ATP WORLD TOUR STARS GO FULL SWING TO RAISE £410,000 FOR GREAT ORMOND STREET HOSPITAL CHILDREN'S CHARITY

LONDON – Many of the world's Top 8 singles players and doubles teams, including the likes of Juan Martin del Potro, Tomas Berdych, Richard Gasquet and Stanislas Wawrinka, hit the red carpet last night for the official Barclays ATP World Tour Finals Gala, at the Natural History Museum in London. The event, supported by Moët & Chandon, raised £410,000 for Great Ormond Street Hospital Children's Charity.

The Gala officially launched the 2013 Barclays ATP World Tour Finals - the year-end climax to the men's professional tennis season, to be played 4-11 November at The O2 - and raised vital funds for the new respiratory ward at Great Ormond Street Hospital. Now in its third year, this year's Gala brought the total raised for the charity to an incredible £1.2 million since 2011.

Players compete for Emirates ATP Rankings points throughout the season in a bid to earn one of the eight coveted berths and a chance to win the \$1.92m prize money on offer for the winner. Played using a round-robin format, each player plays three matches as they compete for a berth in the knockout semi-finals and beyond. The prestigious tournament has been contested in major cities around the world with a rich history dating back to the birth of The Masters in 1970 in Tokyo. Since 2000 the event has taken place in cities such as Lisbon, Sydney, and Shanghai. In 2009 the tournament was moved to London, where it will be played through 2015.
