Benjamin Bonzi (FRA) vs [WC] Feliciano Lopez (ESP)

First Meeting

Benjamin Bonzi | Age: 25 | World No. 58 | Career-High No. 52 | 2022: 9-10 (Marseille SF) | Stuttgart: 0-0 (Debut) > Achieved career-high No. 52 in May, two months after advancing to 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells 3R. > Earned 50 wins and 6 titles on ATP Challenger Tour in 2021, tying with 4 other players for 2nd-most Challenger titles in a single season behind Griekspoor (8 in 2021).

> Defeated No. 15 Karatsev for biggest win of career and to reach 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 Marseille.

> Qualified at 2018 Wimbledon, 2020 Roland Garros and 2021 Wimbledon after defeating future World No. 1 Medvedev in tour-level debut at 2017 Roland Garros as WC.

> Ended junior career by winning 2014 Roland Garros boys' doubles title with countryman Halys.

NOTE: Bonzi is playing in his 3rd tour-level event on grass, he has a 1-2 tour-level grass record, winning his 1R match at 2021 Wimbledon (d. No. 205 Trungelliti).

Feliciano Lopez | Age: 40 | World No. 113 | Career-High No. 12 | 2022: 0-5 | Stuttgart: 15-11 (2017 Final) > Former World No. 12 ended 2021 at No. 106 after finishing 19 straight years in Top 100 (2002-20).

> Captured singles and doubles titles at 2019 London/Queen's Club as 37-year-old, becoming oldest player to sweep both titles at same event since Rosewall, 40, at 1975 Jackson.

> Counts victories over No. 1 Nadal (2010 London/Queen's Club) and No. 1 Djokovic (2016 Dubai) among his 39 Top-10 wins and 503 singles wins overall.

> Three-time Wimbledon quarter-finalist competed in record 79th consecutive Grand Slam men's singles main draw at 2022 Australian Open.

> Defeated No. 1 seeds and previous 3 champions to win 2016 Roland Garros doubles title w/M. Lopez.

NOTE: Lopez is making his 12th appearance in the event, first time in 2001 on clay (I. to No. 101 Hipfl in 1R).

Oscar Otte | Age: 28 | World No. 61 | Career-High No. 53 | 2022: 10-11 (Munich SF) | Stuttgart: 0-0 (Debut) > Broke into Top 400, Top 300 and Top 200 in 2017 before entering Top 100 in January 2022 and achieving career-high No. 53 in May 2022.

> Reached 1st ATP Tour QF at 2022 Belgrade and 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 Munich in back-to-back weeks.

> Qualified at Roland Garros, Wimbledon and US Open in 2021, earning 6 straight wins to reach US Open 4R.
> Squandered 2-set lead vs. countryman A. Zverev in 2021 Roland Garros 1R and 2-sets-to-1 lead vs. 2-time champion Murray in 2021 Wimbledon 2R.

> Captured 5 Challenger titles, including Ismaning, Ortisei and Bari in fall 2021.

NOTES: Otte's 2nd tour-level event on grass after qualifying and reaching 2R at 2021 Wimbledon (I. to No. 118 Andy Murray).

Daniel Altmaier | Age: 23 | World No. 59 | Career-High No. 54 | 2022: 3-12 (Pune QF) | Stuttgart: 0-0 (2017 Q1) > Finished at No. 100 in 2021 year-end rankings and reached career-high No. 53 in May 2022.

> Won Challenger titles in 2022 at Heilbronn, and 2021 at Braunschweig, Ludenscheid, and Puerto Vallarta.

> Made Grand Slam qualifying debut at 2020 RG and earned 6th win of tournament over No. 8 Berrettini to reach 4R.

> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SFs of career in back-to-back weeks at Umag and Kitzbuhel in July 2021.

> Hits a one-handed backhand and says his idols growing up were fellow one-handers Federer and Wawrinka.

NOTE: Altmaier is 1-11 on tour-level this season outside of his quarter-final run in Pune in February.

Giron Leads 1-0 6-7(1) 6-3 6-4

Marcos Giron | Age: 28 | World No. 53 | Career-High No. 49 | 2022: 8-15 (Dallas SF) | Stuttgart: 0-0 (2021 Q1) > Achieved career-high No. 49 in May 2022 after advancing to ATP Masters 1000 Rome 3R as a lucky loser. > Qualified en route to ATP Masters 1000 Paris 3R in both 2020 and 2021, earning biggest win of career over No. 10 Berrettini in 2020.

> Also in city of Paris, rallied from 6-2 6-4 5-1 down and saved 3 MPs vs. Dimitrov en route to 2021 Roland Garros 3R.

> Began 2019 with Orlando Challenger title as World No. 308 and ended 2019 with Houston Challenger title as World No. 123 (d. Karlovic after saving 6 MPs).

> Turned pro in 2014 after winning NCAA singles title for UCLA, then underwent surgeries on both hips and missed 8+ months in 2016.

NOTE: Giron is 2-10 in his last 12 tour-level matches, winning both matches in his run to 3R at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Rome as a lucky loser (d. No. 15 Schwartzman).

Jan-Lennard Struff | Age: 32 | World No. 103 | Career-High No. 29 | 2022: 1-8 (1-2 at ATP Cup) | Stuttgart: 5-6 (2019 SF) > Achieved career-high No. 29 after reaching 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2020 Cincinnati, but fell to No. 99 in May 2022 after suffering right foot injury.

> On home soil, advanced to 1st ATP Tour singles final at 2021 Munich and earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Medvedev in 2021 Halle 1R.

Posted personal-best 35 victories in 2019, highlighted by 1st Grand Slam 4R appearance at Roland Garros.
In 2018, became 1st player in Open Era to rally from 2 sets down in Wimbledon 1R and 2R (d. L. Mayer and Karlovic).

> Lost in qualifying at 20 tour-level events before qualifying for 1st time at 2013 Roland Garros and earning 1st tourlevel win at 2013 Wimbledon as Q (d. Kavcic).

NOTE: Struff is playing in his first match since retiring vs. Martinez in 1R at 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Miami in March and was out since due to ongoing toe injury. He is 0-6 on tour-level this season outside of ATP Cup.

[6] Lorenzo Sonego (ITA) vs Benoit Paire (FRA)

First Meeting

Lorenzo Sonego | Age: 26 | World No. 32 | Career-High No. 21 | 2022: 12-14 (Buenos Aires SF) | Stuttgart: 0-0 (Debut) > Earned personal-best 30 wins and achieved career-high No. 21 in 2021, sweeping Cagliari titles to become 1st Italian champion on home soil in singles since 2006 and in doubles since 2005 (w/Vavassori).

> Broke into Top 50 after saving championship point vs. Kecmanovic to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Antalya.
> Upset No. 1 Djokovic 6-2 6-1 en route to 2020 Vienna final, becoming 1st lucky loser to defeat Djokovic and equaling fewest games ever conceded to Djokovic in a match.

> Saved 1 MP vs. Thiem en route to 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Rome SF, becoming 1st Italian semi-finalist at Foro Italico since 2007 and 2nd since 1978.

> Beat Fritz 7-6(5) 6-3 7-6(17) to reach 2020 Roland Garros 4R, winning longest men's singles TB in event history.

NOTE: Sonego has a 11-6 career tour-level record on grass, including ATP Tour title at 2019 Antalya, final at 2021 Eastbourne and 4R at 2021 Wimbledon.

Benoit Paire | Age: 33 | World No. 80 | Career-High No. 18 | 2022: 3-15 (Aus. Open 3R) | Stuttgart: 7-6 (2017 SF) > Rose 99 spots during season to end 2015 at No. 19, then reached career-high No. 18 in January 2016.

> In 2015, won 1st ATP Tour singles title (Bastad), 3 Challenger titles and 1 Futures title to become 1st player to sweep titles at all 3 levels since Darcis in 2007.

> Earned personal-best 34 wins in 2019, adding 2 more ATP Tour titles at Marrakech and Lyon.

> Advanced to Grand Slam 4R on 4 occasions, including at 2015 US Open after saving 2 MPs to defeat 2014 finalist Nishikori in 1R.

> Defeated No. 3 Wawrinka for biggest win of career at 2017 Madrid, lost to Wawrinka in biggest of 9 career finals at 2015 Tokyo and teamed w/Wawrinka for lone doubles title at 2013 Chennai.

NOTE: Paire is playing in his 16th tour-level event of the season, winning tour-level matches only at Australian Open (d. No. 79 Monteiro, No. 28 Dimitrov) and Geneva (d. No. 61 Ruusuvuori).
