achieved career-high No. 110 after winning 2021 Poznan Challenger title.
 > Qualified at 6 tour-level events in 2021: Montpellier, Dubai, Marbella, Barcelona, Roland Garros and Wimbledon.
 > Earned 1st ATP Tour win at 2018 Geneva as Q (d. F. Mayer) and 1st Grand Slam win at 2021 US Open as LL (d. Lopez).
 > Won 1st of 3 Challenger titles by defeating 17-year-old countryman Alcaraz in 2020 Cordenons final.
 > Defeated future ATP Masters 1000 champions Hurkacz and Tsitsipas en route to final of 2015 European Junior Championships.

NOTE: Zapata Miralles is hoping to break his 5-match losing streak on tour-level. 2021 Barcelona is the only tour-level in his career where he has recorded consecutive wins.

Tommy Robredo | Age: 39 | World No. 362 | Career-High No. 5 | 2022: 0-0 (Monterrey CH 2R) | Event: 27-16 (2004 Title)
 > Achieved career-high No. 5 on 28 August 2006 after reaching ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati SF. Ended 13 seasons in Top 50 (2001-10, 2013-15). Fell to No. 471 on 14 May 2012 following leg surgery. Returned to No. 14 on 31 March 2014. Dropped to No. 550 on 30 January 2017 following right elbow surgery. Broke back into Top 150 on 18 September 2017.
 > Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals in 2006 and went 1-2 (d. Blake, l. to Nadal and Davydenko).
 > Captured 11 of 12 singles titles on clay. Held 5 MPs and lost to Murray in both 2014 Shenzhen and 2014 Valencia finals. Earned 40+ victories in 6 seasons (2004-07, 2009, 2014). Enjoyed 500th win in 2014 Valencia SF (d. Chardy). Owns 2-7 record vs. World No. 1 with wins over Hewitt at 2003 Roland Garros and Djokovic at 2014 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati. Boasts 200+ wins on clay (261-132) and hard (230-185).
 > Reached 7 Grand Slam QFs. En route to 2013 Roland Garros QF, joined Cochet at 1927 Wimbledon as 2nd player to post 3 straight comebacks from 2 sets down (d. Sijsling, Monfils and Almagro). Advanced to 2000 Roland Garros boys' singles final. Won boys' doubles titles in 2000 at Australian Open w/Mahut and Roland Garros w/M. Lopez.

NOTE: Robredo, the winner here in 2004, made his debut in this event in 1999 and is making the 2022 Barcelona his last professional event. Searching for his first tour-level win since 2017 Roland Garros (d. No. 55 Evans in 1R).

Soonwoo Kwon | Age: 24 | World No. 71 | Career-High No. 52 | 2022: 9-9 (7 times in 2R) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)

- > Achieved career-high No. 52 after winning 1st ATP Tour title in 1st final at 2021 Nur-Sultan.
- > Defeated Ivashka for 1st ATP Tour QF win in 8th attempt to reach 2021 Eastbourne SF as LL.
- > Reached 2021 Roland Garros 3R after qualifying at Wimbledon and US Open in 2019.
- > Went 35-14 at Challengers in 2019 with titles at Yokohama and Seoul, then captured 3rd Challenger title at 2021 Biella-2.
- > Enjoys eating Kit Kat chocolate bars on court and going to the karaoke to sing with friends on off-days.

NOTE: Kwon is 7-2 in his opening rounds this season. He is seeking his 1st win on clay since reaching 3R of 2021 Roland Garros (l. to No. 9 Berrettini).

Benoit Paire | Age: 32 | World No. 61 | Career-High No. 18 | 2022: 2-10 (Aus. Open 3R) | Event: 12-10 (2016 SF)

- > Rose 99 spots during season to end 2015 at No. 19, then reached career-high No. 18 in January 2016.
- > In 2015, won 1st ATP Tour singles title (Bastad), 3 Challenger titles and 1 Futures title to become 1st player to sweep titles at all 3 levels since Darcis in 2007.
- > Earned personal-best 34 wins in 2019, adding 2 more ATP Tour titles at Marrakech and Lyon.
- > Advanced to Grand Slam 4R on 4 occasions, including at 2015 US Open after saving 2 MPs to defeat 2014 finalist Nishikori in 1R.
