David Goffin (BEL) vs Pedro Martinez (ESP)

First Meeting

David Goffin | Age: 34 | World No. 68 | Career-High No. 7 | 2025: 8-15 (Acapulco, Munich QFs) | Event: 11-5 ('24 SF)
 > Earned career-high 59 wins in 2017, ending season at career-high No. 7 after defeating No. 1 Nadal and No. 2 Federer en route to Nitto ATP Finals championship match.
 > Became 6th and final player to beat Nadal and Federer at same event (also Davydenko, Del Potro, Djokovic, Murray and Nalbandian).
 > First Belgian to break into Top 10, qualify for Nitto ATP Finals, defeat World No. 1 and reach an ATP Masters 1000 final (2019 Cincinnati).
 > In 2022, earned 300th victory (d. Andujar in Marrakech 2R), captured 6th ATP Tour title (Marrakech) and posted 3rd win over World No. 1 (d. Alcaraz in Astana 1R).
 > Advanced to 4 Grand Slam QFs, most recently 2022 Wimbledon, and led Belgium to Davis Cup finals in 2015 and 2017.

NOTE: Goffin reached at least the quarter-finals in 3 of his 5 previous appearances at the event, including SF last year (l. to Sonego). He seeks first hard-court win since defeating No. 3 Alcaraz at ATP Masters 1000 Miami in March.

Pedro Martinez | Age: 28 | World No. 66 | Career-High No. 36 | 2025: 14-22 (Buenos Aires SF) | Event: 0-1 (2022 2R)
 > Broke into Top 50 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Santiago in February and Top 40 in May 2022, before achieving career-high No. 36 in February 2025.
 > Defeated No. 16 Bautista Agut at 2021 Kitzbuhel for en route to 1st ATP Tour SF and final and No. 8 Ruud for biggest win of career en route to 2024 Estoril final.
 > Led all players by qualifying for 6 tour-level events in 2020, including Australian Open, Rio de Janeiro, Rome and Roland Garros.
 > Also in 2020, earned 1st tour-level win at Australian Open (d. Koepfer), posted 1st ATP Masters 1000 win at Rome (d. Querrey) and advanced to 1st Grand Slam 3R at Roland Garros.
 > Reached 8 of his 13 career Challenger finals on home clay in Spain, highlighted by 2020 Marbella, 2021 Seville, 2023 Maspalomas, 2024 Girona and 2024 Valencia titles.

NOTE: Martinez is one of four Spaniards in the draw (also Bautista Agut, Carreno Busta, Munar), as they bid to become first nation to capture 3 singles titles in Winston-Salem tournament history. He is 1-5 in his last 6 tour-level matches on hard courts with a sole win against Jarry in ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati 1R last week.

Yoshihito Nishioka | Age: 29 | World No. 130 | Career-High No. 24 | 2025: 8-12 (Dallas QF) | Event: 0-1 (2016 1R)

> Japanese left-hander achieved career-high No. 24 in June 2023 after advancing to Grand Slam 4R at 2023

Australian Open and Roland Garros for the 1st time in career.

> Earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Ruud en route to 2nd ATP Tour title at 2022 Seoul.

> Saved 2 MPs vs. Shapovalov en route to 1st title at 2018 Shenzhen as 171st-ranked Q.

> On US soil, rallied from a set down 3 times en route to 2020 Delray Beach final, saved 1 MP vs. de Minaur en route to 2022 Washington final and won 3rd ATP Tour title at 2024 Atlanta.

> Defeated countryman and World No. 5 Nishikori en route to 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati QF as Q.

NOTE: Nishioka returns to the event for the first time in 9 years after debuting in 2016 and losing to Millman in 1R. He is on a 6-match losing streak vs. Top 100, seeking first win since defeating No. 67 Vukic in Delray Beach 1R in February (W/O to eventual champion Kecmanovic in 2R). He earned all 8 tour-level wins of 2025 on hard courts.

Pablo Carreno Busta | Age: 34 | World No. 93 | Career-High No. 10 | 2025: 5-11 (4x 2R) | Event: 19-7 (2016 Title)

> Winner of 7 singles and 4 doubles titles achieved career-high No. 10 in singles and No. 16 in doubles during 2017 season.

> Captured 2022 Montreal championship to become 15th different Spaniard to win an ATP Masters 1000 title since start of series in 1990.

> Defeated No. 1 Djokovic and No. 2 Medvedev en route to 2020 Tokyo Olympics bronze medal (held in 2021).

> Reached US Open SF and Roland Garros QF in both 2017 and 2020, as well as 2016 US Open doubles final with countryman Garcia-Lopez.

> Member of 2019 Davis Cup championship team and helped Team Spain reach ATP Cup finals in 2020 (5-1 in doubles) and 2022 (4-1 in singles).

NOTE: Carreno Busta is one of four former champions in the draw (also Bautista Agut, Baez, Sonogo) and aims to become the first player to record 20 wins at the event. He is 6-1 vs. left-handers in last 7 matches, losing to Shelton at Australian Open in January.

Mackenzie McDonald | Age: 30 | World No. 95 | Career-High No. 37 | 2025: 8-11 (7x 2R) | Event: 0-0 (2016 Q1)

> Broke into Top 50 in February 2022 and achieved career-high No. 37 in October 2023 after undergoing right hamstring surgery in 2019 and falling out of Top 250 in 2020.

> Defeated former champions Kyrgios and Nishikori en route to 1st ATP Tour final at 2021 Washington, then won 1st ATP Tour title in doubles at 2022 Tokyo w/Melo.

> Upset defending champion and World No. 2 Nadal in 2023 Australian Open 2R for biggest win of career and No. 7 Rublev en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Toronto.

> Advanced to 2018 Wimbledon 4R as No. 103 and 2021 Australian Open 4R as No. 192, becoming lowest-ranked player in Australian Open 4R since No. 248 Canas in 2004.

> Qualified for 2013 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati at age 18 by defeating USC legend Johnson, then went on to win 2016 NCAA singles and doubles titles for UCLA.

NOTE: McDonald is playing in his 250th tour-level match (113-136) and is making his main draw debut at the event. His only previous appearance was nine years ago, losing in qualifying round 1 to McGee. He aims to advance to 2R for 8th time this season but is still looking for back-to-back ATP Tour wins since run to Newport QF in July last year.

Brandon Holt | Age: 27 | World No. 106 | Career-High No. 99 | 2025: 1-6 (Mallorca 2R) | Event: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Son of former WTA World No. 1 Tracy Austin broke into Top 200 in 2023 and Top 100 at career-high No. 99 in June 2025, a week before making his Wimbledon main draw debut.
 > Defeated No. 12 Fritz in 2022 US Open 1R in tour-level debut as No. 303-ranked Q for biggest win of career and earned 2nd tour-level win at 2023 Australian Open as Q over Vukic.
 > Owns 87-67 Challenger record (2-3 in finals), capturing both titles earlier this season at Nonthanburi-3 and Bengaluru.
 > Four-time All-American at University of Southern California from 2017-20, also earning 2019 Pac-12 Singles Player of the Year honours.
 > Former Top-50 junior advanced to 2015 US Open boys' doubles final w/R. Smith as WC (l. to Auger-Aliassime/Shapovalov).

NOTE: Holt seeks 4th tour-level win (3-13), second on home soil after upset over No. 12 Fritz in 2022 US Open 1R. After defeating Bonzi in Mallorca 1R in June, he aims to record multiple ATP Tour wins in one season for first time in his career.
