MUBADALA CITI DC OPEN TALKING POINTS

- There will be a new champion crowned at **Mubadala Citi DC Open** as every player in the 2024 draw looks for their first Washington title this week. **Andrey Rublev** is headlining the draw as the No. 1 seed, as the World No. 8 looks to improve his best result at the event - reaching semi-finals in 2018 and 2022. The 26-year-old is 15-6 on hard courts this season (8-0 start), highlighted by title in Hong Kong and run to Australian Open QF.
- No. 2 seed **Ben Shelton** leads 12 Americans in the Washington draw this year. The 21-year-old will be on the hunt for 2nd ATP 500 title after winning in Tokyo last year. The American No. 3 will be aim to record first win of US summer hard-court swing this season after losing to **Shang Juncheng** in his opening round of Atlanta last week and first win at the event (also losing to Shang in Washington 2R last year).
- Shelton is joined by fellow Top-8 American seeds, No. 4 **Sebastian Korda**, No. 5 **Frances Tiafoe**, as all three attempt to be the first American man to capture the title in **Rock Creek Park** since **Andy Roddick** in 2007. No. 15 seed **Alex Michelsen**, the youngest American in Top 200, makes his Washington debut and enters the draw on the back of reaching 2nd ATP Tour final in Newport two weeks ago (l. to Giron).
- There are two former finalists in the draw, American **Mackenzie McDonald**, who lost the 2021 final to **Jannik Sinner**. McDonald opens against left-handed Italian **Mattia Bellucci** on Monday on Grandstand. **Yoshihito Nishioka**, who reached the 2022 final (l. to Kyrgios), comes to Washington after winning his 3rd ATP Tour title in Atlanta on Sunday. The Japanese No. 1 will bid to extend his winning streak and grab biggest title of career.

Emil Ruusuvuori | Age: 25 | World No. 71 | Career-High No. 37 | 2024: 15-12 (Hong Kong Final) | Event: 5-3 (2022-23 3R)
> Ex-World No. 4 junior set career-high No. 37 in April 2023 after becoming the first Finnish player to reach ATP Masters 1000 QF since Nieminen in 2013 at 2023 Miami.
> In 2022, reached 1st ATP Tour final at Pune and earning personal-best 35 tour-level wins during season.
> Defeated No. 5 Thiem during 2019 Davis Cup tie, No. 7 A. Zverev en route to 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R, No. 9 Sinner at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch and No. 8 Rublev at 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati.
> In 2020, reached 1st SF at Astana after winning ATP debut at Montpellier (d. D. Novak), ATP Masters 1000 debut at Cincinnati (d. Korda) and Grand Slam debut at US Open (d. Bedene).
> Posted 36-12 Challenger record in 2019 with titles at Fergana, Mallorca, Glasgow and Helsinki.
> Began playing tennis at age 5 after a tennis coach spotted him playing badminton with his mom, Eva, and convinced him to switch sports.

NOTE: Ruusuvuori looks for first win on hard courts since reaching Doha QF in February. He aims to successfully pass Washington 1R for the fourth consecutive year (2021 2R, 2022-23 3R, d. No. 11 Hurkacz in 2022 2R).

Borna Coric | Age: 27 | World No. 83 | Career-High No. 12 | 2024: 8-13 (Montpellier Final) | Event: 1-1 (2016 3R)
> Owns 11 wins vs. Top 5 and ended 2018 at career-high No. 12 after finishing 2015 as youngest player in Top 50 and 2014 as youngest player in Top 100.
> As World No. 152, upset No. 3 Nadal en route to 2022 Cincinnati title, becoming lowest-ranked champion in tournament and ATP Masters 1000 series history.
> Defeated Federer to win 2018 Halle title, ending Swiss' last run as World No. 1 and becoming youngest champion in tournament history at age 21.
> Saved 5 MPs vs. Kohlschreiber for 1st ATP Tour title at 2017 Marrakech and 6 MPs vs. Tsitsipas en route to 1st Grand Slam QF at 2020 US Open.
> Helped Croatia capture 2018 Davis Cup, but missed 12 months from March 2021-March 2022 – including Davis Cup Finals – due to right shoulder injury.

NOTE: Coric makes his second appearance in Washington, 8 years after reaching 3R (d. Sugita in 2R, l. to Monfils). The Croat looks for first win vs. higher-ranked opponent since defeating No. 18 Bublik at ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo in April (3-9 vs. higher-ranked opponents in 2024).

Denis Shapovalov | Age: 25 | World No. 139 | Career-High No. 10 | 2024: 12-17 (4x 3R) | Washington: 1-3 (2018 3R)
 > After becoming 1st Canadian US Open men's singles quarter-finalist in 2020, joined Raonic as 2nd Canadian man in history to break into Top 10.
 > Defeated 2-time champion Murray and earned 5-set wins over Kohlschreiber and Khachanov en route to 1st Grand Slam SF at 2021 Wimbledon.
 > Reached 2019 Paris final and 4 other ATP Masters 1000 SFs, including 2017 Montreal, where he upset No. 2 Nadal and became youngest semi-finalist in series history at age 18 (since 1990).
 > Beat Carreno Busta to begin 2022 ATP Cup final and Kokkinakis to begin 2022 Davis Cup final, helping Canada sweep both team titles.
 > Ended junior career with 2016 Wimbledon boys' singles title, then broke into Top 50 of PIF ATP Rankings less than 15 months later.

NOTE: Shapovalov aims to record his first hard court win since defeating No. 11 Tsitsipas at ATP Masters 1000 Miami in March. He made his ATP Tour debut in Washington in 2016 as 371-ranked WC (l. to Lacko in 1R).

Roberto Bautista Agut | Age: 36 | World No. 76 | Career-High No. 9 | 2024: 15-14 (2 QFs) | Washington: 0-0 (Debut)
 > Earned 400th win of career in 2024, captured 10th and 11th ATP Tour titles of career in 2022 and ended 2019 at career-high No. 9.
 > Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2019 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam SF at 2019 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-9 record in Grand Slam 4R matches.
 > Defeated No. 1 Djokovic in 2016 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai SF, 2019 Doha SF and 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Miami 4R, as well as No. 1 Medvedev in 2022 Mallorca QF.
 > Went 4-1 at 2022 ATP Cup and 6-0 at 2020 ATP Cup to lead Spain to finals after helping his country win 2019 Davis Cup.
 > Played football for Villarreal C.F. until he was 14 years old.

NOTE: Bautista Agut, the oldest player in the draw, makes his Washington debut. The Spaniard is 8-1 in his opening rounds since March (10-4 in 2024) and 4-1 vs. players ranked outside Top 100 this season (l. to No. 197 Raonic in 's-Hertogenbosch 2R).

Reilly Opelka | Age: 26 | World No. 371 | Career-High No. 17 | 2024: 4-2 (Newport SF) | Washington: 3-5 (2021-22 3R)
 > Former Wimbledon junior champion became No. 1 American in June 2021 and achieved career-high No. 17 in February 2022 before undergoing hip surgery later that year.
 > Defeated Isner for 4th ATP 250 title on American soil at 2022 Houston after beating him 7-6(7) 7-6(22) en route to 2022 Dallas title, winning longest tiebreak in ATP Tour history (since 1990).
 > At 2020 Delray Beach, saved 1 MP vs. Raonic and defeated Nishioka on same day to win 2nd title.
 > At 2019 New York, saved 6 MPs and hit 43 aces vs. Isner in SF, then hit 43 more aces vs. Schnur in final to win 1st title.

> Upset No. 3 Tsitsipas at 2021 Toronto for biggest win of career and to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 final.

NOTE: Opelka makes his sixth appearance in Washington, first debuting in 2016 as No. 833-ranked WC (l. to Jaziri in 1R). He is playing in his third ATP Tour event since 2022 Washington, having nearly 2-year injury break from ATP Tour. He returned this month reaching Newport SF and Atlanta 2R.

James Duckworth | Age: 32 | World No. 81 | Career-High No. 46 | 2024: 8-7 (3 QFs) | Washington: 5-7 (2018 3R)

> Achieved career-high No. 46 in January 2022 after earning personal-best 22 tour-level wins in 2021, highlighted by 1st ATP Tour final at Astana and biggest win of career vs. No. 13 Goffin at Miami.

> Also in 2021, advanced to 1st Grand Slam 3R at Wimbledon and 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at Paris.

> Went 0-3 on ATP Tour and 49-18 at Challengers in 2019 with 4 titles in 6 finals: Bangkok, Baotou, Playford and Pune.

> Underwent 9 surgeries: right elbow in late-2012, early-2014 and February 2018; right foot in February 2017, August 2017 and January 2018; right shoulder in March 2017 and March 2020; and hip in January 2022.

> Grandmother, Beryl Penrose, swept singles and doubles titles at 1955 Australian Championships.

NOTE: Duckworth aims to record his 50th tour-level win on hard courts (49-72). The 32-year-old Australian also makes his 8th appearance in Washington and looks for first win at the event since reaching 2018 3R.

> Secured 1st ranking point at age 15 in 2018, broke into Top 200 in September 2023 after winning his 2nd Challenger title at Cary and achieved career-high No. 109 in July 2024.

> Defeated Cecchinato for 1st tour-level win at 2021 US Open as 18-year-old WC.

> Squandered 2-set lead vs. Lorenzi in tour-level debut at 2019 US Open as 16-year-old WC, becoming youngest player to compete at event since Young, 16, in 2005.

> Owns a 51-38 Challenger record (4-1 in finals), highlighted by winning 1st Challenger title at 2022 Tiburon defeating Ben Shelton.

> Earned US Open WCs by winning 2019 and 2021 USTA Boys' 18s National Championships.

> Lost to 2018 USTA Boys' 18s champion Brooksby in 2021 Cleveland Challenger 1R and 2017 USTA Boys' 18s champion Kypson in 2021 Wichita ITF QF.

NOTE: Svajda looks to record multiple tour-level wins in a season for the first time in career (2021, 2023-24 - 1) after entering the draw as LL following Coria's withdrawal. Last year in Washington debut, earned win over Purcell in 1R.

J.J. Wolf | Age: 25 | World No. 143 | Career-High No. 39 | 2024: 1-8 (Houston 2R) | Washington: 5-2 (2022-23 QF)

> Already ranked No. 272 when he turned pro in July 2019, then broke into Top 100 in August 2022 and achieved career-high No. 39 in February 2023.

> Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SF and final of career at 2022 Florence after reaching US Open 3R as WC in both 2020 and 2022.

> Upset No. 14 Tiafoe for biggest win of career and to reach 2nd ATP Tour SF at 2023 Dallas.

> Defeated fellow American Mmoh to advance to 2023 Australian Open 4R, falling in 5 sets to countryman Shelton.

> Owns 80-47 Challenger record overall, including 5-1 in finals and 21-7 with 2 titles in Columbus, where he played 3 seasons of college tennis for Ohio State University.

NOTE: Wolf reached the quarter-final stage in both previous main draw appearances at the event and now looks for first tour-level win on hard courts since defeating No. 28 Baez in Stockholm 1R last October (0-5 in 2024).

> Earned career-high 59 wins in 2017, ending season at career-high No. 7 after defeating No. 1 Nadal and No. 2 Federer en route to Nitto ATP Finals championship match.

> Became 6th and final player to beat Nadal and Federer at same event (also Davydenko, Del Potro, Djokovic, Murray and Nalbandian).

> First Belgian to break into Top 10, qualify for Nitto ATP Finals, defeat World No. 1 and reach an ATP Masters 1000 final (2019 Cincinnati).

> In 2022, earned 300th victory (d. Andujar in Marrakech 2R), captured 6th ATP Tour title (Marrakech) and posted 3rd win over World No. 1 (d. Alcaraz in Astana 1R).

> Advanced to 4 Grand Slam QFs, most recently 2022 Wimbledon, and led Belgium to Davis Cup finals in 2015 and 2017.

NOTE: Goffin looks for first win in Washington since reaching the quarter-finals in 2018. He is 0-5 vs. Top 100 on hard courts in 2024, aiming for 1st Top 100 win on the surface since defeating No. 87 Halys in Antwerp 1R last October.

> Broke into Top 200 in January 2022 and Top 100 in August 2022, achieving career-high No. 92 in July 2024.

> Did not drop a set to qualify for 2022 Roland Garros, then won 5th-set TB vs. No. 41 Karatsev in tour-level debut.

> Owns 132-80 Challenger record (6-7 in finals), winning titles at 2021 Warsaw, 2022 Buenos Aires-2, 2022 Lima, 2023 Antofagasta, 2024 Piracicaba and 2024 Santa Cruz de la Sierra.

> Boasts 120-66 ITF record (4-6 in finals), winning most recent title at 2020 Cordoba.

> Peaked at No. 70 on ITF Junior Circuit, winning 2 boys' singles and 4 boys' doubles titles.

NOTE: Ugo Carabelli is playing in his first ATP Tour match outside clay courts and owns a 4-7 tour-level record, previously reaching 2R at 2022 Roland Garros, 2023 Buenos Aires, 2024 Buenos Aires and 2024 Umag last week.
