## LEXUS ATP HEAD2HEAD: TUESDAY FIRST-ROUND SINGLES MATCHES

### ROY EMERSON ARENA

#### Juan Manuel Cerundolo (ARG) vs Jan-Lennard Struff (GER) **First Meeting**

**Juan Manuel Cerundolo** | Age: 23 | World No. 109 | Career-High No. 79 | 2025: 4-6 (Madrid 3R) | Gstaad: 0-1 ('21 1R)  
> Former Top-10 junior achieved career-high No. 79 in January 2022 after winning 3 Challenger titles in 5 finals during 2021 season.

> Qualified, won 8 matches in 9 days and captured title at 2021 Cordoba in his ATP Tour debut as a 19-year-old ranked 335th.

> Became 1st player to win a title in his debut since Ventura at 2004 Casablanca and 5th-lowest-ranked player to win a title since ATP Tour was established in 1990.

> Boasts 146-77 Challenger record (10-4 in finals), sweeping back-to-back titles on home soil at 2023 Tigre-1 and Tigre-2.

> Father, Alejandro, also played pro tennis; older brother, Francisco, achieved career-high No. 18 in May 2025; older sister, Constanza, played on Argentine field hockey team that won gold at 2018 Youth Olympics.

**NOTE:** Cerundolo is competing in his first tour-level event since defeating No. 33 Michelsen in Roland Garros 1R (l. to Medjedovic in 2R). He advanced to his first Challenger final of 2025 in Braunschweig last week (l. to Navone).

**Jan-Lennard Struff** | Age: 35 | World No. 129 | Career-High No. 21 | 2025: 7-16 (Marseille QF) | Gstaad: 4-2 ('24 SF)  
> Achieved career-high No. 21 in June 2023 after advancing to 3rd ATP Tour final at 2023 Stuttgart.

> Entered 2023 Madrid as LL, defeating No. 5 Tsitsipas in QF and Karatsev in SF, after losing to him in qualifying, to become 1st lucky loser to reach an ATP Masters 1000 final in series history (since 1990).

> On home soil, advanced to 1st ATP Tour singles final at 2021 Munich, earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Medvedev in 2021 Halle 1R and became 3rd oldest first-time ATP Tour champion at 2024 Munich.

> Posted personal-best 35 victories in 2019, highlighted by 1st Grand Slam 4R appearance at Roland Garros.

> In 2018, became 1st player in Open Era to rally from 2 sets down in Wimbledon 1R and 2R (d. L. Mayer and Karlovic).

> Lost in qualifying at 20 tour-level events before qualifying for 1st time at 2013 Roland Garros and earning 1st tour-level win at 2013 Wimbledon as Q (d. Kavcic).

**NOTE:** Struff reached latest of 14 career ATP Tour SFs at this venue last year (l. to Halys). He is 1-5 on tour-level clay this year, looking for 2nd win after defeating van de Zandschulp at ATP Masters 1000 Madrid (l. to Tsitsipas in 2R).

#### [NG] Martin Landaluce (ESP) vs [6/WC] David Goffin (BEL) **First Meeting**

**Martin Landaluce** | Age: 19 | World No. 138 | Career-High No. 133 | 2025: 0-3 (2x 1R) | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut)

> Former World No. 1 junior earned 1st ranking point in 2023, broke into Top 200 in October 2024 and achieved career-high No. 133 in February 2025 after making Grand Slam main draw debut at 2025 Australian Open.

> Made his professional debut at 2022 Alicante CH a week before his ATP Tour debut at 2022 Gijon as WC.

> Defeated countryman Munar for 1st ATP Tour win at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Miami as WC, becoming 1st player born in 2006 or later to win an ATP Masters 1000 match.

> Owns 53-39 Challenger record, highlighted by 1st title at 2024 Olbia and 27-15 on ITF World Tennis Tour, winning 1st title at 2024 M25 Vila Real de Santo Antonio.

> Posted a 58-8 record on junior circuit in 2022, including a 15-match winning streak on grass before losing in Wimbledon boys' singles SF, then captured 2022 US Open boys' singles title.

**NOTE:** Landaluce seeks 2nd tour-level win after defeating No. 72 Munar at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Miami (0-6 since). He would be youngest match winner in Gstaad since Auger-Aliassime, 17, defeated Andreozzi in 2018 1R.

**David Goffin** | Age: 34 | World No. 68 | Career-High No. 7 | 2025: 7-11 (2 QFs) | Gstaad: 4-2 (2015 Final)  
 > Earned career-high 59 wins in 2017, ending season at career-high No. 7 after defeating No. 1 Nadal and No. 2 Federer en route to Nitto ATP Finals championship match.  
 > Became 6th and final player to beat Nadal and Federer at same event (also Davydenko, Del Potro, Djokovic, Murray and Nalbandian).  
 > First Belgian to break into Top 10, qualify for Nitto ATP Finals, defeat World No. 1 and reach an ATP Masters 1000 final (2019 Cincinnati).  
 > In 2022, earned 300th victory (d. Andujar in Marrakech 2R), captured 6th ATP Tour title (Marrakech) and posted 3rd win over World No. 1 (d. Alcaraz in Astana 1R).  
 > Advanced to 4 Grand Slam QFs, most recently 2022 Wimbledon, and led Belgium to Davis Cup finals in 2015 and 2017.

**NOTE:** Goffin seeks first win since reaching Munich QF in April (l. to F. Cerundolo) before being sidelined due to foot injury from Rome to Wimbledon. He is one of 3 former finalists in the draw alongside Ruud (2021-22) and Wawrinka (2005), reaching 2015 final (l. to Thiem) and 2017 QF (l. to Haase) in two prior appearances at this venue.

## [WC] Jerome Kym (SUI) vs [Q] Calvin Hemery (FRA)

## First Meeting

**Jerome Kym** | Age: 22 | World No. 154 | Career-High No. 123 | 2025: 0-1 (Davis Cup) | Gstaad: 0-0 (2024 Q2)  
 > Former World No. 5 junior began 2024 season as No. 485, then broke inside Top 300 in June and Top 200 in July, achieving career-high No. 123 in May 2025.  
 > Made tour-level debut at 2021 Davis Cup with a win over Troost, then won his second tour-level match in 2024 Davis Cup over No. 212 Buse to help Switzerland defeat Peru 4-0.  
 > Defeated compatriot Riedi to play in final qualifying round at 2024 US Open (lost in deciding set tiebreak to Halys).  
 > Owns 44-27 Challenger record (2-0 in finals), defeating No. 70 Nishioka in 2R en route to 2024 Prostějov title as No. 444-ranked Q and saved 7 MPs vs. Topo in QF to win 2024 Zug title on home soil.  
 > Started playing tennis at age 3 after finding a racquet at his grandmother's home and credits Swiss Davis Cup captain Severin Luthi for being a great mentor.  
 > Ended junior career by advancing to 2021 US Open boys' singles SF after reaching Wimbledon QF earlier that year.

**NOTE:** Kym is playing his 2nd ATP Tour match excluding Davis Cup after losing to No. 16 Humbert in Basel 1R in October. He won his last clay-court tournament on home soil, picking up lone Challenger title in Zug 12 months ago.

**Calvin Hemery** | Age: 30 | World No. 171 | Career-High No. 116 | 2025: 0-0 (2 CH Finals) | Gstaad: 0-1 (2015 1R)  
 > Achieved career-high No. 116 in April 2018 before falling outside Top 500 in September 2019 and returning to Top 200 in November 2023.  
 > Qualified for ATP Tour debut at 2015 Gstaad and defeated countryman Lamasine for 1st win at 2016 Bastad as Q.  
 > Owns 144-134 Challenger record (1-11 in finals), picking up lone title at 2017 Tampere in his second final.  
 > Made lone Grand Slam main draw appearance as WC at 2018 Roland Garros, losing to Schwartzman.  
 > Earned 8 ITF Tour titles, often succeeding in Africa with trophies in Abuja, Lagos, and Brazzaville.  
 > Reached 2013 Roland Garros boys' singles QF as WC, losing to eventual champion Garin.

**NOTE:** Hemery is playing in his first ATP Tour main draw since 2023 Metz as Q (l. to Lestienne) and seeks his 3rd ATP Tour win after wins over countrymen Lamasine at 2016 Bastad and Moutet at 2018 Lyon. 30-year-old made his ATP Tour debut in Gstaad 10 years ago as Q, losing to Lajovic in 1R.

## Alexander Shevchenko (KAZ) vs Stan Wawrinka (SUI)

## Shevchenko Leads 1-0

**Alexander Shevchenko** | Age: 24 | World No. 101 | Career-High No. 45 | 2025: 6-13 (3x 2R) | Gstaad: 0-0 (Debut)  
 > Broke into Top 300 in March 2022, Top 200 in June 2022 and Top 100 in April 2023, achieving career-high No. 45 in February 2024 after defeating No. 7 Rune for biggest win of career to reach Rotterdam QF.  
 > Saved 2 MPs to earn 1st Top 10 win over No. 9 Fritz and reach 1st ATP Tour QF in Basel, then advanced to 1st SF and final in Metz to end his 2023 season.  
 > Also advanced to ATP Tour QFs in Montpellier, Rotterdam, Geneva and Almaty during 2024 season.  
 > Earned 1st ATP Tour win at 2023 Barcelona (d. Giustino) and 1st Grand Slam win at 2023 Roland Garros (d. Otte).  
 > Did not drop a set en route to 1st Challenger final and title at 2022 Bratislava and 2nd title at 2023 Tenerife-1.

**NOTE:** Shevchenko bids to be 3rd man representing Kazakhstan to win a match in Gstaad after Schukin in 2010 and Golubev in 2014. He reached 2 of 6 ATP Tour QFs on Swiss soil at 2023 Basel (d. Wawrinka in 1R) & 2024 Geneva.

**Stan Wawrinka** | Age: 40 | World No. 156 | Career-High No. 3 | 2025: 1-8 (Bucharest 2R) | Gstaad: 10-12 ('05 Final)  
> Achieved career-high No. 3 in 2014 and ended 2014-16 at No. 4 before undergoing 2 left knee surgeries in 2017 and 2 left foot surgeries in 2021.  
> Boasts 5 wins over World No. 1 at Grand Slams, including finals of 2014 Australian Open (d. Nadal), 2015 Roland Garros (d. Djokovic) and 2016 US Open (d. Djokovic).  
> One of 3 players to defeat Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal at Grand Slams (also Berdych, Tsonga).  
> Owns 16 singles titles with 11 straight wins in finals from 2014-16, defeating fellow Swiss Federer for lone ATP Masters 1000 title at 2014 Monte-Carlo.  
> Won 2008 Beijing Olympics doubles gold medal w/Federer and helped Switzerland capture 2014 Davis Cup.

**NOTE:** Wawrinka reached 1st of 31 tour-level finals in Gstaad in 2005 (l. to Gaudio) and made his ATP Tour debut at this event at 18 in 2003. He would be 2nd oldest-player to win an ATP Tour match on clay since 1980 after Connors, 41, at 1994 Atlanta (d. Flach) and 3rd-oldest match winner in tournament history at 40 years and 3 months.
