**Aleksandar Kovacevic** | Age: 27 | World No. 69 | Career-High No. 62 | 2025: 12-17 (2 Finals) | Hangzhou: 0-0 (Debut)  
 > Broke into Top 100 in January 2024 after previously peaking at No. 101 in April 2023 and achieved career-high No. 62 in July 2025 after defeating No. 10 Rublev to advance to his 2nd ATP Tour final in Los Cabos.  
 > Defeated countryman McDonald to reach 2022 Seoul SF in ATP Tour main draw debut as 222nd-ranked LL and upset No. 10 Rublev for biggest win of career to reach 1st ATP Tour final at 2025 Montpellier.  
 > Won Challenger titles at Cleveland, Waco, Shenzhen and Temuco in 2023, highlighted by win over Wu Yibing in Cleveland final and captured latest title at 2025 Oeiras-2.  
 > Made Grand Slam debut at 2023 Roland Garros, losing to eventual champion Djokovic in 1R and defeated Tabilo to earn 1st Grand Slam win at 2024 Australian Open.  
 > Played 5 years of college tennis at University of Illinois, where he was a 2-time All-American and graduated in 2021 with finance degree.

**NOTE:** Kovacevic earned 10 of 12 tour-level wins this season on hard courts, highlighted by runs to finals in Montpellier and Los Cabos. He seeks first ATP Tour win on Chinese soil after first round losses in Zhuhai and Shanghai in 2023 and Chengdu and Shanghai last year and would face No. 1 seed Rublev in 2R (2-0 H2H).

**Luca Nardi** | Age: 22 | World No. 85 | Career-High No. 67 | 2025: 8-12 (Dubai QF) | Hangzhou: 0-1 (2024 1R)

> Broke into Top 200 in April 2022, Top 100 in March 2024, then achieved a career-high No. 67 in March 2025 after advancing to 1st ATP Tour QF in Dubai as LL.  
 > Entered 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells as No. 123-ranked LL to become lowest-ranked player to defeat No. 1 Djokovic at an ATP Masters 1000 or Grand Slam event in his career.  
 > Also as a lucky loser, advanced to 4R of 2025 Cincinnati after wins over No. 30 Shapovalov and No. 17 Mensik.  
 > Earned 1st ATP Tour win at 2022 Astana as Q after appearing in main draws of 2020 Antwerp as Q, 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Rome as WC and 2022 Hamburg as Q.

- > Owns 98-66 Challenger record (7-4 in finals), winning 1st title on home soil at 2022 Forlì-1.
- > Coming from same hometown as Moto GP legend Valentino Rossi, he notes riding motorcycles as his biggest passion outside tennis.

**NOTE:** Nardi opens Hangzhou main draw action for second year in a row after losing to Marozsán in first Center Court main draw match of inaugural edition last year. He recorded 7 of his 8 tour-level wins this year on hard courts, including 2 as LL to reach Dubai QF and 3 as LL en route to ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati 4R.

**Mariano Navone** | Age: 24 | World No. 82 | Career-High No. 29 | 2025: 18-21 (Buenos Aires QF) | Hangzhou: 0-0 (Debut)  
> Broke into Top 200 in June 2023, Top 100 in February 2024 and Top 50 in April 2024, achieving career-high No. 29 in June 2024 after capturing 6th Challenger title in Cagliari.

> As No. 31 seed at 2024 Roland Garros, became 1st man in Open Era to be seeded in his Grand Slam main draw debut and defeated former-World No. 10 Carreno Busta in 1R.

> Earned 1st ATP Tour win and advanced to 1st QF, SF and final at 2024 Rio de Janeiro as Q and defeated clay-court champions Darderi, Seyboth Wild and F. Cerundolo en route to 2nd final in Bucharest.

> On home soil, made his ATP Tour debut at 2024 Córdoba as WC and earned biggest win of career over No. 12 Rune to reach 2025 Buenos Aires QF before squandering 2 MPs vs. eventual champion Fonseca in QF.

> Posted 40-18 Challenger record in 2023, ending the season on a 19-2 run and led all players with 5 Challenger titles, winning in Poznań, Santa Fe, Santa Cruz, Buenos Aires and Santa Fe-2.

> Began playing at age 3 as his parents and sister all played tennis and is nicknamed La Navoneta.

**NOTE:** Navone aims to record personal-best 19th win of the season (18 in 2024, 2025) to equal Etcheverry for 2nd-most wins among Argentines this season (behind F. Cerundolo, 33). He is 1-11 vs. higher-ranked opponents on hard courts, lone win over No. 55 Giron in Winston-Salem 2R in August this year (l. to No. 55 Giron in US Open 1R).

**Learner Tien** | Age: 19 | World No. 54 | Career-High No. 48 | 2025: 17-19 (2 SFs) | Hangzhou: 0-0 (Debut)

> Broke into Top 200 in August 2024, Top 100 in January 2025 and Top 50 in August 2025 at career-high No. 48 to be youngest American man ranked inside Top 50 since Roddick in 2002.

> Upset No. 5 Medvedev en route to 2025 Australian Open 4R as Q to be youngest man to defeat a Top-5 player at that event in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973) and No. 2 Zverev at 2025 Acapulco.

> Qualified for 2024 Next Gen ATP Finals, defeating Top-3 seeds, No. 1 Fils, No. 3 Mensik in RR and No. 2 Michelsen in SF to become 1st left-handed finalist in event history.

> Went on a 28-match winning streak from May to July 2024, capturing ITF Tour titles at M15 San Diego (2x), M15 Rancho Santa Fe, M15 Lakewood and 1st Challenger title in Bloomfield Hills.

> Peaked at No. 4 in juniors, highlighted by runs to junior finals of 2023 Australian Open (l. to Blockx) and US Open (l. to Fonseca) and defeated Blockx/Fonseca to capture 2023 Australian Open boys' doubles title w/C. Williams.

**NOTE:** Tien is seeded at an ATP Tour event for first time in his career and is 6-1 in his opening rounds at tour-level events since June, lone loss to No. 7 Djokovic in US Open 1R. 19-year-old is ranked No. 3 on [PIF ATP Live Race to Jeddah](#) for Next Gen ATP Finals, only trailing No. 1 Mensik and No. 2 Fonseca.

**Adrian Mannarino** | Age: 37 | World No. 53 | Career-High No. 17 | 2025: 11-11 (2 times in 4R) | Hangzhou: 0-0 (Debut)  
> Ended 12 straight years in Top 75 of PIF ATP Rankings (2013-24) and became the oldest man to break into Top 20 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 35, achieving career-high No. 17 in January 2024.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title in 7th final of career at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch, 2nd title in 11th final of career at 2022 Winston-Salem.

> Posted personal-best 43 wins in 2023, highlighted by ATP Tour titles in Newport, Astana and Sofia.

> Earned first Top 5 win over No. 5 Cilic to reach biggest final of career at 2017 Tokyo and biggest win of career over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch.

> Reached Australian Open 4R in 2022 and 2024, Wimbledon 4R in 2013, 2017 and 2018 and US Open 4R in 2025 after defeating No. 6 Shelton in 3R via RET and now owns 1-22 record vs. Top-10 players at Grand Slams.

**NOTE:** Mannarino went 6-2 in his two most recent events by reaching 4R of ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati and US Open, his best results this season. 37-year-old, who is the oldest player in the field, reached 15 ATP Tour finals in his career (5-10), including one on Chinese soil, at 2019 Zhuhai (l. to de Minaur).

**Wu Yibing** | Age: 25 | World No. 196 | Career-High No. 54 | 2025: 2-3 (Washington 3R) | Hangzhou: 0-1 (2024 1R)

- > Rose from No. 1,869 in March 2022 to No. 54 in May 2023 after missing March 2019-January 2022 due to injuries.
- > Saved 4 championship points vs. Isner at 2023 Dallas following SF win over No. 8 Fritz, becoming 1st Chinese man to win an ATP Tour title, reach an ATP Tour final and earn a Top-10 win.
- > Qualified at 2022 US Open and became 1st Chinese man to reach US Open 3R in tournament history (since 1881), falling to World No. 1 and defending champion Medvedev.
- > Posted 40-7 record in main draw and qualifying matches across all levels in 2022, winning 3 ATP Challenger Tour titles and an ITF World Tennis Tour title in Orange Park, FL, USA.
- > Swept 2017 US Open boys' singles title and boys' doubles title w/Hsu to become World No. 1 junior, then won Shanghai Challenger title a week later as 496th-ranked WC.

**NOTE:** Hangzhou-native Wu seeks first win in his home town after being forced to retire in 1R to Wong last year. He earned both ATP Tour wins of the season in Washington in July, defeating No. 48 Monfils and No. 24 Popyrin. 25-year-old defeated Mannarino at 2023 Dallas en route to becoming 1st Chinese ATP Tour champion in history
