BMW OPEN BY BITPANDA TALKING POINTS

- In its first year as an ATP 500 event, the **BMW Open by Bitpanda** is headlined by World No. 3 **Alexander Zverev**, who is making his 11th consecutive appearance and won back-to-back titles in 2017-18. He aims to be the second 3-time champion in tournament history after **Philipp Kohlschreiber** (2 Davydenko, Orantes, Perez Roldan, Rune, Squillari, Vilas, Zverev). Munich is one of five ATP Tour events Zverev has won twice.
- No. 2 seed Ben Shelton is making his debut at the event and seeks first clay-court win of the season after winning his first title on the surface in Houston last year. ATP Masters 1000 Miami champion and No. 6 seed Jakub Mensik will play his first tournament since defeating Djokovic to clinch first ATP Tour trophy in March.
- Defending champion Jan-Lennard Struff became the third-oldest first-time ATP Tour title winner when he
 triumphed last April at 33 years and 11 months old. The German also reached his first ATP Tour final at this
 venue in 2021 and has appeared in 13 of the last 14 editions (including qualifying). He will start his title
 defense against No. 5 seed Francisco Cerundolo, who won his last 6 opening-round matches.
- The other three Germans in the main draw are wildcards Daniel Altmaier, Justin Engel, and Yannick
 Hanfmann. Engel was the first 2007-born player to win an ATP Tour match when he defeated Wong in Almaty
 last year and will be playing his first tour-level event on home soil. Hanfmann reached 1st of his 18 ATP Tour
 quarter-finals in Munich as No. 273-ranked qualifier in 2017.

Miomir Kecmanovic | Age: 25 | World No. 48 | Career-High No. 27 | 2025: 12-9 (1 Title) | Munich: 3-1 (2022 SF) > Broke into Top 40 after winning 1st ATP Tour title at 2020 Kitzbuhel and achieved career-high No. 27 in January 2023.

- > Earned personal-best 38 wins in 2022, reaching Australian Open 4R, Roland Garros 3R and Wimbledon 3R.
- > Advanced to ATP Masters 1000 QFs at 2019 Indian Wells as LL, 2022 Indian Wells and 2022 Miami, equaling biggest win of career in 2022 Indian Wells 4R vs. No. 6 Berrettini.
- > Beat Ruud and Davidovich Fokina to reach 2019 Next Gen ATP Finals SF (I. to eventual champion Sinner) and saved 2 championship points to defeat Davidovich Fokina in 2025 Delray Beach final for 2nd ATP Tour title.
- > Defeated Tsitsipas in 3rd-set TB to win 2015 Orange Bowl junior title, then ended 2016 as World No. 1 junior ahead of No. 2 Tsitsipas.

NOTE: Kecmanovic seeks first clay win of the season after missing 1 MP vs. Tiafoe at ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo last week. He reached 2022 SF in lone Munich main draw appearance (I. to van de Zandschulp).

Marcos Giron | Age: 31 | World No. 45 | Career-High No. 37 | 2025: 11-7 (3x QF) | Munich: 2-2 (2023 QF)

- > One of 3 former UCLA Bruins to break into Top 50 during 2022 season (also Cressy, McDonald) and achieved career-high No. 37 in August 2024 after saving 1 MP in Newport final to win 1st ATP Tour title.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour final at age 29 and in his home state of California at 2022 San Diego.
- > Qualified at 11 ATP Masters 1000 events, including 2023 Toronto, before earning biggest win of career over No. 5 Rune at 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells.
- > Reached 2021 Roland Garros 3R after rallying from 6-2 6-4 5-1 down and saving 3 MPs vs. Dimitrov in 1R, as well as 3R of 2023 Roland Garros and 2025 Australian Open.
- > Won 2014 NCAA singles title for UCLA and broke into Top 100 in 2020 following right hip surgery in 2015 and left hip surgery in 2016.

NOTE: Giron reached 1st of 2 ATP Tour clay-court QFs at this venue in 2023 (I. to van de Zandschulp). He is 10-1 in opening-round matches since October, lone loss to No. 37 Thompson at ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells in March.

First Meeting

Borna Gojo | Age: 27 | World No. 410 | Career-High No. 72 | 2025: 0-2 (2 times in 1R) | Munich: 0-0 (Debut)

- > Achieved career-high No. 72 in November 2023 soon after reaching 1st ATP Tour QF in Vienna.
- > Qualified to reach 2023 US Open 4R without losing a set in the main draw to break inside Top 100.
- > Led Croatia to 2021 Davis Cup final with 4 singles wins (d. Gunneswaran, Popyrin, Sonego, Lajovic).
- > Made ATP Tour main draw debut on his college campus at 2018 Winston-Salem as WC (I. to Harrison).
- > Owns 106-79 record on Challenger circuit (2-3 in finals), winning 1st title at 2022 Ortisei.
- > Earned 1st ranking point at age 17 in 2016 before playing college tennis at Wake Forest University from 2017-19.
- > Three-time All-American helped Demon Deacons win 2018 NCAA team title and lost to teammate Chrysochos in 2018 NCAA singles final.

NOTE: Gojo seeks 1st tour-level win outside Davis Cup since reaching 2023 Vienna QF and biggest clay-court win of career (0-4 vs. Top 100 across all levels). He is 2-5 vs. Top 20, defeating Americans No. 11 Tiafoe at 2023 Davis Cup and No. 12 Paul in 2023 Vienna 2R, and would be first Croat to win a match in Munich since Dodig reached 2016 QF.

Ben Shelton | Age: 22 | World No. 15 | Career-High No. 12 | 2025: 10-7 (Aus. Open SF) | Munich: 0-0 (Debut) > Broke into Top 200 in August 2022, Top 100 in November 2022 and Top 20 in September 2023, achieving career-high No. 12 in March 2025 after advancing to Australian Open SF.

- > Defeated countrymen Paul and Tiafoe at 2023 US Open to become youngest American man in US Open SF since Chang, 20, in 1992 and beat No. 4 Sinner to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Shanghai.
- > Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2023 Tokyo, joining Bryan Shelton as 4th father-son duo to win a tour-level championship in Open Era (Phil & Taylor Dent, Ramanathan & Ramesh Krishnan, Petr & Sebastian Korda).
- > Advanced to 2023 Australian Open QF at age 20 and on his 1st trip outside USA, becoming youngest American man in Aus. Open QF since Giammalva Jr., 19, in 1982, and in Grand Slam QF since Roddick, 20, at 2002 US Open.
- > Posted 65-10 singles record in 2 seasons for University of Florida, clinching 2021 NCAA team title and 2022 NCAA singles title while being coached by his father Bryan, a former World No. 55.

NOTE: Shelton seeks first win since losing to eventual champion in Draper in ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells QF last month. He is 11-1 vs. players ranked outside Top 100 since Wimbledon, losing most recent match to No. 182 Wong in ATP Masters 1000 Miami 2R in March.

Alexander Zverev | Age: 27 | World No. 3 | Career-High No. 2 | 2025: 14-7 (Aus. Open Final) | Munich: 15-8 ('17-'18 Titles) > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal.

- > Led ATP Tour with 6 titles in 2021 and leads all players born since 1990 with 23 career titles, defeating No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and 2021 Nitto ATP Finals championships.
- > Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.
- > Earned wins over 14-time champion Nadal en route to 2024 Roland Garros final and 10-time champion Djokovic via RET to reach 2025 Australian Open final.
- > Defeated Djokovic at 2017 Rome and Federer at 2017 Montreal for 1st and 2nd of his 6 ATP Masters 1000 titles.
- > Joined Murray and Thiem as 3rd player to defeat Djokovic on hard (4 times), Federer on grass (2016 Halle SF) and Nadal on clay (2 times).

NOTE: Zverev aims to join Kohlschreiber (2007, 2012, 2016) as only 3-time champions in tournament history. He is 15-1 in opening rounds on clay since losing to O'Connell at this venue in 2023, getting defeated by Berrettini at ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo last week.

Alexandre Muller | Age: 28 | World No. 40 | Career-High No. 39 | 2025: 12-8 (Hong Kong Title) | Munich: 0-0 (Debut) > Broke into Top 500 in 2016, Top 250 in 2019, Top 100 in 2023 and achieved career-high No. 39 in April 2025 soon after advancing to biggest final of career in Rio de Janeiro.

- > Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2025 Hong Kong, becoming 3rd man in Open Era to win a tour-level title by rallying from a set down in all matches played after Ashe at 1975 WCT Finals and Bublik at 2024 Montpellier.
- > Defeated clay-court champions Gasquet and Musetti en route to 1st SF and final at 2023 Marrakech and earned biggest win of career over No. 6 Rublev to reach 4R at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Rome.
- > Made tour-level debut at 2017 Roland Garros as a WC (I. to Monteiro) and won 1st tour-level match at 2021 Australian Open as LL, beating Londero in 1R.
- > Owns a 140-122 Challenger record (3-3 in finals), winning 1st title at 2022 Blois after saving a MP in his 1R match.
- > Had a tennis court at his childhood home and began playing with his dad at age 6 and says he was better at football than tennis before choosing the latter.

NOTE: Muller seeks biggest win of career and is 1-8 vs. Top 10, defeating No. 6 Rublev at 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Rome. He reached the final in most recent ATP 500 clay-court event in Rio de Janeiro in February (I. to Baez).

Chun-Hsin Tseng | Age: 23 | World No. 103 | Career-High No. 83 | 2025: 3-4 (Rio de Janeiro QF) | Munich: 0-0 (Debut) > Earned 1st ranking point at age 15 in November 2016, broke into Top 100 in June 2022, achieved career-high No. 83 in August 2022 and qualified for 2022 Next Gen ATP Finals.

- > Made Grand Slam debut at 2022 Australian Open as WC, then qualified at 2022 Roland Garros.
- > Posted 1st ATP Tour win at 2022 Los Cabos (d. Chappell) after earning 5 tour-level wins in Davis Cup play for Chinese Taipei.
- > Dropped 1 set en route to 1st Challenger title at 2021 Maia-2, then did not drop a set en route to Bengaluru and Murcia Challenger titles in 2022.
- > Ended 2018 season as World No. 1 junior after posting 21-2 record in Grand Slam boys' singles matches (Australian Open final, Roland Garros title, Wimbledon title, US Open SF).

NOTE: Tseng earned both his ATP 500 wins in Rio de Janeiro in February (I. to Baez in QF) and seeks 2nd-biggest win of career after defeating No. 28 Tabilo during that run. He is 1st player from Chinese Taipei in tournament history.

Daniel Altmaier | Age: 26 | World No. 68 | Career-High No. 47 | 2025: 8-9 (2x QF) | Munich: 1-2 (2022 2R)

- > Made Top 50 debut a day before his 25th birthday in September, achieving career-high No. 47 in October 2023.
- > Reached 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Madrid as a LL and defeated countryman No. 6 Zverev for biggest win of career at 2024 Acapulco.
- > Made Grand Slam qualifying debut at 2020 Roland Garros and earned 6th win of tournament over No. 8 Berrettini to reach 4R and defeated No. 9 Sinner en route to 2023 Roland Garros 3R.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour SFs of career in back-to-back weeks at Umag and Kitzbuhel in July 2021.
- > Ended 2022 season with 13 wins in his last 14 Challenger matches, including back-to-back titles at Lima-2 and Guayaquil.
- > Hits a one-handed backhand and says that his idols growing up were fellow one-handers Federer and Wawrinka.

NOTE: Altmaier seeks first ATP Tour win on home soil since beating No. 7 Rublev to reach 2023 Hamburg QF. He defeated No. 19 Auger-Aliassime en route to ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo 3R last week (l. to No. 3 Alcaraz).
