ALL-TIME MEN'S TITLES LEADERBOARD: World No. 1 **Novak Djokovic** owns 24 Grand Slam titles, men's all-time record. The Serb is looking to become the first player in all-time history to win 25 Grand Slam singles tournaments, breaking the tie with **Margaret Court** at 24 (11 in Open Era). Last year in Paris, Djokovic became the only player in history to win all four Grand Slam tournaments at least three times and now aims to defend the Paris title for the 1st time.

NO. 1 RANKING SCENARIOS: It's a two-way battle for No. 1 in the PIF ATP Rankings after Roland Garros. Here are the round-by-round point scenarios for the 10 June rankings below. If Djokovic does not reach the semi-finals stage, Sinner would become the first Italian No. 1 in history of PIF ATP Rankings (since 1973) regardless of his result in the event and join Alcaraz as the only players born in the 2000s to reach World No. 1 on the PIF ATP Rankings.

32x TOP SEED: World No. 1 **Novak Djokovic** is the top seed at a Grand Slam tournament for the 32nd time in his career, an Open Era record. The 3-time Roland Garros champion is the oldest No. 1 seed at Roland Garros in Open Era and oldest No. 1 seed at any Grand Slam since 41-year-old **Ken Rosewall** at 1976 Australian Open.

RETURNING RAFA: 14-time Roland Garros champion **Rafael Nadal** returns to Paris for his 19th appearance at the event after missing last year's event due to hip injury. The 37-year-old reached at least the third round in all previous appearances; however he will meet World No. 4 **Alexander Zverev** in his opening round this week. He is unseeded at a Grand Slam event for the first time since 2005 Australian Open and first time at Roland Garros in his career.

GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS: There are seven Grand Slam champions in this year's Roland Garros main draw, including three former Roland Garros champions **Djokovic**, **Nadal** and **Stan Wawrinka**. Four of the Top 5 seeded players have lifted a Grand Slam trophy before, with No. 2 seed **Jannik Sinner** winning the most recent Grand Slam event at Australian Open in January.

SINNER / ALCARAZ: The No. 2 seed **Sinner** and No. 3 seed **Alcaraz** arrive to Paris with title hopes, as both players look to join the tournament's champions list for the first time. The Italian and Spaniard are entered in their first event since Madrid after having to pull out from Rome due to injuries. The youngsters are the only men's Grand Slam champion born in 2000s and both aim to become the 1st player born after **Novak Djokovic** (22 May 1987) to lift the La Coupe des Mousquetaires trophy on final day of the event.

HOME FAVORITES: There are 17 Frenchmen in the 2024 Roland Garros draw, led by No. 17 seed **Ugo Humbert**, No. 22 seed **Adrian Mannarino** and No. 29 seed **Arthur Fils**. Fils, who will turn 20 in June, is the third youngest seeded Frenchman at Roland Garros in Open Era behind **Richard Gasquet**, 18, in 2005 and **Gael Monfils**, 19, in 2006.

MAKING HISTORY: Monfils, who will take on Seyboth Wild in his opening round, aims to become the sole leader for most Grand Slam match wins by a Frenchman. His compatriot, **Richard Gasquet**, returns to Roland Garros for the 21st time, as he faces Coric in 1R. If he steps on the court, Gasquet will tie **Feliciano Lopez** for most main draw appearances at Roland Garros in Open Era.

CLAY CONTENDERS: Entering Roland Garros, World No. 20 **Sebastian Baez** leads the ATP Tour in clay court wins (19) and titles (2). The big events on European clay this season were split by Top 10 seeds **Stefanos Tsitsipas** (Monte-Carlo), **Casper Ruud** (Barcelona), **Andrey Rublev** (Madrid) and **Alexander Zverev** (Rome), who all look to grab their 1st Grand Slam title over the next two weeks.
