ABN AMRO OPEN TALKING POINTS

- ATP Tour returns to Rotterdam Ahoy arena for 52nd edition of **ABN Amro Open** that includes four former champions: **Felix Auger-Aliassime** (2022), **Andrey Rublev** (2021) and 2023 champion **Daniil Medvedev**, who on Monday takes on 2015 champion **Stan Wawrinka** in a first-round encounter.
- World No. 3 **Carlos Alcaraz** makes his Rotterdam debut as the 21-year-old looks for his 1st indoor ATP Tour title and attempts to become 1st Spanish champion in tournament history years after his coach, **Juan Carlos Ferrero**, reached 2004 final and his idol, **Rafael Nadal**, reached 2009 final. He faces a familiar foe in his 1R match as he meets Dutch wildcard **Botic van de Zandschulp** after losing to him in US Open 2R last year.
- No. 2 seed **Medvedev**, who won all of his 20 tour-level titles at different events, will bid to break that streak this week. Last year's runner-up **Alex de Minaur** returns as No. 3 seed and will attempt to capture his 3rd ATP 500 title after winning in Acapulco in 2023 and 2024, while 2022 runner-up **Stefanos Tsitsipas** looks for his 1st ATP 500 title, as the 11-time ATP Tour champion is 0-11 in finals at ATP 500 level.
- 2022 champion **Auger-Aliassime** won his 7th title in Montpellier on Sunday to become the 1st player to win multiple ATP Tour titles in 2025 and the indoor specialist aims to continue his winning streak at the site of his 1st ATP Tour title. No. 7 seed **Arthur Fils** led the tour with 17 ATP 500 wins last year, highlighted by Hamburg and Tokyo titles and the 20-year-old will attempt to become the youngest champion in tournament history.
- Dutch No. 1 **Tallon Griekspoor** is 17-3 on home soil since the start of 2023 season, including runs to Rotterdam SF in last two editions, losing to **Jannik Sinner**. He is joined by wildcards **Botic van de Zandschulp**, who takes on No. 1 seed in 1R for second consecutive year and World No. 1 junior **Mees Rottgering**. 17-year-old Rottgering will close the Centre Court action on Day 1, looking for 1st ATP Tour win.

Flavio Cobolli | Age: 22 | World No. 35 | Career-High No. 30 | 2025: 2-4 (3 times in 1R) | Rotterdam: 0-0 (2022 Q1)
> Broke into Top 200 in January 2022 and Top 100 in October 2023, achieving career-high No. 30 in September 2024 soon after reaching 1st ATP Tour final in Washington.
> Earned biggest wins of career over Americans Shelton as No. 15 en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2024 Geneva and as No. 14 to reach 1st final at 2024 Washington and No. 13 Paul in 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati 1R.
> Also in 2024, reached Australian Open 3R as Q (d. No. 18 Jarry in 1R) and US Open 3R as No. 31 seed.
> Saved 3 MPs vs. Giron to win ATP Tour main draw debut 3-6 7-6 7-6 at 2021 Parma as 429th-ranked WC.
> Peaked at No. 8 in juniors and ended junior career by winning 2020 Roland Garros boys' doubles title w/Stricker.

NOTE: Cobolli aims to break a 4-match losing streak since defeating No. 14 Humbert in United Cup RR by saving 1 MP. He is one of 7 Italians in Top 50 of PIF ATP Rankings, 2nd-most of all countries (USA - 8) and seeks 10th Top 30 win of career (9-18), 1st on indoor hard court (0-1).

Hubert Hurkacz | Age: 27 | World No. 21 | Career-High No. 6 | 2025: 3-4 (Aus. Open 2R) | Rotterdam: 4-5 (2021-24 2R)
> Top Polish men's player in history ended 2021 and 2023 at year-end career-high No. 9 after Nitto ATP Finals appearances and reached career-high No. 6 in August 2024.
> Entered 2021 Wimbledon on 6-match losing streak, then reached 1st Grand Slam SF by defeating 8-time champion Federer 6-3 7-6(4) 6-0 in final singles match of Swiss' career.
> Upset 5 seeds to win 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Miami title and saved a championship point to win 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai after losing in the 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Montreal final.
> Also advanced to ATP Masters 1000 SFs at 2021 Paris, 2022 Miami and 2023 Cincinnati and captured ATP Masters 1000 doubles titles at 2020 Paris w/Auger-Aliassime and 2022 Miami w/Isner.
> Defeated No. 1 Medvedev 6-1 6-4 in 63 minutes to win 5th ATP Tour singles title in 5th final at 2022 Halle (now 8-3 in finals).

NOTE: Hurkacz bids to advance to Rotterdam 2R for the fifth consecutive year in sixth appearance (l. to No. 6 Tsitsipas in 2020 1R). He is playing in his first event since dropping outside Top 20 of PIF ATP Rankings for 1st time since April 2021, when he won ATP Masters 1000 Miami as No. 37 (199 consecutive weeks).

Stefanos Tsitsipas | Age: 26 | World No. 12 | Career-High No. 3 | 2025: 1-2 (Aus. Open 1R) | Rotterdam: 9-6 (2022 Final)
> Top-ranked Greek of all time achieved career-high No. 3 in August 2021 and boasts 11 wins vs. Top-3 opponents (2 vs. No. 1, 4 vs. No. 2, 5 vs. No. 3).
> Six-time Grand Slam semi-finalist, highlighted by runs to 2021 Roland Garros and 2023 Australian Open finals, losing to Djokovic on both occasions.
> Captured 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals title at age 20 and 2019 Nitto ATP Finals title at age 21, becoming youngest champion of latter since Hewitt, 20, in 2001.
> Won 11 ATP Tour titles, including 2021, 2022 and 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo, but still seeking 1st ATP 500 title (0-11 in finals).
> Youngest of 30 players to defeat Djokovic (2018 Toronto 3R), Federer (2019 Australian Open 4R) and Nadal (2019 Madrid SF), sweeping Big 3 before turning 21.

NOTE: Tsitsipas made his ATP Tour debut in Rotterdam 8 years ago as No. 205-ranked WC (l. to No. 14 Tsonga). The Greek won 4 of his 11 ATP Tour titles indoors at 2018 Stockholm, 2019-20 Marseille and 2019 Nitto ATP Finals.

Harold Mayot | Age: 22 | World No. 138 | Career-High No. 103 | 2025: 0-1 (Montpellier 1R) | Rotterdam: 0-0 (Debut)
> Former No. 1 junior earned 1st ranking point in 2019, broke into Top 500 in 2020, Top 200 in 2023 and achieved career-high No. 103 in October 2024.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour QF as Q in his hometown at 2023 Metz and 2nd QF at 2024 Montpellier as WC.
> Defeated countryman Bonzi to earned 1st tour-level win at 2023 Wimbledon as Q (l. to Pella in 2R).
> Made ATP Tour debut at 2020 Marseille and Grand Slam debut at 2020 Roland Garros as a WC.
> Owns 82-68 Challenger record (0-5 in finals), reaching finals at 2022 Tampere, 2023 Mallorca, 2024 Barletta, 2024 Ilkley and 2024 Orleans.
> Beat compatriot and doubles partner Cazaux in 2020 Australian Open boys' singles final to become the first Frenchman to win the title since Sidorenko in 2006.

NOTE: Mayot, who turns 23 on Tuesday, is playing in his 1st match vs. a Top 20 opponent and looks for biggest win of career (0-3 vs. Top 30). He seeks 1st ATP Tour win since defeating No. 84 Coric in Atlanta 1R last July.

Stan Wawrinka | Age: 39 | World No. 155 | Career-High No. 3 | 2025: 0-2 (2 times in 1R) | Rotterdam: 12-5 (2015 Title)
> Achieved career-high No. 3 in 2014 and ended 2014-16 at No. 4 before undergoing 2 left knee surgeries in 2017 and 2 left foot surgeries in 2021.
> Boasts 5 wins over World No. 1 at Grand Slams, including finals of 2014 Australian Open (d. Nadal), 2015 Roland Garros (d. Djokovic) and 2016 US Open (d. Djokovic).

- > One of 3 players to defeat Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal at Grand Slams (also Berdych, Tsonga).
- > Owns 16 singles titles with 11 straight wins in finals from 2014-16, defeating fellow Swiss Federer for lone ATP Masters 1000 title at 2014 Monte Carlo.
- > Won 2008 Beijing Olympics doubles gold medal w/Federer and helped Switzerland capture 2014 Davis Cup.

NOTE: Wawrinka aims to record an ATP Tour win in a 22nd different season (2003, 2005-24). The 39-year-old, who made his Rotterdam debut in 2005 (l. to No. 1 Federer in 2R), won 2015 title by defeating No. 7 Berdych and now aims to earn first Top 10 win since defeating No. 7 Rublev in Stockholm QF last year (63-102 vs. Top 10 in career).

Daniil Medvedev | Age: 28 | World No. 7 | Career-High No. 1 | 2025: 1-1 (Aus. Open 2R) | Rotterdam: 10-4 (2023 Title)

- > Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in 2004.
- > Six-time Grand Slam finalist owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.
- > Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).
- > Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.
- > Won 18 of his 20 singles titles on hard courts and all 20 of his titles at different events, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami and 2023 Rome, his 1st career clay ATP Tour title.

NOTE: Medvedev is on a 5-match winning streak in Rotterdam after winning 2023 title (d. Sinner) and not playing last year. This week, the 28-year-old seeks 1st title since 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Rome and bids to capture an ATP Tour title at the same event twice for 1st time in career.

First Meeting

Mattia Bellucci | Age: 23 | World No. 92 (Career-High) | 2025: 1-1 (Montpellier 2R) | Rotterdam: 0-0 (Debut)

- > Began 2022 season as No. 681 on PIF ATP Rankings, broke in Top 500 in April, Top 200 in October and ended the year as No. 154, before breaking in Top 100 in November 2024 and achieving career-high No. 92 in February 2025.
- > Earned biggest win of career over No. 32 Mannarino to reach 1st ATP Tour QF at 2024 Atlanta as Q.
- > Made tour-level debut at 2023 Australian Open as Q, then qualified Roland Garros and Wimbledon and US Open in 2024, defeating former champion Wawrinka in US Open 1R for 1st Grand Slam win.
- > Owns 61-60 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning titles at 2022 Saint-Tropez as No. 275-ranked Q, 2022 Vilnius in back-to-back weeks and 2023 Cassis.

NOTE: Bellucci defeated Dutchmen 16-year-old Boogaard in Q1 and No. 8 seed Brouwer in Q2 to qualify for 3rd ATP 500 event in as many attempts (also 2024 Washington and Tokyo). Last week, he earned 1st ATP Tour win of 2025 by defeating Pouille in Montpellier 1R, before losing to eventual finalist Kovacevic in 2R.

Mees Rottgering | Age: 17 | World No. 839 | Career-High No. 800 | 2025: 0-0 | Rotterdam: 0-0 (Debut)

- > Current World No. 1 junior earned 1st ranking point at age 15 and achieved career-high No. 800 in August 2024.
- > Reached top of junior rankings on 6 January 2025, a month before making his ATP Tour debut in Rotterdam as WC.
- > He is 25-20 on ITF World Tennis Tour (0-1 in finals), reaching 1st final at 2024 M15 Sharm ElSheikh in February and partnered with countryman Van Sambeek to capture 2024 M15 Metzingen doubles title without losing a set.
- > Boasts 90-41 record in juniors, highlighted by 2024 Wimbledon boys' singles final, becoming 1st Dutchman to play in boys' singles Wimbledon finalist since de Bakker in 2006, and won 2024 ITF World Tennis Tour Junior Finals title.
- > Was invited to join Dutch team as a hitting partner at 2024 Davis Cup Finals as the team went on to reach 1st final for Netherlands in Davis Cup history.

NOTE: World No. 1 junior Rottgering is making his ATP Tour debut and aims to be the youngest man to win a main draw match in Rotterdam since Federer, 17, in 1999 and second man born in 2007 or later to win an ATP Tour match after Engel defeated Wong at 2024 Almaty.

Youngest Match Winners in Rotterdam: At 17 years and 6 months, Rottgering would become the fourth youngest match winner in Rotterdam history.
