 > Equalled career-best win over No. 4 Thiem and went 3-0 in singles for Team Poland at 2020 ATP Cup.
 > Advanced to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2019 Indian Wells and won 1st ATP Tour doubles title at 2020 ATP Masters 1000 Paris w/Auger-Aliassime.

- > Behar and Escobar bid to become 1st South American doubles champions at Delray Beach Open.
- > Behar would be 1st Uruguayan doubles champion on ATP Tour since Cuevas at 2017 Vienna w/Bopanna.
- > Escobar would be 1st Ecuadorian doubles champion on ATP Tour since N. Lapentti at 1999 Adelaide w/Kuerten.

> Became 1st qualifier in 7-year tournament history to reach Rio de Janeiro final in 2020.

> Went 43-23 at Challengers in 2019 with titles at Koblenz, Barletta and Biella.

> Never ranked on ITF Junior Circuit and says that he played tennis for fun until age 18.

> Coached by his girlfriend and 6-time Lynn University All-American Valentine Confalonieri.

> Owns 7-4 Davis Cup singles record, highlighted by 7-6(4) 2-6 7-6(8) win over Uchiyama during Ecuador's 3-0 sweep of Japan in 2020 Qualifiers.
> Won 2010 Roland Garros and US Open boys' doubles titles w/Beretta, then chose to go to college and was a 2-time doubles All-American (2012, 2015) and NCAA team champion (2012, 2014).
> Uncle, Andres Gomez, won 1990 Roland Garros title; cousin, Nicolas Lapentti, was also a Top-10 player on ATP Tour.

> Achieved career-high No. 8 in 2018 after reaching 1st Grand Slam SF at Wimbledon (l. to Anderson 26-24 in 5th after 6:36).
> Owns 15 ATP Tour titles, including 5 at Atlanta, 4 at Newport and 2 at Winston-Salem (all tournament records).
> Beat No. 1 Djokovic en route to ATP Masters 1000 finals at 2012 Indian Wells and 2013 Cincinnati, then became oldest 1st-time ATP Masters 1000 champion in history with 2018 Miami title at age 32.
