DAY 9 TALKING POINTS

- Reigning champion **Jannik Sinner** looks for his 25th consecutive hard-court win at Grand Slam level, when he takes on World No. 24 **Alexander Bublik** on **Arthur Ashe Stadium** on Monday. 24-year-old Italian also aims to advance to his 8th consecutive Grand Slam quarter-final. Bublik is one of two men to defeat Sinner in 2025 and will aim to repeat Halle 2R result to reach his 2nd Grand Slam quarter-final after Roland Garros earlier this year.

- World No. 15 **Andrey Rublev** takes a 7-1 **Lexus ATP Head2Head** lead into his fourth-round encounter with Canadian No. 1 **Felix Auger-Aliassime**. Rublev seeks his 11th Grand Slam quarter-final to secure himself another chance to look for his first semi-final at this level. Auger-Aliassime upset World No. 3 Zverev in 3R and now aims to reach the last 8 stage at this venue for second time in career after his run to 2021 SF.
- World No. 10 **Lorenzo Musetti** meets World No. 44 **Jaume Munar** with both men playing in their first US Open 4R. Musetti aims to join Alcaraz and Sinner as only men born in 2000s to reach Grand Slam QFs on clay, grass and hard courts. Munar aims to advance to his 20th and biggest tour-level quarter-final, 1st above ATP 500 level.
- If **Musetti** and **Sinner** both prevail on Monday, it will mark the first time in history multiple Italian men reach the quarter-finals of all 4 Grand Slam events in a season (Aus. Open – Sinner, Sonego; Roland Garros – Musetti, Sinner; Wimbledon - Cobolli, Sinner). Only Australians, Spaniards and Americans previously achieved this feat in men's singles in Open Era. They are also on a collision course to meet in 1st all-Italian Grand Slam men's QF.
- World No. 435 qualifier **Leandro Riedi** rallied from 2 sets down for first Top 20 win over No. 19 Cerundolo en route to his 1st Grand Slam 4R and now looks for another biggest win of his career, when he takes on World No. 8 **Alex de Minaur**. Riedi bids to join Federer and Wawrinka as only Swiss men's quarter-finalists at Grand Slam level in this century and become the lowest-ranked Grand Slam quarter-finalist since 2002.
- No. 8 **de Minaur** leads the ATP Tour in hard-court wins this season (27), highlighted by saving 3 championship points to win the Washington title in July. 26-year-old Australian No. 1 attempts to advance to his 6th Grand Slam quarter-final, third at this venue after reaching the stage in 2020 (l. to Thiem) and last year (l. to Draper).

FELIX AUGER-ALIASSIME

US Open Stats

- > Canadian No. 1 is making his 8th consecutive US Open main draw appearance (2018-25), defeating B. Harris 6-4 7-6(8) 6-4 in 1R, Safiullin 6-1 7-6(4) 7-6(5) in 2R and World No. 3 Zverev 4-6 7-6(7) 6-4 6-4 in 3R.
- > In 2021, reached his lone Grand Slam SF in New York to become 1st Canadian US Open men's singles semi-finalist in event history and youngest US Open men's singles semi-finalist since 20-year-old Del Potro won 2009 US Open title.
- > Beat 18-year-old Alcaraz in youngest US Open QF, SF or final since 1984 and Grand Slam QF, SF or final since 2006.
- > By advancing to QFs at 2021 Wimbledon and 2021 US Open, became youngest man to reach consecutive Grand Slam QFs since Del Potro reached 2008 US Open, 2009 Australian Open and 2009 Roland Garros QFs before 21st birthday.
- > Defeated 2012 champion and former World No. 1 Murray en route to 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2020 US Open.
- > At 2020 US Open, joined Pospisil and Shapovalov as 1st Canadian men's trio to reach 4R at same Grand Slam event.
- > Lost to countryman Shapovalov in 2018 US Open 1R as Q and 2019 US Open 1R.
- > Defeated Tsitsipas 6-4 7-5 en route to 2016 US Open boys' singles title, won 2015 US Open boys' doubles title w/Shapovalov and reached 2016 US Open boys' doubles final w/Sigouin.
- > One of two former boys' singles champions remaining in the field (also Fritz).
- > Aims to avoid losing 8 matches vs. a single opponent for first time in career (7 vs. Medvedev, Tsitsipas, Rublev).
- > After defeating No. 3 Zverev in 3R for first Top-5 win at a Grand Slam (now 1-7) and now attempts to record multiple Top 20 wins in one Grand Slam event for the first time in his career (4-7 vs. Top 20 at this level).
- > Aims to advance to his 4th Grand Slam QF after reaching the stage at three consecutive events at 2021 Wimbledon, 2021 US Open and 2022 Australian Open and would be 1st Canadian man to contest in multiple US Open QFs in history.
- > He is No. 20 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#) and could rise to No. 18 with a 4R win to secure return to Top 20.

Career Highlights

- > Achieved career-high No. 6 and earned personal-best 60 wins during breakout 2022 season, including career-long 16-match win streak with 3 titles in as many weeks at Florence, Antwerp and Basel.
- > Also in 2022, won Rotterdam title to snap 0-8 start to career in singles finals, advanced to 3rd straight Grand Slam QF at Australian Open, and swept team titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.
- > Led ATP Tour with 45 hard-court and 31 indoor wins in 2022, highlighted by victories over No. 1 Alcaraz and former No. 1s Djokovic, Murray and Nadal.
- > At 2021 US Open, became 1st Canadian men's singles semi-finalist in tournament history (since 1881) and at 2024 Madrid, became 1st Canadian ATP Masters 1000 finalist on clay in series history (since 1990).
- > As an 18-year-old in 2019, became youngest Top-25 player since Hewitt, 18, in 1999, youngest ATP 500 finalist in series history at Rio de Janeiro (since 2009), and youngest semi-finalist in Miami tournament history (since 1985).

ANDREY RUBLEV

US Open Stats

- > Appearing in his 10th US Open main draw, 9th consecutive (2015, 2017-25), he defeated Q Prizmic 6-4 6-4 6-4 in 1R, WC Boyer 6-3 6-3 5-7 7-6(4) in 2R and Q Wong 2-6 6-4 6-3 4-6 6-3 in 3R.
- > Last year, came back from 2 sets down to defeat Rinderknech in 2R before nearly doing the same against Dimitrov in 4R, losing in 5 sets after erasing a 0-2 deficit.
- > Made 1st of his 10 Grand Slam QFs as a 19-year-old at 2017 US Open, losing to No. 1 Nadal in QF
- > Also made the QFs in 2020 (l. to No. 5 Medvedev), 2022 (l. to Tiafoe), and 2023 (l. to No. 3 Medvedev).
- > Qualified at 2015 US Open as a 17-year-old and lost to Anderson in Grand Slam main draw debut.
- > Defeated Fritz to reach 2014 US Open boys' singles QF (l. to Tiafoe).
- > Auger-Aliassime is the only opponent Rublev recorded 7 tour-level wins against and this is his most dominant Lexus ATP Head2Head (+6, also 6-0 vs. Dzumhur).
- > Jumped 2 places to No. 13 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#) and would pass Ruud to No. 12 with a 4R win.
- > He is 15-20 vs. Top 30 at Grand Slam level (0-2 in 2025), including 7-7 at US Open, seeking first Top 30 win at this event since defeating No. 21 Shapovalov and No. 9 Norrie to reach 2022 QF.
- > Aims to advance to his 11th Grand Slam quarter-final (0-10), first since 2024 Australian Open (l. to Sinner).
- > Looks to reach his 5th US Open QF (2017, 2020, 2022-23) to become fifth active male player to achieve the feat.

Career Highlights

- > Former No. 1 junior broke into Top 20 in January 2020, Top 10 in October 2020 and Top 5 in September 2021.
- > Rallied from a set down in both SF (d. Fritz) and final (d. Rune) at 2023 Monte-Carlo to capture 1st ATP Masters 1000 title and defeated two-time defending champion No. 3 Alcaraz en route to 2nd title at 2024 Madrid.
- > Defeated No. 3 Nadal at 2021 Monte-Carlo, No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Cincinnati and No. 1 Sinner at 2024 Montreal en route to ATP Masters 1000 finals and beat No. 1 Djokovic for 11th of 17 ATP Tour titles at 2022 Belgrade.
- > Led tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.
- > Ten-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist reached 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF and won gold medal in All-ROC mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).
- > Went 9-1 in singles and 4-1 in doubles at team events during 2021 season, sweeping titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.

JANNIK SINNER

US Open Stats

- > He is making his 7th US Open main draw appearance, highlighted by becoming 1st Italian man to win the title last year.
- > Last year, defeated No. 1 American Fritz in final in straight sets to win 2nd of his 4 Grand Slam titles, losing just two sets en route to championship to McDonald in 1R and Medvedev in QF.

- > By reaching 2024 SF became 1st man born in 1990 or later to reach Grand Slam semi-finals at all 4 events, before becoming 11th man in Open Era (2nd-youngest behind Courier) to play in all 4 Grand Slam finals at 2025 Wimbledon.
- > Made 2023 4R by defeating former champion Wawrinka in 3R, before losing to 2020 runner-up Zverev in 4h41m.
- > Lost another marathon in 5h 15m in 2022 QF to eventual champion Alcaraz after holding 1 MP in 4th set. Match ended at US Open record 2:50 a.m.
- > Joined Berrettini in 2021 and 2022 as 1st pair of Italian men to reach same US Open 4R in event history (since 1881). Also joined Berrettini in 2022 as 1st pair of Italian men to reach same US Open QF in event history.
- > Squandered 2-set lead and lost 5th-set tiebreak vs. Khachanov in 2020 US Open 1R.
- > Qualified and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 US Open (l. to 2016 champion Wawrinka in 1R).
- > Bids to become 2nd man in history to win both Australian Open and US Open in back-to-back years (Federer 2006-07).
- > Would be the fourth man to reach 5 consecutive Grand Slam finals in Open Era after Federer (10 in 2005-07, 8 in 2008-10), Djokovic (6 in 2015-16, 5 in 2020-21) and Nadal (5 in 2011-12).
- > Aims to be fourth man in Open Era to reach finals of all 4 Grand Slams in a season after Laver (1969), Federer (2006-07, 2009) and Djokovic (2015, 2021, 2023).
- > He is on a 24-match winning streak on hard courts at Grand Slam level, last loss to Zverev in 2023 US Open 4R and 23-1 in Grand Slams this year, lone loss to Alcaraz in Roland Garros final after holding 3 championship points.
- > Attempts to be first man to defend US Open title since Federer won 5 consecutive titles from 2004-08.
- > Boasts 78-1 record vs. players ranked outside Top 20 since 2023 US Open, lone loss to No. 45 Bublik in Halle 2R this year and aims to be the youngest man to earn 24 Grand Slam wins in a season since Nadal, 22, in 2008 (24).
- > Aims to advance to his 3rd US Open QF (2022, 2024), reach QF for 8th straight Grand Slam event, and tie Alcaraz (13) for second-most Grand Slam QFs among men born since 1990, only trailing Zverev (15).

Career Highlights

- > Unranked to begin 2018, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager, broke into Top 10 at age 20 in 2021 and became 1st Italian World No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 22 in 2024, remaining at top of rankings since (64 weeks).
- > At 2024 Australian Open, defeated 10-time champion Djokovic in SF and rallied from 2 sets down in final vs. Medvedev to be 2nd Italian men's singles Grand Slam champion in Open Era (Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros).
- > Joined Federer (2003-04 Wimbledon) and Nadal (2005-06 Roland Garros) as only men this century to successfully defend 1st Grand Slam title at 2024 Australian Open.

- > Became 11th man in Open Era and 2nd youngest behind Courier to reach finals of all 4 Grand Slam events, stopping Alcaraz's 20-match winning streak at the event to win 2025 Wimbledon title.
- > Captured 2024 US Open title to join Djokovic, Federer and Wilander as only players to win both hard-court Grand Slam titles in a season and became third man to win 1st two Grand Slam titles in one year in Open Era following Connors in 1974 and Vilas in 1977.
- > Boasts most titles of any Italian in Open Era (20), including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2023 Toronto, 2024 Miami, 2024 Cincinnati and 2024 Shanghai.
- > Led Italy to 2023 and 2024 Davis Cup titles, first since 1976, became 1st Italian to win Nitto ATP Finals title on home soil in Turin in 2024.

ALEXANDER BUBLIK

US Open Stats

- > Kazakhstan's No. 1 player is competing in 7th consecutive US Open main draw (2019-25).
- > Reached best US Open result in main draw debut in 2019 (d. Giraldo, Fabbiano, I. to Andujar in 3R), also advancing to 2R in 2021 (d. Hanfmann) and 2022 (d. Gaston).
- > Lost to former champion Thiem in 2023 1R and to Shang in 1R last year.
- > He is on a 11-match winning streak and is 20-2 since the start of Roland Garros, highlighted by Halle, Gstaad, Kitzbuhel titles and win over No. 1 Sinner in Halle 2R and is one of 3 men to capture 3 titles this year (also Alcaraz, 6 & Darderi, 3).
- > Defeated 2014 champion Cilic 6-4 6-1 6-4 in 1R, Schoolkate 6-3 6-3 6-3 in 2R and No. 14 seed Paul 7-6(5) 6-7(4) 6-3 6-7(5) 6-1 in 3R to advance to his first US Open 4R.
- > He rose 6 spots to No. 18 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#) and would jump to No. 15 with a win.
- > Attempts to be the second man this decade to earn multiple wins over World No. 1 in a season while ranked outside Top 20 after Kyrgios in 2022 defeated No. 1 Medvedev as No. 37 in Toronto 2R and as No. 25 in US Open 4R.
- > Bids to be the first player to defeat Sinner before quarter-final stage at a Grand Slam since Zverev in 2023 US Open 4R and is the only player to record a win over Sinner prior to QF at any event since the start of 2024 season (2025 Halle 2R).
- > Plays in his third Grand Slam fourth round after 2023 Wimbledon and Roland Garros earlier this year, when he became first man representing Kazakhstan to reach a Grand Slam quarter-final in history.
- > Yet to drop serve this week, winning 55 of his 55 service games, becoming 10th man to reach US Open 4R without dropping serve in this century and could join Nadal in 2010 & 2013 and Tsonga in 2015 as only men to advance to US Open QF by winning all service games played.
- > Bublik is 13-25 vs. Top 10, including 4-3 this season, and is 3-5 vs. Top 10 at Grand Slam level, earning all 3 wins at Roland Garros, defeating No. 9 Monfils in 2020 1R before wins over No. 9 de Minaur and No. 5 Draper this year.
- > Aims to record second win over a World No. 1 (1-3) after defeating No. 1 Sinner in Halle 2R in June this year and is one of two players to defeat Sinner this season (also Alcaraz 3 times).
