DEFENDING CHAMPION: World No. 2 **Carlos Alcaraz** enters Roland Garros leading the ATP Tour in wins (30) and titles (3) this season, including titles at ATP Masters 1000 events in Monte-Carlo and Rome. 22-year-old defeated Zverev in five sets last year to win his 1st Roland Garros title and now aims to join Nadal (10 times) and Kuerten (in 2001) as only men to successfully defend Roland Garros title this century. At 22 years and 1 month, he would become 5th youngest man in history to lift Roland Garros trophy multiple times following Borg (19), Nadal (20), Wilander (20) and Courier (21).

A YEAR OF NO. 1: With his run to Roland Garros SF last year, Jannik Sinner secured himself the World No. 1 spot for first time in career and 23-year-old Italian hasn't left the top of PIF ATP Rankings since. He is guaranteed to stay at No. 1 regardless of any outcome in Paris, extending his streak to 52 weeks. He is the second Italian man to be No. 1 seed at Roland Garros following Pietrangeli in 1961. He is on a 14-match winning streak in Grand Slams after picking up titles at 2024 US Open and 2025 Aus. Open and could become 6th man in Open Era to win 3 consecutive Grand Slam events.

TOP-2 SEEDS: A week after meeting in the final of Rome, No. 1 seed **Sinner**, 23, and No. 2 seed **Alcaraz**, 22, begin their campaigns to meet in a Grand Slam final for the first time. It marks the first time two players aged 23-and-under are Top-2 seeds at a Grand Slam event since No. 1 Federer, 23, and No. 2 Roddick, 22, at 2005 Wimbledon. If they both advance to the final, it would be the first championship match at a Grand Slam event between players born in 2000s.

ALL-TIME MEN'S TITLES LEADERBOARD: World No. 6 **Novak Djokovic** owns men's all-time record with 24 Grand Slam titles. Serbian looks to become the 1st player in history to win 25 Grand Slam singles tournaments, breaking the tie with **Margaret Court** at 24 (11 in Open Era). Djokovic is 28-2 at Roland Garros this decade, only losing to Nadal in 2020 final and 2022 QF. In 2024, he was forced to withdraw from his QF encounter vs. Ruud due to knee injury. 38-year-old is playing in Geneva final on Saturday to capture 100th tour-level title and arrive to Paris on a 4-match winning streak.

ALL-TIME MEN'S RECORDS: Nadal's 14 Roland Garros titles, Djokovic's 10 Australian Open titles, Federer's 8 Wimbledon titles

FORMER FINALISTS: Last year, World No. 3 **Alexander Zverev** advanced to his first final on Parisian clay. German will attempt to join Djokovic, Nadal and Federer as only men in Open Era to reach Roland Garros SF in 5 consecutive years. Two-time finalist **Casper Ruud** (2022-23) captured biggest title of career in Madrid earlier this May and leads the ATP Tour in clay wins (128) and titles (12) since 2020. 2021 finalist **Stefanos Tsitsipas** returns as No. 20 seed, his first time seeded outside Top 10 at Roland Garros since 2018. All three look for their first Grand Slam title and bid to join Thiem (1993) at 2020 US Open and Medvedev (1996) at 2021 US Open as only Grand Slam men's champions born in 1990s.



GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS: There are six Grand Slam champions in this year's Roland Garros main draw, including three former Roland Garros champions **Alcaraz**, **Djokovic**, and **Stan Wawrinka**. 40-year-old Wawrinka received a wildcard this year and will face **Jacob Fearnley** in 1R in attempt to join Karlovic in 2019 (d. F. Lopez) as the only men to win a Roland Garros main draw match after turning 40 years of age in last 50 years of the event (5th in Open Era).

HOME FAVORITES: There are 18 Frenchmen in 2025 Roland Garros main draw, including seeds No. 14 **Arthur Fils**, No. 22 **Ugo Humbert** and No. 31 **Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard**. With Fils, 20, and Mpetshi Perricard, 21, it marks the first time two Frenchmen aged 21-and-under are seeded at Roland Garros since 1932, as both look for their first main draw wins at the event just four years after they teamed up to win 2021 boys' doubles title.

RICHARD'S FAREWELL: French veteran **Gasquet** announced plans to retire after Roland Garros, as 38-year-old wildcard takes on a fellow French wildcard **Terence Atmane** in his opening round. By stepping on court, Gasquet will tie Antoine Gentien for most Roland Garros main draw appearances in event history (22) and set the new Open Era record. He is 30-21 at the event, highlighted by his run to 2016 quarter-final and also winning 2004 mixed doubles title w/Golovin.

CHASING HISTORY: Monfils owns all-time record for most Grand Slam wins among Frenchmen and could tie Boussus for most Roland Garros wins among Frenchmen with run to 3R this year. He meets **Hugo Dellien** in 1R, aiming to extend his 15-2 record in 1Rs. Last year, **Corentin Moutet** became 1st Frenchman to reach 4R at the event since Gaston in 2020, as this year home players bid to go even further. Last French men's quarter-finalist is Gasquet in 2016, last semi-finalist Tsonga in 2015, last finalist Leconte in 1988 and Noah in 1983 remains only home champion in Open Era.

IN FORM ON CLAY: Entering Roland Garros, No. 18 **Francisco Cerundolo** leads the ATP Tour in clay court wins (19), highlighted by run to Buenos Aires final, his home event. No. 5 seed **Jack Draper** and No. 8 seed **Lorenzo Musetti** enter a Grand Slam event as Top 10 for 1st time in their careers. Draper advanced to his 1st ATP Tour final on clay at ATP Masters 1000 Madrid earlier this month, while Musetti reached semi-finals of all three ATP Masters 1000 events on clay this year and owns 8-4 record at Roland Garros, with all 4 losses coming against Top-4 players.
