ERSTE BANK OPEN TALKING POINTS

- Two-time champion **Andy Murray** and World No. 7 **Matteo Berrettini** are in second-round action at the Erste Bank Open on Wednesday. Murray is 9-0 lifetime in Vienna, where his second title run propelled him to a year-end finish as World No. 1 in 2016. The 34-year-old is competing in his ninth tournament of the last 11 weeks.
- Murray has exceeded three hours in three matches since the start of the US Open on 30 August, including a
 come-from-behind win over 18-year-old Carlos Alcaraz at Indian Wells on 10 October. If Alcaraz avenges that
 loss, he will become the second-youngest player to beat Murray, trailing only Borna Coric, 18, at 2015 Dubai.
- On Monday, Berrettini qualified for the Nitto ATP Finals, which will be held in his native Italy for the first time
 next month. Berrettini's opponent on Wednesday, Nikoloz Basilashvili, is in the running for one of the two
 spots remaining in the eight-man field. The Georgian reached his first ATP Masters 1000 final in Indian Wells.
- The FedEx ATP Race to Turin is wide open following Murray's upset of Hubert Hurkacz on Monday. Both
 Cameron Norrie and Jannik Sinner can pass No. 8 Rafael Nadal and No. 9 Hurkacz in the standings by
 reaching the Vienna semi-finals. Sinner begins his Vienna campaign on Wednesday against Reilly Opelka.
- Berrettini and Sinner's countryman Lorenzo Sonego meets lucky loser Dominik Koepfer in a first-round match. Sonego was a lucky loser last year in Vienna when he defeated World No. 1 Novak Djokovic 6-2 6-1 en route to the final. Djokovic's three games tied the fewest won in his career. He also won three games in losses to Marat Safin at the 2005 Australian Open (6-0 6-2 6-1) and Feliciano Lopez at 2016 Dubai (6-3 ret.).

1R: Reilly Opelka (USA) vs [7] Jannik Sinner (ITA)

First Meeting

Reilly Opelka | Age: 24 | World No. 27 | Career-High No. 18 | 2021: 20-20 (Toronto Final) | Vienna: 0-0 (Debut) > Became No. 1 American in June 2021 and achieved career-high No. 19 after advancing to Grand Slam 4R for 1st time at 2021 US Open.

- > Defeated No. 3 Tsitsipas at 2021 Toronto for biggest win of career and to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 final.
- > Saved 6 MPs and hit 43 aces vs. Isner, then hit 43 more aces vs. Schnur to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 New York.
- > Saved 1 MP vs. Raonic and beat Nishioka on same day to win 2nd title at 2020 Delray Beach.
- > Peaked at No. 4 in juniors following 10-1 run at 2015 Wimbledon, winning boys' singles title and reaching boys' doubles final w/Santillan.

NOTE: Opelka and Sinner captured 2021 Atlanta doubles title in only tournament as a team (d. Johnson/Thompson).

Jannik Sinner | Age: 20 | World No. 11 | Career-High No. 11 | 2021: 42-18 (4 Titles) | Vienna: 2-2 (2019-20 2R)

- > Unranked to begin 2018, made Top-100 debut in 2019, ended 2020 as No. 1 teenager and became youngest Italian ever to break into Top 15 in 2021.
- > Won Next Gen ATP Finals title in 2019 and 5 tour-level titles from 2020-21, becoming youngest 5-time ATP Tour champion at age 20 since Djokovic, 19, in 2007.
- > As a 19-year-old at 2021 Washington, became 1st teenager to win an ATP 500 title since category was created in 2009 (146 events).
- > As a 19-year-old at 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Miami, became 1st Italian finalist and 2nd-youngest finalist in 36-year tournament history.
- > Advanced to 2020 Roland Garros QF in tournament debut at age 19, becoming 1st debutant to reach Roland Garros QF since Nadal in 2005 and youngest quarter-finalist at event since Djokovic, 19, in 2006.

NOTE: Sinner did not drop a set en route to titles at Sofia (27 September-3 October) and Antwerp (18-24 October).

1R: Gael Monfils (FRA) vs [WC] Lorenzo Musetti (ITA)

First Meeting

Gael Monfils | Age: 35 | World No. 21 | Career-High No. 6 | 2021: 15-16 (Sofia Final) | Vienna: 14-7 (2008 Final)

- > Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 6 after earning personal-best 44 wins in 2016.
- > Owns 10 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500s at 2016 Washington, 2019 Rotterdam and 2020 Rotterdam.
- > Reached at least 1 final in 17 straight seasons (2005-21), including ATP Masters 1000s at 2009 Paris, 2010 Paris and 2016 Monte Carlo.
- > Earned 500+ career victories, highlighted by biggest win over No. 1 Nadal in 2009 Doha QF and career-long win streaks of 12 matches and 25 sets in 2020.
- > Advanced to 2008 Roland Garros and 2016 US Open SFs after winning junior titles at Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon in 2004.

NOTE: After starting season with 3-10 record, Monfils can improve to .500 with a win on Wednesday (16-16).

Lorenzo Musetti | Age: 19 | World No. 67 | Career-High No. 57 | 2021: 19-18 (Acapulco, Lyon SFs) | Vienna: 0-0 > Achieved career-high No. 57 following run to 2021 Roland Garros 4R (I. to World No. 1 and eventual champion Djokovic after leading by 2 sets).

- > Advanced to ATP Tour SFs at 2020 Sardinia as WC, 2021 Acapulco as Q and 2021 Lyon.
- > Beat Wawrinka and Nishikori to reach 2020 Rome 3R as Q-WC, becoming 1st player born in 2002 to win an ATP Tour match and youngest player in Rome 3R since Santoro, 18, in 1991.
- > Following Rome run, defeated 4 Top-100 players for 1st Challenger title at 2020 Forli as WC.
- > Became World No. 1 junior after winning 2019 Australian Open boys' singles title and reaching 2018 US Open boys' singles final.

NOTE: Musetti is 3-10 since reaching 2021 Roland Garros 4R and will fall to .500 with a loss on Wednesday (19-19).

Murray Leads 1-0

Andy Murray | Age: 34 | World No. 156 | Career-High No. 1 | 2021: 13-11 (Metz QF) | Vienna: 9-0 (2014, 2016 Titles) > Became 1st British World No. 1 in singles at age 29 in 2016, making him 2nd-oldest player to debut at No. 1 behind Newcombe, 30, in 1974.

Andy Murray

- > Ended 2016 on 24-match win streak, defeating No. 2 Djokovic at Nitto ATP Finals to clinch year-end No. 1 ranking.
- > First British Grand Slam champion (2012 US Open) and Wimbledon champion (2013, 2016) since Perry in 1936 (Wimbledon, US Championships).
- > Also 1st player to win 2 Olympic gold medals in singles (2012 London, 2016 Rio), highlighted by 6-2 6-1 6-4 rout of No. 1 Federer in 2012 final on Wimbledon's Centre Court.
- > Only player with at least 7 victories over Federer, Nadal and Djokovic, including championship wins over all 3 among his 14 ATP Masters 1000 titles.

NOTE: Murray snapped 11-match losing streak vs. Top-25 opponents by defeating No. 10 Hurkacz on Monday.

Carlos Alcaraz | Age: 18 | World No. 42 | Career-High No. 38 | 2021: 23-15 (Umag Title) | Vienna: 1-0 (2021 2R) > Achieved career-high No. 38 at age 18 on 13 September 2021, becoming youngest player ranked that high since countryman Nadal, 17, was No. 37 on 26 April 2004.

- > Upset No. 3 Tsitsipas in 5th-set TB en route to 2021 US Open QF at age 18, becoming youngest quarter-finalist at US Open in Open Era and at a Grand Slam since Chang, 18, at 1990 Roland Garros.
- > Captured 2021 Umag title at age 18 to become youngest ATP Tour champion since Nishikori, 18, at 2008 Delray Beach and Spanish champion since Nadal, 18, was 8 days younger at 2004 Sopot.
- > Beat Ramos-Vinolas in ATP Tour debut at 2020 Rio de Janeiro as 16-year-old, becoming youngest match winner since Garin, 16, at 2013 Vina del Mar and Spanish match winner since Nadal, 15, at 2002 Mallorca.
- > Went 20-4 with 3 titles at Challengers in 2020, sweeping Barcelona and Alicante titles at age 17 to become youngest champion in consecutive weeks since ATP Challenger Tour was established in 1978.

NOTE: Alcaraz meets Murray in 2R for 2nd time in as many appearances since US Open QF run (also Indian Wells).

Nikoloz Basilashvili | Age: 29 | World No. 25 | Career-High No. 16 | 2021: 33-25 (2 Titles) | Vienna: 2-3 (2016, 2021 2R)

- > Former World No. 16 is 15-3 on German clay with titles at 2018 Hamburg, 2019 Hamburg and 2021 Munich.
- > Earned career-high 33 victories in 2021, highlighted by biggest win of career over No. 3 Tsitsipas en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at Indian Wells.
- > En route to titles, defeated No. 4 Del Potro at 2018 Beijing, No. 5 A. Zverev at 2019 Hamburg (saved 2 MPs) and No. 6 Federer at 2021 Doha (saved 1 MP).
- > Posted best Grand Slam finish at 2018 US Open, falling to defending champion and No. 1 Nadal in 4R.
- > Father, Nodar, was a dancer in Georgian national ballet.

NOTE: Basilashvili was 0-6 in ATP Masters 1000 R16 matches before run to Indian Wells final earlier this month.

Matteo Berrettini | Age: 25 | World No. 7 | Career-High No. 7 | 2021: 40-10 (2 Titles) | Vienna: 4-1 (2019 SF) > Achieved career-high No. 7 after reaching 2021 US Open QF, becoming highest-ranked Italian since No. 7 Barazzutti in 1978.

- > Runner-up at 2021 Wimbledon became 1st Italian finalist in tournament history and 1st Italian Grand Slam finalist since Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros.
- > Beat Monfils in 5th-set TB at 2019 US Open to become 2nd Italian semi-finalist in tournament history (also Barazzutti on clay in 1977).
- > Owns 40-10 record in 2021, including 4th title at Belgrade-1, 5th title at London/Queen's Club and 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at Madrid.
- > Defeated No. 3 Thiem for biggest career win en route to 2021 ATP Cup team final and No. 5 Thiem at 2019 Nitto ATP Finals to become 1st Italian to earn a singles win in tournament history (since 1970).

NOTE: Berrettini and Basilashvili are 2 of 13 players with multiple tour-level titles this season (Ruud leads tour with 5).

1R: Lorenzo Sonego (ITA) vs [LL] Dominik Koepfer (GER) First Meeting

Lorenzo Sonego | Age: 26 | World No. 23 | Career-High No. 21 | 2021: 27-21 (Cagliari Title) | Vienna: 4-2 (2020 Final) > Earned personal-best 27 wins and achieved career-high No. 21 in 2021, sweeping Caligari titles to become 1st Italian champion on home soil in singles since 2006 and in doubles since 2005 (w/Vavassori).

- > Broke into Top 50 after saving championship point vs. Kecmanovic to win 1st ATP Tour title at 2019 Antalya.
- > Upset No. 1 Djokovic 6-2 6-1 en route to 2020 Vienna final, becoming 1st lucky loser to defeat Djokovic and equaling fewest games conceded to Djokovic in a match.
- > Saved 1 MP vs. Thiem en route to 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Rome SF, becoming 1st Italian semi-finalist at Foro Italico since 2007 and 2nd since 1978.
- > Defeated Fritz 7-6(5) 6-3 7-6(17) to reach 2020 Roland Garros 4R, winning longest men's singles TB in tournament history.

NOTE: Sonego beat 4 higher-ranked opponents, including No. 1 Djokovic, en route to 2020 Vienna final (I. to Rublev).

Dominik Koepfer | Age: 27 | World No. 62 | Career-High No. 50 | 2021: 19-22 (Acapulco SF) | Vienna: 0-0 (Debut)

- > Earned 1st ranking point at age 21 in 2015, broke into Top 100 in 2019 and achieved career-high No. 50 in 2021.
- > Did not drop a set en route to 1st ATP Tour SF at 2021 Acapulco.
- > Qualified and made ATP Masters 1000 main draw debut at 2020 Rome, where he saved 1 MP vs. de Minaur and earned biggest win of career over No. 9 Monfils en route to 1st ATP Tour QF.
- > Posted 6 wins en route to 2019 US Open 4R as Q, then reached 3R at Roland Garros, Wimbledon and Tokyo Olympics in 2021.
- > Earned finance degree and was a 2-time All-American at Tulane University in New Orleans (2013-16).

NOTE: Due to Garin's right shoulder injury, Koepfer is a lucky loser in both singles and doubles w/Gille.

1R: Fabio Fognini (ITA) vs [8] Diego Schwartzman (ARG)Series Tied 1-115 Sao Paulo (Brazil)ClayR16Fabio Fognini6-3 1-6 6-217 Vienna (Austria)HardR32Diego Schwartzman6-1 2-6 6-2

Fabio Fognini | Age: 34 | World No. 36 | Career-High No. 9 | 2021: 22-22 (Monte Carlo QF) | Vienna: 5-7 (2013, 2015 QFs) > As a 32-year-old in 2019, became oldest player to break into Top 10 for 1st time, as well as 1st Italian in Top 10 since Barazzutti in 1979.

- > Also became 1st Italian ATP Masters 1000 champion, beating Nadal for 3rd time on clay en route to 2019 Monte Carlo title.
- > Earned biggest win of career over No. 1 Murray at 2017 Rome and 300th win of career over Monfils at 2018 Rome.
- > Broke through as a doubles player in 2015 by winning Australian Open, reaching 3 ATP Masters 1000 finals and qualifying for Nitto ATP Finals with countryman Bolelli.
- > Married to 2015 US Open women's singles champion Flavia Pennetta with 2 children Federico and Farah and 3rd on the way.

NOTE: Fognini is 1 of 5 Italians competing in Vienna on Wednesday and 1 of 6 in draw (Mager lost on Tuesday).

Diego Schwartzman | Age: 29 | World No. 16 | Career-High No. 8 | 2021: 35-21 (1 Title) | Vienna: 6-3 (2019 Final) > More than 2 years after rising to No. 11, broke into Top 10 at career-high No. 8 in 2020 and qualified for Nitto ATP Finals

- > Advanced to 3 Roland Garros and 2 US Open QFs, highlighted by win over No. 3 Thiem in 5:08 to reach 2020 Roland Garros SF.
- > Earned biggest win of career over No. 2 Nadal en route to 1st ATP Masters 1000 final at 2020 Rome, having entered 0-9 vs. Nadal and 0-22 vs. Top 5.
- > Shortest Top-8 player at 1.70m (5'7") since 1.68m (5'6") Solomon in 1981, Grand Slam semi-finalist since Solomon at 1980 Roland Garros, and ATP Masters 1000 finalist in series history (since 1990).
- > Snapped 5-match losing streak with 5 straight wins at 2016 Istanbul, rallying from a set and 5-2 down vs. Dimitrov to capture 1st of 4 ATP Tour titles.

NOTE: Schwartzman is 8-3 in his last 3 appearances on ATP Tour (San Diego QF, Indian Wells QF, Antwerp Final).
