## LEXUS ATP HEAD2HEAD: SINGLES FINAL

**Felix Auger-Aliassime** | Age: 25 | World No. 8 | Career-High No. 5 | Career: 269-173 (8 Titles) | Montpellier: 10-2 ('25 Title)  
> Finished 2025 season at career-high No. 5 after winning titles in Adelaide, Montpellier and Brussels and advancing to US Open SF, Nitto ATP Finals SF and ATP Masters 1000 Paris final during the season.

> Earned personal-best 60 wins during breakout 2022 season, including career-long 16-match win streak with 3 titles in as many weeks at Florence, Antwerp and Basel.

> Also in 2022, won Rotterdam title to snap 0-8 start to career in singles finals, swept team titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup and recorded victories over No. 1 Alcaraz and former No. 1s Djokovic, Murray and Nadal.  
> At 2021 US Open, became 1st Canadian men's singles semi-finalist in tournament history (since 1881) and reached 2024 Madrid final to become 1st Canadian ATP Masters 1000 finalist on clay in series history (since 1990).  
> As an 18-year-old in 2019, became youngest Top-25 player since Hewitt, 18, in 1999, youngest ATP 500 finalist in series history at Rio de Janeiro (since 2009), and youngest semi-finalist in Miami tournament history (since 1985).

**NOTE:** Auger-Aliassime leads all players in indoor wins this decade (88), including Montpellier title last year. He bids to capture his 9th ATP Tour title, setting new record for most titles among Canadians in Open Era. 25-year-old is 13-1 vs. Frenchmen since the start of 2025 season and attempts to become the second man to defend the Montpellier title after Gasquet in 2015-16 and first to retain their 2025 title this season to rise to No. 6 on PIF ATP Rankings.

**Adrian Mannarino** | Age: 37 | World No. 70 | Career-High No. 17 | Career: 320-361 (5 Titles) | Montpellier: 9-7 ('26 Final)

> Ended 13 straight years in Top 75 of PIF ATP Rankings (2013-25) and became the oldest man to break into Top 20 in PIF ATP Rankings history at age 35, achieving career-high No. 17 in January 2024.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title in 7th final of career at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch, 2nd title in 11th final of career at 2022 Winston-Salem.

> Posted personal-best 43 wins in 2023, highlighted by ATP Tour titles in Newport, Astana and Sofia.  
> Earned first Top 5 win over No. 5 Cilic to reach biggest final of career at 2017 Tokyo and biggest win of career over No. 3 Medvedev at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch.  
> Reached Australian Open 4R in 2022 and 2024 and Wimbledon 4R in 2013, 2017 and 2018 and posted win over No. 6 Shelton via RET to reach 2025 US Open 4R, after 0-22 start vs. Top-10 at Grand Slams.

**NOTE:** Mannarino saved 3 MPs to defeat Humbert in 2R and now seeks 6th ATP Tour title (5-10 in finals), first since 2023 Sofia. He is 11-61 vs. Top 10, 1-11 since July 2023, earning most recent win over No. 6 Shelton in US Open 3R last year. Playing in his 1st ATP Tour final on home soil, he aims to become the fifth French champion in Montpellier. He is No. 51 on PIF ATP Live Rankings and would reach No. 45 with a title, returning to Top 50 for 1st time since September 2024.

### Arribage/Olivetti Notes

- > French duo is 13-4 on tour-level as a pair (9-2 in 2026), made their team debut at Valencia CH last September, losing in 1R, before winning their 1st title in Almaty the following week in their ATP Tour debut.
- > Won 2 ATP Tour titles at 2025 Almaty and 2026 Auckland, defeating team Frantzen/Haase en route to both titles.
- > Attempting to become the fifth all-French team to win Montpellier after Mahut/Roger-Vasselin in 2012, Gicquel/Llodra in 2013, Herbert/Mahut in 2022 and Doumbia/Reboul in 2024.
- > Earned deciding set wins over Cervantes/Martinez in 1R and Chidekh/Reymond in 2R before defeating No. 1 seeds and 2024 champions Doumbia/Reboul in straight sets.
- > They would become the first players to win multiple ATP Tour titles this season after Auckland title.
- > Team is ranked No. 6 on [PIF ATP Doubles Teams Rankings](#). Arribage is ranked No. 42 (career-high) and Olivetti is ranked No. 57 (career-high No. 40 in 2024).
- > Arribage, 25, is 3-0 in ATP Tour finals, winning 1st title in Buenos Aires last February w/Andreozzi.
- > Olivetti, 34, is 4-7 in ATP Tour finals, previously capturing titles at 2024 Munich and 2024 Gstaad w/Bhambri as both players attempt to win their first ATP Tour title on home soil.

### Frantzen/Haase Notes

- > German/Dutch duo is 16-9 as a pair on tour-level (5-3 in 2026), highlighted by winning their 1st ATP Tour title as a team at 2025 Chengdu.
- > Also advanced to 2025 US Open QF, saving 3 MPs to defeat No. 3 seeds Heliovaara/Patten in 1R and 2 MPs to defeat Luz/Olivetti in 2R, before losing to eventual champions Granollers/Zeballos in QF in 3 sets.
- > Defeated WC Martin/Humbert in 1R and earning wins over Paris/Willis in QF and No. 2 seeds Schnaitter/Wallner in SF to advance to their second ATP Tour final together.
- > Frantzen attempts to become 1st German doubles champion in Montpellier since Alexander and Mischa Zverev won 2017 title.
- > Haase aims to tie Roger-Vasselin (2012, 2019, 2021) for most doubles titles in Montpellier after winning in 2023 with Middelkoop and last year w/van de Zandschulp, defeating Griekspoor/Stevens in all-Dutch final.
- > Team is ranked No. 19 on [PIF ATP Doubles Teams Rankings](#). Frantzen is ranked No. 47 (career-high No. 42 in June 2025), while Haase is ranked No. 61 (career-high No. 29 in 2023).
- > Frantzen, 27, is 1-3 in ATP Tour finals, advancing to finals w/Jebens at 2023 Metz, 2024 Kitzbuhel, and 2024 Hangzhou, before winning 1st title at 2025 Chengdu w/Haase.
- > Haase, 38, is 10-15 in tour-level doubles finals, including run to 2013 Australian Open final w/Sijsling and playing in an ATP Tour final 19 years after reaching his first at 2007 Amersfoort w/Wassen.
