CENTER COURT

Damir Dzumhur (BIH) vs Jacob Fearnley (GBR)

First Meeting

Damir Dzumhur | Age: 33 | World No. 58 | Career-High No. 23 | 2025: 20-26 (2 SFs) | Career: 149-171 (3 Titles)
> Broke into Top 100 in 2015 and Top 50 in 2017 before winning 3rd ATP Tour title at 2018 Antalya to achieve career-high No. 23.
> Earned personal-best 36 victories in 2017, highlighted by biggest wins of career over No. 3 Wawrinka at Dubai and No. 4 A. Zverev at Shenzhen.
> Advanced to Grand Slam 3R on 6 occasions, including at 2018 Roland Garros, where he led No. 3 A. Zverev by 2 sets to 1 and held 1 MP before losing.
> First player to sweep both Russian titles in a single season, capturing St. Petersburg and Moscow championships in 2017.
> Reached ATP Masters 1000 R16 on 3 occasions, including at 2016 Miami, where he defeated No. 5 Nadal in 2R.
> Went 6-0 in finals on ATP Challenger Tour in 2024, tying with 5 other players for 2nd-most Challenger titles in a single season behind Griekspoor (8 in 2021).

NOTE: Dzumhur seeks 150th tour-level win (149-171) to become 1st Bosnian man to achieve the feat. He is 14-2 after winning 1st set on tour-level this season and owns an unbeaten 4-0 career record vs. Brits on tour-level.

Jacob Fearnley | Age: 24 | World No. 73 | Career-High No. 49 | 2025: 16-20 (Queen's QF) | Career: 18-23 (1 QF)
> Unranked in July 2023, broke into Top 500 in June 2024, Top 200 in August 2024 and Top 100 in September 2024, before achieving career-high No. 49 in June 2025 after run to Roland Garros 3R.
> Made ATP Tour debut at 2024 Eastbourne as WC, defeated Moro Canas at 2024 Wimbledon for 1st tour-level win (l. to 7-time champion Djokovic in 2R) and advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF at 2025 London/Queen's Club.
> Posted 27-3 Challenger record in 2024 with titles in Nottingham 2, Lincoln, Rennes and Orleans, owning highest win percentage in a season at Challenger level since 2011 (min. 25 matches played).
> Peaked at No. 27 in junior rankings, highlighted by wins over future World No. 1s Alcaraz in 2018 Sanxenxo Grade 2 final by 6-2 4-6 7-6(12) and Sinner in 2017 Malta ITF U18 Grade 4 1R.
> Spent five-years playing college tennis for Texas Christian University, former team of countryman Norrie, becoming four-time ITA All-American and helped his team clinch the national championship in his final year.

NOTE: Fearnley earned 16 of 18 career tour-level wins this season, including run to 1st ATP Tour QF in London / Queen's Club in June. 24-year-old seeks third indoor tour-level win of 2025 after defeating No. 70 Nishikori in Davis Cup in January and No. 27 Griekspoor in Stockholm 1R in October.

Miomir Kecmanovic | Age: 26 | World No. 54 | Career-High No. 27 | 2025: 22-27 (Delray Beach Title) | Career: 167-175 (2 Titles)
> Broke into Top 40 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2020 Kitzbuhel and achieved career-high No. 27 in January 2023.

> Earned personal-best 38 wins in 2022, reaching Australian Open 4R, Roland Garros 3R and Wimbledon 3R.

> Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 QFs at 2019 Indian Wells as LL, 2022 Indian Wells and 2022 Miami, equaling biggest win of career in 2022 Indian Wells 4R vs. No. 6 Berrettini.

> Beat Ruud and Davidovich Fokina to reach 2019 Next Gen ATP Finals SF (l. to eventual champion Sinner) and saved 2 championship points to defeat Davidovich Fokina for 2nd ATP Tour title at 2025 Delray Beach.

> Defeated Tsitsipas in 3rd-set TB to win 2015 Orange Bowl junior title, then ended 2016 as World No. 1 junior ahead of No. 2 Tsitsipas.

NOTE: Kecmanovic earned 18 of 22 wins this season on hard courts, highlighted by Delray Beach title. He is No. 54 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#) after finishing the season as No. 54 in both 2023 and 2024 and could place inside Top 50 of Year-End PIF ATP Rankings for the third time (No. 44 in 2020, No. 29 in 2022) by reaching semi-finals this week.

Kamil Majchrzak | Age: 29 | World No. 68 | Career-High No. 61 | 2025: 15-12 (Marrakech SF) | Career: 46-54 (2 SFs)
> Former World No. 7 junior broke into Top 100 in July 2019 and achieved career-high No. 75 in February 2022.
> Advanced to ATP Tour SFs at 2022 Pune and 2025 Marrakech as Q, before defeating former finalist Berrettini en route to 2025 Wimbledon 4R and saved 5 MPs to defeat No. 10 Khachanov en route to 2025 US Open 3R.
> In 2019, qualified at Australian Open and Wimbledon before advancing to US Open 3R as LL with 5-set wins over Jarry and Cuevas.
> Owns 180-106 Challenger record (9-6 in finals), defeating future Top-20 players Carreno Busta and Cecchinato to reach 1st final at 2015 Mohammedia as Q.
> Ended junior career as 2014 Youth Olympics gold medallist, also capturing 2013 US Open boys' doubles title w/Ma. Redlicki and earning wins over future Top-10 ATP players Berrettini, Fritz, Hurkacz, Medvedev and Rublev.

NOTE: Majchrzak seeks biggest win by ranking on indoor hard courts (d. No. 55 Otte at 2022 Sofia). With a win, he would pass Hurkacz for most wins among Polish players on ATP Tour this season (Hurkacz - 15-11).

[WC] Stan Wawrinka (SUI) vs Botic van de Zandschulp (NED) First Tour-Level Meeting

Stan Wawrinka | Age: 40 | World No. 159 | Career-High No. 3 | 2025: 3-12 (3x 2R) | Career: 581-375 (16 Titles)
> Achieved career-high No. 3 in 2014 and ended 2014-16 at No. 4 before undergoing 2 left knee surgeries in 2017 and 2 left foot surgeries in 2021.
> Boasts 5 wins over World No. 1 at Grand Slams, including finals of 2014 Australian Open (d. Nadal), 2015 Roland Garros (d. Djokovic) and 2016 US Open (d. Djokovic).
> One of 3 players to defeat Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal at Grand Slams (also Berdych, Tsonga).
> Owns 16 singles titles with 11 straight wins in finals from 2014-16, defeating fellow Swiss Federer for lone ATP Masters 1000 title at 2014 Monte-Carlo.
> Won 2008 Beijing Olympics doubles gold medal w/Federer and helped Switzerland capture 2014 Davis Cup.

NOTE: Wawrinka is playing in Greece for the first time in his professional career and aims to record his second hard-court ATP Tour win of the season after defeating Kecmanovic in Basel 1R two weeks ago. He owns 4th-most indoor wins (115) among active players after Djokovic (198), Monfils (149), Cilic (146), highlighted by 2015 Rotterdam title.

B. van de Zandschulp | Age: 30 | World No. 80 | Career-High No. 22 | 2025: 16-20 (Winston-Salem F) | Career: 111-111 (3 Finals)
> Achieved new career-high ranking 14 times in 2022, peaking at No. 22 in August and ending 2nd straight season as No. 1 Dutchman.
> At 2021 US Open, became 3rd men's qualifier to reach US Open QF in Open Era, 1st Dutchman to reach Grand Slam QF since 2004, and only player to take a set off eventual champion Medvedev.
> Earned personal-best 38 wins in 2022, including victories over Norrie, Fritz and Bublik to help Netherlands qualify for Davis Cup Finals knock-out stage.
> In 2024, posted upsets over No. 3 Alcaraz in US Open 2R for biggest win of career and Nadal in Davis Cup Finals to end former World No. 1's career and help Netherlands advance to 1st Davis Cup final in history (since 1900).
> In Munich, upset No. 7 Ruud en route to 1st ATP Tour final in 2022 and No. 10 Fritz to reach 2nd final in 2023, before squandering 4 championship points in 2023 final and losing to Rune on both occasions.
> Went 11-1 in Grand Slam qualifying matches in 2021, qualifying at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open, while entering Wimbledon as LL (l. to Tringelliti in Q3).

NOTE: van de Zandschulp seeks third indoor ATP Tour win of 2025 after wins over No. 45 Fonseca in Brussels 1R and No. 17 Lehecka in Basel 1R. He is 14-1 after winning 1st set on tour-level this season, lone loss to 38-year-old Gasquet in Bucharest 1R (6-4 5-7 1-6).

Alexandre Muller | Age: 28 | World No. 43 | Career-High No. 38 | 2025: 22-26 (Hong Kong Title) | Career: 49-65 (1 Title)
> Broke into Top 500 in 2016, Top 250 in 2019, Top 100 in 2023 and broke into Top 50 after advancing to biggest final of career in Rio de Janeiro in February 2025, before achieving career-high No. 38 in August that year.
> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Hong Kong, becoming 3rd man in Open Era to win a tour-level title by rallying

from a set down in all matches played after Ashe at 1975 WCT Finals and Bublik at 2024 Montpellier.
> Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Musetti en route to 1st SF and final at 2023 Marrakech and earned Top 10 wins over No. 6 Rublev at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Rome and No. 3 Zverev at 2025 Hamburg.
> Made tour-level debut at 2017 Roland Garros as WC (l. to Monteiro) and won 1st tour-level match at 2021 Australian Open as LL, beating Londero in 1R.
> Owns 140-123 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning 1st title at 2022 Blois after saving a MP in his 1R match.

NOTE: Muller looks to record 50th tour-level win of his career (49-65) and aims to record second indoor win of the season after defeating No. 33 Nakashima in ATP Masters 1000 Paris 1R last week. He earned 11 of 22 wins in 2025 on hard courts, highlighted by 1st ATP Tour title in Hong Kong in first week of the season.

Jan-Lennard Struff | Age: 35 | World No. 101 | Career-High No. 21 | 2025: 15-20 (3 QFs) | Career: 237-262 (1 Title)

> Achieved career-high No. 21 in June 2023 after advancing to 3rd ATP Tour final at 2023 Stuttgart.
> Entered 2023 Madrid as LL, defeating No. 5 Tsitsipas in QF and Karatsev in SF, after losing to him in qualifying, to become 1st lucky loser to reach an ATP Masters 1000 final in series history (since 1990).
> On home soil, advanced to 1st ATP Tour singles final at 2021 Munich, earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Medvedev in 2021 Halle 1R and at age 33 became third oldest first-time ATP Tour champion at 2024 Munich.
> Defeated No. 10 Goffin en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2020 Cincinnati and No. 4 Ruud en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Monte Carlo.
> Posted personal-best 35 victories in 2019, highlighted by 1st Grand Slam 4R appearance at Roland Garros.
> In 2018, became 1st player in Open Era to rally from 2 sets down in Wimbledon 1R and 2R (d. L. Mayer and Karlovic).
> Lost in qualifying at 20 tour-level events before qualifying for 1st time at 2013 Roland Garros and earning 1st tour-level win at 2013 Wimbledon as Q (d. Kavcic).

NOTE: Struff is playing in his fourth ATP Tour indoor event of the season, reaching quarter-finals in Marseille and Almaty (lost in Rotterdam 1R). He is 5-12 vs. Top 50 in 2025, including 3-2 since August, earning wins over No. 11 Rune and No. 17 Tiafoe en route to US Open 4R and No. 10 Khachanov in Almaty 2R last month.
