### ROLEX PARIS MASTERS TALKING POINTS

- ATP Tour returns to **Rolex Paris Masters** in the final edition in **Accor Arena** with 3 former champions included in the draw: **Karen Khachanov** (2018), **Daniil Medvedev** (2020) and **Holger Rune** (2022), as they bid to join 7-time champion **Novak Djokovic** and 2-time champion **Marat Safin** as the only players to capture multiple Paris Bercy titles in this century. Last year's finalist **Grigor Dimitrov** is also in the field.
- World No. 1 **Jannik Sinner** leads the ATP Tour in wins (65) and titles (7) in 2024 and enters Paris on a 10-match winning streak in ATP Masters 1000 events after winning Cincinnati and Shanghai. He aims to become the 3rd player to win 3 consecutive ATP Masters 1000 tournaments in series history after **Novak Djokovic** (5 times) and **Rafael Nadal** (2 times) and 1st player to win 4 titles in a single season since Djokovic in 2016.

- No. 2 seed **Carlos Alcaraz** will be attempting to capture his 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title of the season this week after lifting the title in Indian Wells in March. The 21-year-old Spaniard attempts to become the 2nd Spanish champion in tournament history after **David Ferrer** in 2012 (d. Janowicz). He is 4-0 indoors this season after helping Spain qualify for the Davis Cup Finals and Team Europe to win the Laver Cup title.
- 2020 finalist and No. 3 seed **Alexander Zverev** is 23-7 in ATP Masters 1000 events this season, earning 2nd-most wins at this level in 2024 (behind Sinner - 28), highlighted by Rome title. If the German wins his opening round match (2R vs. Darderi or Griekspoor), he will be the fourth different man to reach Round of 16 at all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events in a season (Berdych - 2011, 2013, Djokovic - 2009, Nadal - 2009, 2017).
- Four vacant spots remain in the hunt to qualify for **Nitto ATP Finals** in November as No. 5 seed **Taylor Fritz**, No. 6 seed **Andrey Rublev** and No. 7 seed **Casper Ruud** seek strong performances to keep their provisional qualifying spots, while No. 8 seed **Grigor Dimitrov** and No. 9 **Alex de Minaur** are among contenders that could shake up the order with deep runs at the **Accor Arena**.
- No. 15 seed **Ugo Humbert** is the first Frenchman seeded at the event since **Gael Monfils** in 2021 (No. 15 in 2021). He leads 8 Frenchmen in the main draw, including 20-year-old **Arthur Fils**, who is No. 1 in PIF ATP Live Race to Jeddah and 21-year-old wildcard **Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard**, who comes to Paris on a 5-match winning streak after capturing biggest title of career in Basel on Sunday.
- Wildcard **Richard Gasquet** makes his 17th appearance in Paris, tied for most with Djokovic. The 38-year-old announced plans to retire after Roland Garros next year and the 2007 semi-finalist, who is the oldest player in the draw, opens against **Flavio Cobolli**. Gasquet owns the record for most wins (605) among Frenchmen in Open Era and is one of three active players to earn 600+ wins on ATP Tour (Djokovic – 1124, Nadal – 1080).

#### Tomas Machac (CZE) vs [WC] Arthur Rinderknech (FRA)

#### First Meeting

**Tomas Machac** | Age: 24 | World No. 25 (Career-High) | 2024: 33-22 (Geneva Final) | Paris: 0-0 (Debut)  
 > Former Top-20 junior broke into Top 100 in time for 2022 year-end rankings and achieved career-high No. 25 in October 2024 after defeating No. 2 Alcaraz to reach ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai SF (l. to No. 1 Sinner).  
 > Upset No. 6 Rublev en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2024 Miami and earned biggest win of career over No. 1 Djokovic to reach 1st ATP Tour final in 2024 Geneva.  
 > Representing Czech Republic, defeated Sousa to reach 2021 Tokyo Olympics 2R and earned wins over Zhang at 2024 Paris Olympics in men's singles 1R and mixed doubles final to win gold medal with Siniakova.  
 > Boasts 110-54 Challenger record (6-5 in finals), including back-to-back titles in Orleans and Mouilleron le Captif in October 2023.  
 > Says that his favourite sports team is Chicago Bulls and his hero is Michael Jordan, who played his last game as a Bull in 1998 – 2 years before Machac was born.

**NOTE:** Machac looks for 50th tour-level win of his career (49-39) and aims to be the first Czech to record a match win at the event since Berdych reached 2016 QF. He is 10-6 in ATP Masters 1000 events this season, highlighted by reaching Miami QF (l. to Sinner) and Shanghai SF (d. No. 2 Alcaraz in QF, l. to No. 1 Sinner).

**Arthur Rinderknech** | Age: 29 | World No. 60 | Career-High No. 42 | 2024: 19-21 (Atlanta SF) | Paris: 0-2 (2021-22 1R)  
 > Broke into Top 50 in January 2022 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at Adelaide-2, then became No. 1 Frenchman and achieved career-high No. 42 in October 2022.  
 > Playing on indoor hard courts in fall 2022, saved 1 MP vs. No. 17 Schwartzman in Tel Aviv 2R, 9 MPs vs. No. 15 Carreno Busta in Gijon QF and 2 MPs vs. No. 16 Cilic in Basel 1R.  
 > In 2021, advanced to Kitzbuhel SF, reached 6 other ATP Tour QFs, and earned 1st 18 tour-level wins of career.  
 > Captured Challenger titles at 2020 Rennes, 2020 Calgary, 2021 Istanbul as Q, 2022 Poznan, 2023 Zug and 2024 Lille.  
 > Five-time All-American at Texas A&M University (3 singles, 2 doubles), where he graduated from Mays Business School in 2018.

**NOTE:** Rinderknech is 1-7 vs. Top 30 players this season (d. No. 26 Tiafoe in Lyon 2R) and seeks first Top 30 win on hard courts since defeating No. 30 Cerundolo in 2023 United Cup RR. He aims to be the fourth Frenchman to record 20 tour-level wins this season and reach the milestone for the second time in career (22 in 2022).

#### [Q] Quentin Halys (FRA) vs Francisco Cerundolo (ARG)

#### First Meeting

**Quentin Halys** | Age: 28 | World No. 90 | Career-High No. 61 | 2024: 9-7 (Gstaad Final) | Paris: 0-1 (2022 1R)  
 > Former World No. 3 junior earned 1st ranking point at age 15 in 2012, entered Top 200 in 2015, broke into Top 100 in 2022 and achieved career-high No. 61 after reaching 1st ATP Tour QF at 2023 Auckland.  
 > As World No. 220, he qualified and advanced to 3R of 2024 Wimbledon, then came from qualifying to reach his 1st ATP Tour final in Gstaad the following week.  
 > Saved 3 MPs to earn 1st Top 20 win over No. 18 de Minaur en route to 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R before losing to eventual champion Medvedev.  
 > Posted 43-10 Challenger record in 2022 (3-4 in finals), winning titles at Pau, Lille and Ismaning.  
 > Defeated future World No. 3 Tsitsipas en route to 2nd of 7 career Challenger titles at 2018 Quimper.  
 > Went 129-46 in singles and 83-35 in doubles on ITF Junior Circuit, ending junior career with run to 2014 US Open boys' singles final after winning 2014 Roland Garros boys' doubles title with countryman Bonzi.

**NOTE:** Halys, who turned 28 on Saturday, earned wins over former-World No. 8 Norrie in Q1 and Buyunchaokete in Q2.
