Alex Molcan (SVK) vs [7] Miomir Kecmanovic (SRB)

First Meeting

Alex Molcan | Age: 24 | World No. 45 | Career-High No. 38 | 2022: 15-10 (Marrakech, Lyon Finals) | Mallorca: 0-0 (Debut)
> Ended 2021 as No. 1 Slovakian, then broke into Top 50 in April 2022 and achieved career-high No. 38 in May 2022.
> Earned 1st 4 ATP Tour main draw wins of career en route to 2021 Belgrade-2 final as 255th-ranked Q (l. to No. 1 Djokovic).
> Also advanced to clay-court finals at Marrakech and Lyon in 2022, defeating No. 9 Auger-Aliassime for biggest win of career in Marrakech 2R.
> Defeated Nakashima in 5 sets to join 4 other qualifiers in 2021 US Open 3R.
> Did not drop a set en route to 1st Challenger title at 2021 Liberec, defeating Jaziri 6-1 6-0 in SF and Machac 6-0 6-1 in final.

NOTE: Molcan is seeking his first grass tour-level win (0-1). He is 3-8 vs. Top 30 players, achieving all 3 wins on clay this season (d. No. 9 Auger-Aliassime en route to Marrakech final and d. No. 24 Khachanov, No. 21 de Minaur en route to Lyon final).

Miomir Kecmanovic | Age: 22 | World No. 30 (Career-High) | 2022: 25-13 (Munich SF) | Mallorca: 0-1 (2021 1R)
> Broke into Top 40 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2020 Kitzbuhel and achieved career-high No. 30 in June 2022.
> Went 2-11 to end 2021 and 24-11 to begin 2022, reaching Grand Slam 3R and 4R for 1st time at 2022 Australian Open.
> Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 QFs at 2019 Indian Wells as LL, 2022 Indian Wells and 2022 Miami, equaling biggest win of career in 2022 Indian Wells 4R vs. No. 6 Berrettini.
> Beat Ruud and Davidovich Fokina to reach 2019 Intesa Sanpaolo Next Gen ATP Finals SF (l. to eventual champion Sinner).
> Defeated Tsitsipas in 3rd-set TB to win 2015 Orange Bowl junior title, then ended 2016 as World No. 1 junior ahead of No. 2 Tsitsipas.

NOTES: No. 2 Serbian (behind No. 3 Djokovic) has won a personal-best 25 matches this season (13-8 on clay, 12-4 on hard) with a SF in Munich and five quarter-finals. Has a 7-7 career tour-level record on grass and has a 14-5 record vs. players lower-ranked than him on tour-level this season.

Mackenzie McDonald | Age: 27 | World No. 53 | Career-High No. 49 | 2022: 13-15 (Dubai QF) | Mallorca: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 50 and achieved career-high No. 49 in February 2022 after undergoing right hamstring surgery in 2019 and falling out of Top 250 in 2020.

- > Defeated former champions Kyrgios and Nishikori en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2021 Washington.
- > Also in 2021, qualified at Roland Garros and Wimbledon after reaching Australian Open 4R as No. 192, becoming lowest-ranked player in Australian Open 4R since No. 248 Canas in 2004.
- > Posted biggest win of career over No. 4 Del Potro to reach 1st ATP Tour SF at 2019 Delray Beach.
- > Qualified for 2013 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati at age 18 by defeating USC legend Johnson, then went on to win 2016 NCAA singles and doubles titles for UCLA.

NOTE: McDonald owns a 6-6 career tour-level record on grass, highlighted by his run to 4R at 2018 Wimbledon (l. to No. 32 Raonic in 4R). He is 10-5 in his tour-level opening rounds in 2022.

Joao Sousa | Age: 33 | World No. 57 | Career-High No. 28 | 2022: 12-9 (Pune Title) | Mallorca: 0-0 (2021 Q2)

- > Top Portuguese player in Pepperstone ATP Rankings history, achieving career-high No. 28 in 2016.
- > Earned biggest win of career over No. 4 Ferrer, then saved 1 MP vs. Benneteau to become 1st Portuguese ATP Tour champion at 2013 Kuala Lumpur.
- > Winner of 4 titles overall, including 2018 Estoril, where he saved 2 MPs vs. P. Sousa in 2R and was congratulated following final by Portuguese President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa.
- > Became 1st Portuguese player to reach a Grand Slam 4R (2018 US Open, 2019 Wimbledon) and 2nd to reach an ATP Masters 1000 QF (2016 Madrid).
- > Speaks Portuguese, Spanish, Catalan, English, French and Italian.

NOTE: Sousa is looking for his first grass tour-level win since advancing to 4R at 2019 Wimbledon (d. No. 18 Cilic in 2R). He has a 14-23 (0.378) career tour-level record on grass, compared to 89-93 (0.489) on clay and 109-131 (0.454) on hard courts.

Jaume Munar | Age: 25 | World No. 75 | Career-High No. 52 | 2022: 11-12 (Melbourne QF) | Mallorca: 0-1 (2021 1R)
 > Former World No. 3 junior achieved career-high No. 52 after upsetting No. 3 A. Zverev for biggest win of career at 2019 Marrakech.

- > Defeated countryman Alcaraz before falling to countryman Carreno Busta in 1st ATP Tour final at 2021 Marbella.
- > Competed at 2018 Intesa Sanpaolo Next Gen ATP Finals and qualified for ATP Masters 1000 events at Indian Wells, Miami and Monte Carlo in 2022.
- > Owns 113-58 Challenger record (8-6 in finals), including 2 titles in 2022 (Marbella, Perugia), both on clay.
- > Reached 2014 Roland Garros boys' singles final and won boys' doubles title in 2015 with countryman Lopez San Martin.

NOTE: Munar is looking for his 1st tour-level career win on grass (0-6). He is 2-8 vs. Top 50 players on Pepperstone ATP Rankings in 2022 (wins over No. 16 Carreno Busta at ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells and No. 20 Basilashvili at Barcelona).

- Aslan Karatsev** | Age: 28 | World No. 38 | Career-High No. 14 | 2022: 9-14 (Sydney Title) | Mallorca: 0-0 (Debut)
- > Broke into Top 20 after winning 2nd ATP Tour title at 2021 Moscow, then achieved career-high No. 14 following 3rd title at 2022 Sydney.
 - > Reached 2021 Australian Open SF as World No. 114, becoming 1st men's semi-finalist in Grand Slam debut in Open Era, 1st men's qualifier to reach Grand Slam SF since Voltchkov at 2000 Wimbledon, and lowest-ranked Grand Slam men's semi-finalist since No. 125 Ivanisevic at 2001 Wimbledon.
 - > Ended 23-match ATP 500 win streak of countryman Rublev en route to 1st ATP Tour title at 2021 Dubai, then defeated No. 1 Djokovic at 2021 Belgrade-1 and No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Rome.
 - > In mixed doubles w/Vesnina, finished as 2021 Roland Garros runner-up and 2020 Tokyo Olympics silver medallist in All-ROC final (held in 2021).
 - > Went 18-2 on ATP Challenger Tour from August-November 2020, including titles at Prague-2 and Ostrava.

NOTE: Karatsev is seeking to break his 5-match tour-level losing streak, losing 9 of his last 10 tour-level matches.
