Sumit Nagal | Age: 27 | World No. 84 | Career-High No. 68 | 2024: 5-15 (5 times in 2R) | Metz: 0-0 (Debut)

> Earned 1st ranking point at age 16 in 2013, broke into Top 200 in 2019 and Top 100 in February 2024 by winning 5th Challenger title in Chennai, achieving career-high No. 68 in July 2024.

> Made ATP Tour debut on home soil at 2018 Pune as Q and Grand Slam debut at 2019 US Open as Q (l. to 5-time champion Federer in 1R), then reached 1st ATP Tour QF at 2021 Buenos Aires.

> Defeated Arnaldi in 2024 Monte-Carlo 1R as Q to become the first Indian to earn an ATP Masters 1000 win on clay.

> Owns 129-106 Challenger record (6-4 in finals), picking up titles at 2017 Bangalore, 2019 Buenos Aires, 2023 Rome, 2023 Tampere, 2024 Chennai and 2024 Heilbronn.

> Peaked at No. 23 in juniors in 2015 and went 88-53 in juniors with wins over future Top 10 players Berrettini, Hurkacz, Shapovalov and Tiafoe, ending junior career by winning 2015 Wimbledon boys' doubles title w/Ly.

NOTE: Nagal is seeking his first indoor ATP Tour win and first hard-court tour-level win since Australian Open in January (d. No. 27 Bublik in 1R, l. to Shang). He is 1-14 against Top 100 players across all levels since ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo (d. No. 66 Diaz Acosta in Basel Q1) and is the first Indian player in singles in tournament history.

Corentin Moutet | Age: 25 | World No. 70 | Career-High No. 51 | 2024: 11-16 (Santiago SF) | Metz: 0-1 (2018 1R)

> Former Top-10 junior ended 2022 at career-high No. 51 after winning 6th Challenger title of career at Szczecin and advancing to ATP Masters 1000 Paris 3R as Q.

> Reached 1st ATP Tour final as 20-year-old at 2020 Doha, becoming youngest French finalist on tour since Gasquet, 20, at 2006 Lyon.

> Beat former champion Wawrinka en route to 2022 US Open 4R, becoming 1st men's lucky loser on record to reach US Open 4R, then reached 4R of 2024 Roland Garros and 3R of 2024 Paris Olympics.

- > Defeated future World No. 3 Tsitsipas for 1st Challenger title at 2017 Brest as 18-year-old WC.
- > Enjoys rapping and playing piano, having released an 8-song EP entitled “Ecorche” in 2020.

NOTE: Moutet aims to snap a 6-match tour-level losing streak since beating Mejia in Winston-Salem in August and seeks first indoor ATP Tour win since defeating No. 13 Norrie in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Paris 2R.

[8] Alex Michelsen (USA) vs [WC] Harold Mayot (FRA)

First Meeting

- Alex Michelsen** | Age: 20 | World No. 44 | Career-High No. 43 | 2024: 28-28 (2 Finals) | Metz: 0-0 (Debut)
- > #NextGenATP player broke inside Top 50 in August 2024 after reaching 3rd ATP Tour final in Winston-Salem and achieved career-high No. 43 in September 2024.
 - > Became the youngest American man in Grand Slam 3R since Young at 2007 US Open, reaching 3R at Australian Open.
 - > Earned 1st ATP Tour win and reached 1st QF, SF and final at 2023 Newport, becoming youngest American ATP Tour finalist since Fritz at 2016 Memphis and reached 2nd final at 2024 Newport (held 1 MP vs. Giron in final).
 - > Defeated No. 9 de Minaur for the biggest win of career in 2024 Los Cabos 2R, before squandering 3 MPs in QF against eventual champion Thompson.
 - > Also reached 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati doubles final w/McDonald after defeating him in qualifying.
 - > Reached career-high No. 25 in ITF Juniors, highlighted by 2022 Wimbledon boys' doubles title w/Gorzny.

NOTE: Michelsen is seeded at an ATP Tour event for the 4th time in career, reaching two finals as a seeded player (Newport final, Washington QF, Winston-Salem final). He is No. 2 on [PIF ATP Race to Jeddah](#), looking to make second Next Gen ATP Finals appearance after getting eliminated in Round Robin stage last year.

- Harold Mayot** | Age: 22 | World No. 107 | Career-High No. 103 | 2024: 4-8 (Montpellier QF) | Metz: 2-1 (2023 QF)
- > Former world No. 1 junior earned 1st ranking point in 2019, broke into Top 500 in March 2020, Top 200 in May 2023 and achieved career-high No. 103 in October 2024.
 - > Reached 1st ATP Tour QF as Q in his hometown at 2023 Metz and 2nd QF at 2024 Montpellier as WC.
 - > Qualified and earned 1st tour-level win at 2023 Wimbledon over compatriot Bonzi (l. to Pella in 2R).
 - > Made ATP Tour debut at 2020 Marseille and Grand Slam debut at 2020 Roland Garros as a WC.
 - > Owns 79-65 Challenger record (0-5 in finals), reaching finals at 2022 Tampere, 2023 Mallorca, 2024 Barletta, 2024 Ilkley, and 2024 Orleans .
 - > Beat compatriot and doubles partner Cazaux in the 2020 Australian Open boys' singles final to become the first Frenchman to win the title since Sidorenko in 2006.

NOTE: Metz-native Mayot reached 1st of 2 ATP Tour QFs at this event last year as Q (l. to eventual champion Humbert). He is 1-6 vs. Top 50 including Challengers, beating No. 44 Nakashima in 2023 Aix-en-Provence CH 2R.
