DAY TWO FAST FACTS

- Three-time US Open champion **Rafael Nadal** meets 2018 US Open quarter-finalist **John Millman** inside Ashe.
- Nadal is 14-0 in US Open 1R. He is 33-1 at US Open against opponents outside Top 50 (l. to No. 54 **Mikhail Youzhny** in 2006 QF). No. 60 Millman is 1-14 vs. Top 10 overall (d. No. 2 **Roger Federer** in 2018 US Open 4R).
- Nadal is 1 of 6 players who won an ATP Tour hard-court title in July or August (ATP Masters 1000 Montreal). However, a hard-court champion from July or August has gone on to win the US Open title only once in the last five years. **Novak Djokovic** captured both the ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati and US Open titles in 2018.
- No. 8 seed **Stefanos Tsitsipas** faces 2017 US Open quarter-finalist **Andrey Rublev** and #NextGenATP Canadians **Felix Auger-Aliassime** and **Denis Shapovalov** meet for the second straight year in the US Open first round. Tsitsipas, Rublev, Auger-Aliassime and Shapovalov are among the nine Top 50 players who are under age of 22.

- Six American men play Tuesday, including **Frances Tiafoe**, who meets **Ivo Karlovic** for 1st time on Court 17. Karlovic, 40, is oldest player in US Open men's singles since 42-year-old **Ken Rosewall** reached 3R in 1977.
- World No. 14 **John Isner**, who meets **Guillermo Garcia-Lopez**, is No. 1 American at US Open for 8th straight year.
- Former No. 1 American **Steve Johnson** faces **Nick Kyrgios** in what the Aussie describes as the "graveyard shift." Johnson vs. Kyrgios is scheduled as the last match of the day -- 2nd on Louis Armstrong Stadium after 7 pm.

- Earned biggest win of career over No. 6 Tsitsipas en route to Wimbledon 3R (l. to Verdasco).
- Withstood 67 aces to defeat Opelka in 5th-set TB and reach Australian Open 3R (l. to Dimitrov).
- Qualified and snapped 9-match tour-level losing streak en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at Eastbourne (l. to Querrey).
- Also qualified at Rotterdam (l. to Tsonga in 1R) and Dubai (l. to Verdasco in 1R).
- Defeated countryman Sonogo to reach Gstaad QF (l. to Stebe).

Career Highlights

- > Achieved career-high No. 70 on 18 September 2017 soon after run to US Open 3R. Enjoyed 1st Top 100 finish in 2017. One of 4 Italians to end 2017 in Top 100 (also Fognini, Lorenzi and Seppi).
- > Qualified and snapped 9-match tour-level losing streak en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2019 Eastbourne. Earned 1st 2 ATP Tour wins en route to 1st QF at 2016 Chennai as Q.
- > Advanced to Grand Slam 3R on 4 occasions: 2017 US Open, 2018 Wimbledon, 2019 Australian Open and 2019 Wimbledon. Defeated 3-time Grand Slam champion Wawrinka in 2018 Wimbledon 2R. Withstood 67 aces to beat Opelka in 2019 Australian Open 2R. Upset No. 6 Tsitsipas for biggest win of career in 2019 Wimbledon 1R.
- > Owns 167-144 record on ATP Challenger Tour (6-2 in finals). Won titles in 2017 at Quanzhou, CHN; Gimcheon, KOR and Seoul, KOR. Boasts Challenger wins over past or present Top 20 players Basilashvili, Berrettini, Cecchinato, Chung, Granollers, Hrbaty, Ramos-Vinolas and Shapovalov.
- > Peaked at No. 6 in junior rankings on 2 April 2007. Captured 2007 Roland Garros boys' doubles title w/Karatchenia.

2019 in Review

- Advanced to 4th straight Roland Garros SF and 2nd straight final (d. No. 1 Djokovic in 5 sets, l. to Nadal).
- Earned 3rd career win over player ranked No. 1 and snapped Djokovic's 26-match Grand Slam win streak.
- Captured biggest title of career at ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells (d. 5-time champion Federer).
- Joined 8-time ATP Masters 1000 champion Muster as 2nd Austrian to win an ATP Masters 1000 title.
- Did not drop a set en route to titles at Barcelona (d. Nadal and Medvedev) and Kitzbuhel (d. Ramos-Vinolas).
- Beat Nadal on clay for 4th straight season and became 2nd player to earn 4+ wins over Nadal on clay (Djokovic 7).
- Saved 2 MPs vs. Federer in ATP Masters 1000 Madrid QF (l. to No. 1 Djokovic in SF). Now 4-2 vs. Federer overall.
- One of 5 players with winning record vs. Federer in at least 5 matches (also Djokovic, Nadal, Kafelnikov, Corretja).
- Ranked in Top 10 each week since 6 June 2016 -- 2nd-longest active streak (Nadal since 25 April 2005).
- Fell in Buenos Aires SF as 2-time champion (l. to Schwartzman in 3rd-set TB after holding 1 MP).
- Reached doubles finals w/Schwartzman at Buenos Aires (l. to M. Gonzalez/Zeballos) and Madrid (l. to Rojer/Tecau).
- Retired in Australian Open 2R vs. Popyrin (ill). Withdrew from Cordoba (ill), Halle (fatigue) and Cincinnati (ill).

Career Highlights

> Achieved career-high No. 4 on 6 November 2017. Ranked in Top 10 each week since 6 June 2016 -- 2nd-longest active streak (Nadal since 25 April 2005). Peaked at No. 2 in juniors on 3 January 2011.

> Posted 50+ wins and qualified for Nitto ATP Finals in 2016, 2017 and 2018. Earned career-high 58 wins in 2016 with 22-3 record in deciding sets, saving 1 MP vs. Nadal en route to Buenos Aires title and 2 MPs vs. Federer en route to Stuttgart title.

> First Austrian to reach 2+ Grand Slam finals, finishing as Roland Garros runner-up to Nadal in 2018 and 2019. Also advanced to Roland Garros SF in 2016 and 2017. Lost 2018 US Open QF to Nadal in 5th-set TB after 4 hours, 49 minutes. Reached 2011 Roland Garros boys' singles final.

> Defeated 5-time champion Federer to capture biggest of 14 titles at 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells. Beat 5-time champion Nadal en route to 2nd straight ATP Masters 1000 Madrid final in 2018. Ended Nadal's 50-set clay win streak, which began after Austrian beat him in 2017 ATP Masters 1000 Rome QF.

> Beat Nadal on clay in 4 straight seasons (2016-19), becoming 2nd player with 4+ clay wins over Spaniard (Djokovic 7). Defeated World No. 1 in 3 straight seasons, beating Murray at 2017 Barcelona, Nadal at 2018 Madrid and Djokovic at 2019 Roland Garros. Also boasts 4-2 record vs. Federer. One of 2 players with clay-court wins over entire Big Four (also Wawrinka).

- Advanced to QFs at Sydney (l. to Simon), Acapulco (l. to Isner in 3 TBs) and Winston-Salem (l. to Johnson).
- Snapped 5-match losing streak en route to Wimbledon 3R (d. Delliën and Djere, l. to Querrey).
- Lost 5-setters to Bautista Agut in Australian Open 2R and A. Zverev in Roland Garros 1R.
- One of 3 Aussies to earn 1st Davis Cup win in Australia's 4-0 victory over Bosnia-Herzegovina (d. Dzumhur).
- Withdrew from Marrakech and retired in Estoril 2R vs. Domingues due to left foot injury.

Career Highlights

- > Achieved new career-high ranking 10 times in 2018, peaking at No. 33 on 15 October soon after reaching US Open QF. Rose from No. 1,101 on 18 August 2014 to No. 71 on 17 August 2015 after recovering from right shoulder surgery. Fell to No. 235 on 28 August 2017 following groin surgery.
- > Defeated defending champion Pouille and saved 3 MPs vs. Bedene en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2018 Budapest. Advanced to 1st ATP SF at 2016 Winston-Salem.
- > At hometown tournament in Brisbane, made ATP Tour debut in 2010 and earned 1st career win in 2013 (d. Ito). Owns 4-7 Brisbane record with 3-set losses to No. 3 Murray in 2013, No. 2 Federer in 2015 and No. 3 Dimitrov in 2018.
- > Upset 5-time champion and World No. 2 Federer for biggest win of career and to reach 1st Grand Slam QF at 2018 US Open. Advanced to 3R at 2016 Australian Open, 2016 Wimbledon, 2017 US Open and 2019 Wimbledon.
- > Owns 143-76 record on ATP Challenger Tour (11-6 in finals). Defeated countrymen in his last 3 Challenger finals at 2017 Hua Hin, THA (d. Whittington); 2018 Kyoto, JPN (d. Thompson) and 2018 Aix-en-Provence, FRA (d. Tomic). Boasts Challenger wins over one-time Top 10 players Baghdatis, Dimitrov and J. Melzer.

2019 in Review

- Captured 12th Roland Garros and 18th Grand Slam title overall (d. Federer and Thiem). Improved to 24-0 in Roland Garros SFs and finals, 93-2 overall at Roland Garros and 118-2 in best-of-5-set matches on clay.
- Became 1st men's or women's player to win a Grand Slam event 12 times. Margaret Court won Aus. Open 11 times.
- At age 33, became oldest Roland Garros champion since 34-year-old Gimeno in 1972.
- Captured ATP Masters 1000 titles at Rome (d. No. 1 Djokovic) and Montreal (d. Medvedev).
- Now owns ATP Masters 1000 records for titles (35), finals (51) and wins (381).
- Set an Open Era record by winning title for 16th straight season (2004-19) -- breaking tie with Federer (2001-15).
- Ranked in Top 10 for 750 consecutive weeks (25 April 2005-9 September 2019) -- surpassing Federer's longest run from 2002-16. Connors holds record of 789 consecutive weeks in Top 10 (23 August 1973-3 October 1988).
- Did not drop a set en route to 5th Australian Open final. Did not win a set for 1st time in 26 Grand Slam finals (l. to No. 1 Djokovic). Defeated #NextGenATP players de Minaur in 3R, Tiafoe in QF and Tsitsipas in SF.
- Five weeks after defeating Federer in Roland Garros SF, lost to him in Wimbledon SF. Owns 24-16 H2H lead.
- Squandered 3 MPs and lost 3rd-set TB to eventual champion Kyrgios in Acapulco 2R.
- Conceded walkover in ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells SF vs. Federer due to right knee injury. Withdrew from Brisbane (thigh strain), ATP Masters 1000 Miami (right knee) and ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati (fatigue).

Career Highlights

- > Finished 2008, 2010, 2013 and 2017 as World No. 1. Ranks 6th all-time with 196 total weeks at No. 1. Spent 750 consecutive weeks in Top 10 since 25 April 2005, including record 160 straight weeks at No. 2 before passing Federer for No. 1 on 18 August 2008.
- > Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals in 15 straight seasons (2005-19). Made 8 appearances and still seeking 1st year-end title after finishing as runner-up in 2010 and 2013. Owns only 1 indoor hard-court title (2005 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid).

> Captured 83 titles, including unprecedented 12 at Roland Garros, 11 at ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo and 11 at Barcelona. Greatest of all time on clay with 59 titles and .918-win percentage (436-39). Owns 118-2 record in best-of-5-set matches on clay (.983). Enjoyed record win streaks on a single surface of 81 matches (2005-07) and 50 sets (2017-18). Boasts most ATP Masters 1000 titles of all time with 35. Only player to sweep Roland Garros and all 3 clay-court ATP Masters 1000 events in a single season (2010).

> Second all-time with 18 titles and 26 finals at Grand Slams, trailing only Federer's 20 titles and 31 finals. As 24-year-old at 2010 US Open, became youngest man in Open Era to complete career Grand Slam. One of 3 men to win a Grand Slam title in teens, 20s and 30s (also Sampras, Rosewall). Captured 1st of 12 Roland Garros titles as 19-year-old in 2005 and remains youngest Grand Slam champion since Chang, 17, at 1989 Roland Garros. Earned 900th win of career in 2018 Roland Garros 3R en route to title (d. Gasquet).

> Won Olympic gold medals in singles at 2008 Beijing and doubles at 2016 Rio w/M. Lopez. One of 2 men to win all 4 Grand Slams and Olympic gold medal in singles (also Agassi). Led Spain to Davis Cup titles in 2004, 2009 and 2011. Owns all-time record with 24 straight Davis Cup singles and doubles wins since 2005.

- Captured 2nd tour-level title at Marseille (d. Kukushkin) and 3rd tour-level title at Estoril (d. Cuevas).
- Upset No. 2 Nadal for biggest win of career and to reach 2nd ATP Masters 1000 final at Madrid (l. to No. 1 Djokovic).
- At age 20, became youngest player to beat Nadal on clay. Also youngest with wins over Nadal, Djokovic & Federer.
- Saved 12/12 BPs to defeat 6-time champion Federer en route to Australian Open SF (l. to Nadal).
- Became youngest Grand Slam semi-finalist since Djokovic, 20, at 2007 US Open.
- Also became youngest Australian Open semi-finalist since Roddick, 20, in 2003.
- Achieved career-high No. 5 on 5 August. First Greek to reach Top 10, Top 5, Grand Slam QF and Grand Slam SF.
- Reached Dubai singles final (l. to Federer) and ATP Masters 1000 Miami doubles final w/Koolhof (l. to Bryan/Bryan).
- Advanced to Roland Garros 4R, losing to 2015 champion Wawrinka 8-6 in 5th after 5 hours, 9 minutes.
- Squandered 1 MP vs. Kyrgios in Washington SF. Played doubles at Washington w/Kyrgios (l. to Cabal/Farah in 1R).

Career Highlights

- > First Greek player to break into Top 5, win an ATP Tour title, reach an ATP Masters 1000 final and advance to a Grand Slam SF. Achieved new career-high ranking 14 times in 2018 and 7 times in 2019, peaking at No. 5 on 5 August 2019. Became No. 1 junior on 23 May 2016 and went on to win Wimbledon boys' doubles title w/Raisma.
- > Swept 5 matches to win 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals title. Followed in footsteps of 2017 champion Chung by reaching Australian Open SF after triumph in Milan. Upset 6-time champion Federer in 4R. Youngest Grand Slam semi-finalist since Djokovic, 20, at 2007 US Open.
- > Advanced to 2018 Toronto final by becoming youngest player to post 4 Top 10 wins at a single event since ATP Tour was established in 1990 (d. Thiem, Djokovic, A. Zverev and Anderson). Youngest ATP Masters 1000 finalist since Djokovic, 19, at 2007 Miami.
- > Earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Nadal to reach 2nd ATP Masters 1000 final at 2019 Madrid. Youngest of 23 players to defeat Nadal on clay. Also youngest of 26 players with wins over Nadal, Djokovic and Federer.
- > Won titles at 2018 Stockholm, 2019 Marseille and 2019 Estoril. Led tour by qualifying at 8 events in 2017, including ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai, where he beat Khachanov for 1st win in 9th match.

- Advanced to 3rd ATP Tour final of career at Hamburg (d. Thiem in QF, l. to Basilashvili).
- Earned biggest career win over No. 3 Federer in 62 minutes to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at Cincinnati as Q (l. to eventual champion Medvedev). Quickest loss by Federer since 2003 Sydney 1R (l. to Squillari in 54 minutes).
- Also qualified at ATP Masters 1000 events in Miami (l. to Shapovalov in 3R) and Monte-Carlo (l. to eventual champion Fognini in 1R). Reached ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells 3R as LL (l. to Khachanov).
- Did not drop a set en route to Indian Wells, USA Challenger final (l. to Edmund).
- Teamed with Donskoy in Russia's 3-1 Davis Cup win over Switzerland (l. to Kym/Laaksonen in 3rd-set TB).
- Withdrew from Roland Garros and Stuttgart qualifying due to wrist injury.
