DAY 7 TALKING POINTS

- Reigning champion and World No. 1 **Jannik Sinner** brings a 23-match winning streak at hard-court Grand Slam events into his US Open 3R encounter with 2020 quarter-finalist **Denis Shapovalov**. At 24 years and 14 days, he bids to become the fourth youngest man to record 20 wins at all 4 Grand Slam events (19-5 at US Open), while Shapovalov aims to earn the biggest win of his career (0-9 vs. World No. 1s).

- American No. 3 **Tommy Paul** closes **Arthur Ashe Stadium** action on Saturday, as he attempts to join countryman Fritz in the fourth round. He takes on No. 23 seed **Alexander Bublik**, who is on a 10-match winning streak and attempts to record his first tour-level win over Paul (0-3 in Lexus ATP Head2Head).
- In an all-Italian battle, World No. 10 **Lorenzo Musetti** faces World No. 26 **Flavio Cobolli**, as both players look for their first US Open 4R. It marks 3rd time in Open Era, 2 Italian men meet in Grand Slam 3R or later, after Lorenzi d. Fabbiano in 2017 US Open 3R and Musetti d. Cecchinato in 2021 Roland Garros 3R. Cobolli and Musetti both aim to reach their 2nd Grand Slam 4R of 2025 (Musetti – Roland Garros SF, Cobolli – Wimbledon QF).
- World No. 3 **Alexander Zverev** takes a 6-2 **Lexus ATP Head2Head** lead into his 3R match vs. **Felix Auger-Aliassime**, but Canadian No. 1 won their sole previous encounter at Grand Slam level, defeating Zverev in 2021 Wimbledon 4R in five sets. Zverev aims to tie Becker and Haas for most hard-court Grand Slam wins among German men (60), while Auger-Aliassime looks for his third US Open 4R after 2020 (4R) and 2021 (SF).

JANNIK SINNER

US Open Stats

- > He is making his 7th US Open main draw appearance, highlighted by becoming 1st Italian man to win the title last year.
- > Last year, defeated No. 1 American Fritz in final in straight sets to win 2nd of his 4 Grand Slam titles, losing just two sets en route to championship to McDonald in 1R and Medvedev in QF.
- > By reaching 2024 SF became 1st man born in 1990 or later to reach Grand Slam semi-finals at all 4 events, before becoming 11th man in Open Era (2nd-youngest behind Courier) to play in all 4 Grand Slam finals at 2025 Wimbledon.
- > Made 2023 4R by defeating former champion Wawrinka in 3R, before losing to 2020 runner-up Zverev in 4h41m.
- > Lost another marathon in 5h 15m in 2022 QF to eventual champion Alcaraz after holding 1 MP in 4th set. Match ended at US Open record 2:50 a.m.
- > Joined Berrettini in 2021 and 2022 as 1st pair of Italian men to reach same US Open 4R in event history (since 1881). Also joined Berrettini in 2022 as 1st pair of Italian men to reach same US Open QF in event history.
- > Squandered 2-set lead and lost 5th-set tiebreak vs. Khachanov in 2020 US Open 1R.
- > Qualified and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 US Open (l. to 2016 champion Wawrinka in 1R).
- > Bids to become 2nd man in history to win both Australian Open and US Open in back-to-back years (Federer 2006-07).
- > Would be the fourth man to reach 5 consecutive Grand Slam finals in Open Era after Federer (10 in 2005-07, 8 in 2008-10), Djokovic (6 in 2015-16, 5 in 2020-21) and Nadal (5 in 2011-12).
- > Aims to be fourth man in Open Era to reach finals of all 4 Grand Slams in a season after Laver (1969), Federer (2006-07, 2009) and Djokovic (2015, 2021, 2023).
- > He is on a 23-match winning streak on hard courts at Grand Slam level, last loss to Zverev in 2023 US Open 4R and 22-1 in Grand Slams this year, lone loss to Alcaraz in Roland Garros final after holding 3 championship points.
- > Attempts to be first man to defend US Open title since Federer won 5 consecutive titles from 2004-08.
- > Boasts 67-1 record vs. players ranked outside Top 20 since the start of 2024 season, lone loss to No. 45 Bublik in Halle 2R this year and aims to record 20th win at US Open, completing the set of 20+ wins at all 4 Grand Slams.
- > Aims to advance to US Open 4R for fifth consecutive year and reach 4R in 16th of last 17 Grand Slam events played (since 2021 US Open), losing to Altmaier in 2023 Roland Garros 2R for lone loss prior to third round.
- > 24-year-old aims to extend his perfect record in Grand Slam third rounds in his career (17-0) and is 15-1 vs. left-handers since the start of 2023 season, lone loss to No. 20 Shelton in 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai 4R.

Career Highlights

- > Unranked to begin 2018, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager, broke into Top 10 at age 20 in 2021 and became 1st Italian World No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 22 in 2024, remaining at top of rankings since (64 weeks).
- > At 2024 Australian Open, defeated 10-time champion Djokovic in SF and rallied from 2 sets down in final vs. Medvedev to be 2nd Italian men's singles Grand Slam champion in Open Era (Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros).
- > Joined Federer (2003-04 Wimbledon) and Nadal (2005-06 Roland Garros) as only men this century to successfully defend 1st Grand Slam title at 2024 Australian Open.
- > Became 11th man in Open Era and 2nd youngest behind Courier to reach finals of all 4 Grand Slam events, stopping Alcaraz's 20-match winning streak at the event to win 2025 Wimbledon title.
- > Captured 2024 US Open title to join Djokovic, Federer and Wilander as only players to win both hard-court Grand Slam titles in a season and became third man to win 1st two Grand Slam titles in one year in Open Era following Connors in 1974 and Vilas in 1977.
- > Boasts most titles of any Italian in Open Era (20), including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2023 Toronto, 2024 Miami, 2024 Cincinnati and 2024 Shanghai.
- > Led Italy to 2023 and 2024 Davis Cup titles, first since 1976, became 1st Italian to win Nitto ATP Finals title on home soil in Turin in 2024.

DENIS SHAPOVALOV

US Open Stats

- > Canadian No. 2 is making his 8th appearance, only missing one edition since 2017 after withdrawing due to knee injury in 2023, and earned wins over Fucsovics 6-4 6-4 6-0 in 1R and Royer 7-6(6) 3-6 7-6(4) 6-3 in 2R so far this week.
- > Advanced to at least 3R in first six appearances at this event, joining Hewitt (1999-04), Federer (2000-05) and Djokovic (2005-10) as only men to achieve that feat in last 30 years at the US Open.
- > Last year, lost to van de Zandschulp in 1R for his first loss prior to 3R at this event.
- > In 2020, became 1st Canadian men's quarter-finalist in tournament history (l. to Carreno Busta in 5 sets).
- > Defeated Auger-Aliassime en route to 2018 3R (l. to Anderson in 5 sets) and 2019 3R (l. to Monfils in 5 sets).

- > Qualified and beat Medvedev, Tsonga and Edmund to reach 2017 US Open 4R as 18-year-old (l. to Carreno Busta).
- > Captured 2015 US Open boys' doubles title w/Auger-Aliassime (d. Holt/R. Smith).
- > By earning his 17th win at US Open, he passed Raonic for most wins at this event among Canadian men in history.
- > One of three players to win multiple hard-court ATP Tour titles this season, after lifting titles in Dallas and Los Cabos (also Alcaraz and Auger-Aliassime, 2).
- > Aims to record his first win over a World No. 1 (0-9) and is 3-6 vs. Top 10 at Grand Slams, earning wins over No. 10 Goffin in 2020 US Open 4R, No. 10 Bautista Agut at 2021 Wimbledon 4R and No. 3 Zverev in 2022 Australian Open 4R.
- > Bids to be the lowest-ranked man to defeat World No. 1 at US Open since No. 37 Clement d. No. 1 Agassi in 2000 2R.
- > Seeks his 6th Grand Slam fourth round, third at US Open (2017, 2020), and first since 2023 Wimbledon.

Career Highlights

- > After becoming 1st Canadian US Open men's singles quarter-finalist in 2020, joined Raonic as 2nd Canadian man in history to break into Top 10.
- > Defeated 2-time champion Murray and earned 5-set wins over Kohlschreiber and Khachanov en route to 1st Grand Slam SF at 2021 Wimbledon.
- > Reached 2019 Paris final and 4 other ATP Masters 1000 SFs, including 2017 Montreal, where he upset No. 2 Nadal and became youngest semi-finalist in series history at age 18 (since 1990).
- > Won 3 of his 4 ATP Tour titles indoors, at 2019 Stockholm, 2024 Belgrade and 2025 Dallas, where he defeated 3 Top 10 players en route to title (No. 4 Fritz in 2R, No. 9 Paul in SF and No. 5 Ruud in F).
- > Ended junior career with 2016 Wimbledon boys' singles title, then broke into Top 50 of PIF ATP Rankings less than 15 months later.

ALEXANDER BUBLIK

US Open Stats

- > Kazakhstan's No. 1 player is competing in 7th consecutive US Open main draw (2019-25).
- > Reached best US Open result in main draw debut in 2019 (d. Giraldo, Fabbiano, I. to Andujar in 3R), also advancing to 2R in 2021 (d. Hanfmann) and 2022 (d. Gaston).
- > Lost to former champion Thiem in 2023 1R and to Shang in 1R last year.
- > One of 3 men to capture 3+ tour-level titles this year alongside Alcaraz (6) and Darderi (3).
- > He is on a 10-match winning streak and is 19-2 since the start of Roland Garros, highlighted by Halle, Gstaad, Kitzbuhel titles and win over No. 1 Sinner in Halle 2R.
- > Defeated 2014 champion Cilic 6-4 6-1 6-4 in 1R and Schoonkate 6-3 6-3 6-3 in 2R to equal his best result at US Open.
- > He rose 5 spots to No. 19 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#) and would jump to No. 17 with a win.
- > Aims to advance to his third Grand Slam fourth round after 2023 Wimbledon and Roland Garros earlier this year, when he became first man representing Kazakhstan to advance to a Grand Slam quarter-final in history.
- > Also bids to become first man representing Kazakhstan to reach US Open 4R (Bublik 0-1, Kukushkin 0-5 in 3R).
- > He is 4-9 vs. Top 20 at Grand Slam level, 2-1 in 2025, seeking second Top 20 win at this level outside Roland Garros after defeating No. 16 Pouille in 2017 Australian Open 1R, also owns 5-2 record vs. Top 20 since April (24-49 in career).

Career Highlights

- > Achieved career-high No. 17 in May 2024 after becoming the 1st ATP Tour champion (since ATP Tour was established in 1990) to come back from a set down in every match en route to his 4th title in Montpellier.
- > In Halle, earned five Top 25 wins in as many matches to capture 2023 title and recorded biggest win of career over No. 1 Sinner en route to 2025 title.
- > Earned 1st Top 5 win over No. 3 A. Zverev in 2022 Montpellier final for 1st ATP Tour title in 5th final.
- > Upset No. 9 de Minaur from 2 sets down and No. 6 Draper en route to 2025 Roland Garros QF, becoming 1st man representing Kazakhstan to become Grand Slam quarter-finalist.
- > Won 6th and 7th title in back-to-back weeks in Gstaad and Kitzbuhel to go 16-5 on clay in 2025 after entering the season with 21-32 record on the surface.
- > In doubles, advanced to 2021 Roland Garros final with countryman Golubev and 2020 Australian Open SF with countryman Kukushkin.

TOMMY PAUL

US Open Stats

- > No. 3 American is making his 8th US Open main draw appearance, debuting as No. 437-ranked qualifier in 2015.
- > Advanced to US Open 4R in back-to-back years, losing to eventual champion No. 1 Sinner in 2024 4R.
- > In 2023, rallied from 2 sets down for the first time in career to defeat Safiullin in 2R en route to first US Open 4R, then lost to compatriot Shelton after defeating him in Aus. Open QF earlier in the season.
- > Rallied from 2-sets-to-1 down to beat Zapata Miralles in 2022 1R and Korda in 2R before losing to eventual finalist Ruud 6-0 in 5th set in 3R. Was 0-4 in US Open main draws prior to 2022.
- > Lost in US Open 1R in 2015 (l. to Seppi), 2017 (l. to Daniel), 2020 (l. to Dimitrov) and 2021 (l. to Carballes Baena).
- > Made tour-level debut at 2015 US Open as an 18-year-old qualifier, then reached boys' singles final (l. to Fritz).
- > Defeated Auger-Aliassime in 3 sets and de Minaur 6-0 6-0 en route to 2015 US Open boys' singles final.
- > Aims to set his personal-best for most Grand Slam wins in a season (11 in 2023, 2024, 2025), owning 11-3 record at this level in 2025 after advancing to Australian Open and Roland Garros QFs and Wimbledon 2R.
- > Defeated Moller 6-3 6-3 6-1 in 1R and Borges 7-6(6) 6-3 5-7 5-7 7-5 in 2R and now seeks US Open 4R for third consecutive year, his 8th 4R at Grand Slam level in career.
- > One of two American men left in the singles draw after Fritz advanced to 4R on Friday (d. Kym).
- > He is 6-14 vs. Top 30 in Grand Slams, 1-4 at US Open (d. No. 21 Davidovich Fokina in 2021 3R), and seeks first Top 30 on hard courts (at any level) since defeating No. 10 Dimitrov in Stockholm final in October last year.

Career Highlights

- > Former World No. 3 junior achieved career-high No. 8 in June 2025 after becoming first American man since Agassi in 2003 to advance to both Australian Open and Roland Garros QFs in a single season.
- > At 2023 Australian Open, became 1st American man to reach SF of that event since Roddick in 2009.
- > Earned 7 wins over Top-5, including biggest win of career over No. 1 Alcaraz to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF at 2023 Toronto.
- > Defeated junior rivals Fritz and Tiafoe en route to 1st ATP Tour final and title at 2021 Stockholm.
- > Earned personal-best 45 wins during 2024 season, highlighted by titles in Dallas, London/Queen's Club and Stockholm and advanced to ATP Masters 1000 SFs in Indian Wells and Rome.
- > Won 2015 Roland Garros boys' singles title (d. Fritz), advanced to 2015 Roland Garros boys' doubles final w/Blumberg and reached 2015 US Open boys' singles final (l. to Fritz).
