NITTO ATP FINALS TALKING POINTS

- **Andrey Rublev** or **Casper Ruud** will qualify for his first Nitto ATP Finals semi-final when the Russian and Norwegian meet in Turin on Friday. Rublev is 4-0 in matches and 8-1 in sets against Ruud, reeling off eight straight sets since dropping their first. The winner will meet 2020 champion **Daniil Medvedev** in the semi-finals.
- Rublev hopes to join Medvedev as the first pair of Russians to reach the Nitto ATP Finals semi-finals in the tournament's 52-year history. The last duo from the same country in the semi-finals was **Roger Federer** and **Stan Wawrinka** of Switzerland (2013-15). Federer beat Wawrinka in 2014 and 2015. They did not meet in 2013.
- Ruud is the first Norwegian to compete at the Nitto ATP Finals and the first Scandinavian singles participant since **Robin Soderling** of Sweden in 2010. If he defeats Rublev, the 22-year-old will become the first Scandinavian singles semi-finalist at the Nitto ATP Finals since Soderling in 2009 (l. to **Juan Martin del Potro**).
- Saturday's other semi-final will feature five-time champion **Novak Djokovic** against 2018 champion **Alexander Zverev**. Three former champions are through to the Nitto ATP Finals semi-finals for the first time since 1994. In Frankfurt that fall, past champions **Andre Agassi**, **Boris Becker** and **Pete Sampras** all reached the semi-finals.
- First things first, Djokovic will play his final Green Group match on Friday against British alternate **Cameron Norrie**. Djokovic is attempting to go 3-0 in group play for the sixth time in 14 Nitto ATP Finals appearances. The Serb swept his group matches en route to the title in 2012-14, as well as en route to the final in 2016 and 2018. Djokovic, who is 4-0 in sets this week, hopes to sweep six sets in group play for the third time (also 2014, 2018).
- Djokovic is meeting Norrie for the first time after defeating Rublev in their first meeting and Ruud in their second. Norrie seeks the biggest win of his career in his first meeting with the No. 1 player in the FedEx ATP Rankings.

Nitto ATP Finals History

- Defeated No. 4 Tsitsipas 6-4 6-4 on Monday and lost 1st meeting with No. 1 Djokovic 6-3 6-2 on Wednesday.
- Making 2nd straight Nitto ATP Finals appearance after going 1-2 in 2020. Beat Thiem in final group match last year.
- Joined by Medvedev for 2nd straight year. Only other Russian duo in same year was Kafelnikov and Safin in 2000.
- Hopes to become 3rd Russian champion of Nitto ATP Finals after Medvedev in 2020 and Davydenko in 2009.
- One of 6 participants who competed at Next Gen ATP Finals (also Medvedev, Tsitsipas, Hurkacz, Ruud, Sinner).
- Runner-up at 2017 Next Gen ATP Finals (l. to Chung) and finished 3rd at 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals (d. Munar).
- Bids to become 4th straight #NextGenATP alum to win this title (2018 A. Zverev, 2019 Tsitsipas, 2020 Medvedev).

Career Highlights

- Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 20 in January 2020, Top 10 in October 2020 and Top 5 in September 2021.
- Defeated countryman and World No. 2 Medvedev for biggest win of career and to reach 2nd ATP Masters 1000 final at 2021 Cincinnati.
- Led ATP Tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.
- Went 4-0 in singles to help Russia win 2021 ATP Cup and earned gold medal in All-Russian mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).
- Advanced to Grand Slam QFs at 2017 US Open, 2020 US Open, 2020 Roland Garros and 2021 Australian Open.

CASPER RUUD

Nitto ATP Finals History

- Defeated alternate Norrie 1-6 6-3 6-4 on Wednesday after losing to No. 1 Djokovic 7-6(4) 6-2 on Monday.
- Became 1st Norwegian player to compete in Nitto ATP Finals tournament history (since 1970).
- One of 4 players in singles or doubles field who is making his tournament debut (also Hurkacz, Sinner, Norrie).
- One of 6 participants who competed at Next Gen ATP Finals (also Medvedev, Tsitsipas, Rublev, Hurkacz, Sinner).
- Bids to become 4th straight #NextGenATP alum to win this title (2018 A. Zverev, 2019 Tsitsipas, 2020 Medvedev).

Career Highlights

- Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 8 after winning 5th title of 2021 season and 6th of career at San Diego (d. Norrie).
- Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.
- Also won titles at 2020 Buenos Aires and 2021 Geneva, passing his father and coach Christian as highest-ranked player and 1st ATP Tour champion from Norway.
- Earned biggest career wins en route to ATP Masters 1000 SFs at 2020 Rome (d. No. 8 Berrettini in QF), 2021 Monte Carlo (d. No. 9 Schwartzman in 2R) and 2021 Madrid (d. No. 5 Tsitsipas in 3R).
- Advanced to Grand Slam 4R for 1st time at 2021 Australian Open after qualifying at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open in 2018.

Nitto ATP Finals History

- Beat Rublev 6-3 6-2 on Wednesday and Ruud 7-6(4) 6-2 on Monday to extend his record of 229 wins vs. Top 10.
- In tournament history, tied for 2nd-most championships with Lendl and Sampras (5) behind Federer (6), own 2nd-most wins (40) behind Federer (59), and has made 2nd-most appearances (14) behind Federer (17).
- Bids to become oldest singles champion in tournament history at age 34. Federer holds record at age 30 in 2011.
- Owns record for most consecutive titles in tournament history with 4 from 2012-15. Also won 2008 title.
- Earned 15 straight Nitto ATP Finals wins from 2012-15, excluding walkover from Federer in 2014 final.
- Won his first 5 Nitto ATP Finals title matches before falling to Murray in 2016 final and A. Zverev in 2018 final.
- Qualified and competed at 14 of last 15 editions, only missing 2017 tournament when he ended year at No. 12.

Career Highlights

- Owns FedEx ATP Rankings records for most weeks at No. 1 (347) and most years ended at No. 1 (7).
- One of 3 men to capture record 20 Grand Slam titles (also Federer, Nadal), hold titles at all 4 Grand Slam events at same time (also Budge, Laver) and win all 4 Grand Slam events more than once (also Emerson, Laver).
- Captured 5 Nitto ATP Finals titles overall and is only player to win 4 in a row (2008, 2012-15).
- Only player to win all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events, doing so multiple times for a record total of 37 titles.
- Boasts winning records against Federer (27-23) and Nadal (30-28), as well as win streaks of 43 matches overall (2010-11), record 31 matches at ATP Masters 1000s (2011) and Open Era-record 30 matches at Grand Slams (2015-16).

Nitto ATP Finals History

- Replaced injured Tsitsipas on Wednesday and lost his Nitto ATP Finals debut match to No. 8 Ruud 1-6 6-3 6-4.
- Joins Sinner as 2nd alternate to play in 2 group matches this week – 3rd time in Nitto ATP Finals history that 2 alternates compete (also 1997 Hanover, 1998 Hanover). All 3 instances featured a British player.
 - 2021 Turin: Cameron Norrie (GBR), Jannik Sinner (ITA)
 - 1998 Hanover: Greg Rusedski (GBR) went 2-0, Albert Costa (ESP) went 0-2
 - 1997 Hanover: Tim Henman (GBR) went 1-0, Thomas Muster (AUT) went 0-1
- Became 4th Brit to play singles at Nitto ATP Finals in 52-year tournament history (also A. Murray in 2008-12 and 2014-16; Henman in 1997-98 and 2004; Rusedski in 1997-98).
- One of 3 Brits competing in Turin this week along with J. Murray and Salisbury in doubles.
- One of 4 players in singles or doubles field who is making his tournament debut (also Hurkacz, Ruud, Sinner).
- At age 26, became 2nd-oldest of 10 players to compete in singles this week behind 34-year-old Djokovic.

Career Highlights

- Achieved career-high No. 12 in November 2021 after becoming 1st Brit to win ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells title in 45-year tournament history.
- Won 1st ATP Tour title at 2021 Los Cabos in 5th final of career following runner-up finishes at 2019 Auckland as WC, 2021 Estoril, 2021 Lyon and 2021 London/Queen's Club.
- Earned 50 wins in 2021 after entering season with 51 career wins, highlighted by biggest victories of career over No. 4 Thiem in Lyon 2R and No. 5 Rublev in San Diego SF.
- Reached Grand Slam 3R on 4 occasions, including at 2020 US Open, where he rallied from 2 sets down and saved 2 MPs vs. Schwartzman in 1R.
- Born in South Africa, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University, and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

Nitto ATP Finals History

- American and Brit will ensure qualifying for 2nd straight Nitto ATP Finals SF by winning 1 set vs. Cabal/Farah.
- Beat 2019 champion Herbert/Mahut 6-7(7) 6-0 [13-11] on Wednesday and Murray/Soares 6-1 7-6(5) on Monday.
- Playing for year-end No. 1, squandered 1 MP and 7-1 Match TB lead in 2020 SF vs. Melzer/Roger-Vasselin.
- Making 3rd consecutive appearance as a team. Ram is making 5th appearance overall (also 2016-17 w/Klaasen).
- Klaasen/Ram reached 2016 Nitto ATP Finals championship match, falling to Kontinen/Peers 2-6 6-1 [10-8].
- For 3rd straight year, Ram is lone American in either field. Salisbury is joined by countrymen J. Murray and Norrie.

Ram Career Highlights

- Achieved doubles career-high No. 4 after winning 2021 US Open title w/Salisbury in his 21st consecutive appearance at event (11 different partners).
- Also captured 2020 Australian Open title w/Salisbury, setting an Open Era record by winning 1st Grand Slam men's doubles championship in his 58th appearance.
- Also at the Australian Open, won 2019 and 2021 mixed doubles titles w/Krejcikova and advanced to 2021 men's doubles final w/Salisbury.
- Reached 2016 Nitto ATP Finals championship match w/Klaasen and owns ATP Masters 1000 titles at 2017 Indian Wells w/Klaasen, 2018 Paris w/Granollers and 2021 Toronto w/Salisbury.
- Stopped playing singles in 2017 after winning 2 titles at Newport and peaking at No. 56 in 2016.

Salisbury Career Highlights

- Broke into doubles Top 10 and achieved career-high No. 3 after winning 1st Grand Slam title at 2020 Australian Open w/Ram, then returned to Australian Open final in 2021 w/Ram.
- Went 11-0 at 2021 US Open alongside Ram in men's doubles and Krawczyk in mixed doubles, becoming 1st player to sweep both titles since B. Bryan in 2010.
- Captured 1st Grand Slam mixed doubles title at 2021 Roland Garros w/Krawczyk, then lost to Krawczyk/N. Skupski in 2021 Wimbledon final w/Dart.
- Only Brit to qualify for 2019 and 2020 Nitto ATP Finals in London w/Ram, then won 1st ATP Masters 1000 title at 2021 Toronto w/Ram.
- Never ranked on ITF Junior Circuit and struggled with injuries before playing at University of Memphis (2011-14).

- Qualified for and lost Nitto ATP Finals SFs in 2018 (l. to Herbert/Mahut) and 2019 (l. to Klaasen/Venus).
- First and only Colombians to compete at Nitto ATP Finals in doubles or singles.
- South Americans own 0 Nitto ATP Final doubles titles. Melo of Brazil is only finalist (2014 w/Dodig, 2017 w/Kubot).
- Zeballos of Argentina has already qualified for Nitto ATP Finals doubles SF this week (w/Granollers).

- Making 4th appearance as team after reaching 2016-18 London SFs. Ended 2016 as No. 1 team.
- Murray participated 4 times overall when event was held on his home soil in London (also 2015 w/Peers).
- Soares is making 7th appearance overall (also 2013-14 w/Peya and 2020 w/Pavic). Reached 2013 SF w/Peya.

Murray Career Highlights

- Became 1st British doubles World No. 1 in April 2016 before younger brother A. Murray became 1st British singles World No. 1 in November 2016.
- Grand Slam men's doubles champion at 2016 Australian Open & US Open w/Soares, as well as runner-up at 2015 Wimbledon & US Open w/Peers and 2021 US Open w/Soares.
- Won Grand Slam mixed doubles titles at 2007 Wimbledon w/Jankovic, 2017 Wimbledon w/Hingis, 2017 US Open w/Hingis, 2018 US Open w/Mattek-Sands and 2019 US Open w/Mattek-Sands.
