Marcos Giron (USA) vs Mattia Bellucci (ITA)

First Meeting

Marcos Giron | Age: 32 | World No. 54 | Career-High No. 37 | 2025: 20-23 (5 QFs) | Event: 5-3 (2024 SF)

- > One of 3 former UCLA Bruins to break into Top 50 during 2022 season (also Cressy, McDonald) and achieved career-high No. 37 in August 2024 after saving 1 MP in Newport final to win 1st ATP Tour title.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour final at age 29 and in his home state of California at 2022 San Diego.
- > Qualified at 11 ATP Masters 1000 events and posted Top-5 upsets over No. 5 Ruud at 2025 Indian Wells and No. 4 Fritz at 2025 Rome.
- > Reached 2021 Roland Garros 3R after rallying from 6-2 6-4 5-1 down and saving 3 MPs vs. Dimitrov in 1R, as well as 3R of 2023 Roland Garros and 2025 Australian Open.
- > Won 2014 NCAA singles title for UCLA and broke into Top 100 in 2020 following right hip surgery in 2015 and left hip surgery in 2016.

NOTE: Giron is making his fourth appearance at this event, reaching his 1st ATP Tour QF at 2020 Antwerp as Q and most recent of 8 career ATP Tour SFs last year. He earned 13 of 20 tour-level wins this season on hard courts, highlighted by QFs in Adelaide, Delray Beach, Acapulco and Chengdu.

Mattia Bellucci | Age: 24 | World No. 71 | Career-High No. 63 | 2025: 12-16 (Rotterdam SF) | Event: 0-0 (Debut) > Began 2022 season as No. 681 on PIF ATP Rankings, broke in Top 500 in April, Top 200 in October and ended the year as No. 154, before breaking in Top 100 in November 2024 and achieving career-high No. 63 in July 2025.

- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF at 2024 Atlanta as Q and defeated No. 7 Medvedev and No. 12 Tsitsipas for biggest wins of career en route to 1st SF at 2025 Rotterdam.
- > Made tour-level debut at 2023 Australian Open as Q, before qualifying for Roland Garros, Wimbledon and US Open in 2024, defeating former champion Wawrinka in US Open 1R for 1st Grand Slam win.
- > Owns 65-63 Challenger record (4-3 in finals), winning titles at 2022 Saint-Tropez as No. 275-ranked Q, 2022 Vilnius in back-to-back weeks, 2023 Cassis, and 2025 Sumter.

NOTE: Bellucci is playing in his first indoor event since earning wins over Medvedev and Tsitsipas to reach his 1st ATP Tour SF in Rotterdam in February. He aims to be the first Italian man to win a match at this event since Sinner won 2021 title, then held in Antwerp.

Reilly Opelka (USA) vs Benjamin Bonzi (FRA) **Bonzi Leads 1-0** 25 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai (China) Hard 7-6(2) 6-4 Benjamin Bonzi Other Meeting 18 Bordeaux CH (France) Clay R16 Reilly Opelka 6-4 6-4

Reilly Opelka | Age: 28 | World No. 62 | Career-High No. 17 | 2025: 23-20 (Brisbane Final) | Event: 0-2 (2020-21 1R) > Former Wimbledon junior champion became No. 1 American in June 2021 and achieved career-high No. 17 in February 2022 before undergoing hip surgery later that year.

- > Defeated Isner for 4th ATP 250 title on American soil at 2022 Houston after beating him 7-6(7) 7-6(22) en route to 2022 Dallas title, winning longest tiebreak in ATP Tour history (since 1990).
- > At 2020 Delray Beach, saved 1 MP vs. Raonic and defeated Nishioka on same day to win 2nd title.
- > At 2019 New York, saved 6 MPs and hit 43 aces vs. Isner in SF, then hit 43 more aces vs. Schnur in final to win 1st title.
- > Upset No. 3 Tsitsipas at 2021 Toronto for biggest win of career and to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 final and defeated No. 7 Djokovic en route to 2025 Brisbane final to break Serbian's 34-match winning streak vs. Americans.

NOTE: Opelka aims to record first win since defeating No. 8 de Minaur in ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati 2R in August and aims to avenge loss to Bonzi in Shanghai 1R last week. He owns 22-16 (.579) career record indoors, including earning 2 of his 4 ATP Tour titles indoors at 2019 New York and 2022 Dallas.

Benjamin Bonzi | Age: 29 | World No. 53 | Career-High No. 42 | 2025: 13-19 (Adelaide QF) | Event: 0-1 (2023 1R) > Broke into Top 50 in June 2022 and achieved career-high No. 42 in February 2023 after defeating 2022 runner-up Ruusuvuori en route to 1st ATP Tour final in Pune.

- > Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2024 Metz as Q, defeating No. 7 Ruud for biggest win of career in 2R.
- > Also earned Top 10 wins over No. 9 Medvedev in 2025 Wimbledon 1R and No. 10 Musetti en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 4R at 2025 Cincinnati.
- > Beat future World No. 1 Medvedev in tour-level debut at 2017 Roland Garros as WC, then reached Grand Slam 3R at 2023 Australian Open, 2023 US Open and 2025 Australian Open.
- > Earned 50 wins and 6 titles on ATP Challenger Tour in 2021, tying with 5 other players for 2nd-most Challenger titles in a single season behind Griekspoor (8 in 2021).
- > Ended junior career by winning 2014 Roland Garros boys' doubles title with countryman Halys.

NOTE: Bonzi seeks first win at this event after losing in 2023 1R to Shevchenko after qualifying for his tournament debut. He is 0-1 indoors on tour-level this year (I. to Van Assche in Marseille 1R), but finished last season on a 21-1 run indoors (including Challengers), highlighted by winning 1st ATP Tour title in Metz as Q.
