Alexei Popyrin | Age: 25 | World No. 25 | Career-High No. 23 | 2025: 6-10 (Monte-Carlo QF) | Geneva: 0-0 (Debut)
> Achieved career-high No. 23 in August 2024 after saving 3 MPs vs. Dimitrov in 3R en route to capturing Montreal title, becoming 1st Australian ATP Masters 1000 champion since Hewitt in 2003.

> Also at 2024 Montreal, earned 5 consecutive Top 20 wins and as World No. 62 became fourth lowest-ranked champion in ATP Masters 1000 series history (since 1990).

> Earned biggest win of career over 4-time champion No. 2 Djokovic to reach 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2024 US Open after entering tournament with 0-6 record in Grand Slam 3R matches.

> Reached 1st ATP Tour SF, advanced to 1st final and won 1st title at 2021 Singapore and beat former champion Wawrinka for 2nd title at 2023 Umag.

> Qualified 10 times at tour-level events in 2019, tying single-season record set by M. Zverev in 2016.

> Peaked at No. 2 in junior rankings after ending career with 17 straight wins and 2017 Roland Garros boys' singles title.

NOTE: Popyrin is making his tournament debut and looking to record his 100th tour-level win (99-122) to become 4th active Australian man to achieve the feat after de Minaur (274), Kyrgios (206) and Thompson (147).

Nicolas Jarry | Age: 29 | World No. 53 | Career-High No. 16 | 2025: 5-10 (Brisbane QF) | Geneva: 8-1 (2023 Title)

> Unranked to begin 2021, achieved career-high No. 16 in May 2024 after becoming 1st Chilean since Gonzalez in 2007 to reach ATP Masters 1000 final in Rome.

> In 2023, rallied from a set down three times in five matches to win 2nd ATP Tour title in Santiago, his hometown, and upset former champions Ruud and Zverev en route to 3rd title in Geneva.

> Joined countryman Garin as fellow 2019 first-time ATP Tour champion by winning Bastad title without losing a set.

> Saved 1 MP vs. No. 3 A. Zverev in 2019 Barcelona 2R for 1st Top 3 win of career, but squandered 2 MPs vs. A. Zverev in Geneva final one month later.

> Peaked at No. 8 in junior rankings after advancing to 2013 Roland Garros boys' doubles final with countryman Garin.

> Parents, Allan and Cecilia, are former pro volleyball players; grandfather, Jaime Fillol, great-uncle, Alvaro Fillol, and uncle, Martin Rodriguez, are former ATP players.

NOTE: Jarry is on a 5-match winning streak in Geneva after capturing his third ATP Tour title in 2023 defeating Dimitrov. He is looking for his first Top 50 win on clay since beating No. 37 Arnaldi, No. 8 Tsitsipas and No. 16 Paul en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final in Rome last year.

Nuno Borges | Age: 28 | World No. 40 | Career-High No. 30 | 2025: 15-13 (Auckland SF) | Geneva: 0-0 (Debut)

> Became 2nd Portuguese man to break inside Top 50 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973) in 2024, achieving career-high No. 30 in September 2024 after saving 3 MPs vs. Mensik to reach US Open 4R.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2024 Bastad by joining Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Zeballos as only men to defeat Nadal in an ATP Tour final on clay.

> Defeated No. 13 Dimitrov for 1st Top 20 win to reach 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2024 Australian Open, becoming first Portuguese in fourth round of that tournament's history.

> Advanced to 10 Challenger finals, winning titles at 2021 Antalya-3, 2022 Barletta, 2023 Monterrey, 2023-24 Phoenix and 2023 Maia, his hometown.

> Five-time All-American during 4-year college career at Mississippi State University, posting 31-match win streak that ended in his last match (l. to Jubb in 2019 NCAA singles final).

NOTE: Borges is the 3rd Portuguese to play in Geneva main draw after Cunha-Silva (1990) and J. Sousa (2015, 2017, 2019, 2022). He is 10-2 in opening rounds on tour-level this year, with losses to Bergs at ATP Masters 1000 Miami and Seyboth Wild at ATP Masters 1000 Rome and is 6-6 vs. Top 50 this season (after 4-0 start).

Alex Michelsen | Age: 20 | World No. 32 (Career-High) | 2025: 13-11 (Delray Beach SF) | Geneva: 2-1 (2024 QF)
> Broke inside Top 50 in August 2024 and achieved career-high No. 32 in March 2025, not long after defeating former finalist Tsitsipas en route to 1st Grand Slam 4R at Australian Open.
> At 2024 Australian Open, became youngest American man in Grand Slam 3R since Young at 2007 US Open.
> Earned 1st ATP Tour win and reached 1st QF, SF and final at 2023 Newport, becoming youngest American ATP Tour finalist since Fritz at 2016 Memphis and reached 2nd final at 2024 Newport (held 1 MP vs. Giron).
> Defeated No. 9 de Minaur for biggest win of career in 2024 Los Cabos 2R, before squandering 3 MPs in QF against eventual champion Thompson.
> Also reached 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati doubles final w/McDonald after defeating him in qualifying.

NOTE: Michelsen reached first ATP Tour QF in Geneva last year (d. No. 12 Fritz in 2R) and earned 1st clay Challenger title in Estoril last month. He is on a 4-match losing streak against Top 50 players on tour-level, looking for first win since defeating No. 12 Tsitsipas and No. 19 Khachanov at Australian Open earlier this year.
