Miomir Kecmanovic | Age: 26 | World No. 49 | Career-High No. 27 | 2025: 20-24 (Delray Beach Title) | Event: 5-2 (2023 SF)
> Broke into Top 40 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2020 Kitzbuhel and achieved career-high No. 27 in January 2023.

> Earned personal-best 38 wins in 2022, reaching Australian Open 4R, Roland Garros 3R and Wimbledon 3R.

> Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 QFs at 2019 Indian Wells as LL, 2022 Indian Wells and 2022 Miami, equaling biggest win of career in 2022 Indian Wells 4R vs. No. 6 Berrettini.

> Beat Ruud and Davidovich Fokina to reach 2019 Next Gen ATP Finals SF (l. to eventual champion Sinner) and saved 2 championship points to defeat Davidovich Fokina for 2nd ATP Tour title at 2025 Delray Beach.

> Defeated Tsitsipas in 3rd-set TB to win 2015 Orange Bowl junior title, then ended 2016 as World No. 1 junior ahead of No. 2 Tsitsipas.

NOTE: Kecmanovic looks for first win outside Davis Cup since defeating Kovacevic and Darderi to reach Winston-Salem QF in August (0-4 since). Making his third appearance in Stockholm after advancing to 2023 SF (d. No. 6 Rune in 2R) and reaching quarter-finals last year.

Alexandre Muller | Age: 28 | World No. 43 | Career-High No. 38 | 2025: 21-23 (Hong Kong Title) | Event: 1-1 (2024 2R)

> Broke into Top 500 in 2016, Top 250 in 2019, Top 100 in 2023 and broke into Top 50 after advancing to biggest final of career in Rio de Janeiro in February 2025, before achieving career-high No. 38 in August that year.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Hong Kong, becoming 3rd man in Open Era to win a tour-level title by rallying from a set down in all matches played after Ashe at 1975 WCT Finals and Bublik at 2024 Montpellier.

> Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Musetti en route to 1st SF and final at 2023 Marrakech and earned Top 10 wins over No. 6 Rublev at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Rome and No. 3 Zverev at 2025 Hamburg.

> Made tour-level debut at 2017 Roland Garros as WC (l. to Monteiro) and won 1st tour-level match at 2021 Australian Open as LL, beating Londero in 1R.

> Owns 140-123 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning 1st title at 2022 Blois after saving a MP in his 1R match.

NOTE: Muller looks to record 3 wins vs. a single opponent on tour-level for first time in career, including saving 2 MPs to defeat Kecmanovic en route to 1st ATP Tour title in Hong Kong this year. He is teaming up with Kecmanovic in doubles this week and aims to tie Fils for third-most match wins among Frenchmen on ATP Tour this year.

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Tallon Griekspoor | Age: 29 | World No. 27 | Career-High No. 21 | 2025: 28-21 (Mallorca Title) | Event: 4-2 (2024 SF)

> Earned personal-best 36 wins in 2023, won 1st ATP Tour title in Pune and achieved career-high No. 21 in November.

> Went 17-3 on home soil in 2023-24, highlighted by 2nd title at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch and rallying from a set down to defeat No. 8 Hurkacz en route to 2024 Rotterdam SF.

> Rallied from a set down for Rotterdam wins as WC over No. 13 Wawrinka in 2018, No. 11 Khachanov in 2019, No. 14 Karatsev in 2022, No. 17 A. Zverev in 2023 and for 's-Hertogenbosch win over No. 18 de Minaur in 2023 – earning first 5 of 16 career Top-20 wins on home soil.

> Upset No. 2 Zverev in 2025 Indian Wells 2R to become 1st Dutch ATP Masters 1000 quarter-finalist since 2018.

> Went 8-0 in finals and 42-7 overall on ATP Challenger Tour in 2021, setting single-season record for most titles and ending season with 25 straight wins.

NOTE: Griekspoor is 3-9 since winning Mallorca title in June, including wins over Brooksby and No. 2 Sinner via RET in Shanghai last week. Last year in Stockholm, became the first Dutchman semi-finalist since 2001 after defeating No. 8 Ruud for 3rd of his 6 career Top 10 wins.

Jacob Fearnley | Age: 24 | World No. 79 | Career-High No. 49 | 2025: 15-17 (Queen's QF) | Event: 1-1 (2024 2R)
> Unranked in July 2023, broke into Top 500 in June 2024, Top 200 in August 2024 and Top 100 in September 2024, before achieving career-high No. 49 in June 2025 after run to Roland Garros 3R.
> Made ATP Tour debut at 2024 Eastbourne as WC, defeated Moro Canas at 2024 Wimbledon for 1st tour-level win (l. to 7-time champion Djokovic in 2R) and advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF at 2025 London/Queen's Club.
> Posted 27-3 Challenger record in 2024 with titles in Nottingham 2, Lincoln, Rennes and Orleans, owning highest win percentage in a season at Challenger level since 2011 (min. 25 matches played).
> Peaked at No. 27 in junior rankings, highlighted by wins over future World No. 1s Alcaraz in 2018 Sanxenxo Grade 2 final by 6-2 4-6 7-6(12) and Sinner in 2017 Malta ITF U18 Grade 4 1R.
> Spent five-years playing college tennis for Texas Christian University, former team of countryman Norrie, becoming four-time ITA All-American and helped his team clinch the national championship in his final year.

NOTE: Fearnley is playing in his first ATP Tour match since losing to Zverev in US Open 2R in August. 24-year-old is 3-9 vs. Top 30 opponents, seeking first Top 30 win on hard courts (0-3) after earning wins over No. 20 Machac at ATP Masters 1000 Madrid, No. 21 Humbert at Roland Garros on clay and No. 24 Cobolli in Eastbourne on grass.

Alexei Popyrin | Age: 26 | World No. 48 | Career-High No. 19 | 2025: 17-19 (3 QFs) | Event: 1-2 (2019 2R)
> Achieved career-high No. 19 in August 2025 after reaching QF in ATP Masters 1000 Canada title defense.
> Posted 5 consecutive Top 20 wins, including saving 3 MPs vs. Dimitrov in 3R en route to 2024 Montreal title, becoming 1st Australian ATP Masters 1000 champion since Hewitt in 2003.
> Earned biggest win of career over 4-time champion No. 2 Djokovic to reach 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2024 US Open after entering tournament with 0-6 record in Grand Slam 3R matches.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour SF, advanced to 1st final and won 1st title at 2021 Singapore and beat former champion Wawrinka for 2nd title at 2023 Umag.
> Qualified 10 times at tour-level events in 2019, tying single-season record set by M. Zverev in 2016.
> Peaked at No. 2 in junior rankings after ending career with 17 straight wins and 2017 Roland Garros boys' singles title.

NOTE: Popyrin is playing in first match since losing to Sinner in US Open 2R in August and making his first appearance at the event since 2019 (d. Otte in 1R). He is 7-11 on hard courts this year, highlighted by quarter-final run at ATP Masters 1000 Toronto.

Sebastian Korda | Age: 25 | World No. 60 | Career-High No. 15 | 2025: 17-14 (Adelaide Final) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)
> Achieved career-high No. 15 in August 2024, joining Petr Korda (No. 2 in 1998) to become only father-son duo to rank inside Top 20 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973).
> Earned biggest wins of career en route to ATP Masters 1000 SFs over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 Shanghai and No. 4 Zverev at 2024 Montreal.
> Did not drop a set en route to 2021 Parma title and captured 2024 Washington title, 32 years after his father, Petr, won in 1992, becoming 1st father-son duo to win the same ATP Tour event.
> Advanced to 2020 Roland Garros 4R as Q and 2021 Wimbledon 4R, becoming 3rd men's player in Open Era to reach 4R in debut at both events (Borg in 1973, Pernfors in 1986).
> Became World No. 1 junior by winning 2018 Australian Open boys' singles title 20 years after his father won Australian Open men's singles title.

NOTE: Korda seeks first Top 40 win since defeating No. 10 Tsitsipas in ATP Masters 1000 Miami in March and is two wins away from becoming fifth man born in 2000s to earn 100 hard-court wins (98-60). His father, Petr, advanced to three consecutive quarter-finals in Stockholm from 1991-93, including win over No. 5 Lendl in 1991 3R.

Leo Borg | Age: 22 | World No. 633 | Career-High No. 334 | 2025: 2-2 (Davis Cup) | Event: 0-4 (2021-24 1R)

> Earned 1st ranking point in May 2021, broke into Top 500 in May 2023 and reached career-high No. 334 in September 2023 after capturing his 3rd ITF World Tennis Tour title at M25 Jakarta.

> Made ATP Tour debut at 2021 Stockholm as WC, losing to eventual champion Paul and posted 1st ATP Tour win at 2023 Bastad over E. Ymer in 1R (l. to Coria in 2R).

> Owns 123-77 record on the ITF Tour (6-4 in finals), winning titles at 2022 M15 Sharm ElSheikh, 2023 M25 Jakarta, 2023 M25 Jakarta, 2024 M15 Kingston, 2024 M25 Nakhon si Thammarat, and 2025 M15 Doha.

> Peaked at No. 12 on ITF junior rankings and notched a 97-56 junior record with 3 titles.

> Son of former-World No. 1 Bjorn Borg grew up playing on hard court, but feels his game is best suited to clay courts.

NOTE: Borg looks for fifth tour-level win of career (4-11), 2nd outside Davis Cup, after defeating No. 166 E. Ymer in 2023 Bastad 1R. He is 0-8 vs. Top 150 across all levels, looking for the biggest win of his career. His father, Bjorn, won the 1980 title as World No. 1, defeating No. 2 McEnroe in the final.

Sebastian Ofner | Age: 29 | World No. 142 | Career-High No. 37 | 2025: 9-13 (Geneva SF) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)

> Earned 1st ranking point at age 17 in July 2013, broke into Top 200 in 2017, Top 100 in June 2023 and achieved career-high No. 37 in January 2024 after reaching 3rd ATP Tour SF at Hong Kong.

> Reached 1st ATP Tour final at 2024 Mallorca, joining Antonitsch, J. Melzer and Thiem as only Austrian men to play in a grass-court final in Open Era.

> Advanced to 2017 Wimbledon 3R in Grand Slam qualifying debut, highlighted by 5-set win over No. 18 Sock and qualified to reach 2023 Roland Garros 4R.

> Reached 1st ATP Tour QF and SF on home soil at 2017 Kitzbuhel as WC.

> Owns 145-115 Challenger record (4-9 in finals), winning titles at 2018 Astana, 2019 Puerto Vallarta and 2022 Prague-1 and latest title at 2023 Salzburg after 0-5 start to 2023 Challenger finals.

NOTE: Ofner aims to break an 8-match losing streak to earn his first win since defeating Paul at Wimbledon in July. He seeks his first hard court win of the year (0-5) and first since 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Miami (d. Nishikori in 1R).
