DAY 4 TALKING POINTS

- Second round of 2024 **Roland Garros** begins on Wednesday with 6 Top 10 players in action, including Grand Slam champions World No. 2 **Jannik Sinner** and World No. 3 **Carlos Alcaraz**, who will be looking to book their spots in the third round on the **Court Philippe Chatrier**. Also joining them on the schedule are No. 6 **Andrey Rublev**, No. 8 **Hubert Hurkacz**, No. 9 **Stefanos Tsitsipas** and No. 10 **Grigor Dimitrov**.
- Alcaraz** opened his tournament with a straight sets win over Wolf in the first round and now takes on qualifier **Jesper de Jong**. The 21-year-old Spaniard reached the third round in all three previous Roland Garros appearances and looks to continue his quest to collect Grand Slam titles on all three surfaces, after winning 2022 US Open on hard courts and 2023 Wimbledon on grass. de Jong seeks the biggest win of his career.
- One of 5 Frenchmen in the second round, 37-year-old **Richard Gasquet** is playing in his 21st Roland Garros and looks for his first win over a Top-2 opponent at a Grand Slam (0-12) when he meets World No. 2 **Jannik Sinner**. Sinner is still undefeated in Grand Slams this season (8-0) and aims to reach the Roland Garros 3R for the 4th time. He would become the 1st Italian to reach No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history, if he reaches the final.
- In a clash of one-handed backhands, 2021 finalist **Stefanos Tsitsipas** takes on unseeded **Daniel Altmaier** in a rematch of their Roland Garros juniors clash eight years ago, won by Tsitsipas. Altmaier is an upset specialist at this venue as he earned wins over No. 8 Berrettini in 2020 3R and No. 9 Sinner in 2R last year. Tsitsipas attempts to reach the third round in Roland Garros for the sixth consecutive year.
- Andrey Rublev** takes a 1-0 head-to-head lead into his match against **Pedro Martinez**, as Rublev aims to extend his perfect 13-0 record vs. Spaniards on clay courts, while Martinez looks to capture the biggest win of his career. **Hubert Hurkacz** meets **Brandon Nakashima** for the first time, looking to reach Roland Garros 3R for the third consecutive year. Polish No. 1 played five sets in his last four matches at the event (2023 1R-3R, 2024 1R).
- Corentin Moutet** upset No. 16 seed **Nicolas Jarry** on Court Simonne Mathieu on Sunday and now returns to the same court to take on **Alexander Shevchenko**. Moutet aims to equal his best result at Roland Garros, previously reaching the 3R in 2019. Shevchenko seeks consecutive Grand Slam match wins for the first time in his career.
- 2015 champion **Stan Wawrinka** takes on **Pavel Kotov** and aims to reach Roland Garros 3R for the first time since 2020 and 13th time in his career. On Court 14, **Denis Shapovalov** faces **Frances Tiafoe** in a battle of former Grand Slam semi-finalists in their first meeting on clay. Shapovalov leads their overall head-to-head 4-2.

JESPER DE JONG

Roland Garros Stats

- > The Dutch No. 3 qualified to make his Roland Garros debut and defeated No. 39 Draper for biggest win of his career in 1R in five sets.
- > Lost in qualifying at Roland Garros on two previous occasions; in 2022 (l. to Masur in Q2) and 2023 (l. to Medjedovic in Q3).
- > Also qualified at 2024 Australian Open to make Grand Slam main draw debut, defeating Cachin in 1R and losing to eventual champion Sinner in 2R.
- > He aims to become 1st Dutchman to earn Top 10 win at a Grand Slam event since Schalken defeated No. 8 Schuettler at 2003 US Open and first at Roland Garros since Verkerk beat No. 7 Coria and No. 4 Moya en route to 2003 final.

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 500 in 2019, Top 200 in 2022 and earned career-high No. 135 in September 2023 soon after winning his 2nd Challenger title at Grodzisk Mazowiecki without losing a set.
- > Made ATP Tour debut at 2022 's-Hertogenbosch as WC and earned 1st tour-level win at 2024 Australian Open as Q over No. 74 Cachin in his Grand Slam main draw debut.
- > He is 6-0 in Grand Slam qualifying in 2024, entering the draw as Q at both Australian Open and Roland Garros.
- > He owns an 80-61 Challenger record (2-3 in finals), came from qualifying to earn 1st final and title at 2021 Almaty-2.
- > Peaked at No. 38 in junior rankings, playing and winning a match at all four junior Grand Slam events in 2018 and reaching 2018 Roland Garros QF w/Erel and US Open SF w/Wenger in boys' doubles.

CARLOS ALCARAZ

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 21-year-old makes his fourth consecutive appearance and owns a 12-3 record at the event.
- > Defeated lucky loser J.J. Wolf 6-1 6-2 6-1 in 1R and aims to reach Roland Garros 3R in all tournament appearances.
- > Last year became the youngest No. 1 seed at Roland Garros since Borg in 1976 and reached the semi-finals before losing to eventual champion Djokovic in 4 sets.
- > In 2022, as a 19-year-old, he became youngest men's player to reach Roland Garros QF since Djokovic, 19, in 2006. The Spaniard lost to Zverev in 4 sets in QF.



- > Qualified in 2021 en route to Roland Garros 3R at age 18 to become youngest men's player to reach 3R since Andrei Medvedev (17) in 1992.
- > In 13th Grand Slam appearance, aims to reach 3R for the 11th time (2R loss at 2021 Aus. Open & Wimbledon).
- > He is 21-1 vs. players ranked outside Top 50 at Grand Slam events (l. to No. 95 M. Ymer at 2021 Australian Open 2R as a No. 141-ranked qualifier).

Career Highlights

- > Youngest and first teenage World No. 1 and year-end No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), making record rise from No. 32 at end of 2021 to No. 1 at age 19 in September 2022, then remaining atop rankings through end of season.
- > His 1st stint at No. 1 was for 20 weeks. After capturing 2023 Wimbledon crown with 5-set win over 7-time champion Djokovic, he remained at No. 1 until after the US Open for a total of 36 weeks in his young career.
- > Became 3rd Spanish man to win Wimbledon after Nadal (2008, 2010) and Manuel Santana (1966).
- > Beat Ruud in 2022 US Open final for No. 1 ranking, becoming youngest men's champion at US Open since Sampras, 19, in 1990 and at any Grand Slam event since Nadal, 19, at 2005 Roland Garros.
- > Became youngest ATP 500 champion at 2022 Rio de Janeiro (since 2009) and 3rd-youngest ATP Masters 1000 champion at 2022 Miami (since 1990).
- > Captured 9 titles as a teenager (9-3 in finals), behind Borg (17), Nadal (16), Wilander (14), Becker (12) and Agassi (10) and 6th-youngest to win 10 tour-level titles behind Wilander, Borg, Nadal, Becker and Agassi.
- > Youngest player to defeat both Nadal and Djokovic and 1st to do so at same clay-court event, beating them on back-to-back days en route to 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2022 Madrid.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2021 US Open, becoming youngest men's quarter-finalist at US Open since Koch, 18, in 1963 (Amateur Era) and at any Grand Slam since Chang, 18, at 1990 Roland Garros.

RICHARD GASQUET

Roland Garros Stats

- > The French veteran is playing in his 21st Roland Garros main draw and ties Feliciano Lopez for most appearances at the event in Open Era.
- > Defeated Coric 7-6(5) 7-6(2) 6-4 to record his 30th win at the event and now seeks his 10th 3R in Roland Garros, first time since 2018 (2005, 2011-18).



- > Reached the Roland Garros fourth round in five attempts (2011-13, 2015-16), defeating No. 6 Nishikori for only Top 10 win at the event (1-12) to reach the 2016 quarter-finals (l. to No. 2 Murray).
- > His 116 Grand Slam wins is 3rd-most among Frenchmen behind Tsonga and Monfils (both 121).
- > He made his debut in 2002, losing to eventual champion Albert Costa in 1R as a 16-year-old WC ranked No. 294.
- > Also at 2002 Roland Garros, captured boys' singles title, defeating Recouderc 6-0 6-1 in the final.
- > Owns 2 wins vs. Top-2 players (2-37), defeating No. 1 Federer at 2005 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo and No. 2 Medvedev at 2022 Geneva.
- > Looks to be the first Frenchman to defeat a Top-2 player at a Grand Slam since Tsonga at 2008 Australian Open (d. No. 2 Nadal) and first at Roland Garros since Mutis defeated No. 2 Roddick in 2004.

Career Highlights

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 7 in 2007 and finished 4 seasons in Top 10 overall (2007, 2012-13, 2015).
- > Defeated Top-5 players in 5 sets to reach SFs at 2007 Wimbledon (d. Roddick in QF), 2013 US Open (d. Ferrer in QF) and 2015 Wimbledon (d. Wawrinka in QF).
- > Owns 16 ATP Tour titles, including 2023 Auckland where he won the title at age 36 to become the oldest winner during the season.
- > Qualified at Nitto ATP Finals in 2007 and 2013, and reached ATP Masters 1000 finals at 2005 Hamburg, 2006 Toronto and 2012 Toronto.
- > Won ATP Tour debut as 15-year-old at 2002 Monte Carlo (d. Squillari), earned biggest career win at 2005 Monte Carlo (d. No. 1 Federer) and posted 500th career win at 2018 Monte Carlo (d. M. Zverev).
- > Remains youngest match winner since start of ATP Tour in 1990 and owns 605 wins overall – most among Frenchmen in Open Era (since 1968) and joined Nadal, Djokovic and Murray as only active players on ATP Tour with at least 600 wins.

JANNIK SINNER

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 22-year-old Italian is playing in his 5th Roland Garros, reaching at least the fourth round stage in first three appearances (2020 QF, 2021-22 4R), before losing to Altmaier in 2R last year.
- > Defeated Eubanks 6-3 6-3 6-4 in 1R and is 8-0 in Grand Slam events this season (won Australian Open in January).
- > Advanced to his first career Grand Slam QF at 2020 Roland Garros in his tournament debut, becoming the first debutant to reach Roland Garros QF since Nadal in 2005. He lost to eventual champion Nadal.
- > Owns an 11-1 record vs. players outside the Top 10 at Roland Garros, l. to No. 79 Altmaier in 2023 2R.
- > He is 25-1 vs. Frenchmen since August 2020, lone loss to Rinderknech at 2021 Lyon (26-5 in career).
- > If he reaches the Roland Garros final this year, he will become the first Italian World No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history regardless of Djokovic's result at this event.

Career Highlights

- > Unranked to begin 2018, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager and broke into Top 10 at age 20 in 2021, then reached career-high No. 2 in April 2024, becoming the highest-ranked Italian in PIF ATP Rankings history.
- > At 2024 Australian Open, defeated 10-time champion Djokovic in SF and rallied from two sets down in final against Medvedev to win his 1st Grand Slam title. Became 1st player to beat Djokovic in SF or later at the tournament.
- > Earned personal-best 64 wins in 2023, setting the record for most wins by an Italian player in a single season in Open Era, highlighted by first ATP Masters 1000 title at Toronto.



- > Won 2019 Next Gen ATP Finals title and 13 tour-level titles from 2020-24 and reached 2023 Nitto ATP Finals championship match in Turin (l. to Djokovic).
- > As 19-year-old in 2021, became 1st teenager to win an ATP 500 title at Washington and 1st Italian finalist in tournament history of ATP Masters 1000 Miami (since 1985).
- > After reaching finals in 2021 and 2023, won his 2nd ATP Masters 1000 title at 2024 Miami, becoming the first Italian with multiple ATP Masters 1000 titles.
- > Reached QFs of all 4 Grand Slam events by 21 years of age, including 2022 Wimbledon (l. to eventual champion Djokovic in QF after holding 2-set lead), 2022 US Open QF (l. to eventual champion Alcaraz after holding 1 MP) and 2020 Roland Garros QF in his tournament debut (l. to eventual champion Nadal).

DANIEL ALTMAIER

Roland Garros Stats

- > The 25-year-old German is making his fourth Roland Garros appearance, defeating Djere 7-5 6-4 6-7(6) 5-7 7-6(6) in 1R in five sets and 5h4m to advance to 2R for the third time (2020 4R, 2022 1R, 2023 3R).
- > Last year earned straight sets win over Huesler in 1R, then defeated No. 9 Sinner in 2R (l. to Dimitrov in 3R).
- > In 2020, came through qualifying to defeat No. 30 seed Struff in 2R and World No. 8 Berrettini both in straight sets to record biggest win of career (l. to Carreno Busta in 4R).
- > The German is 4-3 vs. Top 10 players, 2-0 at Roland Garros and 1-1 in 2024 (d. No. 6 Zverev in Acapulco 1R).
- > Played in Roland Garros boys' singles event in 2016, losing to Tsitsipas in 1R.

Career Highlights

- > Made Top 50 debut a day before his 25th birthday in September, achieving career-high No. 47 in October 2023.
- > In 2023, reached 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at Madrid as a LL and defeated No. 7 Rublev for biggest win of career en route to 2023 Hamburg QF.
- > Ended 2022 season with 13 wins in his last 14 Challenger matches, including back-to-back titles at Lima-2 and Guayaquil.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SFs of career in back-to-back weeks at Umag and Kitzbuhel in July 2021.
- > Made Grand Slam qualifying debut at 2020 Roland Garros and earned 6th win of tournament over No. 8 Berrettini to reach 4R and defeated No. 9 Sinner en route to 2023 Roland Garros 3R.
- > Hits a one-handed backhand and says that his idols growing up were fellow one-handers Federer and Wawrinka.



STEFANOS TSITSIPAS

Roland Garros Stats

- > Greek star is making his 8th straight Roland Garros appearance (22-7) and from 2017-2021, improved his result every year since making debut as a qualifier ranked No. 205 in 2017 (l. to Karlovic in 1R).
- > Defeated Fucsovics 7-6(7) 6-4 6-1 in 1R and now looks to reach 3R of Roland Garros for the 6th consecutive year.
- > Last year advanced to his 3rd Roland Garros QF, losing to Alcaraz after losing to Rune in 4R in 2022.
- > En route to his first Grand Slam final in 2021, beat Isner (3R), No. 12 Carreno Busta (4R), No. 2 Medvedev (QF) and No. 6 Zverev (SF in 5 sets) before falling to Djokovic 6-7(6) 2-6 6-3 6-2 6-4.
- > In 2018, reached 2R (l. to No. 8 Thiem in 4 sets) and followed with 4R in 2019 (l. to Wawrinka 8-6 in 5th set), SF in 2020 (l. to No. 1 Djokovic 6-1 in 5th set) and runner-up in 2021.
- > Reached boys' singles 3R in 2015 (d. Humbert in 2R, l. to Fritz in 3R) and QF in 2016 (l. to Shapovalov).

Career Highlights

- > Top-ranked Greek of all time achieved career-high No. 3 in August 2021 and boasts 11 wins vs. Top-3 opponents (2 vs. No. 1, 4 vs. No. 2, 5 vs. No. 3).
- > Finished in Top 10 of PIF ATP Rankings for past 5 years (No. 4 in 2021-22, No. 6 in 2019-2020 and 2023).
- > Six-time Grand Slam semi-finalist, highlighted by runs at 2021 Roland Garros and 2023 Australian Open finals, losing to Djokovic on both occasions.
- > Captured 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals title at age 20 and 2019 Nitto ATP Finals title at age 21, becoming youngest champion of latter since Hewitt, 20, in 2001.
- > Won 11 ATP Tour titles, including 2021, 2022 and 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Monte Carlo, but still seeking 1st ATP 500 title (0-11 in finals).
- > Youngest of 30 players to defeat Djokovic (2018 Toronto 3R), Federer (2019 Australian Open 4R) and Nadal (2019 Madrid SF), sweeping Big 3 before turning 21.

ANDREY RUBLEV

Roland Garros Stats

- > Making 6th appearance at Roland Garros, reaching the quarterfinals in 2020 (l. to Tsitsipas) and 2022 (l. to Cilic).
- > Defeated Daniel 6-2 6-7(3) 6-3 7-5 in 1R and aims to reach 3R for the 10th consecutive Grand Slam event played since losing to Struff in 2021 Roland Garros 1R.
- > Lost in five sets 4 out of 5 times with 1R exits to Schwartzman (2017) and Struff (2021), and a 3R exit to Sonego (2023).

- > Rallied from 2 sets down for the only time in his career to defeat Querrey in 2020 1R.
- > Captured 2014 Roland Garros boys' singles title (d. Munar) and reached boys' doubles SF w/Kozlov (l. to Bonzi/Halys).
- > Rublev is 13-0 vs. Spaniards on tour-level clay in his career, including wins over No. 3 Nadal at 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo and No. 3 Alcaraz at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.

Career Highlights

- > Former World No. 1 junior broke into Top 20 in January 2020, Top 10 in October 2020 and Top 5 in September 2021.

- > Defeated No. 3 Nadal at 2021 Monte Carlo and No. 2 Medvedev at 2021 Cincinnati en route to ATP Masters 1000 finals, then beat No. 1 Djokovic for 11th of 16 ATP Tour titles at 2022 Belgrade.
- > Led tour with 5 titles in 2020, tied for tour-lead with 41 victories in 2020, and won 23 matches and 4 titles in a row at ATP 500 events from 2020-21.
- > Ten-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist reached 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF and won gold medal in All-ROC mixed doubles final at 2020 Tokyo Olympics w/Pavlyuchenkova (held in 2021).
