DAY 10 TALKING POINTS

- Four-time champion **Novak Djokovic** continues his campaign to become the first player in history to win 25 Grand Slam singles titles, as he faces World No. 4 **Taylor Fritz** on Tuesday to reach his 53rd Grand Slam SF. 38-year-old aims to complete the set of semi-finals at all 4 Grand Slam events this season for record-extending 7th time in his career. He also bids to extend his spotless record vs. Americans at US Open (15-0) and his unbeaten 13-0 record in US Open QFs to tie Jimmy Connors for most men's singles semi-finals in this tournament's history.

- Last year's finalist **Taylor Fritz** aims to become the first American man to advance to back-to-back US Open semi-finals since Agassi in 2002-03, as he seeks first win over Djokovic in their 11th meeting. He aims to record his second Top 10 win of the season (d. No. 3 Zverev in Stuttgart final) to reach back-to-back Grand Slam SFs for the first time in career after run to Wimbledon SF in July. If he defeats Djokovic, it would mark only the second time since 2007 that the 38-year-old Serbian does not reach a Grand Slam final in a season (2017).

- World No. 2 **Carlos Alcaraz** advanced to US Open QF without dropping a set for the first time in career and now takes on World No. 21 **Jiri Lehecka**. Alcaraz leads the ATP Tour in wins (58) and titles (6) this season and looks for his first Grand Slam SF on hard courts since 2023 US Open to extend his 10-match winning streak. 22-year-old Spaniard would become the fifth man in Open Era to reach 9 Grand Slam SFs before turning 23 years of age.

- Czech No. 1 **Jiri Lehecka** attempts to record the biggest win of his career to advance to his first Grand Slam semi-final. He bids to become the first man to defeat Alcaraz before the final of any event since Goffin in Miami 2R in March and first Czech man to record a Top-2 win at a Grand Slam since Berdych defeated No. 1 Federer at 2012 US Open. 23-year-old is guaranteed to break inside Top 20 for the first time after the US Open.

US Open Stats

- > Making his 4th consecutive US Open main draw appearance and defeated Coric 3-6 6-4 7-6(5) 6-1 in 1R, Etcheverry 3-6 6-0 6-2 6-4, Collignon 6-4 6-4 6-4 in 3R and Mannarino 7-6(4) 6-4 2-6 6-2 in 4R.
- > Last year, defeated Fucsovics for 1st US Open win and posted lone comeback from 2 sets down in career vs. Krueger in 2R to reach his 1st US Open 3R before to No. 6 Rublev.
- > With Machac, became first Czech men's duo to reach 4R of same Grand Slam event since Berdych, Vesely at 2016 Wimbledon and first at US Open since Berdych, Novak in 2004.
- > Became the fifth man born in 2000s to reach quarter-finals of both Grand Slam hard-court events, joining Alcaraz, Auger-Aliassime, Sinner and Shelton.
- > Playing in his 2nd Grand Slam quarter-final after 2023 Australian Open (l. to Tsitsipas) and attempts to become the first Czech man to advance to the last 4 stage at this level since Berdych at 2017 Wimbledon.
- > Also bids to be first Czech US Open men's singles semi-finalist since Berdych in 2012 and second-youngest Czech man to reach his 1st Grand Slam semi-final after Lendl, 21, at 1981 Roland Garros.
- > He is No. 15 on PIF ATP Live Rankings, securing his Top 20 debut on Monday after reaching quarter-finals to be the third Czech man to break inside Top 20 this season after Machac (on 3 March) and Mensik (on 19 May) and would jump to No. 12 with a QF win.
- > After defeating then-No. 3 Alcaraz for 1st Top-3 win in Doha this February, he aims to record the biggest win of his career (0-5 vs. Top-2) to record personal-best 35th win of the season (34 in 2023 and 2025).

Career Highlights

- > Achieved career-high No. 21 in August 2025 after 8-0 start to year with Brisbane title and run to Aus. Open 4R.
- > Defeated No. 5 Rublev to reach 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2023 Doha and en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2024 Indian Wells before defeating No. 4 Medvedev via RET to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 SF at 2024 Madrid.
- > In Australia, earned wins over No. 12 Norrie and No. 7 Auger-Aliassime en route to 2023 Australian Open QF and captured both ATP Tour titles at 2024 Adelaide and 2025 Brisbane.
- > Reached 1st ATP Tour SF at 2022 Rotterdam as Q after defeating No. 12 Shapovalov in 1R for 1st ATP Tour win.
- > Celebrated 21st birthday during 2022 Next Gen ATP Finals and finished as runner-up.
- > Former World No. 10 junior won 2019 Wimbledon boys' doubles title with countryman Forejtek.

CARLOS ALCARAZ

US Open Stats

- > Alcaraz is playing in US Open main draw for the fifth straight year, reaching at least the quarter-final stage in first three appearances (2021 QF, 2022 Title, 2023 SF) before losing to van de Zandschulp in 2R last year.
- > Beat No. 7-ranked Ruud in 2022 final in 4 sets to become 1st teenager to capture US Open men's title since Sampras in 1990 (19 years, 28 days). Afterwards became the 28th World No. 1 (and youngest) in the history of the PIF ATP Rankings (since 1973). Became 1st man to win US Open title in 1st or 2nd appearance since Pancho Gonzales in 1948 (2nd).
- > En route to title, earned 5-set wins over [15] Cilic in 4R, [11] Sinner in QF in 5h, 15m - saved 1 MP and [22] Tiafoe in SF to be 1st man to save match point en route to US Open title since Wawrinka in 2016 (1 vs. Evans in 3R).
- > Finished the tournament with 23 hours, 39 minutes on court, most by a US Open champion on record (since 1999). The previous record was 2012 champion Murray with 21 hours, 51 minutes.
- > Made US Open debut ranked No. 55 at 18 in 2021 and became youngest men's quarter-finalist at this event since Thomaz Koch, 18, at 1963 US Championships and youngest at Grand Slam since Chang, 18, at 1990 Roland Garros.
- > In 2021, won 5th-set TB vs. No. 3 Tsitsipas in 3R to earn his first Top 3 win (retired in QF due to upper right leg injury) to be the youngest man to earn Top 10 win at a Grand Slam since Ancic, 18, beat No. 9 Federer at 2002 Wimbledon.
- > Owns 21-2 record at Grand Slams this season, reaching Australian Open QF (l. to Djokovic), saved 3 championship points to win Roland Garros (d. Sinner) and reached Wimbledon final (l. to Sinner).
- > At 22 years and 3 months, he became the youngest man in Open Era to reach 13 Grand Slam QFs and advanced to both quarter-finals of all 4 Grand Slams in one season and to Grand Slam QF without dropping a set for 1st time in career.
- > Spaniard leads the ATP Tour in wins (58) and titles (6) this season and has advanced to the final of all 7 events played since losing to Goffin in ATP Masters 1000 Miami 2R in March.
- > On a 43-2 run since April, highlighted by titles in Monte-Carlo, Rome, Roland Garros, Queen's Club and Cincinnati.
- > If he matches or betters Sinner's result at US Open, he will return to World No. 1 for first time since September 2023.
- > By reaching US Open SF, he would pass 10,000 point mark on PIF ATP Rankings for the first time in his career, previous best 9815 on 28 August 2023.
- > He is on a 10-match winning streak after winning Cincinnati earlier this month and defeated Opelka 6-4 7-5 6-4 in 1R, Bellucci 6-1 6-0 6-3 in 2R, Darderi 6-2 6-4 6-0 in 3R and Rinderknech 7-6(3) 6-3 6-4 in 4R to reach US Open QF.

NOVAK DJOKOVIC

US Open Stats

- > Making 19th US Open appearance since debut in 2005, only missing tournament twice since (2017, 2022). Owns 4-6 record in US Open finals and in 2023 became the oldest US Open champion in Open Era.
- > Looks for sole all-time record for most Grand Slam titles (25) and attempts to tie Connors, Federer and Sampras for most US Open men's singles titles in Open Era (5).
- > Avenged 2021 final loss to Medvedev in 2023 final, winning in straight sets. Only lost two sets all event to Djere in 3R, rallying from two sets down for the 8th time in career.
- > In 2021, lost to Medvedev in final 6-4 6-4 6-4, falling short of becoming 1st man to win a singles calendar Grand Slam since Rod Laver in 1969.
- > Owns Open Era record for most US Open men's singles finals (Djokovic 10, Lendl 8, Sampras 8, Connors 7, Federer 7).
- > En route to 2021 final, he posted wins after losing opening set against Nishikori in 3R, [WC] Brooksby in 4R, [6] Berrettini in QF and [4] A. Zverev in SF. Entered 2021 season with 31-36 Grand Slam record after losing 1st set (went 10-1 in 2021 Grand Slam tournaments). It marked 1st time in his career in any tournament he posted 4 wins from a set down.

- > Captured US Open titles in 2011 (d. No. 2 Nadal), 2015 (d. No. 2 Federer), 2018 (d. No. 3 Del Potro) and 2023 (d. No. 3 Medvedev). Saved 2 match points and rallied from 2 sets down vs. Federer in 2011 SF en route to 1st US Open title.
- > Winner of 94 US Open matches – 2nd in Open Era (Connors 98, Djokovic 94, Federer 89, Agassi 79, Lendl 73).
- > Making 80th Grand Slam main draw appearance, only trailing F. Lopez and Federer (both 81) in men's singles history.
- > He is 23-0 after winning the 1st set this season and aims to extend his all-time men's record for most Grand Slam semi-finals (52). With a win, he would pass Fritz to No. 4 on [PIF ATP Live Rankings](#).
- > 38-year-old is 37-1 when facing a home player at a Grand Slam, including 15-0 vs. Americans at US Open, lone loss to No. 2 Murray in 2013 Wimbledon final.
- > He is 125-83 vs. Top-5 players in his career, 2-3 this year, earning wins over No. 3 Alcaraz in Australian Open QF and No. 3 Zverev in Roland Garros QF (41-29 vs. Top-5 at Grand Slams, 8-8 at US Open).
- > All-time Grand Slam match win leader defeated Norrie in 3R to pass Federer for most men's hard court wins in Grand Slam history (192) and now aims to tie Connors for most men's singles semi-finals in US Open history (14).
- > He is 50-10 in Grand Slam QFs in his career, 20-1 since 2018 Wimbledon, lone loss to Nadal in 2022 Roland Garros QF.
- > Bids to be the third oldest US Open men's semi-finalist in Open Era after Rosewall, 39, in 1974 (also 38 in 1973) and Connors, 39, in 1991.

Career Highlights

- > Record breaking 7-time Nitto ATP Finals champion owns ATP/WTA record for most weeks at No. 1 (428), as well as PIF ATP Rankings records for most years ended at No. 1 (8) and most wins vs. Top 10 (261), finishing in Top 5 in 16 of last 18 years (2017 – No. 12, 2024 - No. 7).
- > All-time leader for most Grand Slam men's singles titles in history (24), including record 10 Australian Open titles, and is 1 of 3 men to hold all 4 Grand Slam championships at same time (also Budge, Laver).
- > Owns record for most wins vs. Top 10 in PIF ATP Rankings history, posting personal-best 31 Top 10 wins in 2015.
- > Only player to win all nine ATP Masters 1000 events since start of series in 1990, doing so multiple times for a record total 40 titles.
- > Defeated Alcaraz in gold medal match at 2024 Paris Olympics, joining Agassi and Nadal as the only men to win all 4 Grand Slam titles and become Olympic champion in singles.
- > Owns most Grand Slam match wins in history, 3rd-most men's singles titles in Open Era (100), 3rd-most men's singles wins in Open Era (1154).

- > Captured 100th tour-level title at 2025 Geneva, joining Connors (109) and Federer (103) as only men to achieve that feat.
- > Earned 370th match win at Grand Slams by defeating F. Cerundolo in 2024 Roland Garros 4R to set the all-time record for most Grand Slam match wins (now 396).
- > Boasts winning records against both Federer (27-23) and Nadal (31-29), as well as win streaks of ATP Tour-record 43 matches (2010-11), ATP Masters 1000-record 31 matches (2011) and Open Era-record 30 Grand Slam matches (2015-16).

TAYLOR FRITZ

US Open Stats

- > Making 10th consecutive main draw appearance (2016-25), first as a Top 5 seed and 4th as No. 1 American.
- > Last year, became first American men's Grand Slam finalist since Roddick at 2009 Wimbledon and first at the US Open since Roddick in 2006 after wins over No. 8 Ruud and No. 4 Zverev.
- > Also beat No. 20 Tiafoe in first all-American men's Grand Slam SF since Agassi d. Ginepri in 2005 US Open SF.
- > Reached 1st US Open QF in 2023 without dropping a set, losing to eventual champion Djokovic.
- > Also reached 3R in 2018 (l. to Thiem) and 2020 (l. to Shapovalov).
- > In 2022, lost in 4 sets to fellow Southern California native No. 303 Brandon Holt in 1R.
- > Ended junior career by defeating countryman Paul to win 2015 US Open boys' singles title.
- > Earned wins over No. 101 Nava 7-5 6-2 6-3 in 1R, No. 353 L. Harris 4-6 7-6(3) 6-2 6-4 in 2R, No. 175 Kym 7-6(3) 6-7(9) 6-4 6-4 in 3R and No. 22 Machac 6-4 6-3 6-3 in 4R to advance to his third consecutive US Open QF.
- > Only American left in the men's field, leads the ATP Tour in wins (25) since the start of grass season on 9 June, highlighted by titles in Stuttgart and Eastbourne and run to Wimbledon SF.
- > Bids to be the first American to defeat Djokovic at a Grand Slam event since Querrey at 2016 Wimbledon (0-20 since).
- > Aims to reach his third Grand Slam semi-final after last year's US Open and Wimbledon in July this year to be the first American man to reach multiple Grand Slam SFs in one season since Roddick in 2009 (Aus. Open, Wimbledon).
- > He is 4-15 vs. Top 10 at Grand Slam level, earning all 4 wins last year over No. 7 Tsitsipas in Aus. Open 4R, No. 4 Zverev in Wimbledon 4R and No. 8 Ruud and No. 4 Zverev en route to US Open final.
- > Would also become the first American man since Agassi in 2002-03 to reach back-to-back US Open SFs and fifth American man to reach multiple US Open SFs in this century after Agassi (3), Roddick (2), Sampras (2) and Tiafoe (2).

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 4 in November 2024 after becoming 1st American since Blake in 2006 to play in Nitto ATP Finals championship match and finish in Top 5 of Year-End PIF ATP Rankings.
- > At 2024 US Open, became 1st American Grand Slam men's finalist since Roddick at 2009 Wimbledon, earning wins over No. 8 Ruud and No. 4 Zverev before defeating Tiafoe in an all-American semi-final.
- > Defeated No. 2 Nadal en route 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF after beating him in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final to become that event's 1st American men's champion since Agassi in 2001.
