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LEXUS ATP HEAD2HEAD: TUESDAY SINGLES MATCHES

COURT CENTRAL

1R: Daniel Altmaier (GER) vs [6] Arthur Rinderknech (FRA) **First Meeting**

Daniel Altmaier | Age: 27 | World No. 46 (Career-High) | 2025: 20-27 (2 QFs) | Metz: 0-1 (2023 1R)
> Made Top 50 debut a day before his 25th birthday in September 2023, achieving career-high No. 46 in November 2025.
> Reached 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Madrid as a LL and defeated No. 4 Fritz for biggest win of career en route to 2025 Roland Garros 4R, earning 3 of 5 career Top 10 wins at that event.
> Made Grand Slam qualifying debut at 2020 Roland Garros and earned 6th win of tournament over No. 8 Berrettini to reach 4R and defeated No. 9 Sinner en route to 2023 Roland Garros 3R.
> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SFs of career in back-to-back weeks at Umag and Kitzbuhel in July 2021.
> Ended 2022 season with 13 wins in his last 14 Challenger matches, including back-to-back titles at Lima-2 and Guayaquil.

NOTE: Altmaier is 11-32 vs. Top 30, 6-11 in 2025, including win over No. 9 Ruud in ATP Masters 1000 Paris 2R last week. He earned 13 of 20 wins this season on hard courts, highlighted by QFs in back-to-back weeks in Rotterdam and Marseille indoors in February.

Arthur Rinderknech | Age: 30 | World No. 28 | Career-High No. 27 | 2025: 27-27 (Shanghai Final) | Metz: 2-2 ('22 QF)
> Broke into Top 50 in January 2022 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at Adelaide-2 and achieved career-high No. 27 in October 2025 after advancing to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final in Shanghai, losing to his cousin Vacherot in the final.
> Earned 1st Top 10 win in 15th attempt over No. 10 Shelton in 2025 Queen's Club 1R as LL before earning wins over No. 3 Zverev in 2025 Wimbledon 1R and en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at 2025 Shanghai.
> Playing on indoor hard courts in fall 2022, saved 1 MP vs. No. 17 Schwartzman in Tel Aviv 2R, 9 MPs vs. No. 15 Carreno Busta in Gijon QF and 2 MPs vs. No. 16 Cilic in Basel 1R.
> In 2021, advanced to Kitzbuhel SF, reached 6 other ATP Tour QFs, and earned 1st 18 tour-level wins of career.
> Captured Challenger titles at 2020 Rennes, 2020 Calgary, 2021 Istanbul, 2022 Poznan, 2023 Zug and 2024 Lille.
> Five-time All-American at Texas A&M University (3 singles, 2 doubles), where he graduated from Mays Business School in 2018.

NOTE: Rinderknech is 11-2 vs. players ranked outside Top 10 since US Open, both losses to his cousin, Vacherot, as No. 204 in Shanghai final and No. 40 in Paris 2R and 20-3 after winning 1st set in 2025 (0-2 vs. Vacherot). 30-year-old returned to French No. 1 on Monday for the first time since the week of 2nd January 2023.

1R: [8] Corentin Moutet (FRA) vs Aleksandar Vukic (AUS) **Vukic Leads 1-0**

24 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai (China) Hard R128 Aleksandar Vukic

Corentin Moutet | Age: 26 | World No. 31 (Career-High) | 2025: 33-24 (2 Finals) | Metz: 2-2 (2024 SF)
> Former Top-10 junior ended 2022 at No. 51, broke inside Top 50 in July 2025 and achieved career-high No. 31 in November after earning personal-best 33 wins in 2025, highlighted by finals of Mallorca and Almaty.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour final as 20-year-old at 2020 Doha, becoming youngest French finalist on tour since Gasquet, 20, at 2006 Lyon.
> Beat former champion Wawrinka en route to 2022 US Open 4R, becoming 1st men's lucky loser on record to reach US Open 4R, then reached 4R of 2024 Roland Garros and 3R of 2024 Paris Olympics.
> Defeated future World No. 3 Tsitsipas for 1st Challenger title at 2017 Brest as 18-year-old WC.
> In 2025, recorded first Top 10 wins of career over No. 10 Rune in Rome 3R in 3H 45M and saved 1 MP for biggest win of career over No. 4 Fritz in London/Queen's Club 1R in 2H 54M.
> Enjoys rapping and playing piano, having released an 8-song EP entitled "Ecorche" in 2020.

NOTE: Moutet is 18-6 in his opening rounds this season, 11-2 on hard courts, looking for third win on home soil in 2025 (2-2). He leads Frenchmen with number of wins this season and is 22-6 vs. players ranked outside Top 50.

Aleksandar Vukic | Age: 29 | World No. 87 | Career-High No. 48 | 2025: 14-28 (Tokyo QF) | Metz: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 200 in March 2020 prior to COVID-19 suspension of ATP Tour and Top 100 in May 2023 and achieved career-high No. 48 in August 2023 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final in Atlanta.
 > Entered 2024 Eastbourne as LL, advancing to 2nd ATP Tour SF by defeating Nishioka in QF after losing to him in qualifying.
 > Qualified and defeated No. 9 Ruud for biggest win of career en route to 3R at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai.
 > Won Challenger titles at 2022 Bengaluru-2 and 2023 Busan and reached Challenger finals at 2021 and 2022 Champaign, where he was a 3-time All-American for University of Illinois from 2015-18.
 > Born in Sydney after parents and older brother fled Montenegro during breakup of Yugoslavia in early-1990s.

NOTE: Vukic is making his tournament debut and aims to become the 4th Australian to win a match in Metz after Philippoussis (2005), Luczak (2005), and de Minaur (2021). 29-year-old seeks third Top 40 win of the year after defeating No. 22 Korda at Australian Open and No. 39 Norrie at ATP Masters 1000 Toronto.

2R: [4] Flavio Cobolli (ITA) vs Lorenzo Sonego (ITA)

First Meeting

Flavio Cobolli | Age: 23 | World No. 22 | Career-High No. 17 | 2025: 31-26 (2 Titles) | Metz: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 200 in January 2022 and Top 100 in October 2023, achieving career-high No. 17 in July 2025 after defeating former finalist Cilic to reach 1st Grand Slam QF at Wimbledon.
 > Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Baez to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Bucharest and captured biggest title of his career at 2025 Hamburg.
 > Earned wins over Shelton as No. 15 en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2024 Geneva and as No. 14 to reach 1st final at 2024 Washington and beat No. 9 Rune via RET for 1st Top 10 win at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.
 > Saved 3 MPs vs. Giron to win ATP Tour main draw debut 3-6 7-6 7-6 at 2021 Parma as 429th-ranked WC.
 > Peaked at No. 8 in juniors and ended junior career by winning 2020 Roland Garros boys' doubles title w/Stricker.

NOTE: Cobolli seeks 13th tour-level quarter-final, 6th of the season, highlighted by title runs in Bucharest and Hamburg. By reaching the final this week, Cobolli would guarantee year-end Top 20 finish for the first time.

Lorenzo Sonego | Age: 30 | World No. 42 | Career-High No. 21 | 2025: 23-28 (3 QFs) | Metz: 11-4 (2022 Title)
 > Earned personal-best 30 wins and achieved career-high No. 21 in 2021, sweeping Cagliari titles to become 1st Italian champion on home soil in singles since 2006 and in doubles since 2005 (w/Vavassori).
 > Broke into Top 50 after saving championship point vs. Kecmanovic to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Antalya.
 > At 2025 Australian Open, beat former champion Wawrinka and reigning Next Gen ATP finalists Fonseca and Tien en route to QF at age 29, to be oldest Italian Grand Slam quarter-finalist since Mulligan at 1970 Roland Garros.
 > Did not drop a set en route to 3rd singles title of career at 2022 Metz, including wins over former champions Simon and Hurkacz and captured 4th title at 2024 Winston-Salem.
 > Upset No. 1 Djokovic 6-2 6-1 en route to 2020 Vienna final, becoming 1st lucky loser to defeat Djokovic and equalling fewest games ever conceded to Djokovic in a match.
 > Saved 1 MP vs. Thiem en route to 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Rome SF, becoming 1st Italian semi-finalist at Foro Italico since 2007 and 2nd since 1978.

NOTE: Sonego seeks 4th ATP Tour QF of the season (0-3), all on hard courts, after Australian Open, Marseille, and Stockholm. He is 1-16 vs. Top 30 opponents in 2025 with a sole win against No. 8 Musetti at ATP Masters 1000 Paris.

2R: Arthur Cazaux (FRA) vs Cameron Norrie (GBR)

Norrie Leads 1-0

Arthur Cazaux | Age: 23 | World No. 62 | Career-High No. 58 | 2025: 16-15 (Kitzbuhel Final) | Metz: 1-1 (2025 2R)
 > After peaking at No. 4 in juniors in 2020, broke inside Top 100 in January 2024 after defeating No. 8 Rune for biggest win of career en route to Australian Open 4R and achieved career-high No. 58 in October 2025.
 > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2025 Gstaad and 1st final at 2025 Kitzbuhel in back-to-back weeks.
 > Defeated countryman Mannarino in ATP Tour main draw debut at 2021 Geneva as 18-year-old WC and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2021 Roland Garros as WC.

- > Owns 79-40 Challenger record (4-5 in finals), winning titles at both 2022 and 2023 Nonthaburi-2 as Q, 2024 Noumea and 2025 Jinan.
- > Went 122-48 on ITF Junior Circuit, highlighted by run to 2020 Australian Open boys' singles final.

NOTE: Cazaux seeks 3rd ATP Tour QF (2-0), first on hard courts, after reaching Gstaad semi-final and Kitzbuhel final in July (lost to Bublik on both occasions). He aims to record back-to-back tour-level wins on hard courts for the 2nd time in his career after run to 2024 Australian Open 4R (l. to Hurkacz).

Cameron Norrie | Age: 30 | World No. 27 | Career-High No. 8 | 2025: 31-25 (Geneva SF) | Metz: 5-1 (2024 Final)
 > Broke into Top 10 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 8 in September 2022, joining Henman, Murray and Rusedski as 4th Top-10 British man in history.
 > Advanced to 13 ATP Tour finals from May 2021-February 2023, highlighted by 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title to become 1st British champion in 46-year tournament history.
 > Reached Grand Slam 4R, QF and SF for 1st time at 2022 Wimbledon, falling to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets and advanced to his 2nd Grand Slam QF at 2025 Wimbledon, losing to defending champion Alcaraz.
 > Earned 52 wins in 2021 before beating No. 1 Alcaraz at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Paris for biggest win of career.
 > Born in South Africa to a Scottish father and Welsh mother, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

NOTE: Norrie became the player with the most wins among Brits this season (31) and now seeks 5th tour-level quarter-final in 2025 (1-3), first since Wimbledon (l. to Alcaraz). He is 6-1 vs. Frenchmen in his last 7 matches with a sole loss to Bonzi in last year's final in Metz.
