CINCH CHAMPIONSHIPS TALKING POINTS

- Four-time ATP Tour champions **Matteo Berrettini** and **Alex de Minaur** will meet on Saturday for a spot in the cinch Championships final. Berrettini, the No. 1 seed and World No. 9, has not lost a set in his tournament debut. De Minaur has won six straight semi-finals but lost six straight matches against Top-10 opponents.
- Also through to the semi-finals is Cameron Norrie, who boasts a 28-12 record on the season and returned to a
 career-high No. 41 in this week's FedEx ATP Rankings. The Brit has earned 14 victories in 2021 over higherranked opponents, including two this week against No. 38 Albert Ramos-Vinolas and No. 24 Aslan Karatsev.
- Norrie will meet either No. 14 **Denis Shapovalov** or No. 65 **Frances Tiafoe**. Rain and darkness prevented Shapovalov and Tiafoe from finishing their guarter-final on Friday. Play will resume with Shapovalov ahead 6-3.
- All five remaining players are under the age of 26. Berrettini is the only one who has played in a tour-level semi-final on grass. The 25-year-old Italian won the Stuttgart title and reached the Halle semi-finals on grass in 2019.

Frances Tiafoe | Age: 23 | World No. 65 | Career-High No. 29 | 2021: 12-10 (2nd QF) | Queen's: 4-2 (2018, 2021 QFs) > Former World No. 2 junior set new career-high ranking 11 times in 2017 and 7 times in 2018 before peaking at No. 29 in 2019.

- > Won 1st ATP Tour title as 20-year-old at 2018 Delray Beach, becoming only WC champion in event history (since 1993) and youngest American champion on tour since Roddick, 19, at 2002 Houston.
- > Defeated Dimitrov on 21st birthday to reach 1st Grand Slam QF at 2019 Australian Open, becoming youngest American Grand Slam quarter-finalist since Roddick, 20, at 2003 Wimbledon.
- > Advanced to 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Miami QF and owns career records of 19-7 in Florida (.731) and 62-98 elsewhere (.388).
- > Parents emigrated from Sierra Leone in 1996 and father was Head of Maintenance at Junior Tennis Champions Center in Maryland, where Frances and his twin brother Franklin trained as kids.

NOTE: Tiafoe has won 7 straight matches overall, including Nottingham Challenger grass-court title last week.

Denis Shapovalov | Age: 22 | World No. 14 | Career-High No. 10 | 2021: 17-12 (Geneva F) | Queen's: 3-3 (2021 QF) > After becoming 1st Canadian US Open quarter-finalist in 2020, became 2nd Canadian in history to break into Top 10 (also Raonic).

- > As an 18-year-old in 2017, became youngest Top-50 player since Nadal, 18, in 2004.
- > Won 1st ATP Tour title in 1st final at 2019 Stockholm, but owns 2-10 record overall in SFs.
- > Reached 2019 Paris final and 4 other ATP Masters 1000 SFs, including 2017 Montreal, where he upset No. 2 Nadal as 18-year-old WC and became youngest ATP Masters 1000 semi-finalist in series history.
- > Ended 2019 season with 3 singles and 2 doubles wins to lead Canada to its 1st Davis Cup final (ESP d. CAN 2-0).

NOTE: Shapovalov is 6-10 on grass with 0 SFs. This week, he earned multiple wins for 1st time at a grass-court event.

Matteo Berrettini | Age: 25 | World No. 9 | Career-High No. 8 | 2021: 24-6 (Belgrade-1 Title) | Queen's: 3-0 (2021 SF)

- > Achieved career-high No. 8 in 2019 to become highest-ranked Italian since No. 8 Barazzutti in 1978.
- > Beat Monfils in 5th-set TB at 2019 US Open to become 2nd Italian semi-finalist in tournament history (also Barazzutti in 1977).
- > Went 13-4 on clay in 2021, reaching 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at Madrid and 2nd Grand Slam QF at Roland Garros.
- > Defeated No. 3 Thiem for biggest career win en route to 2021 ATP Cup team final and beat No. 5 Thiem at 2019 Nitto ATP Finals to become 1st Italian to earn a singles win in tournament history (since 1970).
- > Won 2 of his 4 ATP Tour titles without dropping serve: 2018 Gstaad on clay and 2019 Stuttgart on grass.

NOTE: Berrettini is appearing in his 11th ATP Tour SF (6-4 with 2 straight wins) and 3rd on grass (1-1).

Alex de Minaur | Age: 22 | World No. 22 | Career-High No. 18 | 2021: 16-12 (Antalya Title) | Queen's: 3-1 (2021 SF) > Four-time ATP Tour singles champion and two-time Next Gen ATP Finals runner-up achieved career-high No. 18 in 2019.

- > Captured 1st title at 2019 Sydney, becoming final champion in his hometown tournament's history (est. 1885).
- > At 2019 Atlanta, became 3rd ATP Tour champion since 1991 to face 0 break points (Haas 2007 Memphis, Isner 2017 Newport).
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2020 US Open, becoming youngest Aussie in US Open QF since his mentor Hewitt in 2002.
- > Son to a Uruguayan father and Spanish mother, splits time between Australia and Spain, and speaks English, Spanish and French.

NOTE: De Minaur is appearing in his 11th ATP Tour SF (8-2 with 6 straight wins) and 1st on a surface other than hard.

Cameron Norrie | Age: 25 | World No. 41 | Career-High No. 41 | 2021: 28-12 (2 Finals) | Queen's: 3-3 (2021 SF) > Former Top-10 junior achieved career-high No. 41 in 2019 and returned to No. 41 following run to 2021 Roland Garros 3R.

- > Advanced to ATP Tour finals at 2019 Auckland as WC, 2021 Estoril and 2021 Lyon.
- > Posted personal-best 28 wins in 2021 including biggest victory of career over No. 4 Thiem in Lyon 2R.
- > Reached Grand Slam 3R on 3 occasions, including at 2020 US Open, where he rallied from 2 sets down and saved 2 MPs vs. Schwartzman in 1R.
- > Born in South Africa, grew up in New Zealand, became No. 1 collegiate player in USA at Texas Christian University, and has represented Great Britain since 2013.

NOTE: Norrie is appearing in his 10th ATP Tour SF (3-6 with 2 straight wins) and 1st on grass.
