- The 53rd edition of the Nitto ATP Finals – and second at the Pala Alpitour in Turin – begins on Sunday with **Rafael Nadal** opening his 11th appearance against American **Taylor Fritz** and two-time Grand Slam finalist **Casper Ruud** facing **Felix Auger-Aliassime**, who won 16 matches and three titles in a row earlier this fall.
- In the absence of **Carlos Alcaraz**, Top-2 seeds Nadal and **Stefanos Tsitsipas** control their own destinies in the race for year-end No. 1. Nadal is after his first Nitto ATP Finals title and sixth year-end No. 1 ranking, while 2019 champion Tsitsipas has yet to break into the Top 2. Year-end No. 1 in the Pepperstone ATP Rankings will be...
 - Alcaraz, if neither B nor C occurs
 - Tsitsipas, if he goes 5-0 at Nitto ATP Finals
 - Nadal, if he wins Nitto ATP Finals title OR goes 4-1 as runner-up AND Tsitsipas does not go 5-0
- Novak Djokovic** seeks a record-tying sixth Nitto ATP Finals title in his 15th appearance at the year-end championships. Djokovic, 35, and Nadal, 36, both bid to become the oldest Nitto ATP Finals champion and the second after turning 30. **Roger Federer** won his sixth Nitto ATP Finals championship in 2011 as a 30-year-old.

Career Highlights

- Rose from No. 7 to career-high No. 2 after falling to Alcaraz in 2022 US Open final with No. 1 ranking at stake.
- First Norwegian to break into Top 35, win an ATP Tour title (9), qualify for Nitto ATP Finals (2021 SF), advance to a Grand Slam final (2022 Roland Garros) and reach an ATP Masters 1000 final (2022 Miami).
- Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.
- Former World No. 1 junior leads ATP Tour since start of 2020 season in clay-court wins (70), finals (10) and titles (8).
- Defeated No. 4 A. Zverev on a hard court for biggest win of career en route to 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Miami final.

Career Highlights

- Achieved career-high No. 6 and earned personal-best 56 wins during breakout 2022 season, including career-long 16-match win streak with 3 titles in as many weeks at Florence, Antwerp and Basel.
- Also in 2022, won Rotterdam title to snap 0-8 start to career in finals, clinched ATP Cup for Team Canada (d. Bautista Agut), led Canada to Davis Cup Finals knock-out stage (d. No. 1 Alcaraz) and earned 6 points to help Team World win its 1st Laver Cup (d. Djokovic).
- At 2021 US Open, became 1st Canadian men's singles semi-finalist in tournament history (since 1881).
- Also advanced to Grand Slam QFs at 2021 Wimbledon and 2022 Australian Open.
- As an 18-year-old in 2019, became youngest Top-25 player since Hewitt, 18, in 1999, youngest ATP 500 finalist in series history at Rio de Janeiro (since 2009) and youngest semi-finalist in Miami tournament history (since 1985).

- Qualified 17 times for Nitto ATP Finals (2005-20, 2022) and making 11th appearance overall (1st in Turin).
- Will secure 6th year-end No. 1 ranking by winning 1st Nitto ATP Finals title or by finishing as runner-up with 4-1 record, as long as Tsitsipas does not go 5-0.
- At age 36, hopes to become oldest singles finalist and champion in Nitto ATP Finals tournament history (since 1970).
- Also hopes to set record for most Nitto ATP Finals appearances before winning 1st title (Murray 8 at 2016 London).
- Advanced to Nitto ATP Finals championship match at 2010 London (l. to Federer) and 2013 London (l. to Djokovic).
- Lost SFs to eventual champ in 2006 (l. to Federer), 2007 (l. to Federer), 2015 (l. to Djokovic) & 2020 (l. to Medvedev).
- Owns 6-4 record in opening matches at Nitto ATP Finals, reaching 2 finals and 3 SFs following opening-match wins.
- Won his only title on indoor hard courts as a 19-year-old at 2005 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid (d. Ljubicic in 5th-set TB from 2 sets down). Owns 2 indoor titles overall, adding 2013 Sao Paulo championship on indoor clay (d. Nalbandian).

Career Highlights

- All-time leader with 23 wins vs. World No. 1 and 22 Grand Slam men's singles titles, including most recent of record 14 Roland Garros titles in 2022 to become oldest champion in event history at age 36.
- Only men's player in history to complete career Grand Slam twice and win 2 Olympic gold medals (2008 Beijing singles, 2016 Rio doubles w/M. Lopez).
- Won an ATP Tour title in record 19 straight seasons (2004-22) and ranked in Top 10 for record 895 consecutive weeks (2005-22), including 209 total weeks as No. 1 following 160 straight weeks as No. 2.
- Owns 4th-most wins in Open Era (1,066), including record 406 wins at ATP Masters 1000s and 2nd-most titles at ATP Masters 1000s (36).
