MIAMI OPEN PRESENTED BY ITAU TALKING POINTS

- Second round at the **Miami Open presented by Itau** concludes on Sunday with 8 remaining 2R matches on the schedule, joined by 16 players, who are already looking to book their tickets to the fourth round of Miami. Five Top 10 players will be in play today, including defending champion and No. 3 seed **Daniil Medvedev**.
- Reigning champion **Daniil Medvedev** started his title defense on Saturday with a straight sets win over Fucsovics and now faces No. 30 seed **Cameron Norrie**. Medvedev has reached at least the semi-finals stage in all three events played this season, while Norrie seeks his first Top 10 win since March last year.
- Last year's runner-up **Jannik Sinner** meets No. 25 seed **Tallon Griekspoor**, taking a 3-0 **Lexus ATP Head2Head** lead into the encounter. Sinner won his last 21 matches vs. players ranked outside of Top 20, with World No. 26 Griekspoor aiming to stop the streak to capture the biggest win of his career (0-8 vs. Top 5).
- Three of the Top 4 Americans (Fritz, Paul and Tiafoe) crashed out of the tournament in the second round with the No. 3 American **Ben Shelton** scheduled to play his opening round on Sunday. The American faces 18-year-old wildcard **Martin Landaluce** in their first meeting, as Shelton looks to join other home players, No. 28 seed **Sebastian Korda**, No. 31 seed **Christopher Eubanks** and wildcard **Martin Damm**, in the third round.

First Meeting

Fabian Marozsan | Age: 24 | World No. 57 (Career-High) | 2024: 8-8 (Indian Wells 4R) | Miami: 1-0 (2024 2R)
> Broke into Top 200 in August 2022, Top 100 in June 2023 and earned career-high No. 57 in January 2024.
> In ATP Tour debut, qualified and defeated No. 2 Alcaraz for biggest win of career en route to 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome 4R, then reached QF at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai QF (d. No. 5 Ruud in 4R).
> Earned 1st Grand Slam main draw win at 2023 US Open (d. Gasquet) and reached 3R at 2024 Australian Open.
> Owns 55-30 record on Challenger tour (3-1 in finals), winning titles at 2022 Banja Luka, 2023 Antalya and 2023 Perugia and losing to compatriot Fucsovics in 2022 Bratislava-2 final.
> Began playing tennis at age 5 and credits his father for teaching him everything about the sport.

NOTE: Marozsan is playing in his 4th ATP Masters 1000 event, making it to the 4R on all three previous occasions (2023 Rome 4R, 2023 Shanghai QF, 2024 Indian Wells 4R). He is 2-1 vs. Top 10 players in his career, defeating No. 2 Alcaraz in Rome 3R and No. 9 Ruud in Shanghai 4R.

Holger Rune | Age: 20 | World No. 7 | Career-High No. 4 | 2024: 13-6 (Brisbane Final) | Miami: 2-1 (2023 4R)
> Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 100 in January 2022, Top 50 in May 2022 and Top 10 in November 2022, becoming highest-ranked Dane in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), reaching No. 4 in August 2023.
> Captured 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Paris title at age 19 by becoming 1st player since start of ATP Tour in 1990 to earn 5 Top-10 wins at an event other than Nitto ATP Finals.
> From 2022 Paris to 2023 Rome, compiled an 18-5 record in 6 ATP Masters 1000 events, posting runner-up results in Monte Carlo (l. to Rublev) and Rome (l. to Medvedev).
> Went on a 7-match winning streak vs. Top 5 opponents, ending the streak with loss to No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome final (7-8 vs. Top 5).
> Ended 2022 season on 19-2 run (2-2 in finals) after going 1-6 from January-February and 0-7 from June-July.
> Upset 2021 finalist Tsitsipas at 2022 Roland Garros to become 1st Danish man to reach QF in tournament history (since 1925) and to reach any Grand Slam QF in Open Era (since 1968).

> Captured 5th Challenger title of career at 2022 Sanremo (d. Passaro 6-1 2-6 6-4), then won ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo Q1 match on same day (d. Albot 6-2 6-3).

NOTE: Rune is making his second main draw appearance at the event, reaching the fourth round last year after losing in qualifying round 1 in 2022. He is 5-0 in his opening rounds this season.

It was the return and backhand Shot Quality that made the difference in Rotterdam. On the backhand side Griekspoor did a good job of matching Sinner for speed (71mph match avg. compared to his 66 mph 52-wk avg.) but it came at the cost of consistency falling from his 52-wk avg. of 82% In down to 75%.

Tallon Griekspoor | Age: 27 | World No. 26 | Career-High No. 21 | 2024: 10-6 (Rotterdam SF) | Miami: 1-1 (2024 3R)

> Earned personal-best 36 wins in 2023, won 1st ATP Tour title in Pune and achieved career-high No. 21 in November.

> Won 2nd title at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch on home soil and earned 1st Top 10 win over No. 9 Fritz en route to 2023 Washington final.

> Rallied from a set down for Rotterdam wins as WC over No. 13 Wawrinka in 2018, No. 11 Khachanov in 2019, No. 14 Karatsev in 2022, No. 17 A. Zverev in 2023 and for 's-Hertogenbosch win over No. 18 de Minaur in 2023 – earning first 5 of 10 career Top-20 wins on home soil and earned biggest win of career over No. 8 Hurkacz at 2024 Rotterdam.

> Went 8-0 in finals and 42-7 overall on ATP Challenger Tour in 2021, setting single-season record for most titles and ending season with 25 straight wins.

NOTE: Griekspoor is 0-8 vs. Top 5 opponents, looking to earn the biggest win of his career and reach R16 in ATP Masters 1000 events for the second time (2023 Paris). He aims to be the first Dutch player to defeat a Top 3 opponent since van Rijthoven d. No. 2 Medvedev at 2022 's-Hertogenbosch.

Jannik Sinner | Age: 22 | World No. 3 (Career-High) | 2024: 17-1 (2 Titles) | Miami: 14-3 (2021, 2023 Finals)

> Unranked to begin 2018, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager and broke into Top 10 at age 20 in 2021, then reached career-high No. 3 in February 2024, becoming the highest-ranked Italian in PIF ATP Rankings history.

> At 2024 Australian Open, defeated 10-time champion Djokovic in SF and rallied from two sets down in final against Medvedev to win his 1st Grand Slam title. Became 1st player to beat Djokovic in SF or later at the tournament.

> Became the first Italian champion in Australian Open tournament history and second Italian man to win a Grand Slam title in Open Era (Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros).

> Earned career-best 64 wins in 2023, setting the record for most wins by an Italian player in a single season in Open Era, highlighted by first ATP Masters 1000 title at Toronto.

> As 19-year-old in 2021, became 1st teenager to win an ATP 500 title at Washington and 1st Italian finalist in tournament history of ATP Masters 1000 Miami (since 1985).

NOTE: Sinner is 29-1 vs. players ranked outside of Top 20 since the start of Wimbledon last year and owns a 6-0 record vs. Dutch players (4-0 this season). He has reached at least R16 at 8 of 9 ATP Masters 1000 events played since the start of 2023 season (2R at 2023 Cincinnati, DNP in 2023 Madrid).

Cameron Norrie | Age: 28 | World No. 31 | Career-High No. 8 | 2024: 10-5 (Rio de Janeiro SF) | Miami: 5-5 (2022 4R)
> Broke into Top 10 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 8 in September 2022, joining Henman, Murray and Rusedski as 4th Top-10 British man in history.

> Advanced to 13 ATP Tour finals from May 2021-February 2023, highlighted by 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title to become 1st British champion in 46-year tournament history.

> Reached Grand Slam 4R, QF and SF for 1st time at 2022 Wimbledon, falling to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets.

> Earned 52 wins in 2021 and 49 wins in 2022 before beating No. 2 Nadal at 2023 United Cup and No. 2 Alcaraz in 2023 Rio de Janeiro final for biggest wins of career.

> Born in South Africa to a Scottish father and Welsh mother, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University, and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

NOTE: Norrie attempts to break a 7-match losing streak vs. Top 10 players (d. No. 7 Rublev at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells) and earn first Top 5 win since defeating No. 2 Alcaraz to capture his latest of 5 ATP Tour titles at 2023 Rio de Janeiro (10-34 vs. Top 10, 6-14 vs. Top 5).

Daniil Medvedev | Age: 28 | World No. 4 | Career-High No. 1 | 2024: 15-3 (2 Finals) | Miami: 15-4 (2023 Title)

> Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in 2004.

> Six-time Grand Slam finalist owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.

> Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).

> Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

> Won 18 of his 20 singles titles on hard courts and all 20 of his titles at different events, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami and 2023 Rome, his 1st career clay ATP Tour title.

NOTE: Medvedev is aiming to defend a title for the first time in his career, previously coming one match away at 2020 Nitto ATP Finals, 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Paris, and 2023 Vienna. He owns a 10-2 record vs. Brits on tour-level after 0-2 start (2 losses to Edmund).

2R: [WC] Martin Landaluce (ESP) vs [16] Ben Shelton (USA)

First Meeting

Martin Landaluce | Age: 18 | World No. 360 | Career-High No. 359 | 2024: 1-0 (Miami 2R) | Miami: 1-0 (2024 2R)

> Former World No. 1 junior earned 1st ranking point in February 2023, broke into Top 500 in November 2023 and reached career-high No. 359 in March 2024 after reaching 1st Challenger SF in Tenerife-3.

> Made his professional debut at 2022 Alicante CH a week before making his ATP Tour debut at 2022 Gijon as WC.

> Defeated compatriot Munar for 1st ATP Tour win at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Miami as WC, becoming the first player born in 2006 or later to win an ATP Masters 1000 match.

> Posted a 58-8 record on junior circuit in 2022, including a 15-match winning streak on grass before losing in Wimbledon boys' singles SF, then captured 2022 US Open boys' singles title.

NOTE: Landaluce earned his first ATP Tour win by defeating Munar in 1R and now looks for his biggest win of career to become the youngest player in Miami 3R since compatriot Nadal in 2004.

Ben Shelton | Age: 21 | World No. 16 | Career-High No. 15 | 2024: 10-6 (Auckland, Dallas SF) | Miami: 0-1 (2023 2R)

> Achieved career-high No. 15 in October 2023 after winning first ATP Tour title at 2023 Tokyo.

> Defeated compatriots Paul and Tiafoe at 2023 US Open to become the youngest American man to reach US Open semi-finals since Chang in 1992, then beat No. 4 Sinner to reach 1st ATP Masters QF at 2023 Shanghai.

> Advanced to 2023 Australian Open QF at age 20 and on his 1st trip outside USA, becoming youngest American man in Aus. Open QF since Giammalva Jr., 19, in 1982, and in Grand Slam QF since Roddick, 20, at 2002 US Open.

> Upset No. 5 Ruud to reach 2022 Cincinnati 3R in ATP Masters 1000 debut at age 19, becoming youngest American man to earn Top-5 win since Roddick, 18, at 2001 Montreal (d. No. 1 Kuerten).

- > Ended 2022 season on ATP Challenger Tour with 3 indoor hard titles in as many weeks at Charlottesville, Knoxville and Champaign.
- > Posted 65-10 singles record in 2 seasons for University of Florida, clinching 2021 NCAA team title and 2022 NCAA singles title while being coached by his father Bryan, a former World No. 55.

NOTE: Shelton is 5-1 in his opening rounds this season, losing to Safiullin in Brisbane in first week of the season. He looks for first win in Miami after losing to Mannarino in 2R last year (1R bye).

It was the two tie-breaks that made the difference for Davidovich Fokina, across the two tie-breaks he averaged 88% Conversion (Ruud 40%) and made 100% of his Backhands hitting them on avg. 3 mph faster than his match avg.

Casper Ruud | Age: 25 | World No. 8 | Career-High No. 2 | 2024: 17-4 (2 Finals) | Miami: 7-4 (2022 Final)

- > Top-ranked Norwegian in history rose from No. 7 to career-high No. 2 after falling to Alcaraz in 2022 US Open final with No. 1 ranking at stake.
- > First Norwegian to win an ATP Tour title (10), play at Nitto ATP Finals (2021 SF, 2022 final), and reach both a Grand Slam final (2022 Roland Garros, US Open, 2023 Roland Garros) and an ATP Masters 1000 final (2022 Miami).
- > Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.
- > Former World No. 1 junior leads ATP Tour since start of 2020 season in clay-court wins (92), finals (13) and titles (9).
- > Defeated No. 4 A. Zverev on a hard court for biggest win of career en route to 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Miami final.

NOTE: Ruud earned his 50th ATP Masters 1000 win (50-33) over Van Assche in 2R and now looks for his 100th hard court tour-level win (99-68). The Norwegian would become the 5th player born since 1990 to own 100 tour-level wins on both hard courts and clay (121).

A. Davidovich Fokina | Age: 24 | World No. 28 | Career-High No. 21 | 2024: 8-6 (2 QFs) | Miami: 2-2 (2023-24 3R)

- > Achieved career-high No. 21 in August 2023, later improving year-end ranking for 8th consecutive year, finishing at No. 26.
- > Broke Djokovic 9 times in Monte Carlo 2R win, setting record for most breaks of Djokovic in a best-of-3-set match to defeat then-World No. 1 en route to 1st ATP Tour final of career at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo.
- > Advanced to 1st Grand Slam QF at 2021 Roland Garros and 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2021 Monte Carlo, highlighted by 5-set win over Ruud in Roland Garros 3R.
- > Ended junior career as World No. 2 after winning Wimbledon boys' singles title and posting 20-1 record in 2017.
- > Owns 2 cats and launched Adoptas.org in 2021, a pet adoption platform that aims to connect anyone looking to adopt or foster a pet with shelters and rescues across Spain.

NOTE: Davidovich Fokina is 6-25 vs. Top 10 players, including win over No. 9 Hurkacz at 2024 United Cup. He aims to reach round of 16 at ATP Masters 1000 events since reaching SF at 2023 Toronto.

Alex de Minaur | Age: 25 | World No. 10 | Career-High No. 9 | 2024: 17-5 (Acapulco Title) | Miami: 1-4 (2022 3R)
> Two-time Next Gen ATP Finals runner-up achieved career-high No. 9 in February 2024 soon after defeating No. 1 Djokovic at 2024 United Cup for biggest win of career.
> Earned personal-best 47 victories in 2022, then captured biggest of 8 ATP Tour titles in Acapulco in 2023 and 2024.
> Advanced to his first ATP Masters 1000 QF, SF and final at 2023 Toronto, losing to Sinner.
> Reached 1st Grand Slam WQF at 2020 US Open immediately after winning 1st ATP Tour doubles title at 2020 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati w/Carreno Busta in team debut and at same venue.
> Defeated Murray to help Team World win 2022 Laver Cup and went 6-1 in Davis Cup play during the season, leading Australia to its 1st final since 2003.
> Son to a Uruguayan father and Spanish mother, splits time between Australia and Spain, and speaks English, Spanish and French.

NOTE: de Minaur is tied with Baez, Ruud and Sinner for most tour-level wins this season (17). The Australian aims to avoid his lowest-ranked loss on the ATP Tour (l. to No. 374 Nishioka in 2018 Miami).

Soonwoo Kwon | Age: 26 | World No. 863 | Career-High No. 52 | 2024: 1-2 (Miami 2R) | Miami: 1-2 (2024 2R)
> Achieved career-high No. 52 after winning 1st ATP Tour title in 1st final at 2021 Astana.
> Added 2nd ATP Tour championship at 2023 Adelaide-2, becoming 1st Korean to win multiple titles and 1st LL to win a title since Cecchinato at 2018 Budapest.
> Advanced to 2021 Eastbourne SF as LL by defeating Ivashka for 1st ATP Tour QF win in 8th attempt.
> Defeated No. 13 Auger-Aliassime of eventual champion Canada for biggest win of career in 2022 Davis Cup Finals group match.
> Went 35-14 at Challengers in 2019 with titles at Yokohama and Seoul, then captured 3rd Challenger title at 2021 Biella-2.

NOTE: Kwon defeated Muller in 1R to capture his first ATP Tour win since 2023 Doha and first ATP Masters 1000 win of career (0-6 prior to event). He is 0-9 vs. Top 10, seeking biggest win of career to become the first Korean player to defeat a Top 10 opponent since Chung defeated No. 4 Zverev at 2018 Australian Open.

Tomas Machac | Age: 23 | World No. 60 (Career-High) | 2024: 8-5 (Marseille QF) | Miami: 2-0 (2024 3R)
> Former Top-20 junior broke into Top 100 in time for 2022 year-end rankings, then earned career-high No. 60 in March 2024 soon after reaching 3rd ATP Tour QF at Marseille.
> Defeated former champion Sock en route to 1st ATP Tour QF at 2023 Houston.
> Earned 1st Top 20 win over No. 17 Tiafoe en route to 1st Grand Slam 3R at 2024 Australian Open.
> Representing Czech Republic, defeated Sousa to reach 2020 Tokyo Olympics 2R (held in 2021) and beat both Gasquet and Evans during 2021 Davis Cup Finals.
> Boasts 110-54 Challenger record (6-5 in finals), including back-to-back titles at Orleans and Mouilleron le Captif in October 2023.
> Says that his favourite sports team is Chicago Bulls and his hero is Michael Jordan, who played his last game as a Bull in 1998 – 2 years before Machac was born.

NOTE: Machac earned the biggest win of his career by upsetting No. 6 Rublev in 1R. Playing in his first ATP Masters 1000 3R, the Czech aims to continue 6-match winning streak vs. lower-ranked opponents on tour-level (7-1 overall).

Andy Murray | Age: 36 | World No. 62 | Career-High No. 1 | 2024: 5-7 (Miami 3R) | Miami: 31-11 ('09, '13 Titles)
> Became 1st British World No. 1 in singles at age 29 in 2016, making him 2nd-oldest player to debut at No. 1 behind Newcombe, 30, in 1974.
> Ended 2016 on 24-match win streak, defeating No. 2 Djokovic at Nitto ATP Finals to clinch year-end No. 1 and ATP-best 9th title of season.
> First British Grand Slam men's singles champion (2012 US Open) and Wimbledon champion (2013, 2016) since Perry in 1936 (Wimbledon, US Championships).
> Also 1st player to win 2 Olympic gold medals in singles (2012 London, 2016 Rio), highlighted by 6-2 6-1 6-4 rout of No. 1 Federer in 2012 final on Wimbledon's Centre Court.

> Owns 738 career wins and is only player with at least 7 victories vs. Djokovic, Federer and Nadal, including championship wins over all 3 among his 14 ATP Masters 1000 and 46 tour-level titles overall.

NOTE: 2-time champion Murray aims to record three wins at an ATP Masters 1000 event for the first time since earning back-to-back titles at 2016 Shanghai and Paris. He aims to avoid third consecutive loss vs. Czech players (Machac in 2024 Marseille, Mensik in 2024 Doha), after going 12-0 against them from 2015 to 2023.

3R: [22] Nicolas Jarry (CHI) vs [Q] Thiago Seyboth Wild (BRA) First Tour-Level Meeting Other Meeting

> Won 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Bastad without losing a set to reach No. 38, the mark that stood as his career-high until May 2023.
> Saved 1 MP vs. No. 3 A. Zverev in 2019 Barcelona 2R, but squandered 2 MPs vs. A. Zverev in Geneva final one month later.

> One week before Santiago, saved 3 MPs to beat Davidovich Fokina in 2020 Rio de Janeiro 1R as WC – longest ATP Tour match at 3:50 since 2009 Madrid SF (Nadal d. Djokovic in 4:03).
> Earned 1st Grand Slam win by upsetting No. 2 Medvedev in 2023 Roland Garros 1R for biggest win of career.
> Has a 99-73 Challenger record, winning 4 of 5 career titles during 2023 season in Vina del Mar, Buenos Aires, Como and Genoa, beating 5 Italians en route to title.
> Ended junior career by beating fellow #NextGenATP player Musetti for 2018 US Open boys' singles title.

NOTE: Seyboth Wild came into March with 1 tour-level hard court win and 0 ATP Masters 1000 wins before reaching back-to-back 3Rs at Indian Wells and Miami. He aims to become the first Brazilian in ATP Masters 1000 R16 since Bellucci at 2016 Rome.
