LEXUS ATP HEAD2HEAD: MONDAY FIRST-ROUND SINGLES MATCHES

CENTER COURT

[5] Roberto Carballes Baena (ESP) vs [WC] Taha Baadi (MAR) **First Meeting**

R. Carballes Baena | Age: 32 | World No. 51 | Career-High No. 49 | 2025: 6-9 (Auckland QF) | Event: 15-4 (2023 Title)
 > Former World No. 8 junior entered Top 50 at 30 years of age at career high No. 49 in April 2023 after rallying from a set down in three of five matches to capture his 2nd ATP Tour title in Marrakech.
 > At 2018 Quito, became 1st Spanish qualifier to win an ATP Tour title since Almagro at 2006 Valencia.
 > Defeated No. 11 Shapovalov 8-6 in 5th after 5 hours to reach 2020 Roland Garros 3R for 1st Top 20 win in 12th attempt and defeated No. 4 Rune at 2023 US Open for 1st win in 14 tries vs. Top 10.
 > Defeated Goffin for 1st ATP Tour win en route to 2014 Casablanca SF as Q.
 > Boasts 243-151 Challenger record (13-8 in finals), including clay-court titles at 2022, 2023 and 2024 Seville.

NOTE: Carballes Baena, the only former champion in the draw, holds the most tournament wins among this year's field and reached 3 of his 5 ATP Tour SFs in Morocco, highlighted by title in 2023 and final in 2024 (l. to Berrettini). He seeks first clay win of 2025 after opening round losses in Buenos Aires (l. to Lajovic) and Rio de Janeiro (l. to Navone)

Taha Baadi | Age: 23 | World No. 703 | Career-High No. 697 | 2025: 1-0 (Davis Cup) | Marrakech: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 900 in June 2024 after winning 1st ITF Tour title in Santo Domingo and achieved career-high No. 697 in March 2025.
 > Made his tour-level debut at 2025 Davis Cup tie, defeating Lock to help Morocco defeat Zimbabwe 4-0 and is making his ATP Tour debut at 2025 Marrakech as WC.
 > Owns 2-9 Challenger record, with wins at Drummondville in 2020 and 2022 and 75-86 record on ITF World Tennis Tour (1-0 in finals), sole title at 2024 M15 Santo Domingo.
 > Born in Rabat, he went on to play college tennis at the University of Kentucky, peaking at No. 21 in ITA Singles Rankings in 2024.

NOTE: Baadi is playing in his first tour-level match outside Davis Cup, seeking biggest win of career in his 2nd match against Top 100 player (l. to No. 64 Mensik in 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Montreal Q1). He aims to be the first Moroccan to post an ATP Tour win since Ouahab defeated No. 34 Kohlschreiber in Marrakech 1R in 2018.

Fabio Fognini (ITA) vs Raphael Collignon (BEL) **First Meeting**

Fabio Fognini | Age: 37 | World No. 99 | Career-High No. 9 | 2025: 0-0 (2x Q1) | Event: 4-5 (2011, 2024 QF)
 > As a 32-year-old in 2019, became oldest player to break into Top 10 for 1st time, as well as 1st Italian in Top 10 since Barazzutti in 1979.
 > Also became 1st Italian ATP Masters 1000 champion, beating Nadal for 3rd time on clay en route to 2019 Monte Carlo title.
 > Boasts most victories of any Italian man in Open Era (426), highlighted by biggest win of career over No. 1 Murray at 2017 Rome.
 > Owns 9 singles and 8 doubles titles, breaking through as a doubles player in 2015 by winning Australian Open, reaching 3 ATP Masters 1000 finals and qualifying for Nitto ATP Finals w/Bolelli.
 > Married to 2015 US Open women's singles champion Flavia Pennetta with 3 children – Federico, Farah and Flaminia.

NOTE: Fognini, oldest player in the draw, is playing in his first ATP Tour main draw match since 2024 Belgrade (l. to Safiullin in 1R) and aims to break a 4-match losing streak since defeating Darderi at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai.

Raphael Collignon | Age: 23 | World No. 92 | Career-High No. 91 | 2025: 0-1 (Marseille 1R) | Marrakech: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Achieved career-high No. 91 in March 2025 after winning his 3rd Challenger title in Pau and reaching final in Lugano in back-to-back weeks.
 > Made his tour-level debut in 2024 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage, losing to van de Zandschulp and Fonseca.
 > Defeated No. 84 van de Zandschulp to win 1st Challenger title at 2024 Luedenscheid and No. 97 Coric en route to 2nd title at Lyon (Décines-Charpieu).
 > Coached by Belgium's Davis Cup captain and former World No. 38 Steve Darcis.
 > Owns 105-42 ITF Tour record with 8 titles, 7 on clay at the M25 level (2022 Arlon, 2022 Marburg, 2022, 2024 Koksijde, 2024 Hammamet, 2024 Angers, and 2024 Kassel) and 1 on hard courts (2022 M15 Monastir).

NOTE: Collignon seeks his first ATP Tour win after losing to van de Zandschulp & Fonseca at 2024 Davis Cup, Fucsovics at 2024 Antwerp, and Medjedovic at 2025 Marseille. He went on a 9-match winning streak on Challenger level in February, highlighted by title in Pau and final in Lugano (l. to Coric).

Aleksandar Vukic (AUS) vs Hugo Dellien (BOL)

First Meeting

Aleksandar Vukic | Age: 28 | World No. 76 | Career-High No. 48 | 2025: 4-8 (Aus. Open 3R) | Marrakech: 2-1 (2024 QF)
> Broke into Top 200 in March 2020 prior to COVID-19 suspension of ATP Tour and Top 100 in May 2023 and achieved career-high No. 48 in August 2023 after reaching 1st ATP Tour final in Atlanta.
> Entered 2024 Eastbourne as LL, advancing to 2nd ATP Tour SF by defeating Nishioka in QF after losing to him in qualifying.
> Qualified and defeated No. 9 Ruud for biggest win of career en route to 3R at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai.
> Won Challenger titles at 2022 Bengaluru-2 and 2023 Busan and reached Challenger finals at 2021 and 2022 Champaign, where he was a 3-time All-American for University of Illinois from 2015-18.
> Born in Sydney after parents and older brother fled Montenegro during breakup of Yugoslavia in early-1990s.

NOTE: Vukic is on a 5-match losing streak looking for first win since defeating Borg at 2025 Davis Cup vs. Sweden. 28-year-old owns a 4-9 tour-level record on clay, earning his first 2 wins on the surface at Marrakech last year.

Hugo Dellien | Age: 31 | World No. 114 | Career-High No. 64 | 2025: 0-1 (Rio de Janeiro 1R) | Marrakech: 0-1 (2022 1R)
> Former World No. 2 junior achieved career-high No. 64 in August 2022, becoming highest-ranked Bolivian since No. 60 Martinez in November 1983.
> Qualified at 2023 Cordoba and defeated 2021 champion J. Cerundolo to become 1st Bolivian tour-level semi-finalist since Martinez at 1983 Washington.
> Also qualified at Buenos Aires, ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo, Barcelona, Estoril and ATP Masters 1000 Madrid in 2022, but missed final 6 months of season due to hand injury.
> Earned 1st ATP Tour win of career at age 25 en route to 2019 Rio de Janeiro QF as Q (d. Andreozzi in 1R).
> Owns 206-118 Challenger record (13-8 in finals), highlighted by 21-1 run with 3 titles from 16 April-7 June 2018.

NOTE: Dellien is playing in his 2nd ATP Tour match of the season and seeking first win after retiring in Rio de Janeiro vs. Darderi in 1R as Q. He aims to become the first Bolivian to record a match win in tournament history.
