**R. Carballes Baena** | Age: 31 | World No. 50 | Career-High No. 49 | 2025: 5-4 (Auckland QF) | Event: 5-7 (2019 QF)  
 > Former World No. 8 junior entered Top 50 at 30 years of age at career high No. 49 in April 2023 after rallying from a set down in three of five matches to capture his 2nd ATP Tour title in Marrakech.  
 > At 2018 Quito, became 1st Spanish qualifier to win an ATP Tour title since Almagro at 2006 Valencia.  
 > Defeated No. 11 Shapovalov 8-6 in 5th after 5 hours to reach 2020 Roland Garros 3R for 1st Top 20 win in 12th attempt and defeated No. 4 Rune at 2023 US Open for 1st win in 14 tries vs. Top 10.  
 > Defeated Goffin for 1st ATP Tour win en route to 2014 Casablanca SF as Q.  
 > Boasts 243-151 Challenger record (13-8 in finals), including clay-court titles at 2022, 2023 and 2024 Seville.

**NOTE:** Carballes Baena is on an 8-match win streak in tour-level opening rounds on clay. The Spaniard is 1-8 on tour-level in his career vs. Serbians, his sole win coming at 2018 Lyon (d. Djere in 1R).

**Dusan Lajovic** | Age: 34 | World No. 81 | Career-High No. 23 | 2025: 1-2 (Brisbane 2R) | Event: 9-8 ('16, '20, '23-'24 QF)  
 > Achieved career-high No. 23 after defeating future World No. 1 Medvedev to reach 1st ATP Tour singles final at 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo.  
 > Entered Monte-Carlo as World No. 48 and became lowest-ranked finalist at that event since No. 53 Aranzi in 2001.  
 > Captured 2nd title at 2023 Banja Luka by defeating over No. 1 Djokovic in QF for biggest win of career and No. 6 Rublev in final, becoming 1st player to post 2 Top 10 wins en route to clay ATP 250 title in series history (since 2009).  
 > Won 1st ATP Tour singles title at 2019 Umag, doubles title at 2015 Istanbul w/Albot and team title at 2020 ATP Cup as member of Team Serbia.  
 > Advanced to Grand Slam 4R on 2 occasions: 2014 Roland Garros and 2021 Australian Open.  
 > Qualified 13 times at ATP Masters 1000 events, including en route to 2018 Madrid QF.

**NOTE:** Lajovic is making his 9th main draw appearance in Buenos Aires, only exceeded by Schwartzman (11) from this year's field. The 34-year-old, the oldest player in the draw, earned 13 of his 17 ATP Tour wins in 2024 on clay.

#### Alexandre Muller (FRA) vs [Q] Laslo Djere (SRB)

#### First Meeting

**Alexandre Muller** | Age: 28 | World No. 58 | Career-High No. 56 | 2025: 5-1 (Hong Kong Title) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)  
 > Broke into Top 500 in 2016, Top 250 in 2019 and Top 100 in April 2023 and achieved career-high No. 56 in January 2025 after defeating former No. 4 Nishikori to capture 1st ATP Tour title in Hong Kong.  
 > Also in Hong Kong, saved 2 MPs vs. Kecmanovic in 2R and became 3rd man in Open Era to win a tour-level title by rallying from a set down in all matches played after Ashe at 1975 WCT Finals and Bublik at 2024 Montpellier.  
 > Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Musetti en route to 1st SF and final at 2023 Marrakech and earned biggest win of career over No. 6 Rublev to reach 4R at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Rome.  
 > Made tour-level debut at 2017 Roland Garros as a WC (l. to Monteiro) and won 1st tour-level match at 2021 Australian Open as LL, beating Londero in 1R.  
 > Owns a 138-122 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning 1st title at 2022 Blois, saving a MP in his 1R match.  
 > Had a tennis court at his childhood home and began playing with his dad at age 6 and says he was better at football than tennis before choosing the latter.

**NOTE:** Making his debut in Buenos Aires, Muller is 11-4 in tour-level opening rounds since Barcelona in April. The Frenchman began the season by winning his 1st ATP Tour title in Hong Kong, rallying from a set down in all 5 matches.

**Laslo Djere** | Age: 29 | World No. 112 | Career-High No. 27 | 2025: 0-0 (Aus. Open Q2) | Event: 5-5 (2021 QF)  
 > Former World No. 3 junior broke into Top 30 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Rio de Janeiro without dropping a set, reaching career-high No. 27 in June 2019.  
 > Dedicated Rio title to his parents, Caba and Hajnalka, who both passed away from cancer.  
 > Defeated countryman Lajovic en route to 2nd title at 2020 Sardinia.  
 > Earned 5 victories and won 5 TBs en route to 2022 Winston-Salem final despite entering event with 15-44 career record on hard courts and 1-18 TB record in 2022.  
 > Also on hard courts, upset World No. 3 Ruud at 2023 Auckland for biggest win of career.

**NOTE:** Djere defeated Argentines Trungelliti in Q1 and Coria in Q2 to appear in Buenos Aires main draw for sixth consecutive year. He seeks 1st ATP Tour win since reaching Belgrade SF in November (l. to Medjedovic).

**Facundo Diaz Acosta** | Age: 24 | World No. 75 | Career-High No. 47 | 2025: 3-2 (Auckland QF) | Event: 6-3 (2024 Title)  
> Left-handed Argentine climbed to career-high No. 47 in April 2024 after advancing to his 3rd and biggest ATP Tour QF in Barcelona.

> In his hometown of Buenos Aires, made ATP Tour debut in 2020 as a WC, captured 1st ATP Tour win in 2023 (d. Coria) and advanced to 1st SF and final en route to 1st ATP Tour title in 2024 (d. No. 21 Jarry).

> Defeated countrymen Gomez and Tirante to reach 1st ATP Tour QF at 2024 Cordoba (l. to Baez).

> Owns 82-54 Challenger record (5-3 in finals), including 44-17 in 2023, earning titles at 2022 Coquimbo, 2023 Savannah, Oeiras-4, Milan and Montevideo.

> Former World No. 6 junior ended junior career in Buenos Aires by earning singles silver medal and doubles gold medal with countryman Baez at 2018 Youth Olympics.

**NOTE:** Defending champion Diaz Acosta defeated No. 21 Jarry for biggest win of career to capture 1st ATP Tour title here last year as WC. He aims to be 2nd man to defend the title in tournament history after 2012-14 champion Ferrer.

**Thiago Seyboth Wild** | Age: 24 | World No. 77 | Career-High No. 58 | 2025: 0-2 (Aus. Open 1R) | Event: 0-1 (2024 1R)

> Former Top-10 junior achieved career-high No. 58 in May 2024 after posting runs to 3R in ATP Masters 1000 events in Indian Wells, Miami and Madrid during the season.

> Upset World No. 2 Medvedev for biggest win of career and 1st Grand Slam win in his Roland Garros main draw debut in 2023 as Q, becoming 1st man to defeat Top 2 seed in Grand Slam 1R since Karlovic at 2003 Wimbledon.

> Captured 2020 Santiago title as 19-year-old WC (d. Ruud), becoming 1st ATP Tour champion born in 2000s and youngest Brazilian champion in Open Era.

> One week before Santiago, saved 3 MPs to beat Davidovich Fokina in 2020 Rio de Janeiro 1R as WC – longest ATP Tour match at 3:50 since 2009 Madrid SF (Nadal d. Djokovic in 4:03).

> Ended junior career by beating fellow #NextGenATP player Musetti for 2018 US Open boys' singles title.

**NOTE:** Seyboth Wild looks to record his 1st win of 2025 after losing to Marozsan in Australian Open 1R and Fils in Davis Cup and first win since defeating No. 48 Mpetshi Perricard in Antwerp 1R last October.

**Mariano Navone** | Age: 23 | World No. 47 | Career-High No. 29 | 2025: 2-4 (Auckland 2R) | Event: 0-1 (2024 1R)

> Broke into Top 200 in June 2023, Top 100 in February 2024 and Top 50 in April 2024, achieving career-high No. 29 in June 2024 after capturing 6th Challenger title of career in Cagliari.

> As No. 31 seed at 2024 Roland Garros, became 1st man in Open Era to be seeded in his Grand Slam main draw debut and defeated Carreno Busta in 1R.

> Earned 1st ATP Tour win and advanced to 1st QF, SF and final at 2024 Rio de Janeiro as Q and defeated No. 21 F. Cerundolo for biggest win of career en route to 2nd final in Bucharest.

> Made his ATP Tour debut at 2024 Cordoba as a WC, then qualified for Buenos Aires and Rio de Janeiro in following two weeks, defeating Coria in Rio de Janeiro for 1st ATP Tour win.

- > Posted 40-18 Challenger record in 2023, ending the season on a 19-2 run and led all players with 5 Challenger titles, winning in Poznan, Santa Fe, Santa Cruz, Buenos Aires and Santa Fe-2.
- > Began playing at age 3 as his parents and sister all played tennis and is nicknamed La Navoneta.

**NOTE:** Navone is one of 10 Argentinians in the main draw, the most home entries at the tournament since 2015 (12 Argentinians). The 23-year-old made his Buenos Aires debut as No. 117-ranked Q (l. to Darderi in 1R), a week before going on a run to Rio de Janeiro final.

**Francisco Comesana** | Age: 24 | World No. 84 (Career-High) | 2025: 0-2 (2 times in 1R) | Event: 0-0 (2024 Q2)

- > Broke into Top 200 in June 2023, Top 100 in April 2024 and achieved career-high No. 84 in November 2024.
- > In Grand Slam main draw debut at 2024 Wimbledon, defeated No. 6 Rublev in 1R for biggest win of career, then beat Walton to become youngest Argentine in Wimbledon 3R since del Potro in 2011.
- > Reached 2024 US Open 3R to become 3rd Argentine man in Open Era to advance to 3R in 1st two Grand Slam main draw appearances after Jaite (in 1984-85) and Markus (in 1991).
- > Made ATP Tour debut at 2024 Cordoba as WC and earned 1st four tour-level wins of career en route to 3R at Wimbledon and US Open later that year.
- > Posted 45-21 Challenger record in 2023, earning most Challenger wins that season, highlighted by titles in Vicenza and Liberec and finals in Skopje and Santa Cruz.

**NOTE:** Comesana looks for 1st ATP Tour win on clay and is playing in his second tour-level event on home soil (2024 Cordoba, l. to Tirante in 1R). He earned all 4 tour-level wins of career in last year's Grand Slam events, reaching 3R of Wimbledon (No. 6 Rublev in 1R) and US Open (d. No. 17 Humbert in 2R).
