ERSTE BANK OPEN TALKING POINTS

- World No. 2 **Jannik Sinner** faces countryman **Flavio Cobolli** in **Erste Bank Open** second round, as 2023 champion aims to reach his 40th hard-court quarter-final and extend his 17-match winning streak indoors. Italian No. 1 is also 29-2 in hard-court ATP 500 events since the start of 2023 season, including Beijing title this year. Cobolli aims to record the biggest win of his career to become 1st Italian to defeat Sinner (0-16).
- No. 2 seed **Alexander Zverev** defeated **Matteo Arnaldi** for his 500th career win in Toronto earlier this year and faces Italian again for another milestone win. German looks to join Alcaraz (67), de Minaur (52) and Fritz (51) as only men to record 50+ wins this season and reach Vienna QF for fifth time in as many appearances. He would be the 2nd man to reach Vienna QF in three consecutive years this decade after Sinner (2021-23).
- In a rematch of Sunday's Almaty final, 2022 champion **Daniil Medvedev** meets **Corentin Moutet**. Medvedev won their latest encounter and will attempt to do the same to become the first man to reach 10 tour-level quarter-finals on hard courts this season and record 40 wins in a season in 7 of last 8 years (28 in 2020). Moutet aims to join Alcaraz as only men to earn Top 20 wins on clay, grass, hard and indoors this season.
- There are 5 Italians in singles action at **Wiener Stadthalle** on Thursday, including World No. 8 **Lorenzo Musetti**, who takes on **Tomas Martin Etcheverry**, as Musetti, who is No. 8 on PIF ATP Race to Turin, aims to reach back-to-back Vienna QFs to remain on track to make his Nitto ATP Finals debut this year. **Matteo Berrettini** opens the **Center Court** action vs. **Cameron Norrie**, as Italian seeks his fourth QF at the event.

Matteo Berrettini | Age: 29 | World No. 59 | Career-High No. 6 | 2025: 16-15 (3 QFs) | Vienna: 8-3 (2019 SF)
 > Achieved career-high No. 6 after reaching 2022 Australian Open SF, becoming 3rd-highest-ranked Italian since start of PIF ATP Rankings in 1973 (No. 1 Sinner in 2024, No. 4 Panatta in 1976).
 > At 2021 Wimbledon, became 1st Italian men's singles finalist in tournament history and 1st Italian Grand Slam men's singles finalist since Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros.
 > First Italian man to reach QFs of all 4 Grand Slam events and 1st to earn a win at Nitto ATP Finals (d. Thiem in 2019 RR).
 > Owns 42-12 record on grass with 4 of his 10 ATP Tour titles, including 2021 and 2022 London/Queen's Club to become 1st player in Open Era to win titles in each of his 1st 2 appearances at that event.
 > Defeated No. 3 Thiem en route to 2021 ATP Cup team final and No. 3 Ruud en route to 2023 United Cup team final before defeating No. 2 Zverev at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo for biggest win of career.

NOTE: Berrettini earned 12 of his 16 wins this season on hard courts, highlighted by QFs in Doha, Dubai and ATP Masters 1000 Miami. Italian aims to advance to his 37th tour-level quarter-final (22-14), sixth on indoor hard court and fourth in Vienna (2019, 2021, 2024).

Cameron Norrie | Age: 30 | World No. 35 | Career-High No. 8 | 2025: 28-23 (Geneva SF) | Vienna: 4-5 ('21-'23, '25 2R)
 > Broke into Top 10 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 8 in September 2022, joining Henman, Murray and Rusedski as 4th Top-10 British man in history.
 > Advanced to 13 ATP Tour finals from May 2021-February 2023, highlighted by 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title to become 1st British champion in 46-year tournament history.
 > Reached Grand Slam 4R, QF and SF for 1st time at 2022 Wimbledon, falling to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets and advanced to his 2nd Grand Slam QF at 2025 Wimbledon, losing to defending champion Alcaraz.
 > Earned 52 wins in 2021 and 49 wins in 2022 before beating No. 2 Nadal at 2023 United Cup and No. 2 Alcaraz in 2023 Rio de Janeiro final for biggest wins of career.
 > Born in South Africa to a Scottish father and Welsh mother, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

NOTE: Norrie ousted No. 7 seed Rublev in 1R and now seeks 47th tour-level quarter-final, first since his run to Wimbledon QF in July. He bids to be the third Brit to reach Vienna QF in this decade after Evans in 2020 and 2022 and Draper last year, who went on to win the title.

Daniil Medvedev | Age: 29 | World No. 14 | Career-High No. 1 | 2025: 39-21 (Almaty Title) | Vienna: 12-2 (2022 Title)

> Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in 2004.

> Six-time Grand Slam finalist owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.

> Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).

> Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

> Won 19 of his 21 singles titles on hard courts and all 21 of his titles at different events, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami and 2023 Rome, his 1st title on clay.

NOTE: Medvedev is on a 5-match winning streak after capturing Almaty title on Sunday, ending 882-day title drought. He is 15-6 at ATP 500 level this season, including runs to final in Halle (I. to Bublik) and SF of Beijing (I. to Tien) and aims to tie Alcaraz for most tour-level quarter-finals this season (13).

Corentin Moutet | Age: 26 | World No. 36 (Career-High) | 2025: 31-22 (2 Finals) | Vienna: 1-0 (2025 2R)

> Former Top-10 junior ended 2022 at No. 51, broke inside Top 50 in July 2025 and achieved career-high No. 36 in October after earning personal-best 31 wins in 2025, highlighted by finals of Mallorca and Almaty.

> Reached 1st ATP Tour final as 20-year-old at 2020 Doha, becoming youngest French finalist on tour since Gasquet, 20, at 2006 Lyon.

> Beat former champion Wawrinka en route to 2022 US Open 4R, becoming 1st men's lucky loser on record to reach US Open 4R, then reached 4R of 2024 Roland Garros and 3R of 2024 Paris Olympics.

> Defeated future World No. 3 Tsitsipas for 1st Challenger title at 2017 Brest as 18-year-old WC.

> In 2025, recorded first Top 10 wins of career over No. 10 Rune in Rome 3R in 3H 45M and saved 1 MP for biggest win of career over No. 4 Fritz in London/Queen's Club 1R in 2H 54M.

> Enjoys rapping and playing piano, having released an 8-song EP entitled "Ecorche" in 2020.

NOTE: Moutet is 9-26 vs. Top 20, including 3-9 in 2025, seeking first win since defeating No. 14 Medvedev in Washington QF. He is looking for 15th ATP Tour QF, second above ATP 250 level after Washington in July this year to be first French quarter-finalist in Vienna since Monfils in 2019.

Matteo Arnaldi | Age: 24 | World No. 72 | Career-High No. 30 | 2025: 20-23 (Delray Beach SF) | Vienna: 2-1 ('23, '25 2R)
 > Broke into Top 500 in September 2021, Top 200 in August 2022 and Top 100 in May 2023, achieving career-high No. 30 in August 2024 after advancing to 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF in Montreal.
 > Reached 1st ATP Tour QF and SF at 2023 Umag and 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2023 US Open.
 > At ATP Masters 1000 Madrid, defeated No. 4 Ruud to reach 3R in 2023 and No. 5 Djokovic en route to 2025 QF.
 > Owns 59-39 Challenger record (4-2 in finals), highlighted by 1st title on home soil at Francavilla al Mare.
 > Peaked at No. 22 in juniors, posting 80-42 singles record (3 titles) and 34-35 doubles record (2 titles).

NOTE: Arnaldi is 0-5 vs. Top-5, attempting to record the biggest win of his career to reach his 9th ATP Tour QF (3-5), fifth of the season and second indoors after Dallas in February this year. Italian No. 7 aims to be the third qualifier to reach Vienna QF this decade after Tiafoe in 2021 and Mensik last year.

Alexander Zverev | Age: 28 | World No. 3 | Career-High No. 2 | 2025: 49-21 (Munich Title) | Vienna: 12-3 ('21 Title)
 > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal.
 > Led ATP Tour with 6 titles in 2021 and is tied with Alcaraz for most titles among players born since 1990, defeating No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and 2021 Nitto ATP Finals championships.
 > Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.
 > Earned wins over 14-time champion Nadal en route to 2024 Roland Garros final and 10-time champion Djokovic via RET to reach 2025 Australian Open final.
 > Defeated Djokovic at 2017 Rome and Federer at 2017 Montreal for 1st and 2nd of his 7 ATP Masters 1000 titles.
 > Joined Murray and Thiem as 3rd player to defeat Djokovic on hard (3 times), Federer on grass (2016 Halle SF) and Nadal on clay (2 times).

NOTE: Zverev bids to record 50th win of the season for sixth time in his career to become the fourth man this season to achieve the feat after Alcaraz, de Minaur and Fritz. He attempts to advance to his 107th tour-level quarter-final, 12th of the year, to continue his run to quarter-finals in all of his appearances in Vienna (2017, 2021, 2023-24)

Jannik Sinner | Age: 24 | World No. 2 | Career-High No. 1 | 2025: 44-6 (3 Titles) | Vienna: 13-4 (2023 Title)
 > Unranked to begin 2018, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager, broke into Top 10 at age 20 in 2021 and became 1st Italian World No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 22 in 2024, remaining at top of rankings for 65 weeks.
 > At 2024 Australian Open, defeated 10-time champion Djokovic in SF and rallied from 2 sets down in final vs. Medvedev to be 2nd Italian men's singles Grand Slam champion in Open Era (Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros).
 > Joined Federer (2003-04 Wimbledon) and Nadal (2005-06 Roland Garros) as only men this century to successfully defend his 1st Grand Slam title at 2025 Australian Open.
 > Also captured 2024 US Open title to join Djokovic, Federer and Wilander as only men to win both hard-court Grand Slam titles in a season.
 > Became 11th man in Open Era and 2nd youngest behind Courier to reach finals of all 4 Grand Slam events, stopping Alcaraz's 20-match winning streak at the event to win 2025 Wimbledon title.
 > Boasts most titles of any Italian in Open Era (21), including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2023 Toronto, 2024 Miami, 2024 Cincinnati and 2024 Shanghai.
 > Led Italy to 2023 and 2024 Davis Cup titles, first since 1976, became 1st Italian to win Nitto ATP Finals title on home soil in Turin in 2024.

NOTE: Sinner is on a 17-match winning streak on indoor hard courts and 6-match winning streak in Vienna after winning the title 2 years ago. He is 16-0 vs. his countrymen on tour-level in his career and 50-1 vs. players outside Top 20 on hard courts since the start of 2024 season, lone loss to No. 31 Griekspoor via RET in 2025 Shanghai 3R.

Flavio Cobolli | Age: 23 | World No. 22 | Career-High No. 17 | 2025: 30-24 (2 Titles) | Vienna: 2-1 (2024-25 2R)
 > Broke into Top 200 in January 2022 and Top 100 in October 2023, achieving career-high No. 17 in July 2025 after defeating former finalist Cilic to reach 1st Grand Slam QF at Wimbledon.
 > Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Baez to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Bucharest and captured biggest title of his career at 2025 Hamburg.
 > Earned wins over Shelton as No. 15 en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2024 Geneva and as No. 14 to reach 1st final at 2024 Washington and beat No. 9 Rune via RET for 1st Top 10 win at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.
 > Saved 3 MPs vs. Giron to win ATP Tour main draw debut 3-6 7-6 7-6 at 2021 Parma as 429th-ranked WC.
 > Peaked at No. 8 in juniors and ended junior career by winning 2020 Roland Garros boys' doubles title w/Stricker.

NOTE: Cobolli is 1-14 vs. Top 10 (0-6 vs. Top-5), aiming to record the biggest win of his career to reach his 13th tour-level quarter-final, third at ATP 500 level this season after winning Hamburg on clay and reaching Halle QF on grass.

and reached the quarter-finals without losing a set.

He is 0-15 vs. Top 10, aiming to record the biggest win of his career to reach his third ATP 500 QF of the season after Hamburg and Halle to become the 5th man to reach ATP 500 QFs on all 3 surfaces in 2025.

- > Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 20 in January 2023 and Top 10 in May 2025, earning career-high No. 6 in June after advancing to Roland Garros SF.
- > Defeated 19-year-old Alcaraz in 2022 Hamburg final at age 20, marking youngest ATP Tour final since 2005 Bastad (19-year-old Nadal d. 19-year-old Berdych) and did not drop a set en route to 2nd title at 2022 Naples.
- > Upset Tokyo gold medallist Zverev en route to bronze medal at 2024 Paris Olympics, earning 1st Olympic singles medal for Team Italy in tennis since 1924.
- > Earned personal-best 40 wins in 2024, including tour-leading 12 wins on grass courts by reaching 1st Grand Slam SF at Wimbledon and final at London/Queen's Club.
- > In 2025, reached 1st ATP Masters 1000 final in Monte-Carlo and advanced to SFs of Madrid and Rome to become first Italian to reach all 3 clay ATP Masters 1000 and Roland Garros SF in one season.
- > At 2023 Monte-Carlo, earned 1st 6-0 6-0 victory at ATP Masters 1000 level since 2016 over Nardi in 2R before upsetting No. 1 Djokovic in 3R for biggest win of career to reach 2nd ATP Masters 1000 QF.
- > Reached 2018 US Open boys' singles final, won 2019 Australian Open boys' singles title and defeated Wawrinka at 2020 ATP Masters 1000 Rome to become 1st player born in 2002 to win an ATP Tour match.

NOTE: Musetti aims to equal his personal-best 40th win of the season (40 in 2024) and reach his 40th tour-level quarter-final, becoming fourth man born in 2000s to achieve the feat and advance to the last 8 stage at 5 of his 6 last events played after US Open QF, Chengdu final, Beijing QF and Brussels QF last week (lost in Shanghai 4R).
