## DAY SIX FAST FACTS

- No. 2 and three-time US Open champion **Rafael Nadal** and No. 6 **Alexander Zverev** are the two highest seeds remaining in the bottom half of the draw. They are two wins away from meeting in the quarter-finals.
- Nadal is looking to reach the 4R-better in his 13th straight Grand Slam tournament played. Nadal is 10-2 in 3R matches in Flushing Meadows (l. to Fognini in 2015 and Blake in 2005).
- Three players in action – **Alexander Bublik**, [Q] **Hyeon Chung** and Zverev have won their first two matches in five sets. Seven of the 16 players on the schedule – **Pablo Andujar**, **Aljaz Bedene**, [24] **Matteo Berrettini**, Bublik, Chung, **Alexei Popyrin** and **Tennys Sandgren**, - are appearing in the 3R for the first time at the US Open.

#### 2019 in Review

- Did not lose more than 3 games in a set to qualify for US Open (d. Ofner, Napolitano and M. Ymer). Then beat [WC] Escobedo in 5 sets in 1R on Tuesday and followed with another 5-set win over [32] Verdasco.
- Earned 1st win of career from 2 sets down at Australian Open (d. Klahn, l. to Herbert in 2R).
- Lost openers at Pune (l. to Gulbis in 2R), Auckland (l. to Statham in 1R) and Rotterdam (l. to Basilashvili in 1R).
- Inactive from 11 February through 29 July due to back injury.
- Fell to No. 170 in ATP Rankings on 26 August -- lowest since No. 173 on 29 December 2014.
- Returned from injury and captured 9th ATP Challenger Tour title of career at Chengdu, CHN (d. Sugita).

#### Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 20 and achieved career-high No. 19 on 2 April 2018. Passed Nishikori in ATP Rankings on 19 March 2018 to end Japanese player's 7-year reign as No. 1 Asian. Peaked at No. 7 in juniors on 14 January 2013.
- > Went 5-0 and defeated No. 1 seed Rublev twice, including in final, to capture 2017 Next Gen ATP Finals title. Reached 11 QFs-or-better in 2018, but still seeking 1st tour-level final of career.
- > Earned biggest win of career over No. 4 A. Zverev and upset former champion Djokovic en route to 2018 Australian Open SF. Became 1st South Korean to reach Grand Slam QF and SF.
- > Also became 1st South Korean to reach an ATP Masters 1000 QF, doing so back-to-back at Indian Wells and Miami in 2018.
- > Won 70+ percent of matches on ATP Challenger Tour (84-27) and ITF Junior Circuit (84-32). Defeated Kyrgios and Coric en route to 2013 Wimbledon boys' singles final.

### 2019 in Review

- Captured 12th Roland Garros and 18th Grand Slam title overall (d. Federer and Thiem). Improved to 24-0 in Roland Garros SFs and finals, 93-2 overall at Roland Garros and 118-2 in best-of-5-set matches on clay.
- Became 1st men's or women's player to win a Grand Slam event 12 times. Margaret Court won Aus. Open 11 times.
- At age 33, became oldest Roland Garros champion since 34-year-old Gimeno in 1972.
- Captured ATP Masters 1000 titles at Rome (d. No. 1 Djokovic) and Montreal (d. Medvedev).
- Now owns ATP Masters 1000 records for titles (35), finals (51) and wins (381).
- Set an Open Era record by winning title for 16th straight season (2004-19) -- breaking tie with Federer (2001-15).
- Ranked in Top 10 for 750 consecutive weeks (25 April 2005-9 September 2019) -- surpassing Federer's longest run from 2002-16. Connors holds record of 789 consecutive weeks in Top 10 (23 August 1973-3 October 1988).
- Did not drop a set en route to 5th Australian Open final. Did not win a set for 1st time in 26 Grand Slam finals (l. to No. 1 Djokovic). Defeated #NextGenATP players de Minaur in 3R, Tiafoe in QF and Tsitsipas in SF.
- Five weeks after defeating Federer in Roland Garros SF, lost to him in Wimbledon SF. Owns 24-16 H2H lead.
- Squandered 3 MPs and lost 3rd-set TB to eventual champion Kyrgios in Acapulco 2R.
- Conceded walkover in ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells SF vs. Federer due to right knee injury. Withdrew from Brisbane (thigh strain), ATP Masters 1000 Miami (right knee) and ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati (fatigue).

### Career Highlights

- > Finished 2008, 2010, 2013 and 2017 as World No. 1. Ranks 6th all-time with 196 total weeks at No. 1. Spent 750 consecutive weeks in Top 10 since 25 April 2005, including record 160 straight weeks at No. 2 before passing Federer for No. 1 on 18 August 2008.
- > Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals in 15 straight seasons (2005-19). Made 8 appearances and still seeking 1st year-end title after finishing as runner-up in 2010 and 2013. Owns only 1 indoor hard-court title (2005 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid).
- > Captured 83 titles, including unprecedented 12 at Roland Garros, 11 at ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo and 11 at Barcelona. Greatest of all time on clay with 59 titles and .918-win percentage (436-39). Owns 118-2 record in best-of-5-set matches on clay (.983). Enjoyed record win streaks on a single surface of 81 matches (2005-07) and 50 sets (2017-18). Boasts most ATP Masters 1000 titles of all time with 35. Only player to sweep Roland Garros and all 3 clay-court ATP Masters 1000 events in a single season (2010).
- > Second all-time with 18 titles and 26 finals at Grand Slams, trailing only Federer's 20 titles and 31 finals. As 24-year-old at 2010 US Open, became youngest man in Open Era to complete career Grand Slam. One of 3 men to win a Grand Slam title in teens, 20s and 30s (also Sampras, Rosewall). Captured 1st of 12 Roland Garros titles as 19-year-old in 2005 and remains youngest Grand Slam champion since Chang, 17, at 1989 Roland Garros. Earned 900th win of career in 2018 Roland Garros 3R en route to title (d. Gasquet).
- > Won Olympic gold medals in singles at 2008 Beijing and doubles at 2016 Rio w/M. Lopez. One of 2 men to win all 4 Grand Slams and Olympic gold medal in singles (also Agassi). Led Spain to Davis Cup titles in 2004, 2009 and 2011. Owns all-time record with 24 straight Davis Cup singles and doubles wins since 2005.

**2019 in Review**

- No. 3 Russian collected his 3rd Top 10 win since July over No. 8 Tsitsipas in 1R on Tuesday to improve to 3-1 on the season (was 1-9 vs. Top 10 opponents from 2015-18).
- Advanced to 3rd ATP Tour final of career at Hamburg (d. Thiem in QF, l. to Basilashvili).
- Earned biggest career win over No. 3 Federer in 62 minutes to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at Cincinnati as Q (l. to eventual champion Medvedev). Quickest loss by Federer since 2003 Sydney 1R (l. to Squillari in 54 minutes).
- Also qualified at ATP Masters 1000 events in Miami (l. to Shapovalov in 3R) and Monte-Carlo (l. to eventual champion Fognini in 1R). Reached ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells 3R as LL (l. to Khachanov).
- Did not drop a set en route to Indian Wells, USA Challenger final (l. to Edmund).
- Teamed with Donskoy in Russia's 3-1 Davis Cup win over Switzerland (l. to Kym/Laaksonen in 3rd-set TB).
- Withdrew from Roland Garros and Stuttgart qualifying due to wrist injury.

**Career Highlights**

- > Achieved career-high ranking 12 times and broke into Top 150, Top 100 and Top 50 during 2017 season. Peaked at No. 31 on 19 February 2018 and posted 20+ wins in both 2017 and 2018. Earned 1st ranking point at age 15 on 15 July 2013 after reaching Haskovo, BUL Futures QF.
- > Went 3-2 at Next Gen ATP Finals in both 2017 and 2018. Runner-up as No. 1 seed in 2017 before finishing 3rd in 2018.
- > Enjoyed 1st ATP Tour SF, final and title at 2017 Umag as LL. Saved 1 MP vs. Pella to reach 2nd final at 2018 Doha and beat No. 4 Thiem en route to 3rd final at 2019 Hamburg. Playing in hometown, won 1st doubles title at 2015 Moscow w/Tursunov as 18-year-old WC. Youngest ATP doubles champion since Nadal, 17, at 2004 Chennai. Reached 2nd doubles final at 2018 ATP Masters 1000 Miami w/Khachanov.
- > Defeated No. 9 Dimitrov en route to 2017 US Open QF as 19-year-old. Youngest US Open quarterfinalist since Roddick, 19, in 2001. Earned biggest career win over No. 3 Federer in 62 minutes to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2019 Cincinnati as Q. Quickest loss by Federer since 2003 Sydney.

> Finished 2014 as World No. 1 junior. Posted 109-38 record on ITF Junior Circuit with wins over future Top 35 ATP players Chung, Djere, Fritz, Tsitsipas and A. Zverev. Won 2014 Roland Garros boys' singles title and reached 2014 Wimbledon boys' doubles final w/Kozlov.

- Won ATP 500 titles at Acapulco (d. A. Zverev) and Washington (d. Medvedev). Owns 5-2 record vs. Top 10 in 2019.
- Saved 3 MPs vs. Nadal in Acapulco 2R and 1 MP vs. Tsitsipas in Washington SF.
- Hit 44 aces to beat Harrison in Brisbane 1R -- 2nd-most ever recorded in Best-of-3-set match (l. to Chardy in 2R).
- Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R-or-better for 4th straight year (l. to Coric in 4R).
- Fell to No. 72 in ATP Rankings on 25 February -- lowest since No. 144 on 30 June 2014.
- Teamed with Tsitsipas and lost to World No. 1 Cabal/Farah in Washington 1R and ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati 1R.
- Withdrew from Rotterdam and Houston due to knee injury, as well as Roland Garros due to illness.

### Career Highlights

- > Ended 2016 at career-high No. 13, finishing season as youngest player in Top 20 at age 21. Broke into Top 50 as 19-year-old on 5 January 2015. Earned 1st ATP ranking point at age 16 on 9 April 2012 after qualifying and winning a round at Kofu, JPN Futures.
- > Saved 3 MPs vs. No. 2 Nadal en route to 2019 Acapulco title and 1 MP vs. Tsitsipas en route to 2019 Washington title. Won career-high 3 titles and 39 matches in 2016. One of 2 men to win 1st meeting with Djokovic, Nadal and Federer (also Hewitt). Owns 20 victories overall vs. Top 10 opponents.
- > Upset No. 1 Nadal and saved 9 MPs vs. Gasquet en route to 2014 Wimbledon QF as 19-year-old WC ranked 144th. Youngest player to beat No. 1 at a Grand Slam since Nadal at 2005 Roland Garros and lowest-ranked since No. 193 Olhovskiy at 1992 Wimbledon. Also reached 2015 Australian Open QF at age 19. Youngest Australian Open quarter-finalist since Cherkasov in 1990.
- > Beat No. 2 Nadal en route to biggest career final at 2017 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati. Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 Miami SFs in 2016 and 2017. Defeated No. 2 Federer in 3 TBs at 2015 Madrid and upset No. 2 Djokovic for 2nd time in 2 weeks at 2017 Indian Wells.
- > Became World No. 1 junior on 21 January 2013. Defeated Kokkinakis for 2013 Australian Open boys' singles title. Won boys' doubles titles at 2012 Roland Garros w/A. Harris, 2012 Wimbledon w/A. Harris and 2013 Wimbledon w/Kokkinakis.

- Reached Roland Garros QF for 2nd time (l. to No. 1 Djokovic) and Australian Open 4R for 1st time (l. to Raonic).
- One of 5 men under 23 to reach Australian Open 4R -- most at a Grand Slam since 2009 Roland Garros (5).
- Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 QFs at Madrid (d. Ferrer in 2R, l. to Tsitsipas) and Montreal (l. to Khachanov).

- Won 2nd and 4th rubber of Germany's 5-0 win over Hungary in Davis Cup Qualifiers (d. Nagy and Borsos).

### Career Highlights

- > Reached career-high No. 3 on 6 November 2017. Achieved new career-high ranking 8 times in 2017 and 14 times in 2016. Youngest player in year-end 2018 Top 10, 2017 Top 20, 2016 Top 50, 2015 Top 100 and 2014 Top 200.
- > Captured biggest title of career at 2018 Nitto ATP Finals (d. No. 1 Djokovic for biggest career win). First German to win title since Becker in 1995. Also qualified in 2017 (1-2 in RR).
- > Beat Wawrinka at age 19 for 1st of 11 titles at 2016 St. Petersburg, becoming youngest ATP Tour champion since Nishikori, 18, at 2008 Delray Beach. Won singles and doubles titles w/M. Zverev at 2017 Montpellier -- 1st brothers to sweep titles since Murrays at 2011 Tokyo. Rallied from 2-sets-to-1 down in 3 straight matches to reach 1st Grand Slam QF at 2018 Roland Garros.
