## DAY ONE FAST FACTS

- **Novak Djokovic, Roger Federer** or **Rafael Nadal** has been US Open No. 1 seed in 16 straight years.
  - From 2004 through 2019, 479 different players have competed in US Open men's singles main draw.
- Djokovic, the World No. 1 and defending champion, is 33-1 in his last 34 matches at Grand Slam tournaments.
- Djokovic is 13-0 in US Open 1R. He is 53-0 in Grand Slam 1R since 2006 Australian Open (l. to **Paul Goldstein**).
- Djokovic is 17-0 at US Open and 75-1 at Grand Slams against opponents outside Top 75 (l. to No. 117 **Denis Istomin** in 2017 Australian Open 2R). The 3-time champion meets No. 76 **Roberto Carballes Baena** on Monday.
- Last time No. 1 seed lost in US Open 1R was 1990, when **Alexander Volkov** upset **Stefan Edberg**. No. 1 seed has reached US Open QFs or better every year after 2000, when **Arnaud Clement** beat **Andre Agassi** in 2R.
- Federer and Nadal have never met at US Open. But Federer and Nagal will meet on Monday... **Sumit Nagal**.
- Nagal, a qualifier, has never won a tour-level match (0-4). Federer has won 1,223 tour-level matches (1,223-266).
- **If Federer beats Nagal, he will extend his record and qualify for 17th Nitto ATP Finals (2002-15, 2017-19).**
- Federer is 18-0 in US Open 1R. He is 61-0 in Grand Slam 1R since 2003 Roland Garros (l. to **Luis Horna**).
- Federer is 18-0 at US Open and 60-2 at Grand Slams against opponents outside Top 100 (l. to No. 154 **Mario Ancic** in 2002 Wimbledon 1R and No. 116 **Sergiy Stakhovsky** in 2013 Wimbledon 2R). Nagal is ranked 190th.
- Ten American men play Monday, including **Zachary Svajda**, 16, who meets **Paolo Lorenzi**, 37, on Court 5. The 21-year age gap is biggest at a Slam since **Ken Rosewall**, 44, beat **Cary Stansbury**, 20, in 1978 Aus. Open 1R.
- Svajda is youngest US Open men's singles player since **Donald Young**, 16, in 2005. If he beats Lorenzi, Svajda will be youngest to win a US Open men's singles match since **Michael Chang**, 16, reached 1988 US Open 4R.
- **Jack Sock** has won US Open titles in boys' singles (2010), mixed doubles (2011) and men's doubles (2018). Sock seeks his first men's singles win of 2019 season (0-3) when he meets **Pablo Cuevas** of Uruguay on Court 12.
- **Reilly Opelka** is making his fifth straight US Open appearance and his first in main draw (2015-18 qualifying). Following Opelka on Court 17 is fellow American **Taylor Fritz**. Opelka was best man at Fritz's wedding in 2016.

#### 2019 in Review

- Saved 2 championship points to defeat Federer in longest Wimbledon final on record (4 hours, 55 minutes).
- Became 1st Wimbledon champion to save championship point since Bob Falkenburg saved 3 MPs in 1948 final.
- Also saved 2 MPs to defeat Federer in both 2010 US Open SF and 2011 US Open SF. Leads H2H 26-22.
- Prior to 5th Wimbledon title, captured record 7th Aus. Open title (d. Nadal). Third all-time with 16 Grand Slam titles.
- Became 1st player in history to win 3+ straight Grand Slam titles on 3 occasions (also 2011-12, 2015-16).
- Also 1st player to win a Grand Slam final over Nadal in straight sets. Spaniard has reached 26 Grand Slam finals.
- Won 26 straight Grand Slam matches until Roland Garros SF (l. to Thiem in 5 sets).
- Earned 200th win vs. Top 10 to capture 33rd ATP Masters 1000 title at Madrid (d. Tsitsipas).
- Saved 2 MPs vs. Del Potro en route to 9th Rome and 49th ATP Masters 1000 final (l. to Nadal).
- Projected to pass Connors and Lendl and move into 3rd all-time with 271 weeks as World No. 1 on 30 September.

#### Career Highlights

> Ended 5 years as World No. 1 (2011-12, 2014-15, 2018). One of 4 players to finish 5+ seasons at No. 1 along with Sampras (6), Connors (5) and Federer (5). Projected to pass Connors and Lendl and move into 3rd all-time with 271 weeks as World No. 1 on 30 September 2019, trailing only Federer's 310 weeks and Sampras' 286 weeks. In 2018, became oldest year-end No. 1 in ATP Rankings history at age 31 (since 1973). Also set records for lowest ranking (No. 22), worst 10-match start (5-5) and fewest pre-Wimbledon titles (0) in same season as finishing No. 1. Earned record \$21,646,145 in 2015 and \$134,979,120 in career.

> Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals 12 times (2007-16, 2018-19), capturing 5 titles overall and becoming 1st player to sweep 4 straight titles (2008, 2012-15). Finished Top 3 and earned 50+ wins in 11 of last 12 seasons (2007-16, 2018).

> Owns 75 singles titles, including 16 Grand Slams (3rd behind Federer's 20 and Nadal's 18) and 33 ATP Masters 1000s (2nd behind Nadal's 35). Won 2+ titles each year from 2006-19, including all 4 Grand Slam and all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events. Only player with titles at all 9 ATP Masters 1000s since start of series in 1990. Enjoyed win streaks of 43 matches overall (2010-11), 31 matches at ATP Masters 1000s (2011) and 30 matches at Grand Slams (2015-16). One of 3 active

players with 800+ victories (also Federer, Nadal). Earned 800th win in 2018 London/Queen's Club QF (d. Mannarino). Owns winning records against Nadal (28-26), Federer (26-22) and Murray (25-11).  
> Swept titles at 2015 Wimbledon, 2015 US Open, 2016 Australian Open and 2016 Roland Garros, becoming 8th player to complete career Grand Slam and 3rd to hold all 4 major titles at one time (also Budge, Laver). Only player to win 3+ Grand Slam titles in a row on 3 occasions (2011-12, 2015-16, 2018-19). Enjoyed Grand Slam streaks of 28 QFs (2009-16), 14 SFs (2010-13) and 6 finals (2015-16). Owns most Australian Open titles of all time with 7. Captured 4th Wimbledon title in 2018 as World No. 21, becoming lowest-ranked Grand Slam champion since No. 44 Gaudio at 2004 Roland Garros. Added 5th Wimbledon title in 2019 by saving 2 championship points vs. Federer.  
> Won 2008 Beijing Olympics bronze medal, then led Serbia to 2010 Davis Cup title (SRB d. FRA 3-2). Lost in 2012 London Olympics bronze medal match and 2013 Davis Cup final, despite defeating Stepanek and Berdych (CZE d. SRB 3-2).

- Advanced to QFs at Buenos Aires (l. to Cecchinato), Barcelona as LL (l. to Nishikori), Bastad (l. to Ramos-Vinolas) and Gstaad (l. to Ramos-Vinolas). Lost 5 straight QFs overall since winning 2018 Quito title (d. Ramos-Vinolas).
- Saved 3 MPs vs. Jarry in Rio de Janeiro 1R (l. to Dellien in 2R). Squandered 1 MP vs. Sonogo in Kitzbuhel 2R.
- Captured ATP Challenger Tour titles at Murcia, ESP (d. M. Ymer) and Lisbon, POR (d. Bagnis).
- Retired in Poznan, POL Challenger 2R vs. Masur due to right shoulder injury.

### Career Highlights

- > Achieved career-high No. 72 on 19 February 2018 soon after winning Quito title. Broke into Top 100 on 8 August 2016 after advancing to Cortina, ITA Challenger SF. Finished 5 straight seasons in Top 200 (2014-18).
- > Captured 2018 Quito championship to become 1st Spanish qualifier to win a title since Almagro at 2006 Valencia. As 24-year-old, became youngest Spanish champion since Nadal, 24, at 2011
- > Posted career-high 17 tour-level wins in 2019. Defeated Goffin for 1st ATP Tour win en route to 2014 Casablanca SF as Q. Enjoyed 1st Grand Slam main draw win at 2018 US Open (d. Krueger) and 1st ATP Masters 1000 main draw win at 2019 Indian Wells (d. Harrison).
- > Owns 160-113 record on ATP Challenger Tour with 7 titles. Ended 2017 season with 16 straight appearances at clay-court Challengers, posting 30-14 main draw record with titles at Cortina, ITA and Manerbio, ITA.
- > Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings on 3 January 2011. Captured 2011 Roland Garros boys' doubles title w/Artunedo Martinavarro. Ended junior career by sweeping titles at 2011 European Championships in singles and doubles w/Ojeda Lara.

### 2019 in Review

- Won 10th Halle and 102nd title at age 37 (d. Goffin). Oldest champion since Rosewall, 43, at 1977 Hong Kong.
- Also won 4th Miami, 28th ATP Masters 1000 and 101st overall title (d. Isner). Played in 50th ATP Masters 1000 final.
- With addition of 4 wins from Laver Cup (2017-18), earned 1,200th win of career in Miami QF (d. Anderson).
- Captured 8th Dubai and 100th overall title (d. Tsitsipas). Trails only Connors' 109 titles and 1,274 wins in Open Era.
- Win over Tsitsipas marked 1st title of career as World No. 7 and 50th different opponent defeated in a final.
- Defeated Nadal to reach 12th Wimbledon final (l. to Djokovic after holding 2 championship points).
- Beat Nishikori in QF for 100th Wimbledon win of career. Became 1st player with 100 wins at a Grand Slam event.
- Did not drop a set en route to 9th ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final (l. to Thiem).
- Returned to Roland Garros for 1st time since 2015 and reached 8th SF at tournament (l. to Nadal).
- Saved 2 MPs vs. Monfils in ATP Masters 1000 Madrid 3R (l. to Thiem in QF after holding 2 MPs).
- Saved 2 MPs vs. Coric in ATP Masters 1000 Rome 3R (W/O vs. Tsitsipas in QF due to right leg injury).
- Earned 20+ wins and advanced to Australian Open 3R-or-better for 20th straight season (l. to Tsitsipas in 4R).

### Career Highlights

> Set new records with 310 weeks overall and 237 consecutive weeks at No. 1 (2004-08). Became oldest No. 1 in history at age 36 on 19 February 2018. Ended 5 seasons as No. 1 (2004-07, 2009). One of 4 players to finish 5+ seasons at No. 1 along with Sampras (6), Connors (5) and Djokovic (5).

> Holds Nitto ATP Finals records for titles (6), finals (10), SFs (15), appearances (16) and wins (57), capturing championship in 3 cities (Houston 2003-04, Shanghai 2006-07, London 2010-11) and 5 times with 5-0 record (2003-04, 2006, 2010-11).

> Owns 102 titles and 1,223 wins -- 2nd-most in Open Era behind Connors' 109 titles and 1,274 wins. Earned 100th title at 2019 Dubai (d. Tsitsipas) and 1,000th win in 2015 Brisbane final (d. Raonic). Enjoyed 41-match win streak (2006-07), reached 17 straight finals (2005-06), posted 24-match win streak in finals (2003-05), won 24 straight matches vs. Top 10 (2003-05) and earned record 65 consecutive victories on grass (2003-08). Went 81-4 in 2005 (.953) for best win percentage since McEnroe went 82-3 in 1984 (.965). Boasts 10 wins vs. World No. 1 and 10 wins from 2 sets down. Never retired in 1,710 matches on tour (1,489 singles and 221 doubles).

> Greatest of all time at Grand Slams with 20 titles in 31 finals and 353 victories overall. One of 8 men to win all 4 majors, securing career Grand Slam at 2009 Roland Garros. Captured record 8th Wimbledon title in 2017. By winning 6th Australian Open title at age 36 in 2018, became 2nd-oldest Grand Slam champion in Open Era behind Rosewall, 37, at 1972 Australian Open. Owns Open Era records for consecutive Grand Slam finals (10), SFs (23) and QFs (36). Won 16 of 27 Grand Slam events beginning with 2003 Wimbledon, then 1 of 27 after that. Made 20 straight appearances at Australian Open (2000-19) and 21 at Wimbledon (1999-2019). Boasts 28 titles, 50 finals and 379 wins at ATP Masters 1000s, including Indian Wells/Miami 'Sunshine Double' in 2005-06 and 2017.

> Two-time Olympic medalist, taking gold in doubles at 2008 Beijing w/Wawrinka and silver in singles at 2012 London. Finished 4th in singles at 2000 Sydney Olympics. Clinched 2014 Davis Cup title for Switzerland by beating Gasquet for 50th Davis Cup win (SUI d. FRA 3-1).

- Broke into Top 200 of ATP Rankings on 29 July and achieved career-high No. 190 on 19 August.
- Qualified at Hamburg (l. to Gasquet in 1R) and US Open (d. Ito, Polansky and Menezes).
- Seeking 1st tour-level win of career in US Open 1R vs. Federer, who owns 1,223 tour-level wins.
- Reached Challenger SFs at Savannah, USA (l. to Lorenzi); Samarkand, UZB (l. to Menezes); Lyon, FRA (l. to E. Ymer); Bratislava, SVK (l. to Gombos) and Milan, ITA (l. to Petrovic).

### Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 200 on 29 July 2019 and achieved career-high No. 190 on 19 August 2019 after qualifying at Hamburg. Earned 1st ATP ranking point at age 16 on 25 November 2013.
- > Made ATP Tour debut on home soil at 2018 Pune as Q. Will make Grand Slam debut at 2019 US Open as Q. Seeks 1st tour-level win in 1R against Federer, who owns 1,223 tour-level wins.
- > Captured 1st ATP Challenger Tour title in 1st final at 2017 Bangalore, IND. Owns 41-43 Challenger record overall.
- > Played primarily on ITF Futures Circuit as recently as March 2018. Posted 108-39 Futures record overall (9-1 in finals).
- > Peaked at No. 23 in juniors on 16 February 2015. Went 83-50 on ITF Junior Circuit with wins over future Top 50 ATP players Hurkacz, Kecmanovic, Shapovalov and Tiafoe. Ended junior career by winning 2015 Wimbledon boys' doubles title w/Ly.

### 2019 in Review

- Broke into Top 100 of ATP Rankings on 11 February and achieved career-high No. 75 on 22 April.
- Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells 3R as Q (d. Paire and Basilashvili, l. to Karlovic).
- Also qualified at Australian Open (l. to Tiafoe in 1R) and ATP Masters 1000 Miami (l. to Munar in 1R).
- Reached 2R at Antalya (l. to Sonego), Los Cabos (l. to Fritz) and Winston-Salem (l. to Paire).
- Suffered straight-set losses to Berrettini and Seppi in Davis Cup Qualifiers (ITA d. IND 3-1).
- Fell in Anning, CHN Challenger final (l. to Clarke).
- Retired in Stuttgart qualifying 1R vs. Viola due to shoulder injury.

### Career Highlights

- > Achieved career-high No. 75 on 22 April 2019 after reaching Anning, CHN Challenger final for 2nd straight year. Broke into Top 100 on 11 February 2019 following run to Chennai, IND Challenger SF. Entered Top 200 on 30 April 2018 after winning Anning, CHN Challenger title. Unranked as recently as 6 July 2015 while recovering from knee injuries.
- > Qualified at 2018 Stuttgart and defeated Shapovalov in ATP Tour debut as a 28-year-old. Went on to qualify at Atlanta, Los Cabos and Chengdu in 2018. Earned bronze medal at 2018 Asian Games in Palembang, INA.
- > Also qualified at Australian Open, ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells and ATP Masters 1000 Miami in 2019. Reached Indian Wells 3R with wins over Paire and Basilashvili.
- > Owns 59-48 ATP Challenger Tour record with titles at Anning, CHN and Bangalore IND in 2018. Ended 2018 season with 16-4 run at Challengers.
- > Played primarily on ITF Futures Circuit as recently as March 2018, when he won 8th Futures title at Chandigarh, IND. Posted 117-42 Futures record overall.

### 2019 in Review

- Achieved career-high No. 5 on 19 August, becoming 1st Russian in Top 5 since No. 5 Davydenko on 28 June 2010.
- Captured 1st ATP Masters 1000 title at Cincinnati (d. No. 1 Djokovic and Goffin). Became 1st Russian to win Cincinnati title. Also beat No. 1 Djokovic to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF at Monte-Carlo (l. to Lajovic).
- Won title at Sofia (d. Fucsovics) and advanced to finals at Brisbane (l. to Nishikori), Barcelona (d. Nishikori, l. to Thiem), Washington (l. to Kyrgios) and ATP Masters 1000 Montreal (d. Thiem and Khachanov, l. to Nadal).
- Leads ATP Tour with 44 wins and 6 finals this season. Went 14-2 with 1 title in 3 finals from 30 July to 18 August.
- One of 5 men under 23 to reach Aus. Open 4R (l. to No. 1 Djokovic) -- most at a Slam since 2009 Roland Garros (5).
- Beat Laaksonen in opening rubber of Russia's 3-1 road win over Switzerland in Davis Cup Qualifiers.
- Withdrew from Sydney due to right shoulder injury and Geneva due to right adductor injury.

### Career Highlights

> Achieved career-high No. 5 on 19 August 2019, becoming 1st Russian in Top 5 since No. 5 Davydenko on 28 June 2010.
