NITTO ATP FINALS TALKING POINTS

- World No. 1 Jannik Sinner takes on No. 5 Taylor Fritz in the championship match of the 55th Nitto ATP Finals in history. It is a rematch of their round robin match on Tuesday, won by Sinner 6-4 6-4 and it marks the first time since 2015 that US Open finalists meet again in the final of Nitto ATP Finals (Djokovic and Federer).
- It is also the 21st time in tournament history the singles finalists meet for the second time during the event, with loser of the round robin match going on to reverse the result in the final 12 of 20 previous occasions, including last year when Novak Djokovic avenged the round robin loss to Sinner in the final.
- No. 1 Sinner enters the final on a 10-match winning streak and won 25 of most recent 26 matches, lone loss to No. 3 Alcaraz in Beijing final. He bids to become the first Italian Nitto ATP Finals champion and could be the first player to win the title without losing a set since Ivan Lendl in 1986. He would be the first man born in 2000s to capture the Nitto ATP Finals title and first player to do it on home soil since Andy Murray at 2016 London.

- 23-year-old Sinner leads the ATP Tour in titles (7) and wins (69, tied w/Zverev) this season and bids to become the first man to earn 70 wins and 8 titles in a season since Andy Murray in 2016 (78 wins, 9 titles). After capturing both hard court Grand Slam titles at Australian Open and US Open this year, Sinner aims to join Djokovic (2015, 2023) and Federer (2004, 2006-07) as the only players to capture three biggest hard court events in a season.
- World No. 5 Taylor Fritz is the first American finalist since 2006 and attempts to record the biggest win of his career (0-10 vs. World No. 1s). He bids to become the first American champion at the event since Pete Sampras at 1999 Hanover. He defeated No. 2 **Zverev** in SF and now aims to be the first player to defeat both Top-2 players in one event since **Zverev** at 2021 Nitto ATP Finals (d. No. 1 Djokovic in SF, No. 2 Medvedev in final).

Fritz aims to become the fifth man born since 1995 to record his 200 hard court wins in his career and capture his 9th ATP Tour title (8-7 in finals), third of the year after Delray Beach and Eastbourne. On the other side of the net, Sinner is 17-5 in tour-level finals, including 7-1 this season.

In doubles, Year-End No. 1 doubles team Marcelo Arevalo and Mate Pavic bid to be the first top-seeded team to
win the title since Bryan brothers in 2014. They meet Kevin Krawietz and Tim Puetz in a rematch of their round
robin match on Monday. The German duo leads their Lexus ATP Head2Head 4-2, including wins at Australian
Open 3R and US Open SF. All four players look for their first Nitto ATP Finals title.

Nitto ATP Finals Stats

- The 23-year-old San Candido native is the first Italian No. 1 seed in Nitto ATP Finals 55-year tournament history.
- Last year became the 4th Italian to qualify for the season finale, joining Adriano Panatta (1975), Corrado Barazzutti (1978) and Matteo Berrettini (2019, 2021), then became first Italian to reach the championship match.
- Also last year went 3-0 in his group, including win over No. 1 Djokovic, as well as No. 6 Tsitsipas and No. 8 Rune, then defeated No. 3 Medvedev in SF and lost to 6-time champion Djokovic in the final (won 7th title in 2023).
- He aims to be the third man to win Nitto ATP Finals title in front of home crowd since 2000, following Hewitt at 2001 Sydney and Murray at 2016 London.
- He bids to join Federer (2004, 2006-07) and Djokovic (2015, 2023) as the only players to win Australian Open, US Open and Nitto ATP Finals in the same season.
- In 2021, served as an ALT after Berrettini withdrew after retiring in his first match vs. Zverev due to an abdominal injury and posted a 6-2 6-2 win over Hurkacz before falling to No. 2 Medvedev in a third-set tie break in his next match.
- Earned 6-3 6-4 win vs. de Minaur on Sunday to earn first win on home soil since becoming first Italian World No. 1 in PIF ATP Rankings history (since 1973), then also earned wins over Fritz (6-4 6-4) and Medvedev (6-3 6-4).
- Owns 9-0 record indoors this season after winning Rotterdam title in February and four wins this week and 12-0 record vs. Americans this season.
- He is the first player to reach Nitto ATP Finals championship match without losing a set since Djokovic in 2018.
- He is 25-1 in his last five events played, winning titles at ATP Masters 1000 events in Cincinnati and Shanghai, US Open title and reaching final of Beijing (I. to No. 3 Alcaraz), currently on a 10-match winning streak.

- At 2024 Australian Open, defeated 10-time champion Djokovic in SF and rallied from two sets down in final against Medvedev to win his 1st Grand Slam title and became 1st player to beat Djokovic in SF or later at the tournament.
- Became the first Italian champion in Australian Open tournament history and second Italian man to win a Grand Slam title in Open Era (Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros).
- Captured 2024 US Open title to join Djokovic, Federer and Wilander to win both hard court Grand Slam titles in one season and be the first man since Vilas in 1977 to win 1st two Grand Slam titles in the same year.
- Leads all players born since 2000 with 17 career titles, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2023 Toronto, 2024 Miami, 2024 Cincinnati and 2024 Shanghai.
- First Italian man to play in 2023 Nitto ATP Finals SF and championship match on home soil in Turin, then led Italy to 2023 Davis Cup title, first since 1976.

Nitto ATP Finals Stats

- The 27-year-old is playing in his second Nitto ATP Finals after entering the event in 2022 as No. 9 (due to No. 1 Alcaraz withdrawal) and reaching the semi-finals.
- Earned round robin wins over No. 2 Nadal and No. 6 Auger-Aliassime (I. to No. 4 Ruud) to become the first American semi-finalist since Sock in 2017.
- He is the first American finalist since Blake at 2006 Shanghai and aims to be 1st champion since Sampras at 1999 Hanover.
- By defeating Medvedev on Sunday, he became the fourth man to capture 50 wins this season (behind Sinner, Zverev, Alcaraz) and first American man to record 50 wins in back-to-back years (54 in 2023) since Blake in 2006-07.
- Qualified as second in Ilie Nastase Group, earning wins over Medvedev 6-4 6-3 and de Minaur 5-7 6-4 6-3 and lost to No. 1 Sinner.
- Owns 5-6 record vs. Top 5 players this year (10-25 in career), earning four wins over Zverev as No. 4 in Wimbledon 4R and US Open QF, as No. 2 in Laver Cup and Nitto ATP Finals SF and win over No. 4 Medvedev in RR.
- By defeating No. 2 Zverev, became the third man to earn 10 Top 10 wins this year after Sinner (16) and Alcaraz (12) and the first American man to earn 10+ Top 10 wins in a season since Agassi (12) and Sampras (10) in 1999.
- Will be the 1st American man to finish in Top 5 of Year-End PIF ATP Rankings since No. 4 Blake in 2006.
- By reaching the final, he secured new career-high No. 4 on Monday and will be the highest-ranked American man since No. 4 Roddick in August 2007.
- He seeks the biggest win of career (0-10 vs. World No. 1s) and aims to become the first American man to defeat World No. 1 at Nitto ATP Finals since Agassi (in SF) and Sampras (in RR) beat No. 1 Safin in 2000.

Career Highlights

- Former World No. 1 junior won 5th ATP Tour title at 2023 Delray Beach to achieve career-high No. 5 and become 1st American in Top 5 since Roddick in September 2009.
- · Will finish inside Top 10 in Year-End PIF ATP Rankings for the third consecutive year after being No. 9 in 2022 and No. 10 in 2023.
- Became the 1st American man in US Open final since 2006 in 2024 after earning wins over No. 8 Ruud in 4R, No. 4 Zverev in QF and No. 20 Tiafoe in all-American semi-final.
- Defeated No. 2 Nadal en route 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF after beating him in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final to become that event's 1st American men's champion since Agassi in 2001.
- Advanced to 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2022 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam QF at 2022 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-7 record in Grand Slam 3R matches.

- Clinched inaugural United Cup for Team USA in 2023, helped Team World capture Laver Cup in 2022 and 2023 and captured bronze medal at 2024 Paris Olympics in men's doubles w/Paul.

LET'S MEET AGAIN - PLAYING SAME OPPONENT TWICE

In the history of the year-end finals, 20 times singles finalists have met twice in the same year-end championships since it first occurred in Houston in 1976. Federer has been involved five times and Djokovic four times. In 12 of the previous 20 occasions, the player who lost the round robin match came back to win in the final, with Djokovic doing it last year.

Nitto ATP Finals Stats

- German duo is No. 6 on <u>PIF ATP Doubles Team Rankings</u> and are making their first team appearance at the event.
- They would finish the year as No. 4 doubles team with a title win, securing Krawietz's third Top 5 finish (No. 4 in 2020 and No. 5 in 2019 w/Mies), while Puetz already confirmed his 2nd Top 10 finish (No. 9 in 2022 w/Venus).
- Krawietz is playing in his 4th Nitto ATP Finals, first since 2021 and reached the semi-finals and final for the 1st time.
- Puetz aims to be the first debutant to win Nitto ATP Finals since Koolhof in 2020.
- They won the Bob Bryan group by defeating No. 1 Arevalo/Pavic and No. 4 Bolelli/Vavassori, before losing to No. 6 Bopanna/Ebden, then saved 1 MP to defeat No. 5 Purcell/Thompson in the semi-finals.
- The pair aims to be the first Germans to win the Nitto ATP Finals doubles title after Fassbender/Pohmann ended up as runners-up at 1975 Stockholm (round robin play).
- Krawietz and Puetz are first No. 8 seeds to play in Nitto ATP Finals doubles SFs since reached Herbert/Mahut in 2018 final and aim to be first No. 8 seeds to win the title since Top-8 seeding was introduced in doubles' field in 1995.
- They would join Nitto ATP Finals singles champions Becker (1988, 1992, 1995), Stich (1993) and Zverev (2018, 2021), as the only German champions at the event.
- Krawietz seeks 11th tour-level title, third on hard courts (2019 New York, 2019 Antwerp w/Mies), while Puetz looks for 10th and biggest ATP Tour title, 3rd on hard courts after 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Paris and 2022 Dubai w/Venus.

Kevin Krawietz Career Highlights

- Achieved doubles career-high No. 7 after reaching 2019 ATP Masters 1000 Paris SF w/Mies.
- Won 2019 and 2020 Roland Garros titles w/Mies to become 1st All-German Grand Slam men's doubles champions and 1st repeat Grand Slam champions since Mirnyi/Nestor at 2011-12 Roland Garros.
- Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals in 2019-20 w/Mies, 2021 w/Tecau following Mies' right knee surgery and 2024 w/Puetz.
- Captured 5 of 10 titles on home soil, including 2023-24 Hamburg titles w/Puetz.

Nitto ATP Finals Stats

- · No. 1 seeds teamed up for the first time at the start of the season and make their team debut at the event.
- Arevalo is appearing for the second time after 2022 w/Rojer and became World No. 1 doubles player for the first time on Monday, while Pavic is making his sixth appearance, highlighted by 2022 final w/Mektic.
- They bid to become the first No. 1 seeds to capture Nitto ATP Finals title since Bob and Mike Bryan at 2014 London.
- They won 4 titles together this season: Hong Kong, Geneva, Roland Garros and ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati.
- The pair broke a 5-match losing streak since reaching US Open SF by defeating Bopanna/Ebden on Wednesday.
- They secured year-end No. 1 on PIF ATP Doubles Teams Rankings.

Open w/Marach, 2020 US Open w/Soares, 2021 Wimbledon w/Mektic, 2021 Tokyo Olympics w/Mektic, 2024 Roland Garros w/Arevalo) achieved by Bryan brothers, Nestor, Woodbridge and Woodforde.

Marcelo Arevalo Career Highlights

- Achieved career-high No. 1 in doubles in November 2024 to become the first Central American World No. 1 in PIF ATP Doubles Rankings history.
- Also became first Central American Grand Slam champion, winning two titles at Roland Garros in 2022 w/Rojer after saving 3 championship points vs. Dodig/Krajicek and 2024 w/Pavic.
- Only titles entering 2022 season came at 2018 Los Cabos w/Reyes-Varela and 2021 Winston-Salem w/Middelkoop, then won personal-best 4 titles in 2022 and 2024.
- Qualified for Nitto ATP Finals in 2022 w/Rojer and finished the season as No. 3 team in 2022 and No. 11 in 2023.
