TERRA WORTMANN OPEN TALKING POINTS

- One of the two ATP 500 grass events of the 2022 season gets underway in Halle with former champion Ugo Humbert and former finalists Andrey Rublev and David Goffin in the field. Former #NextGenATP players Daniil Medvedev, Stefanos Tsitsipas, Felix Auger-Aliassime, Hubert Hurkacz join Rublev as the Top-5 seeds.
- No. 1 seed **Medvedev** will be hoping to become 2nd No. 1 player to win the Halle event after No. 1 Federer won 4 times in 2004-06 and 2008. The top seed is still seeking his first title in 2022, reaching finals at Australian Open in January and 's-Hertogenbosch last week.
- No. 3 seed **Rublev** could tie with Nadal and Alcaraz with most tour-level titles this season (4) and tie Nadal for most tour-level finals in 2022 (5). He opens his tournament vs. **Basilashvili**, who he beat en route to 2021 final in Halle.
- No. 2 seed Tsitsipas and No. 4 seed Auger-Aliassime both already appeared in a ATP500 final this season earlier this year in Rotterdam (Auger-Aliassime defeated Tsitsipas 6-4 6-2). Both opened their grass court season last week with Tsitsipas reaching quarter-final in Stuttgart (I. to Murray) and Auger-Aliassime reaching semi-final in 's-Hertogenbosch (I. to van Rijthoven).
- Four German players in the field: **Oscar Otte**, who reached the semi-final in Stuttgart last week (I. to Berrettini), **Daniel Altmaier** and wildcard recipients **Henri Squire** and **Jan-Lennard Struff**, who beat No. 2 Medvedev in 1R of Halle last year.

Pablo Carreno Busta | Age: 30 | World No. 19 | Career-High No. 10 | 2022: 16-12 (Barcelona F) | Halle: 0-0 (Debut) > Winner of 6 singles and 4 doubles titles achieved career-high No. 10 in singles and No. 16 in doubles in 2017. > Reached US Open SF in 2017 after defeating 4 qualifiers and in 2020 after defeating No. 1 Djokovic by default and earning 5-set wins over Uchiyama and Shapovalov.

> Defeated No. 1 Diokovic and No. 2 Medvedev en route to 2020 Tokyo Olympics bronze medal (held in 2021).

> Advanced to Roland Garros QF in 2017 and 2020, as well as 2016 US Open doubles final with fellow countryman Garcia-Lopez.

> Helped Team Spain reach ATP Cup finals in 2020 (5-1 in doubles) and 2022 (4-1 in singles).

NOTE: Carreno Busta is making his debut at Halle, which is also his 1st grass court tournament of the season. He has a 4-10 (.286) career tour-level record on grass.

Holger Rune | Age: 19 | World No. 28 (Career-High) | 2022: 16-11 (Munich Title) | Halle: 0-0 (Debut) > Broke into Top 400, 300 and 200 in 2021, then entered Top 100 in January 2022 and achieved career-high No. 28 in June 2022 following his 1st ATP Tour title in Munich and maiden Grand Slam quarter-final at 2022 Roland Garros (d. No. 4 Tsitsipas in 4R).

> Earned biggest win of career over World No. 3 and 2-time champion A. Zverev en route to 1st ATP Tour Title at 2022 Munich, becoming 1st Danish finalist since Carlsen won 2005 Memphis title.

> As 17-year-old Q-WC at 2021 Santiago, became 1st ATP Tour quarter-finalist born in 2003 or later, 1st Danish quarter-finalist since Pless at 2006 Newport, and youngest quarter-finalist since Coric, 17, at 2014 Umag. > Captured 5th Challenger title of career at 2022 Sanremo (d. Passaro 6-1 2-6 6-4), then won ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo Q1 match on same day (d. Albot 6-2 6-3).

> Won 2019 Roland Garros boys' singles title and went on to become World No. 1 junior in October 2019.

NOTE: This is Rune's first tour-level match on grass and his first match since reaching the guarter-final stage at 2022 Roland Garros. He is sitting at his career-high ranking of No. 28 on the Pepperstone ATP Rankings.

Andrey Rublev | Age: 24 | World No. 8 | Career-High No. 5 | 2022: 29-8 (3 Titles) | Halle: 6-2 (2021 Final) > Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 20 in January 2020, Top 10 in October 2020 and Top 5 in September 2021.

> Defeated countryman and World No. 2 Medvedev for biggest win of career and to reach 2nd ATP Masters 1000 final at 2021 Cincinnati.

> Led ATP Tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.

> Earned 4 singles wins at both 2021 ATP Cup and 2021 Davis Cup Finals, sweeping both team titles.

> Owns 11 ATP Tour titles, reached 4 Grand Slam QFs and won gold medal in All-ROC mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).

NOTE: Rublev's first grass court event of the season, returning to Halle where he reached the final in 2021 beating Basilashvili in semi-final. He has a 11-5 (0.688) career tour-level record on grass.

Nikoloz Basilashvili | Age: 30 | World No. 25 | Career-High No. 16 | 2022: 9-18 (Doha Final) | Halle: 4-3 (2021 SF) > Broke into Top 20 and achieved career-high No. 16 in 2019 after advancing to Grand Slam 4R for 1st time at 2018 US Open.

> Earned personal-best 33 victories in 2021, highlighted by biggest win of career over No. 3 Tsitsipas en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at Indian Wells.

> Captured 5 ATP Tour titles despite 140-155 career record (.475) and 5 ATP Challenger Tour titles despite 55-56 career record (.495).

> En route to titles, defeated No. 4 Del Potro at 2018 Beijing, No. 5 A. Zverev at 2019 Hamburg (saved 2 MPs) and No. 6 Federer at 2021 Doha (saved 1 MP).

> Father, Nodar, was a dancer in Georgian national ballet.

NOTES: Basilashvili won 3 of his 5 ATP Tour titles in Germany (2018 Hamburg, 2019 Hamburg, 2021 Munich). He is 6-20 vs Top 10 players (0-1 on grass, I. to No.7 Rublev at 2021 Halle SF).

[Q] Radu Albot (MDA) vs Ugo Humbert (FRA)

First Meeting

Radu Albot | Age: 32 | World No. 116 | Career-High No. 39 | 2022: 5-4 (Australian Open 3R) | Halle: 1-1 (2019 2R) > Achieved career-high No. 39 and earned personal-best 31 wins in 2019, highlighted by 1st ATP Tour title at Delray Beach (d. Evans after saving 3 MPs).

> Defeated No. 12 Carreno Busta in 5 sets for biggest win of career en route to 2018 Wimbledon 3R.

> Struggled with right shoulder injury to start 2020, then ended season by equaling career-best win over No. 12 Shapovalov in Sofia 2R.

> Peaked at No. 11 as a junior in 2007 and earned wins over future ATP No. 3s Dimitrov and Raonic.> Speaks Romanian, Russian, English and a bit of German and Spanish after training in Romania, USA, Germany and Spain.

NOTES: Albot has qualified for the second consecutive week, reaching 2R in Stuttgart last week before losing to eventual champion Berrettini.

Ugo Humbert | Age: 23 | World No. 50 | Career-High No. 25 | 2022: 4-13 (3 times in 2R) | Halle: 5-0 (2021 Title) > Achieved career-high No. 25 after upsetting No. 6 A. Zverev and No. 7 Rublev en route to biggest of 3 career titles at 2021 Halle.

> Won 1st ATP Tour title at 2020 Auckland as 21-year-old to become youngest French champion since Gasquet, 21, at 2007 Mumbai, and 1st Frenchman to win Auckland title in tournament history (since 1956).

> Saved 4 MPs vs. Evans en route to 2nd ATP Tour title at 2020 Antwerp.

> Owns 6-5 record vs. Top 10 and earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Medvedev at 2022 ATP Cup.

> Rallied from 2 sets down to defeat countryman Monfils en route to 2019 Wimbledon 4R.

NOTE: Humbert won his biggest career title in Halle last year beating two Top 10 players en route to the title (d. No. 6 Zverev in 2R, No. 7 Rublev in F).

Ilya Ivashka | Age: 28 | World No. 42 | Career-High No. 41 | 2022: 10-12 (3 QFs) | Halle: 0-1 (2021 1R)

> Qualified at 8 events in 2018, earned personal-best 31 wins in 2021 and achieved career-high No. 41 in 2022.

> Won 1st ATP Tour title at 2021 Winston-Salem by defeating Ruusuvuori 6-2 6-1 in SF and M. Ymer 6-0 6-2 in final.

> Upset No. 6 A. Zverev for biggest win of career en route to 2021 Munich SF as Q.

> Advanced to 2021 Wimbledon 4R and 2021 US Open 3R after starting career 1-6 at Grand Slams.

> Earned 3-set wins over Monfils and Kukushkin to reach 2020 Tokyo Olympics 3R (held in 2021).

NOTE: Ivashka has already reached an ATP Tour quarter-final on all 3 surfaces this season, Marseille on indoor hard courts, Geneva on clay courts and 's-Hertogenbosch on grass courts.

Jan-Lennard Struff | Age: 32 | World No. 149 | Career-High No. 29 | 2022: 2-9 (Stuttgart 2R) | Halle: 2-8 (2019, 2021 2R) > Achieved career-high No. 29 after reaching 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2020 Cincinnati, but fell to No. 99 in May 2022 after suffering right foot injury.

> On home soil, advanced to 1st ATP Tour singles final at 2021 Munich and earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Medvedev in 2021 Halle 1R.

> Posted personal-best 35 victories in 2019, highlighted by 1st Grand Slam 4R appearance at Roland Garros.

> In 2018, became 1st player in Open Era to rally from 2 sets down in Wimbledon 1R and 2R (d. L. Mayer and Karlovic).

> Lost in qualifying at 20 tour-level events before qualifying for 1st time at 2013 Roland Garros and earning 1st tourlevel win at 2013 Wimbledon as Q (d. Kavcic).

NOTE: Struff earned the biggest win of his career over No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Halle in 1R. He owns a 14-24 (0.368) tour-level record on grass.
