Stefanos Sakellaridis | Age: 21 | World No. 290 | Career-High No. 286 | 2025: 2-1 (Davis Cup) | Career: 3-4

> Earned 1st ranking point in 2021 at age 16, broke into Top 500 in 2023 and achieved career-high No. 286 in September 2025 after run to Challenger semi-final in Istanbul.

> Playing for Greece at 2023 United Cup, he defeated Bergs to become the first man born in 2004 or later to earn an ATP Tour win and received a WC for 2025 Athens.

> Owns 22-20 Challenger record, highlighted by run to semi-finals at 2023 Zhuhai, 2024 Concepcion as Q, 2025 Zug as Q and 2025 Istanbul and 126-102 on ITF World Tennis Tour (3-5 in finals), winning all 3 titles during 2025 season.

> Defeated No. 98 Struff for biggest win of career at 2025 Roanne CH.

> Comes from a tennis family with sister, Sapfo, current WTA Top 400 player, as well as brothers, Michalis and Dimitris, who are both ranked on [PIF ATP Rankings](#).

NOTE: Sakellaridis seeks the biggest win of his career (0-3 vs. Top 50) to earn his third tour-level of the season after earning 2 wins playing for Greece in Davis Cup vs. Egypt in February. In first ATP Tour event in Greece since 1994, he bids to be the first Greek to earn an ATP Tour win on home soil* since Bavelas at 1990 Athens (d. Azar).

Nuno Borges | Age: 28 | World No. 46 | Career-High No. 30 | 2025: 28-30 (Auckland SF) | Vienna: 0-0 (Debut)

> Became 2nd Portuguese man to break inside Top 50 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973) in 2024, achieving career-high No. 30 in September 2024 after saving 3 MPs vs. Mensik to reach US Open 4R.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2024 Bastad by joining Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Zeballos as only men to defeat Nadal in an ATP Tour final on clay.

> Defeated No. 13 Dimitrov to reach 2024 Aus. Open 4R, becoming 1st Portuguese player in fourth round in tournament's history and earned biggest win of career over No. 8 Ruud to advance to 2025 Roland Garros 3R.

> Advanced to 10 Challenger finals, winning titles at 2021 Antalya-3, 2022 Barletta, 2023 Monterrey, 2023-24 Phoenix and 2023 Maia, his hometown.
 > Five-time All-American during 4-year college career at Mississippi State University, posting 31-match win streak that ended in his last match (l. to Jubb in 2019 NCAA singles final).

NOTE: Borges is 1-6 on indoor hard courts since the start of 2024 season, defeating No. 158 Wawrinka in Marseille 1R earlier this year for lone win. He leads the ATP Tour in wins after losing the 1st set this season (14).

Korda Leads 2-1

Alexei Popyrin | Age: 26 | World No. 47 | Career-High No. 19 | 2025: 17-22 (3 QFs) | Career: 110-134 (3 Titles)

> Achieved career-high No. 19 in August 2025 after reaching QF in ATP Masters 1000 Canada title defense.
 > Posted 5 consecutive Top 20 wins, including saving 3 MPs vs. Dimitrov in 3R en route to 2024 Montreal title, becoming 1st Australian ATP Masters 1000 champion since Hewitt in 2003.
 > Earned biggest win of career over 4-time champion No. 2 Djokovic to reach 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2024 US Open after entering tournament with 0-6 record in Grand Slam 3R matches.
 > Reached 1st ATP Tour SF, advanced to 1st final and won 1st title at 2021 Singapore and beat former champion Wawrinka for 2nd title at 2023 Umag.
 > Qualified 10 times at tour-level events in 2019, tying single-season record set by M. Zverev in 2016.
 > Peaked at No. 2 in junior rankings after ending career with 17 straight wins and 2017 Roland Garros boys' singles title.

NOTE: Popyrin looks for first win since defeating Ruusuvuori in US Open 1R in August, 0-4 since, including loss to Korda in Stockholm 1R and seeks 1st Top 100 win since defeating No. 14 Medvedev and No. 9 Rune to reach ATP Masters 1000 Toronto QF. Australian won his 1st of his 3 ATP Tour titles at 2021 Singapore on indoor hard.

Sebastian Korda | Age: 25 | World No. 54 | Career-High No. 15 | 2025: 19-17 (Adelaide Final) | Career: 144-96 (2 Titles)

> Achieved career-high No. 15 in August 2024, joining Petr Korda (No. 2 in 1998) to become only father-son duo to rank inside Top 20 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973).
 > Earned biggest wins of career en route to ATP Masters 1000 SFs over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 Shanghai and No. 4 Zverev at 2024 Montreal.
 > Did not drop a set en route to 2021 Parma title and captured 2024 Washington title, 32 years after his father, Petr, won in 1992, becoming 1st father-son duo to win the same ATP Tour event.
 > Advanced to 2020 Roland Garros 4R as Q and 2021 Wimbledon 4R, becoming 3rd men's player in Open Era to reach 4R in debut at both events (Borg in 1973, Pernfors in 1986).
 > Became World No. 1 junior by winning 2018 Australian Open boys' singles title 20 years after his father won Australian Open men's singles title.

NOTE: Korda aims to record 20 wins for fifth straight season (31 in 2021, 34 in 2022, 26 in 2023, 31 in 2024) to become the 11th American man to achieve the feat this season. American won 14 of his 19 wins this season on hard courts, highlighted by Adelaide final and run to ATP Masters 1000 Miami QF.
