NATIONAL BANK OPEN PRESENTED BY ROGERS TALKING POINTS

- ATP Tour returns to Toronto for National Bank Open Presented by Rogers with 4 former champions in the
 draw, including No. 1 seed Alexander Zverev, who won in 2017 as a 20-year-old, No. 10 Daniil Medvedev,
 who lifted the title at Sobeys Stadium in 2021 and defending champion Alexei Popyrin, who last year as
 World No. 62 shocked the field in Montreal by becoming 1st Australian ATP Masters 1000 champion since 2003.
- World No. 3 **Zverev** is a 7-time ATP Masters 1000 champion, including 2017 Montreal, and will attempt to win his second title of the season after capturing ATP 500 Munich title on clay in April. He is 12-5 at this event, but owns 3-3 record in Toronto, highlighted by run to 2018 QF. This week could be historic for the 28-year-old German, as he could become 1st man born in 1990 or later to capture 500 wins if he advances to 4R.
- No. 2 seed Taylor Fritz and No. 4 seed Ben Shelton lead tournament-high 15 Americans in this year's field, as they became the first American duo to be Top-4 seeds at an ATP Masters 1000 event since No. 3 Roddick and No. 4 Agassi at 2005 Montreal. Fritz is on a 15-3 run since start of June with titles in Stuttgart and Eastbourne and run to Wimbledon SF, while Shelton looks for his 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF this week.
- Three Canadians are among seeds this year with No. 21 seed Felix Auger-Aliassime, No. 22 seed Denis Shapovalov and No. 27 seed Gabriel Diallo all attempting to become 1st Canadian ATP Masters 1000 champion in series history (since 1990) and first Canadian champion at this tournament since Robert Bedard in 1958 (held in Vancouver). All three already captured an ATP Tour title this season, Auger-Aliassime winning in Adelaide and Montpellier, Shapovalov in Dallas and Los Cabos and Diallo in 's-Hertogenbosch.
- While World No. 1 and most recent champion in Toronto, Jannik Sinner (in 2023), withdrew from the event, his countryman and No. 3 seed Lorenzo Musetti will attempt to join him on the champions list. 23-year-old owns tour-leading 16 ATP Masters 1000 match wins this season, highlighted by run to Monte-Carlo final and semi-finals in Madrid and Rome. Last year's Montreal champion Popyrin will aim to join A. Murray (2009-10), Djokovic (2011-12) and Nadal (2018-19) as only men to successfully defend the title in Canada this century.
- There are two ATP Masters 1000 champions of this season in Canada's draw, as No. 8 seed and 2022 Montreal semi-finalist Casper Ruud won his first title at this level in Madrid in May on clay. 19-year-old Jakub Mensik surprised his idol Novak Djokovic in Miami final in March to become fourth man in ATP Masters 1000 history to win his 1st ATP Tour title at this level and aims to join Michael Chang, 18, in 1990, Boris Becker, 18, in 1986 and Rafael Nadal, 19, in 2005 as only teenagers to win men's title in Canada in Open Era.

- > At 2020 Delray Beach, saved 1 MP vs. Raonic and defeated Nishioka on same day to win 2nd title.
- > At 2019 New York, saved 6 MPs and hit 43 aces vs. Isner in SF, then hit 43 more aces vs. Schnur in final to win 1st title.
- > Upset No. 3 Tsitsipas at 2021 Toronto for biggest win of career and to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 final and defeated No. 7 Djokovic en route to 2025 Brisbane final to break Serbian's 34-match winning streak vs. Americans.
