Kamil Majchrzak (POL) vs Terence Atmane (FRA)

First Meeting

Kamil Majchrzak | Age: 29 | World No. 81 | Career-High No. 175 | 2025: 7-5 (Marrakech SF) | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Former World No. 7 junior broke into Top 100 in July 2019 and achieved career-high No. 75 in February 2022.
 > Saved 2 MPs in 1st qualifying round vs. Tringali to qualify for 2025 Australian Open before reaching his 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2025 Marrakech as Q and advancing to 2025 Wimbledon 4R after win over former finalist Berrettini in 1R.
 > Went 3-0 for Team Poland at 2022 ATP Cup and advanced to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 Pune.
 > In 2019, qualified at Australian Open and Wimbledon before advancing to US Open 3R as LL with 5-set wins over Jarry and Cuevas.
 > Owns 175-106 Challenger record (8-6 in finals), defeating future Top-20 players Carreno Busta and Cecchinato to reach 1st final at 2015 Mohammedia as Q.
 > Ended junior career as 2014 Youth Olympics gold medallist, also capturing 2013 US Open boys' doubles title w/Ma. Redlicki and earning wins over future Top-10 ATP players Berrettini, Fritz, Hurkacz, Medvedev and Rublev.

NOTE: Majchrzak made career-best Grand Slam run at Wimbledon in his most recent event, defeating No. 35 Berrettini in 1R for biggest win of career and losing to No. 20 Khachanov in 4R. He looks to be 4th Polish match winner in tournament history after 1981 champion Fibak, Gasiorek, and Kubot.

Terence Atmane | Age: 23 | World No. 127 | Career-High No. 118 | 2025: 0-1 (Roland Garros 1R) | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 500 in July 2022 and Top 200 in September 2023, earning career-high No. 118 in July 2024 after reaching 3R at ATP Masters 1000 Rome (d. No. 29 Musetti in 2R via RET).
 > Made ATP Tour debut at 2023 Zhuhai as Q and beat Thompson at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai for 1st win.
 > Qualified to make Grand Slam debut at 2024 Australian Open, taking a set off eventual finalist Medvedev in 1R.
 > Went 11-1 in three-week span at Challenger events in September 2023, earning 1st final and title at Zhangjiagang after saving 6 MPs vs. Sun in 1R and 2nd title at Guangzhou, saving 3 MPs vs. Polmans in the final.
 > Owns 19-10 Challenger record in 2025 with titles in Busan and Guangzhou and went 35-18 on Challenger level in 2023, including 19-5 record in tie-breaks in Challenger events that year.
 > Reached career-high No. 20 on the ITF Juniors circuit, highlighted by run to 2020 Roland Garros boys' doubles QF w/Malgaroli.

NOTE: Atmane seeks 1st tour-level win since ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai last October, claiming all 4 career wins in ATP Masters 1000 events (2 – Rome, Shanghai). He is 4-10 vs. Top 100 on tour-level (2-2 on clay).

Ignacio Buse | Age: 21 | World No. 167 | Career-High No. 152 | 2025: 1-1 (Santiago 1R) | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 300 in July 2024 after reaching 1st Challenger SF in Salzburg and achieved career-high No. 152 after capturing 1st Challenger title in Heilbronn in June 2025.
 > Made his tour-level debut at 2023 Davis Cup tie vs. Norway defeating Budkov Kjaer, before defeating No. 20 Jarry for biggest win of career in 2024 Davis Cup.
 > Owns 38-32 Challenger record, winning 2025 Heilbronn and losing in 2024 Como final, and 52-26 record on ITF World Tennis Tour (3-2 in finals), most recent title at 2024 M25 Vic.
 > Peaked at No. 9 in junior rankings in January 2022 and went on runs in boys' doubles to Roland Garros final and US Open SF with countryman Bueno later that season.

NOTE: Buse is playing in his 2nd ATP Tour event after losing to eventual champion Djere in Santiago 1R in February. He bids to become the youngest Peruvian to win an ATP Tour match since Horna, 20, at 2001 Umag (d. Damm) and 4th Peruvian match winner in tournament history after Horna, Varillas, and Yzaga.

Laslo Djere | Age: 30 | World No. 60 | Career-High No. 27 | 2025: 13-9 (Santiago Title) | Gstaad: 6-3 (2018, 2021 SF)
 > Former World No. 3 junior broke into Top 30 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Rio de Janeiro without dropping a set, reaching career-high No. 27 in June 2019.
 > Dedicated Rio title to his parents, Caba and Hajnalka, who both passed away from cancer.

- > Defeated countryman Lajovic en route to 2nd title at 2020 Sardinia and former champions Martinez and Baez to capture 3rd title at 2025 Santiago.
- > Earned 5 victories and won 5 TBs en route to 2022 Winston-Salem final despite entering event with 15-44 career record on hard courts and 1-18 TB record in 2022.
- > Also on hard courts, upset World No. 3 Ruud at 2023 Auckland for biggest win of career.

NOTE: Djere earned 12 of 13 ATP Tour wins on clay this year, highlighted by Buenos Aires SF and Santiago title. Gstaad is one of four ATP Tour events where he advanced to multiple semifinals in his career (Budapest, Gstaad, Hamburg, Kitzbuhel).

Arthur Cazaux (FRA) vs Nikoloz Basilashvili (GEO)

First Meeting

Arthur Cazaux | Age: 22 | World No. 116 | Career-High No. 63 | 2025: 4-7 (4 times in 2R) | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > After peaking at No. 4 in juniors in 2020, broke inside Top 100 in January 2024 after defeating No. 8 Rune for biggest win of career en route to Australian Open 4R and achieved career-high No. 63 in December.
 > Defeated countryman Mannarino in ATP Tour main draw debut at 2021 Geneva as 18-year-old WC.
 > Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2021 Roland Garros as a WC and earned wins over Bergs at 2024 Wimbledon in 5 sets, 2-time semi-finalist Carreno Busta at 2024 US Open and No. 28 Baez at 2025 Aus. Open.
 > Owns 73-39 record on ATP Challenger Tour (3-5 in finals), winning titles at both 2022 and 2023 Nonthaburi-2 as Q and 2024 Noumea.
 > Went 122-48 on ITF Junior Circuit, highlighted by run to 2020 Australian Open boys' singles final.
 > Discovered tennis at age 3 when his father was watching Nadal at Roland Garros and started playing tennis against the wall as nobody in his family played the sport.

NOTE: Cazaux seeks 2nd ATP Tour win on clay after defeating No. 37 Mannarino in 2021 Geneva 1R in tour-level debut (0-7 on clay since). He qualified for Wimbledon and defeated Walton in 1R in his most recent event (l. to No. 11 de Minaur in 4 sets in 2R).

Nikoloz Basilashvili | Age: 33 | World No. 112 | Career-High No. 16 | 2025: 3-5 (Montpellier QF) | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Broke into Top 20 and achieved career-high No. 16 in 2019 after advancing to Grand Slam 4R for 1st time at 2018 US Open.
 > Earned personal-best 33 victories in 2021, highlighted by biggest win of career over No. 3 Tsitsipas en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at Indian Wells.
 > Captured 5 ATP Tour titles despite 149-177 career record (.457) and 6 ATP Challenger Tour titles despite 82-81 career record (.503).
 > En route to titles, defeated No. 4 Del Potro at 2018 Beijing, No. 5 A. Zverev at 2019 Hamburg (saved 2 MPs) and No. 6 Federer at 2021 Doha (saved 1 MP).
 > Father, Nodar, was a dancer in Georgian national ballet.

NOTE: Basilashvili seeks 150th tour-level win (149-177), 1st on clay since saving 1 MP to defeat Cressy at 2022 Roland Garros (0-4 since). He is 2nd Georgian to compete in Gstaad after Labadze in 2003 (l. to F. Lopez in 1R).

Dominic Stricker | Age: 22 | World No. 229 | Career-High No. 88 | 2025: 0-5 (2x 1R) | Gstaad: 2-4 (2022-23 2R)
 > After ending 2020 as World No. 3 junior, achieved career-high No. 88 in October 2023 after defeating No. 7 Tsitsipas for biggest win of career en route to 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2023 US Open.
 > Qualified for Next Gen ATP Finals in 2022 and 2023, falling in SFs to Lehecka and Medjedovic.
 > Advanced to QFs in ATP Tour debut at 2021 Geneva and 2nd ATP Tour main draw at 2021 Stuttgart.
 > Beat Cressy in 2022 Basel 1R as 20-year-old WC to become youngest Swiss to earn a win in Basel since Federer, 19, in 2000 and No. 8 Ruud in 2023 2R to be youngest Swiss quarter-finalist in Basel since Federer, 20, in 2001.
 > Captured 1st Challenger title in 2nd Challenger appearance at 2021 Lugano as WC.
 > Defeated Riedi in 1st All-Swiss Grand Slam boys' singles final at 2020 Roland Garros before teaming w/Cobolli to win boys' doubles title, becoming 1st player to sweep those titles since Gonzalez in 1998.

NOTE: Stricker seeks 1st ATP Tour win since defeating No. 35 Griekspoor in Basel 1R in October (l. to No. 14 Rune in 2R). He is making his 5th consecutive appearance in Gstaad, defeating Huesler in 2022 1R and Fils in 2023 1R.

Pierre-Hugues Herbert | Age: 34 | World No. 144 | Career-High No. 36 | 2025: 4-4 (4x 2R) | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Former Top-40 singles player defeated No. 5 Tsitsipas for biggest win of career en route to 4th ATP Tour singles final at 2021 Marseille.
 > Formed strong doubles team with countryman Mahut, who is 9 years older, that led to his career-high No. 2 doubles ranking in 2016.
 > One of 8 teams to complete career Grand Slam in doubles, winning titles at 2015 US Open, 2016 Wimbledon, 2018 Roland Garros, 2019 Australian Open and 2021 Roland Garros.
 > Captured Nitto ATP Finals doubles titles in 2019 and 2021 after squandering championship point in 2018 and qualifying in 2015-17.
 > Frenchmen boast 21-8 team record in tour-level doubles finals, including 7-2 at ATP Masters 1000s with 7 different titles.

NOTE: Herbert is 4-0 in tour-level opening rounds this year, including defeating Coria in Marrakech and Bonzi at Roland Garros for first tour-level wins on clay since 2021. He is playing in an ATP Tour event on Swiss soil for the second time in his career after 2014 Basel (d. Roger-Vasselin, l. to No. 3 Nadal in 2R).
