CINCINNATI OPEN TALKING POINTS

- For third time in PIF ATP Rankings history, World No. 1 and World No. 2 will contest men's singles final at
 Cincinnati Open. Defending champion and No. 1 Jannik Sinner takes on No. 2 Carlos Alcaraz, who is
 attempting to win his 1st title in Cincinnati after squandering 1 championship point in final vs. Djokovic two
 years ago. Alcaraz leads their Lexus ATP Head2Head 8-5, including 5-2 in their hard-court matches.
- No. 1 seed Sinner is on a 26-match winning streak on hard courts since losing to Alcaraz in Beijing final last year and attempts to win his 5th ATP Masters 1000 title, first since Shanghai last year. He would become the fourth man to win 3 titles this season after winning Australian Open and Wimbledon (Alcaraz 5; Bublik, Darderi 3). He attempts to be first man to defend Cincinnati Open title since Federer in 2014-15 and could become first ATP Masters 1000 champion without dropping a set since Alcaraz at 2023 Indian Wells.

• With a win, **Sinner** would tie **Alcaraz** for most tour-level titles among men born in 2000s (21), as well as tie both Alcaraz and Cilic for 3rd-most titles among active male players. On the other side of the net, Alcaraz bids to become 8th and 2nd-youngest man (22Y 3M) to win 8 ATP Masters 1000 titles. If he wins, Alcaraz would be in front of Sinner on <u>PIF ATP Live Rankings</u> during the US Open once last year's points are removed.

World No. 2 Alcaraz is on a 16-match winning streak at ATP Masters 1000 level after titles at Monte-Carlo and Rome, aiming to tie Muster (17) for 10th-longest winning streak in series history. He attempts to be the third Spaniard to win Cincinnati men's title after Carlos Moya (2002) and Rafael Nadal (2013) and could become the youngest man to win the title at this event since Murray, 21, in 2008.

Sinner has outperformed Alcaraz across five of the seven Insights in Cincinnati, playing with a notably aggressive style. His In Attack Score sits 3% above his 52-week average, and he's been highly effective in those moments, boasting a Conversion Score of 84%.

That said, Alcaraz still holds the edge in their head-to-head at ATP events, with a 5–3 record over Sinner. The data highlights how he's managed that: despite trailing in most areas, he leads in two key Insights. The most decisive is his impressive Steal Score of 39%.

Another factor is their evenly matched Forehand Quality, with both players posting an elite 8.8 when facing each other. With such a finely balanced weapon on both sides, the forehand battle could well decide the outcome of this match.

Jannik Sinner | Age: 24 | World No. 1 (Career-High) | 2025: 31-3 (2 Titles) | Cincinnati: 12-3 (2024 Title) > Unranked to begin 2018, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager, broke into Top 10 at age 20 in 2021 and became 1st Italian World No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 22 in 2024, remaining at top of rankings since (61 weeks). > At 2024 Australian Open, defeated 10-time champion Djokovic in SF and rallied from 2 sets down in final vs. Medvedev to be 2nd Italian men's singles Grand Slam champion in Open Era (Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros). > Joined Federer at 2003-04 Wimbledon and Nadal at 2005-06 Roland Garros as only men this century to successfully defend 1st Grand Slam title at 2024 Australian Open.

- > Also captured 2024 US Open title to join Djokovic, Federer and Wilander as only men to win both hard-court Grand Slam titles in a season.
- > Became 11th man in Open Era to reach singles finals of all 4 Grand Slams and stopped Alcaraz's 20-match winning streak at the event to win 2025 Wimbledon title after missing 3 match points in 2025 Roland Garros final vs. Alcaraz.
- > Boasts most titles of any Italian in Open Era (20), including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2023 Toronto, 2024 Miami, 2024 Cincinnati and 2024 Shanghai.
- > Led Italy to 2023 and 2024 Davis Cup titles, first since 1976, became 1st Italian to win Nitto ATP Finals title in Turin in 2024 and Next Gen ATP Finals title in Milan in 2019.

NOTE: Sinner, who turned 24 on Saturday, is on a 12-match winning streak after winning Wimbledon in July and 9-match winning streak in Cincinnati after winning last year's title. He seeks 21st tour-level title (20-7 in finals), 5th at ATP Masters 1000 level, aiming to successfully defend a tour-level title for third time in his career (2020-21 Sofia, 2024-25 Australian Open) and extend his 26-match winning streak on hard courts.

Carlos Alcaraz | Age: 22 | World No. 2 | Career-High No. 1 | 2025: 53-6 (5 Titles) | Cincinnati: 11-4 (2023, 2025 Final) > Youngest and first teenage World No. 1 and year-end No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), making record rise from No. 32 at end of 2021 to No. 1 at age 19 in September 2022, earning total of 36 weeks.

- > Beat Ruud in 2022 US Open final for No. 1 ranking, becoming youngest men's champion at US Open since Sampras, 19, in 1990 and at any Grand Slam event since Nadal, 19, at 2005 Roland Garros.
- > Won 2024 Roland Garros to become youngest man to win Grand Slam titles on all three surfaces and saved 3 championship points in longest final in tournament history to defend the title at 2025 Roland Garros.
- > Defeated 7-time champion Djokovic in 2023 and 2024 Wimbledon finals to be 2nd man in Open Era to win 1st four Grand Slam finals and became youngest Olympic men's finalist since 1904, earning silver medal at Paris Olympics.
- > Youngest player to defeat both Nadal and Djokovic and 1st to do so at same clay-court event, beating them on back-to-back days en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2022 Madrid.

NOTE: Alcaraz leads the ATP Tour in wins (53) and titles (5) this season and is on a 38-2 run since April. He aims to capture 22nd tour-level title (21-7 in finals), sixth of 2025, and 8th at ATP Masters 1000 level. He is 4-2 vs. World No. 1s and bids to join Sinner (3 in 2023) as only men to earn 3 No. 1 wins in a single year in last 10 seasons. With a win, he would be the first man since Djokovic and Murray (both 56) in 2015 to earn 54+ wins before heading to US Open.
