LEXUS ATP HEAD2HEAD: SUNDAY FIRST-ROUND SINGLES MATCHES

David Goffin (BEL) vs [WC] Aleksandar Vukic (AUS)

First Meeting

David Goffin | Age: 34 | World No. 52 | Career-High No. 7 | Career: 346-253 (6 Titles) | Brisbane: 2-2 ('13, '16 2R) > Earned career-high 59 wins in 2017, ending season at career-high No. 7 after defeating No. 1 Nadal and No. 2 Federer en route to Nitto ATP Finals championship match.

- > Became 6th and final player to beat Nadal and Federer at same event (also Davydenko, Del Potro, Djokovic, Murray and Nalbandian).
- > First Belgian to break into Top 10, qualify for Nitto ATP Finals, defeat World No. 1 and reach an ATP Masters 1000 final (2019 Cincinnati).
- > In 2022, earned 300th victory (d. Andujar in Marrakech 2R), captured 6th ATP Tour title (Marrakech) and posted 3rd win over World No. 1 (d. Alcaraz in Astana 1R).
- > Advanced to 4 Grand Slam QFs, most recently 2022 Wimbledon, and led Belgium to Davis Cup finals in 2015 and 2017.

NOTE: Goffin seeks 1st win in opening ATP Tour match of the season since reaching SF at 2021 Antalya (d. Herbert in 1R). He is the only Belgian match winner in tournament history (d. Ebden in 2013 1R and T. Bellucci in 2016 1R).

Aleksandar Vukic | Age: 28 | World No. 68 | Career-High No. 48 | Career: 41-53 (1 Final) | Brisbane: 0-1 (2024 1R) > Broke into Top 200 in March 2020 prior to COVID-19 suspension of ATP Tour and Top 100 in May 2023, then achieved career-high No. 48 in August 2023 soon after reaching 1st ATP Tour final at 2023 Atlanta.

- > Entered 2024 Eastbourne as LL, advancing to 2nd ATP Tour SF by defeating Nishioka in QF after losing to him in qualifying.
- > Qualified and defeated No. 9 Ruud for biggest win of career en route to 3R at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai.
- > Won Challenger titles at 2022 Bengaluru-2 and 2023 Busan and reached Challenger finals at 2021 and 2022 Champaign, where he was a 3-time All-American for University of Illinois from 2015-18.
- > Born in Sydney after parents and older brother fled Montenegro during breakup of Yugoslavia in early-1990s

NOTE: Vukic seeks 1st ATP Tour win on home soil since 2022 Australian Open (d. L. Harris in 1R, I. to Holt in 2R). He went 10-4 in opening-round tour-level matches since May after starting the 2024 season 3-8 and is 10-6 vs higher-ranked opponents on tour-level since June after going 2-10 against them from January to May 2024.
