First Tour-Level Meeting

#### DAY FOUR HIGHLIGHTS

- Three former US Open champions No. 2 **Roger Federer**, No. 6 **Novak Djokovic** and No. 7 **Marin Cilic** headline Thursday's second round action. The four other former US Open winners in the top half of the draw won their first round matches. In addition there are seven Frenchmen among the 16 matches in the order of play. The 10 Frenchmen overall in the second round is the most at the US Open since there were 12 in 2010.
- In the first men's match on Arthur Ashe Stadium, five-time champion **Federer** brings a 6-0 head-to-head record (13-1 in sets) against **Benoit Paire**. In their last meeting in the 2R of Halle on June 21, Federer saved two match points before prevailing 9-7 in a third set tie-break. Federer is looking to remain unbeaten in the first two rounds in Flushing Meadows. He is 17-0 in second round and 18-0 in first round matches. Paire is 6-33 lifetime vs. Top 10 opponents and he's lost his last eight matches since beating No. 3 Wawrinka in the 2R at ATP Masters 1000 Madrid in May 2017. The 29-year-old Frenchman is 1-8 in Grand Slam play vs. Top 10 opponents with his lone win coming over No. 4 Kei Nishikori in the 1R of the 2015 US Open.
- In the evening session on Ashe, two-time champion **Djokovic** takes on American **Tennys Sandgren** for the second time. Djokovic cruised to a 63 61 62 victory over Sandgren in the 1R of Wimbledon en route to his fourth title at the All England Club. Djokovic has compiled an outstanding 28-4 record since a 6-6 start, highlighted by his 13th Grand Slam title at Wimbledon and 31st ATP Masters 1000 title at Cincinnati to become the first player to win the career Golden Masters (all nine Masters 1000 tournaments). Sandgren is 2-2 against Top 10 opponents with both wins coming at the Australian Open in January over No. 8 Wawrinka and No. 5 Thiem en route to the quarter-finals.
- On Louis Armstrong Stadium, No. 4 Alexander Zverev attempts to reach the third round at the US Open for the first time in four appearances as he takes on lucky loser Nicolas Mahut. In their only previous meeting in the first round of Marseille in February 2017, the Frenchman prevailed in two tie-breaks. Ther 21-year-old #NextGenATP German star has lost in the second round the past two years. He leads the ATP World Tour this season with 44 match wins. Mahut is 5-38 lifetime against Top 10 opponents (0-9 in Grand Slam play) and he is looking to snap an 11-match losing streak since his last win over No. 10 Wawrinka in the 2013 's-Hertogenbosch final. In the evening session, Gael Monfils and No. 21 Kei Nishikori meet for the fifth time (Nishikori leads 3-1).
- On Grandstand, No. 17 and top Frenchman Lucas Pouille, takes on Marcos Baghdatis for the first-time in a tour level tournament and 2014 champion Cilic follows against #NextGenATP qualifier Hubert Hurkacz of Poland. The Croat won the only previous meeting in four sets at Roland Garros on May 31.
- On Court 17, No. 30 Nick Kyrgios meets Frenchman Pierre-Hugues Herbert followed by #NextGenATP stars
  Alex de Minaur and Frances Tiafoe. The winner will make their second straight Grand Slam third round showing
  after both advanced to the 3R at Wimbledon. The 19-year-old Aussie is No. 4 in the ATP Race to Milan standings
  and the 20-year-old American follows at No. 5. The Next Gen ATP Finals will be held Nov. 6-10 in Milan.

#### 2018 in Review

- Improved to 7-1 in 1R matches at US Open with 76 36 75 76 win over Austrian [Q] Novak on Tuesday.
- Advanced to SFs at Pune (d. Fucsovics after saving 5 MPs in 2R, I. to Anderson) and Sydney (I. to de Minaur).
- Lost 10 of last 11 ATP World Tour SFs since reaching biggest final of career at 2015 Tokyo.
- Upset 6-time champion Djokovic in ATP Masters 1000 Miami 2R (I. to Krajinovic in 3R).
- Squandered 1 MP vs. Simon in Marrakech 1R, but reached doubles final w/Roger-Vasselin (I. to Mektic/Peya).
- Also squandered 2 MPs against 9-time champion Federer in Halle 2R.
- Fell to No. 231 Krueger in ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells 1R -- 15th loss to player outside Top 100 since 2016.
- Withdrew from Rotterdam due to back injury.

- > Rose 99 spots to finish 2015 at No. 19, then reached career-high No. 18 on 11 January 2016 following run to Chennai SF. Finished 5 of last 6 seasons in Top 50 (2012-13, 2015-17).
- > Captured 1st ATP World Tour singles title at 2015 Bastad without dropping a set. Also in 2015, won Futures title at Bressuire, FRA and Challenger titles at Bergamo, ITA; Quimper, FRA; and Mouilleron Le Captif, FRA. Became 1st player since Darcis in 2007 to win a tour-level, Challenger and Futures title in same season.
- > Posted double-digit win totals in 7 straight seasons (2012-18). Played 30+ tournaments in 2013, 2016 and 2017, including all 4 Grand Slams and 9 ATP Masters 1000 events. Reached 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF and SF at 2013 Rome.
- > Defeated No. 3 Wawrinka for biggest win of career in 2017 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid 2R. Lost to Wawrinka in biggest final of career at 2015 Tokyo. Teamed w/Wawrinka for lone doubles title at 2013 Chennai.
- > Saved 2 MPs to beat Nishikori en route to 2015 US Open 4R. Also reached 2017 Wimbledon 4R. Won a 5-setter at 4 straight Grand Slam events from 2016 Roland Garros through 2017 Australian Open.

#### 2018 in Review

- Opened on Tuesday night with a 62 62 64 win over Nishioka to improve to 18-0 in 1R US Open matches.
- Became oldest World No. 1 in 45-year history of ATP Rankings at age 36 on 19 February.
- Owns records for most weeks at No. 1 (310), years since debut at No. 1 (14) and years between stints at No. 1 (5).
- Extended records with 20th Grand Slam title and 30th final at Australian Open (d. Cilic). Tied record with 6th AO title.
- Secured No. 1 ranking with Rotterdam QF win (d. Haase). Went on to win 97th ATP World Tour title (d. Dimitrov).
- Clinched No. 1 most recently with Stuttgart SF win (d. Kyrgios in 3rd-set TB). Went on to win 98th title (d. Raonic).
- Ranked No. 1 for 6 weeks from 19 February-1 April, 1 week from 14-20 May and 1 week from 18-24 June.
- Tied his own record with 34 straight sets won at Wimbledon before squandering 1 MP in QF (I. to Anderson).
- Held in 100 straight service games at ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati (I. to Djokovic in final after being broken 3 times).
- Saved 2 MPs vs. Paire en route to 12th Halle final (I. to Coric).
- Enjoyed career-best 17-0 start before squandering 3 MPs vs. Del Potro in ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final.
- Fell to Del Potro in 3rd-set TB. Now 1-8 in championship matches decided by final-set TB.
- Also lost 3rd-set TB to No. 175 Kokkinakis in ATP Masters 1000 Miami 2R -- worst loss by World No. 1 since same tournament and round in 2003 (No. 178 Clavet d. No. 1 Hewitt).
- Skipped clay-court season and has not played on surface since 12 May 2016 (I. to Thiem in Rome 3R).

- > Enjoyed record 310 weeks at No. 1, including record 237 straight from 2 February 2004 to 17 August 2008. Became oldest World No. 1 in 45-year history of ATP Rankings at age 36 on 19 February 2018. Ended 5 seasons as No. 1 (2004-07, 2009), tied with Connors (1974-78) for 2nd-most year-end No. 1 finishes behind Sampras (1993-98).
- > Holds Nitto ATP Finals records for titles (6), finals (10), SFs (14), appearances (15) and wins (55), capturing championship in 3 cities (Houston 2003-04, Shanghai 2006-07, London 2010-11) and 5 times with 5-0 record (2003-04, 2006, 2010-11).
- > Owns 98 titles, 2nd-most in Open Era behind Connors' 109. Also trails only Connors in wins with 1,166 to American's 1,256. Earned 1,000th victory in 2015 Brisbane final over Raonic. Enjoyed career-long 41-match win streak (2006-07), reached 17 straight finals (2005-06), posted 24-match win streak in finals (2003-05), won 24 straight matches vs. Top 10 (2003-05) and earned record 65 consecutive victories on grass (2003-08). Went 81-4 in 2005 (.953) for highest win percentage since McEnroe went 82-3 in 1984 (.965). Boasts 10 wins vs. World No. 1 and 10 wins from 2 sets down. Never retired in 1,639 matches on tour (1,421 singles and 218 doubles).
- > Greatest of all time at Grand Slams with 20 titles in 30 finals and 336 victories overall. One of 8 men to win all 4 majors, securing career Grand Slam at 2009 Roland Garros. Captured record 8th Wimbledon title in 2017. Second-oldest Grand Slam champion in Open Era behind Rosewall (1972 Australian Open). Owns Open Era records for consecutive Grand Slam finals (10), SFs (23) and QFs (36). Won 16 of 27 Grand Slam events from 2003 Wimbledon through 2010 Australian Open, then 1 of 27 from 2010 Roland Garros through 2016 US Open. Owns 27 titles and 359 wins at ATP Masters 1000 events, including Indian Wells/Miami 'Sunshine Double' in 2005-06 and 2017.
- > Two-time Olympic medalist, taking gold in doubles at 2008 Beijing w/Wawrinka and silver in singles at 2012 London. Finished 4th in singles at 2000 Sydney. Clinched 2014 Davis Cup title for Switzerland by beating Gasquet for 50th Davis Cup win of career (SUI d. FRA 3-1).

# 2018 in Review

- Won 50th straight Grand Slam 1R match Tuesday over Fucsovics 63 36 64 60 and improved to 13-0 in 1R at US Open.
- Ended career-long 54-week title drought by winning 4th Wimbledon and 13th Grand Slam title overall (d. Anderson).
- As World No. 21, became lowest-ranked Grand Slam champion since No. 44 Gaudio at 2004 Roland Garros.
- Improved to 27-25 vs. Nadal by defeating World No. 1 in Wimbledon SF 10-8 in 5th after 5 hours, 15 minutes.
- Improved to 24-22 vs. Federer by beating World No. 2 for ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati title.
- Became 1st player to win titles at all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events since start of series in 1990.
- Earned 800th career win in London/Queen's Club QF (d. Mannarino), but squandered 1 MP in final (l. to Cilic).
- Advanced to Roland Garros QF-or-better for 9th straight year (I. to Cecchinato in QF).
- Reached ATP Masters 1000 Rome QF-or-better for 12th straight season (I. to Nadal in SF).
- Started year 6-6 with 3 straight losses to Chung in Aus. Open 4R, Daniel in Indian Wells 2R and Paire in Miami 2R.
- Fell to No. 22 in ATP Rankings on 21 May -- lowest since No. 22 on 2 October 2006. Returned to Top 10 on 16 July.
- Underwent surgery on right elbow shortly after Australian Open, which was his 1st tournament in 6 months.

- > Ended 4 years as World No. 1 (2011-12, 2014-15). One of 7 players to finish 4+ seasons at No. 1 along with Sampras (6), Connors (5), Federer (5), Lendl (4), McEnroe (4) and Nadal (4). Spent 223 total weeks at No. 1, 5th all-time behind Federer's 310, Sampras' 286, Lendl's 270 and Connors' 268. Finished Top 3 and earned 60+ wins in 10 straight seasons (2007-16).
- > Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals in 10 straight years (2007-16), capturing 5 titles overall and becoming 1st player to sweep 4 straight titles (2008, 2012-15).
- > Owns 70 singles titles, 6th-most in Open Era, including 13 Grand Slams (4th all-time) and 31 ATP Masters 1000s (2nd behind Nadal's 33). Won 2+ titles each year from 2006-18, including all 4 Grand Slam and 9 ATP Masters 1000 events. Only player with titles at all 9 ATP Masters 1000s since start of series in 1990. Enjoyed win streaks of 43 matches overall (2010-11), 31 matches at ATP Masters 1000s (2011) and 30 matches at Grand Slams (2015-16). One of 3 active players with 800+ victories (also Federer, Nadal), earning 800th win in 2018 London/Queen's Club QF (d. Mannarino). Owns winning records against Nadal (27-25), Federer (24-22) and Murray (25-11).

- > Swept titles at 2015 Wimbledon, 2015 US Open, 2016 Australian Open and 2016 Roland Garros, becoming 8th player to complete career Grand Slam and 3rd to hold all 4 major titles at one time (also Budge, Laver). Tied with Emerson and Federer for most Australian Open titles in history (6). Loss to Querrey in 2016 Wimbledon 3R snapped streaks of 28 QFs, 9 SFs, 6 finals and 4 titles in a row at Grand Slams.
- > Won 2008 Beijing Olympics bronze medal, then led Serbia to 2010 Davis Cup title with straight-set wins over Simon and Monfils (SRB d. FRA 3-2). Lost in 2012 London Olympics bronze medal match and 2013 Davis Cup final, despite defeating Stepanek and Berdych in straight sets (CZE d. SRB 3-2).

#### 2018 in Review

- Earned first US Open win over Djokovic's countryman Troicki 63 64 62 on Tuesday. Last year lost to No. 7 Cilic in 1R.
- Earned 1st 2 Top 10 wins over No. 8 Wawrinka and No. 5 Thiem en route to Australian Open QF (I. to Chung).
- As World No. 97, became lowest-ranked Australian Open quarter-finalist since No. 105 Tillstrom in 1996.
- Became 1st player to earn 1st Grand Slam win en route to QFs since Verkerk at 2003 Roland Garros.
- Also became 1st player to reach 1st tour-level QF at a Grand Slam since Kyrgios at 2014 Wimbledon.
- Advanced to 1st ATP World Tour SF and final at Houston (d. Karlovic, l. to Johnson).
- Lost 5 straight matches before reaching Geneva QF (I. to Fognini).
- Squandered 1 MP vs. Fognini in Rio de Janeiro 2R and 3 MPs vs. Tiafoe in Estoril 1R.
- Broke into Top 50 and achieved career-high No. 47 in ATP Rankings on 16 April.
- Withdrew from Quito due to fatigue, as well as 's-Hertogenbosch, Halle Q and Eastbourne due to arm injury.

- > Achieved career-high No. 47 on 16 April 2018 after reaching Houston final. Broke into Top 100 on 12 June 2017 following Grand Slam debut at Roland Garros. Fell as low as No. 714 on 2 February 2015 following hip surgery.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP World Tour SF and final at 2018 Houston. Qualified for 1st time in 15th try on tour and made ATP debut at 2017 Houston.
- > Beat Top 10 players Wawrinka and Thiem en route to 2018 Australian Open QF. As World No. 97, became lowest-ranked Australian Open quarter-finalist since No. 105 Tillstrom in 1996. Also 1st player to earn 1st Grand Slam win en route to QF since Verkerk at 2003 Roland Garros.
- > Owns 106-90 record on ATP Challenger Tour with titles at 2013 Champaign, USA; 2017 Tempe, USA and 2017 Savannah, USA. Boasts Challenger wins over countrymen Harrison, Johnson, Sock and Young.
- > Peaked at No. 9 in junior rankings on 20 April 2009. Went 70-38 on ITF Junior Circuit, including wins over Basilashvili, Evans, Harrison, Pospisil and Sock.

#### 2018 in Review

- Replaced Jiri Vesely as LL and beat countryman [WC] Corentin Moutet 62 75 57 64 and looking to reach US Open 3R for third straight year, his best result in 12 previous appearances.
- Advanced to Marseille QF (d. Tsitsipas and Muller, I. to Ivashka).
- Fell to No. 136 in ATP Rankings on 6 August -- lowest since No. 240 on 17 June 2013.
- Captured 3rd Grand Slam doubles title in 4th final w/Herbert at Roland Garros (d. Marach/Pavic).
- Earned 300th doubles win on 30 May in Roland Garros 1R (d. Lindstedt/Matkowski).
- Also defeated Marach/Pavic in Rotterdam final w/Herbert, ending Austrian and Croat's 17-0 start to season.
- Helped France reach Davis Cup SF by teaming w/Herbert to beat Haase/Rojer in 1R and Bolelli/Fognini in QF.

- > Became World No. 1 in doubles on 6 June 2016, joining Noah as only No. 1s from France in singles or doubles. First Frenchman to finish a season at No. 1, doing so in 2016. Also ended 2016 at No. 2 in team rankings w/Herbert and No. 39 in singles, just shy of career-high No. 37.
- > Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals in 2015-17 w/Herbert. Eliminated in round robin each year.
- > Won 21 of 22 doubles titles with countrymen, including 3 Grand Slam and 6 ATP Masters 1000 titles w/Herbert. Reached finals at all 4 Grand Slams w/Herbert, highlighted by titles at 2015 US Open, 2016 Wimbledon and 2018 Roland Garros. Also at 2018 Roland Garros, earned 300th doubles win and made 18th doubles tournament appearance -- most in Open Era before capturing title. Beat former partners Benneteau and Roger-Vasselin for 2016 Wimbledon title in 1st All-French Grand Slam final of Open Era.
- > Defeated doubles partner Herbert to advance to 2016 Wimbledon 4R in singles.
